AWARDS FROM AUSTRALIA—1974.

THE Harkness Fellowships for education and travel in the United States are offered in different categories to candidates from the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and Western Europe.

Five Fellowships in all are to be offered in open competition in Australia and New Zealand.

Candidates should be not more than 30 years of age on September 1, 1974 (consideration may be given in exceptional circumstances to a candidate above this age). They should have an honours degree or equivalent, or in the case of public servants, an attested level of professional competence and they must show that in addition to outstanding ability clearly demonstrated in their own fields, they have concern for the broader interests of the community.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Road Traffic Code, 1965, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd January, 1970 with amendments up to and including the 13th August, 1969 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Regulation 606 substituted. 2. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 606 the following regulation:—
- Entering or leaving a road or carriageway. 606. (1) A driver entering a road or carriageway from land abutting the road or carriageway shall give way to—
- all vehicles travelling in either direction along the carriageway; and
 - all vehicles turning or intending to turn preparatory to leaving the carriageway at the point that the driver is entering that carriageway,
- unless instructed to the contrary by a traffic control signal.
- (2) A driver turning or intending to turn preparatory to leaving a carriageway shall give way to all vehicles travelling in the opposite direction along that carriageway.
- (3) A driver entering or leaving a road or carriageway shall give way to all pedestrians, unless instructed to the contrary by a traffic control signal.

PART I—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Mundaring Town Planning Scheme No. 1, District Zoning Scheme, hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Mundaring (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") except that where land is shown in the Scheme Map as "Regional Reservation" the responsible authority shall be deemed to be the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959 (as amended) shall apply to such reservations.

1.3 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of the broken black border on the Land Use maps. The Scheme area comprises the whole of the District of the Shire of Mundaring.

1.4 Metropolitan Region Scheme: The Scheme is complementary to and is not a substitute for the Metropolitan Region Scheme and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time, shall continue to have effect.

1.5 Maps: The following maps form the remaining documents of the Scheme:—

- Land Use Maps—Sheets 1-7.
- Scheme Maps—(Zoning Proposals) Sheets 1-14.

1.6 General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are to—

- (a) Zone the Scheme area for the purpose of this Scheme described.
- (b) Make provisions as to the nature and location of buildings and the size of the lots when used for certain purposes.
- (c) Preserve objects of natural beauty and historic and scientific interest.
- (d) Make provision for other matters necessary or incidental to Town Planning and Housing.

1.7 Acquisition of Land: The land within the Scheme area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

1.8 Definitions and Interpretations: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 (as amended) and as set out in the Uniform Building By-laws 1965 (as amended) and otherwise as follows:—

"Absolute Majority" means a majority of the total number of the members for the time being the Shire Council whether present or not.

"Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended).

"Art Gallery" means a building used for display of works of art and includes the sale of such to the public.

"Caretaker's House" means a building used as a residence by the proprietor or manager of an activity or use carried on upon the same site or by a person having care of a building.

"Club" means a building to house a society of people or an association for some common object.

"Development" means the use or development of any land and includes the erection, construction, alteration or carrying out as the case may be, of any building, or excavation on any land.

"Eating House" means any house building or structure or any part thereof in which meals are served to the public for gain or reward.

The term does not include:—

- (a) Any premises licensed under the Licensing Act, 1911, other than a restaurant within the meaning of section 44G of that Act in respect of which a restaurant license under that Act is granted, or
- (b) Any building or other structure used temporarily for serving meals to the public at any fair, show, military encampment, races or other public sports, games or amusements.

"Hostel" means a house of residence or boarding house for students, youth, aged persons or other special or specific class.

"Incidental Use" means an accessory use which is minor to a predominant use on the same site.

"Motor Vehicle Wrecking" means the collecting and dismantling of used motor vehicles or part thereof or the storage or sale of dismantled motor vehicles.

"Noxious Trade" means and includes the following activities:—

- (1) Abattoirs, slaughter houses and knackeries.
- (2) Bone mills and bone manure depots.
- (3) Chemical manufacturing works and dye manufacturing works.

(4) Fellmongeries, tanneries and wool-scouring works.

(5) Flock factories.

(6) Glue factories.

(7) Manure and fertilizer works.

(8) Piggeries.

(9) Places for storing, drying and/or processing bones, hides, hoofs or skins.

(10) Soap and candleworks, other than those using paraffin wax or factories.

(11) Tripe boiling establishments.

(12) Gut cleaning, gut scraping, gut drying, gut spinning works, except works of this description which are carried out in conjunction with butchers' shops.

(13) Fat rendering.

(14) Works for boiling down meat, blood, bone or offal.

(15) Manufacture and storage of explosives.

(16) Petroleum refining.

(17) Sugar refining.

(18) Acetylene gas manufacture.

(19) Celluloid manufacture.

(20) Manufacture of detonating or explosive substances.

(21) Manufacture of any substance liable to a sudden explosion, inflammation or ignition.

(22) Storage of quarried materials.

