(2) Subject to the Second Schedule to these rules, all plans referred to in subrule (1) of this rule shall, subject to any order or direction of the Court relating thereto, be prepared in ink on good, durable paper measuring not less than fifteen inches in length and twelve inches in width and shall show clearly the number and size and proposed use of all rooms and outbuildings, the type of construction, and the boundaries of the premises to which the plan relates, and the specifications referred to therein shall include a detailed list of materials used or to be used in the construction of the affected premises, and a description of all wall and ceiling finishes, floor coverings and kitchen equipment.
- Rule 13A added. 3. The principal rules are amended by adding after rule 13 the following rule:—
13A. A licensee who objects to the granting of a licence or a provisional certificate on the grounds that the reasonable requirements of the neighbourhood do not justify the granting of the licence or provisional certificate shall produce all books of account and statements of account relating to the running of his business for inspection by the applicant or the applicant's solicitor not less than seven days before the day fixed for the hearing of the application.
- Rule 14A added. 4. The principal rules are amended by adding after rule 14 the following rule:—
14A. (1) Every application made under subsection (5) of section 129 of the Act shall contain, or have attached thereto, a plan in duplicate clearly showing the part or parts of the licensed premises for which the approval of the Court is sought.
(2) All existing licensees must make application in terms of subrule (1) of this rule on or before the 31st May, 1973.
- Application under s. 129 (5). 5. The principal rules are amended by adding after rule 18 the following rule:—
18A. An application for a packet licence permit—
(a) shall specify—
(i) the name of the vessel and the address or name of the place at which it is moored;
(ii) the name and address of the proprietor of the vessel;
(iii) the date and the hours for which the permit is required;
(iv) type of occasion;
(v) name of club, organisation or association;
(vi) the common interest shared by the passengers; and
(vii) an estimate of the number of passengers expected to be in attendance on the vessel; and
(b) shall be lodged, not less than two days before the permit is required, with all persons with whom it is, under the Act, required to be lodged.
- Rule 18A added. 6. The principal rules are amended by adding after rule 23 the following rule:—
23A. The Court may, at any time, during the currency of a licence or permit, by notice in writing to the licensee or permit holder, impose, vary or revoke conditions under which the licence or permit was granted or renewed and the conditions or variations shall operate or cease to operate from the date of the notice.
- Packet licence permit. Variation of licences and permits.