(23) Places for the collection or storage of marine stores within the meaning of the Marine Stores Act, 1902.

(24) Manufacture of plastic products;

and includes any trade or industry from which is emitted noxious fumes, vapour, dust or grit or noxious waste liquid or matter.

"Objects of Natural Beauty" means the natural beauties of the area including lakes and other inland waters, banks of rivers and streams, hill slopes and summits and valleys.

"Principal Use" means the predominant use of land as distinguished from an incidental use.

"Rural Pursuit" means and includes agriculture, horticulture, forestry, pasture and poultry farming, but does not include bee keeping or dog kennels.

"Restaurant" means a building or portion of a building, in which meals are served to the public for reward, excluding a hostel, any licensed premises other than a licensed restaurant, or a building used temporarily for serving meals.

"Salvage Yard" means land used primarily or partially for collecting, storage and/or sale of discarded goods, scrap metal and used building materials.

"Stables" means a structure in which horses are housed, boarded or kept.

"Studio" means a building or room used as a workshop by a painter, sculptor, photographer, radio station for broadcasting or television station for filming.

"Vehicle" means any kind of land carriage and includes agricultural vehicles.

"Veterinarian Service" means the building or place used to treat sick animals, by a veterinarian. It may or may not include boarding of animals.

PART II.—RESERVES.

2.1 Basic Types: In the Scheme the planning area is divided into the following types of reserves:—

- (1) Regional Reservations—
 Parks and Recreation.
 Railways.
 State Forests.
 Water Catchment.
 Roads—
 Controlled Access Highways.
 Other Major Highways.
 Important Regional Roads.
 Public Purposes.
- (2) Local Authority—
 Reservations.
 Public Open Space.
 Public Purposes.
 Civic and Cultural.
 Local Roads.

2.2 Crown Reservations: The land shown as "Crown Reservations" on the Scheme maps are land reserved by the Lands and Surveys Department pursuant to the Lands Act, 1963. The said lands are not reserved by this Scheme.

2.3 Regional Reservations: The land shown as "Regional Reservations" on the Scheme maps are lands reserved by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority pursuant to the Metropolitan Region Scheme and are shown in order to comply with the Metropolitan Region Planning Act, 1959 (as amended). The said lands are not reserved by this Scheme.

2.4 Local Authority Reservations: Land set aside under this Scheme for this purpose is deemed to be reserved for a purpose indicated on the approved Scheme maps, or other such Government, Civic or Cultural purpose as may be approved by the responsible authority in conjunction with the appropriate government authority. These lands are already vested or shall be vested in or acquired by the Council.

- (a) Local authority reservations until vested in the Council may be used—
- (i) for the purpose for which the land is reserved under this Scheme;
- (ii) where such land is vested in a public authority for any purpose for which such land may lawfully be used by that authority; and
- (iii) for the purpose for which it was used at the date upon which the Scheme came into operation unless the land shall have in the meantime become vested in a public authority or unless such shall have been changed by Council.
- (b) No person shall, in respect of development on a local authority reservation, without the approval of Council—
- (i) demolish or damage any building or works;
- (ii) remove or damage any tree;
- (iii) excavate, spoil or waste the land so as to destroy, affect or impair its usefulness for the purpose for which it is reserved; or
- (iv) construct, extend or alter any building or structure other than a boundary fence.
- (c) The Council may on written application of the owner of a local authority reservation, grant its approval in writing, to carry out any of the works mentioned in the clause immediately preceding or refuse its approval upon such conditions as it thinks fit.
- (d) In giving its approval, the responsible authority shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purpose of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(e) No provision of this part shall prevent the continued use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme being gazetted, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

(f) No provision of this part shall prevent the responsible authority from providing any public road or road widening, right-of-way, drainage reserve or the like, or closing and disposing of such in accordance with any immediate or future requirements.

(g) If the Council shall—

(i) refuse to grant its approval to the use of a local authority reservation for any purpose permitted on land adjoining it, or

(ii) refuse to grant its approval to the carrying out of any of the works mentioned in Clause 2.3(b) hereof, or

(iii) when granting its approval to the carrying out of any of the said works impose conditions which are unacceptable to the person applying for such approval, and if—

(a) the applicant does not agree to abandon the application for the Council's approval, or

(b) in the meantime, the Council does not resolve to exercise its powers under Section 13 of the Act, or

(c) no previous claim for compensation has been made for injurious affection by reason of the reservation of the land,

the owner may claim compensation for injurious affection by reason of the reservation of the land and the Council's decision provided such claim is made within six (6) months of the decision of the Council.

(h) A local authority reservation may be dealt with or disposed of by Council upon such terms and conditions as it thinks fit provided that the land is used for or preserved for the use for which the land is reserved.

2.5 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the grounds that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grant its approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the Office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal or approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1. The Scheme area is divided into the following types of zones set out hereunder:

1. Residential.
2. Commercial.
3. Light Industry.
4. Rural.
5. Hotel.
6. Fuel Depot.
7. Service Station.
8. Place of Public Assembly.
9. Special Purposes.

3.2 The said zones are delineated by colour on the Scheme map according to the Legend thereon.

3.3. The zoning table following at the end of this part indicates, subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the uses permitted in the various zones shown in the Zoning Table. The uses are determined by cross reference between the list of Use Classes on the left hand side of the Zoning Table and the list of Zones at the top of the Zoning Table. The symbols used in the cross reference Zoning Table have the following meaning:—

“P” A use that is permitted under this Scheme.

“AA” A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.

“IP” A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided by the Council.

“X” A use that is not permitted

3.4 (a) No development of any land in the Scheme Area shall be commenced or continued without the approval of the Responsible Authority, except for a single dwelling house.

(b) Approval under this part does not exempt the person to whom exemption is granted from the requirements, if any, to obtain promises or approval for development on the land under any other law.

3.5 (a) Where in the Zoning Table a particular use is mentioned it is deemed to be excluded from any use class which by its more general terms would otherwise include such particular use.

(b) If a particular use or purpose is not mentioned in the list of use classes or is not included in the general terms of any of the use classes such use or purpose shall unless it is permitted by the subsequent provisions of this Scheme be deemed to be prohibited.

3.6. Special Purposes Zone:

3.7 The Special Purposes Zone is not included in the Zoning Table as this zone relates to specific uses which Council may approve in respect of a specific lot or lots.

3.8 Those portions of the Scheme Area coloured Yellow on the Scheme Maps and specified in the schedule hereto are classified as Special Purposes Zones.

3.9 No person shall use any land or any building or structure thereon within a Special Purposes Zone except for the use or purpose set against such land respectively in the schedule.

3.10 Any person who desires to use land for a purpose which by the provisions of this Scheme is only permitted if approval is given by the Council shall make application for such approval to the Council in writing.

3.11 The application shall state the following particulars:—

- (a) The full name and address of the applicant.
- (b) A description of the land and the particulars of the Certificate of Title.
- (c) The names and addresses of the registered proprietors and of all other persons having an interest in the land and the nature of their interest.
- (d) The nature of the applicant's interest in the land.
- (e) The purpose for which the applicant desires to use the land.
- (f) The nature of the building and other improvements now on the land.
- (g) The nature of the buildings and other improvements the applicant desires to construct on or make to the land.

3.12 The Council shall consider the application and may refuse its approval or may resolve to recommend to a subsequent meeting of the Council that approval be granted. If the Council resolves to recommend that approval be granted it shall refer the matter to a subsequent meeting of the Council to be held not less than three weeks nor more than six months after the passing of the resolution recommending approval.

3.13 The Council may resolve that notice be given to ratepayers likely to be affected by the granting of the approval and in that case it shall notify the applicant of the names and addresses of all persons who according to the Rate Book are the rateable owners of land within an area to be specified by the Council likely to be affected by the granting of the application.

3.14 The Council should require notice to be given to ratepayers if the proposed use is likely to be carried on at night or is likely to cause noise or to cause an assembly of persons or vehicles.

3.15 If so directed by the Council the applicant shall—

- (a) cause to be sent by certified post to the owners whose names and addresses have been given to him by the Council and to all persons having an interest in the land the subject of the application a copy of his application to the Council; and
- (b) cause to be published in a newspaper circulating in the Scheme area notice of his application setting out in an abbreviated form the information contained in his application and stating that objections may be made to the Council within twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice.

3.16 At a subsequent meeting of the Council held if notices have been given after the expiration of twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice and after the expiration of twenty-eight days from the posting of the said notices to the owners whichever is the later the Council shall again consider the application and decide whether to grant or withhold its approval or grant its approval upon conditions.

3.17 In making its decision on applications for its approval the Council shall take into consideration the following matters:—

- (a) The provisions of any Town Planning Scheme including this Scheme affecting the land the subject of the application or affecting land in the vicinity.
- (b) The nature of the proposed development in relation to the development of any land within the vicinity of the said land.
- (c) The size, shape and character of the parcel of land to which the application relates and the nature and siting of the proposed building the view from the building and the interruption of view likely to be caused by the proposed building.
- (d) Any representations which may be made by any Statutory Authority.
- (e) The existing the likely future amenity of the neighbourhood including (but without limiting the generality of the foregoing) the question of whether the proposed development is likely to cause injury to such amenity including injury due to the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, liquid wastes or waste products.
- (f) The nature of the roads giving access to the said land.
- (g) What parking facilities are available or proposed and the likely requirements for parking.
- (h) Such other matters as the Council considers relevant.

3.18 The Council may enter into agreements with the applicant whereby the applicant covenants for himself and his transferees to carry out and observe the conditions (if any) imposed by the Council in granting its approval as aforesaid.

3.19 Domestic Animals: Nothing in the Zoning Table is to be taken to imply that the provisions of the relevant Regulations and By-laws relating to domestic animals are superceded or replaced.

PART IV.—BUILDING STANDARDS AND PARTICULAR ZONING REQUIREMENTS.

4.1 Minimum Development Requirements: Subject to the provisions of the Scheme no person shall develop any land or use any building for any of the purposes mentioned in Column No. 1 of the Building Table unless such development is in accordance with the standards set against such purpose in the Table which follows at the end of this part.

4.2 Subdivisional Standards: The Council's recommendation to the Town Planning Board for

subdivisional applications within the residential zone will be made in accordance with the following standards:—

The areas mentioned above denote useable space only and are not to be misconstrued as the accepted minimum lot area.

The lot sizes mentioned may be varied at the discretion of Council in special circumstances, or where Council is satisfied that the land involved is capable of catering for a higher population density than would be generated by the lot sizes mentioned.

4.3 Buildings Containing Flats and Offices: If special permission of the Council is given a building within a Commercial Zone may contain a penthouse for residential purposes.

4.4 Duplex Houses: In addition to the requirements specified in the Building Table, the following provisions shall apply to Duplex Houses:—

- (a) No duplex house shall be constructed within a distance of twenty (20) chains along the street on which it fronts in a Rural Zone, of an approved or developed duplex or triplex house site, or within a distance of ten (10) chains along the street on which it fronts in the Residential Zone.
- (b) If Council's approval to commence development on the site has been granted the applicant shall make application to Council for a building permit with all necessary plans and specifications within six (6) months from the date of such preliminary approval.
- (c) If the duplex house shall not be completed in accordance with the Building Permit within two (2) years from the date of issue of such Building Permit, the Council may revoke any approval given by it to erect a duplex on the said land.

4.5 Landscaping: The application for a building license and the accompanying plans and specifications for a building or use which is shown as requiring special siting on the land use table shall include details of the proposed landscaping of the area. Council may request that a bond be deposited with it in order to ensure that this condition is complied with. This bond shall not exceed fifty (50) dollars.

4.6 Building Restrictions: Unless otherwise permitted by this Scheme, no person shall erect or use a building for a purpose specified in Column No. 1 of the Building Table following this clause unless it complies with the standards laid down in that Table, subject to—

- (a) No building shall be erected nearer than fifty (50) feet from the street alignment of the northern and southern alignments of Great Eastern Highway.
- (b) Where a lot in a Residential Zone has frontage to more than one street, the Council may permit a building to be erected nearer to the street alignment of the less important of the streets but not nearer than twenty-five (25) feet to such street alignment. The Council shall in each case determine which is or are the less important street or streets.
- (c) No person shall erect, or cause to permit to be erected, any building so that any portion of the building is erected closer to any road or street than the building alignment as above determined. Provided that this clause may be varied by the responsible authority in its discretion as follows:
 - (d) (i) Where both adjoining lots are built upon and one or more such buildings shall be nearer to the street or road than the building setback line determined above, the responsible authority may permit a building to be erected

closer to the line, but not nearer than the foremost portion of the rearmost building.

- (ii) The responsible authority may permit the erection of carports (i.e., structures consisting of a roof and supports only, but with no walls or wall sheeting of any kind).

4.7 Set Back Area, Adjacent to Street: No person shall in any of the following:—

- (a) Residential Zone.
- (b) Commercial Zone.
- (c) Light Industry Zone.
- (d) Rural Zone.

use land between the street alignment and the building line for any purpose except one or more of the following:

- (a) A means of access.
- (b) Lawns and gardens.
- (c) The daily parking of vehicles used by employees and customers.
- (d) Wayside stalls where permitted by Council.

4.8 No person shall between the street alignment and the setback distance—

- (a) place or display a vehicle or vehicles for sale;
- (b) place or permit to remain any vehicle which is being wrecked or repaired;
- (c) place or permit to remain any fuel or raw materials or wastes of manufacture or except as hereinafter permitted any products or by-products of manufacture.

4.9 Access for Loading and Unloading of Vehicles:

- (a) No person shall use a building for business or industry unless there is provided a paved access way for vehicles from a street to the rear of the building for the purpose of loading and unloading and of a nature mentioned in this clause.
- (b) The access way shall be so constructed that vehicles using it may return to a street in a forward gear.

4.10 Vehicle Parking: The parking spaces to be provided in accordance with the Building Table shall measure not less than ten (10) feet by eighteen (18) feet and shall be paved and serviced by all necessary access ways.

4.11 Public Car Park: An owner may, if the Council so agrees, contribute to the cost of acquisition and development by the Council of a public car park. The cost of each parking space in a public car park shall be ascertained by dividing the total cost or estimated cost of the acquisition and establishment of the public car park by the number of car parking spaces therein. The number of car parking spaces which an owner is required to provide pursuant to the Building Table shall, if the Council so agrees, be reduced by the number of car parking spaces in a public car park of which an owner pays the cost.

4.12. Parking of Commercial Vehicles in Residential Zones: No person shall on privately owned land within a Residential Zone—

- (a) park or allow to remain stationary for more than four hours consecutively—
 - (i) more than one commercial vehicle and if there is one such vehicle it must be housed in a domestic garage or domestic outbuilding;
 - (ii) any vehicle which due to size or load is not capable of being completely housed within a domestic

garage or domestic outbuilding having a maximum floor area of 500 square feet and in which no horizontal dimension is more than 25 feet;

(iii) a vehicle which together with the load thereon exceeds nine feet in height;

(b) repair, service or clean a commercial vehicle unless such work be carried out whilst the vehicle is housed in a domestic garage or domestic outbuilding.

4.13 Light Industry Zone Provisions: The following provisions shall apply in light industry zone:—

- (a) The owner of the land on which a building is erected shall provide on the land or on land adjacent to the land on which the building is erected, permanent parking spaces sufficient to accommodate one car space for each two persons likely to work in the building, or on the subject land.
- (b) In the case of an industry in which employees work on shift work, the said parking spaces shall be sufficient to accommodate one car space for every two persons likely to be employed in the two largest shifts. Car spaces shall be provided on the basis of 180 square feet per car.
- (c) The parking spaces shall be so located that the vehicles have easy access thereto and the owner of the land whereon provision is to be made for parking spaces in conformity with this requirement shall before any buildings are constructed or extended, lodge with the Council a plan on which it is delineated all parking spaces and access lanes to be provided in accordance with this requirement. The owner shall at all times clearly indicate on the ground the boundaries of all parking spaces and access lanes in conformity with the said plan.
- (d) The owner shall, when lodging the plan referred to hereto, lodge with the Council a certificate stating the total number of persons employed and the number likely to reside or work in the building for which the parking spaces are shown on the plan lodged with the Council and in the case of an industry in which employees are employed in shift work, the total number of persons likely to be employed in the two shifts in which the largest number of persons are employed.
- (e) No persons shall use a service road, access way or parking area situated on a parcel of land for any other purpose than a service road, access way or vehicle parking respectively.
- (f) No building or any other structure shall be erected closer than a distance of 50 feet from any part of a residential zone, except with the approval of Council. Trees shall be planted and maintained in this setback to provide a suitable screen.
- (g) No building shall exceed two storeys in height provided that this will not apply in the case of storage silos, water towers and similar uses.
- (h) Where any building is used or intended to be used for the purpose of classes 6, 7 and 8 occupancy, as defined in the Uniform Building By-laws there shall be provided accommodation in the form of loading docks for vehicles delivering goods to or removing goods from such a building, every loading dock shall be so located that no portion of any vehicle occupying or adjoining same shall project over the street alignment and where a site has an abuttal to more than one street, the re-

sponsible authority may require that access to loading docks shall be only from such street or streets as it shall so determine.

- (i) In cases where a site has two or more street frontages, no buildings shall be constructed closer than thirty (30) feet to the alignment of the main road frontage or closer than twenty (20) feet to the alignment of the lesser road frontage unless the frontages are the same in which case there shall be a setback of such distance from such frontage as may be nominated by the Council.
- (j) The whole of any wall or building facing any street shall be constructed in brick, concrete or masonry.
- (k) Notwithstanding the provision of the preceding paragraph, an owner builder or architect may apply to the responsible authority for permission to use materials other than those prescribed and the responsible authority after consideration of a report by the building surveyor may permit the use of such other materials where it is satisfied that such use will not defeat the objects of the preceding paragraph.
- (l) Each open yard shall be screened from public roads by a close fence or wall not less than six (6) feet in height unless with special permission of Council.
- (m) The ground floor area of all buildings on any site shall not exceed 60 percent of the area of the site.
- (n) No person shall stack or place any fuel, raw materials, products or by-products or waste of manufacture in an industrial zone nearer to the road or street than the building setback line.
- (o) No person shall use the land between the building setback line and the road or street for any purpose other than a means of access, for parking of vehicles, for loading or unloading vehicles, or for lawns and gardens.
- (p) Save with the permission of the responsible authority no advertising sign shall be erected in front of any building line whether prescribed herein or by the by-laws of the responsible authority. Any such sign shall be limited in size to 43 square feet on which shall be marked only the name and occupation of the occupier.
- (q) On the same site as an industrial building, a dwelling house may be erected which forms part of or adjoins the industrial building. Such house is to be occupied by a caretaker or an employee of the industry and set aside for the exclusive use of the occupants. It must be established that such a dwelling house is necessary for the proper operation of the industry but not more than one such residence shall be permitted on each industrial site.
- (r) No person shall occupy a residence in an industrial zone as outlined in (q) above if the industrial undertaking ceases to operate.
- (s) None of the provisions of this clause are to be taken to limit the use of land in the Industrial Zone for agricultural activity and the accessory uses set out in the Zoning Table.

4.14. Relaxation of Standards: Subject to the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws the Council may either generally or in any particular case relax the requirements of this part if the resolution to do so is passed by an absolute majority and confirm within six months by absolute majority of the Council at a subsequent meeting.

PART V.—MISCELLANEOUS.

5.1 Signs, Notices and Advertisements:

(a) A person shall not erect or maintain and neither the owner nor the occupier of the premises shall permit to remain thereon—

(i) a public sign or notice in or on land adjacent to a street or right of way;

(ii) an advertisement, advertising hoarding, illustrated sign or other advertising device,

except with the written consent of the Council or otherwise in accordance with the terms of such consent.

(b) Nothing in this clause relates to a sign that is—

(i) a sign indicating that the premises whereon it is affixed are for sale or for letting and bearing no other advertisement;

(ii) a plate not exceeding two square feet in area erected or affixed on the street alignment or between that alignment and the building setback distance to indicate the name and occupation or profession of the occupier of the premises used for such occupation or profession;

- (iii) of an area not exceeding four square feet in area and is affixed to a building or is erected or affixed behind the building setback distance, to indicate the name of the occupier and his trade or occupation there carried on;
- (iv) an election sign for a candidate or candidates in a Federal, State or Local Government election, provided that—
 - (a) such sign shall not be displayed at any time prior to 42 days before the polling date to which the sign relates,
 - (b) such sign shall be removed within 7 days following the polling date of the election to which the sign relates,
 - (c) such sign shall be limited to two square feet in area, unless otherwise approved by the Council,
 - (d) before any election notice is displayed prior approval of the Council in writing shall be obtained for permission to display election notices. Council, in deciding whether or not to grant permission, may require the payment of a bond of \$100 which it shall retain until all approved signs are removed in accordance with (b) above.
 - (e) Should signs not be removed in accordance with (b) above, Council may enter onto land remove such offending signs. Should such action be necessary, the relevant bond shall be forfeited.
- (v) A sign in the Light Industry Zone.

5.2 The Council may by its officers, employees or contractors enter upon any land and take down and remove any sign, notice, advertisement, hoarding or device erected or maintained without the approval of the Council or contrary to the terms of the approval if the owner has failed to do so within twenty eight (28) days of a request by Council.

5.3 Sewerage Disposal: The Council may refuse to issue a building permit for any particular type of development if in the opinion of Council insufficient provision is or can be made for the disposal of sewerage.

5.4 Wayside Stalls: No person shall erect or maintain a wayside stall on public land, nor expose for sale at it any commodity, that has not been grown or produced on the land on which the wayside stall is situated.

5.5 Buildings to be Moved: Any building or structure which has been wholly or partially erected in the Shire shall not be moved and/or placed upon any premises in the Shire until a permit for such removal shall have been obtained from the Building Surveyor. When moved onto new premises such buildings shall conform to all the provisions of this ordinance. No building or structure shall be moved into the Shire from outside the Shire until a permit for such moving has been obtained from the Building Surveyor. Before a permit may be issued for moving a building or structure, the Building Surveyor shall inspect same and shall determine if it is in a safe condition to be moved, whether it may be reconditioned to comply with the Building Code and other Shire requirements for the use and occupancy for which it is to be used. Providing that these conditions can be complied with, a permit shall be issued for the moving of the said building or structure.

5.6 Outbuilding: The Council will permit the construction of outbuildings up to 600 square feet.

PART VI.—PRESERVATION AND CONSERVATION OF OBJECTS OF NATURAL BEAUTY AND HISTORICAL BUILDINGS AND OBJECTS OF HISTORIC OR SCIENTIFIC INTEREST

6.1 (a) The Council may resolve that it will consider whether an object of natural beauty specified in the resolution mentioned in sub-clause (1) or (2) of this clause.

(b) The Council may resolve that it will consider whether an historical building or an object of historical or scientific interest should be preserved.

6.2 If the Council shall pass one of the resolutions mentioned in the subclause immediately preceding (hereinafter called "the preliminary resolution") it shall forthwith give notice of the resolution to—

- (a) The owner of the land on which the object of natural beauty or the historical building or the object of historical or scientific interest is situated.
- (b) The occupier of such land if he is not the owner.
- (c) All other persons whose names appear on the certificate of Title to the said land as having an interest therein.
- (d) The National Trust of Australia (W.A.).
- (e) The Royal Western Australian Historical Society (Inc.).
- (f) The Western Australian Tourist Development Authority.
- (g) Such other persons who in the opinion of the Council could give to it information which would assist the Council in arriving at a decision on the proposal.

6.3 The said notice shall inform the person to whom it is directed that the matter will be reconsidered by the Council after the expiration of two calendar months from the date of the passing of the said resolution and that any recommendations or objection made in writing to the Council by such person before that time will be considered. The notice shall also contain a copy of this Part of the Scheme.

6.4 The Council shall cause a copy of the preliminary resolution to be published in a newspaper circulating throughout the State of Western Australia and in a newspaper published in the Council's District if such exists.

6.5 After the expiration of two calendar months but not later than four calendar months from the passing of the preliminary resolution the matter shall be reconsidered by the Council.

6.6 The Council shall consider all written recommendations and objections submitted to it and may resolve that the object of natural beauty or the historical building or object of historical or scientific interest should be conserved or preserved as the case may be. If the Council shall pass the said resolution (hereinafter called "the preservation resolution") it shall give written notice thereof to all persons mentioned in Clause 6.2 hereof.

6.7 If the Council shall not within a period of six months from the passing of the preliminary resolution pass the preservation resolution the Council shall be deemed to have abandoned the proposal contained in the preliminary resolution and shall not pass a preservation resolution unless and until the procedure mentioned in this Part of the Scheme shall have again been followed.

6.8 The Council may purchase or subject to the Act resume the parcel of land on which the object of natural beauty or the historical building or object of historical or scientific interest mentioned in the preservation resolution passed by the Council is situated or so much thereof as is in the opinion of the Council necessary for the preservation of the said object or building.

6.9 The Council may—

- (a) enter into agreement with the owners or occupiers of land on which an object of natural beauty or historic building or object of historical or scientific interest is

situated for the preservation or conservation of such building or object whether a preservation resolution has been passed or not;

- (b) enter into agreements with any of the organisations named in paragraphs (d) or (f) of Clause 6.2 hereof or with any other person for the preservation or conservation of any building or object mentioned in a preservation resolution passed by the Council or if the owner thereof so agrees notwithstanding that no preservation resolution has been passed;
- (c) enter into agreements relating to the determination and settling of compensation.

6.10 Any person who is injuriously affected by the passing of a preservation resolution may within six months from the passing of the said resolution claim compensation from the Council.

6.11 If the parties cannot agree upon the amount of compensation payable it shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration Act, 1895.

6.12 No person shall without the written consent of the Council—

- (a) within six months from the passing of a preliminary resolution, or
- (b) after the passing of a preservation resolution, make any alteration or addition to, damage, deface, demolish or remove any object of natural beauty historic building or object of historical or scientific interest referred to in any such resolution.

PART VII.—DEVELOPMENT.

7.1 Council's Approval Necessary: In addition to a Building License, Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development except a private dwelling house.

7.2 Application for Approval: Applications to the Council for its approval to commence development shall be made on the form shown in Appendix "A".

7.3 Council's Approval: The Council may grant approval with or without conditions or may refuse to grant its approval to the application to commence development.

7.4 If the Council shall have granted its approval to commence development subject to conditions and any of the conditions shall not be fulfilled or complied with the Council may revoke its approval.

7.5 The Council may limit the time for which its approval to commence development remains valid.

7.6 If the Council shall not within sixty (60) days of the receipt by it of an application to commence development have conveyed its decision to the applicant, the application shall be deemed to have been refused.

7.7 Appeals: Any owner aggrieved by a decision of Council exercising a discretionary power conferred on it by virtue of this Scheme may appeal to the Minister or the Town Planning Court in accordance with Part V of the Act.

7.8 If the Minister or the Appeals Court shall allow the appeal subject to conditions or impose any conditions such conditions shall have effect and be binding in like manner as if they were imposed by Council.

PART VIII.—NON-CONFORMING USES.

8.1 Non-Conforming Uses Permitted: If at the gazettal date any land, building or structure is being lawfully used for a purpose not permitted by the foregoing provisions of the Scheme (hereinafter called a "non-conforming use") or if any land is built on or any building or structure is built in a manner not permitted by the Scheme, such land, building or structure may continue to be used for that purpose or in that manner but not such land use shall be altered except to conform with the Scheme and no such building or structure shall be added to or altered or any additional building erected unless approval to do is granted by the Council.

8.2 No provision of this Scheme shall prevent the carrying out of any development on land for which twelve (12) months immediately prior to the gazettal date a permit or permits required under the Act and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and are current.

8.3 Discontinuance or Change of Non-Conforming Use: If at the gazettal date any land building or structure is being used for a non-conforming use or any land is built on in a manner not permitted by this Scheme, and such non-conforming use shall after such date be discontinued or changed or the buildings removed no person shall thereafter use the land or any building or structure thereon or in which the non-conforming use was carried on for any purpose or in a manner not permitted by this Scheme unless approval to do so is granted by the Council.

8.4 Destruction of Buildings: If any building or structure is at the gazettal date being used for a non-conforming use and is subsequently destroyed or damaged to an extent of more than seventy-five percent of its value no such land use shall be altered except to conform with the Scheme and the buildings shall not be repaired or rebuilt, altered or added to for the purpose of being used for a non-conforming use or in a manner or position not permitted by the Scheme unless approval to do so is granted by the Council.

8.5 Council's Approval: The Council may grant its approval to the change of the use of any land from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use if the proposed use is in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use and in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

8.6 Conditions of Approval: When the Council grants its approval under any of the foregoing clauses of this part it may grant such approval upon such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.

8.7 Acquisition and Agreements to Discontinue Use: The Council may for the purpose of discontinuing any particular non-conforming use acquire the lot and buildings (if any) on or in which the use is or is permitted to be carried on or make agreements relating to the payment of compensation or moneys to persons willing to discontinue a non-conforming use.

8.8 Register of Non-Conforming Uses: Any person carrying out a non-conforming use may within six calendar months of the gazettal date or within such extended time as the Council may allow to give to the Council in writing full information of the nature and extent of the non-conforming use.

PART IX.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

9.1 Powers of Council: The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall in addition to all other powers vested in it have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land or building within the Scheme area.
- (b) To enter into agreements and arrangements with any of the owners of land within the Scheme area.
- (c) To deal with or dispose of or lease any land for the time being vested in it and to acquire land or buildings within the Scheme area, upon such terms and conditions as it thinks fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell or lease land on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking and other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and building be used for a specified purpose.

9.2 Twenty-eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to Section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said Section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

9.3 The Council may at the time exercise the powers conferred by Section 13 of the Act.

9.4 Prohibition:

- a) No person shall use any land or any building or structure thereon otherwise than in accordance with or contrary to the provisions of this Scheme.
- (b) If pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme approval shall have been granted by the Council upon conditions no person shall commit a breach of any of those conditions.

9.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

9.6 Compensation: Unless otherwise provided in the Scheme claims for compensation by reason of this Scheme shall be made not later than six months after the gazettal date.

SCHEME No. 5—WHOLE SHIRE.

THE Gnowangerup Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) Preserving the amenity of the Shire of Gnowangerup.
- (b) Controlling land development.
- (c) Preventing ribbon development.
- (d) Controlling the placing of advertising signs and billboards.
- (e) Reducing the effects of mining on the environment.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Gnowangerup Town Planning Scheme No. 5—Whole Shire hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the Shire of Gnowangerup excluding those areas covered by existing Town Planning Schemes.

1.3 The Council may prepare guiding plans in respect of any urban zone which it shall use to assist it in the use of its discretionary powers under the Scheme.

1.4 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Gnowangerup, hereinafter called "the Council".

1.5 Arrangement of the Scheme:

The Scheme is divided into the following parts—

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Reserves.
- Part III.—Zones.
- Part IV.—Non Conforming Uses.
- Part V.—General Provisions.
- Part VI.—Administration.

The Scheme documents comprise this text and the Scheme Map (sheets 1 and 2).

1.6 Interpretation:

- (a) Subject to the provisions of subclause (b) of this clause, in this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless specifically stated herein.
- (b) In this Scheme, unless the context requires otherwise, "major road" means a road designated as such on the Scheme Map; "extractive industry" means the taking of sand, gravel, clay, soil, rock, stone, ore, minerals or similar substance from the land, and also the processing of those materials; "sign" means any device erected for the purpose of advertising or soliciting a service or a commodity or publicising an event or place or object; "roadhouse" means a service station with or without public eating facilities.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

2.1 This Scheme shall not apply to Crown Reserves or unalienated Crown Land unless these are transferred to freehold or leasehold when such land shall be deemed as long as it is so held to be in the Rural Zone and the provisions of the Scheme relating to land in that Zone shall apply.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme Area is divided into the following zones:

Urban and Rural.

3.2 (a) Table No. 1 appended to clause 3.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of Zones at the top of that Table.

(b) Where a use is not specifically stated in the list of Use Classes it shall be included in the most appropriate Use Class or deemed not to be permitted in any zone at the discretion of Council.

3.3 The symbols used in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meaning.

"P"—a use that is permitted.

"AA"—a use that is permitted only if permission is granted by Council.

"IP"—a use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by Council.

"X"—a use that is not permitted.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USES.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent:

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was lawfully used at the time of coming into force of the Scheme or

- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part III a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may not be extended without the written consent of Council.

4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the area than the existing use, or is in the opinion of Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Uses:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property or by payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or both owner and occupier of the property and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 Signs, Hoardings, Billboards, etc.:

5.1.1 No person shall erect any sign within 10 chains of the centre line of a major road without the prior written approval of the Council.

5.1.2 The Council shall not approve the erection of any sign for a service or commodity which is not offered, or produced or sold on the lot on which the sign is to be erected, except as provided in the sections 5.1.5 and 5.3.2 of this Part.

5.1.3 The Council shall not approve the erection of any sign which is to be affixed to a tree or a fence-post.

5.1.4 In exercising its discretionary power under this section, Council shall have regard to:

- (i) the design and colour of the sign;
- (ii) a maximum area of 12 sq. ft.;
- (iii) the location of the sign and its effect on the scenic attraction of the area; and
- (iv) the distractive effect that the sign may have on motorists.

5.1.5 Temporary signs: Council may approve the erection of a sign for a specific period and the provisions of this section shall apply to such signs.

5.1.6 Where a person has been given permission to erect a sign, he shall remove it after the service or commodity offered or solicited is no longer offered or solicited.

5.1.7 Council may specify an area on the approaches to an urban zone where approved signs may be erected.

5.1.8 Clause 5.1.1 of this Part shall not apply to road signs and other signs erected by public authorities.

5.1.9 The Council may order the removal of a sign which has been erected contrary to the provisions of this Part by sending a registered letter to that effect to the owner of the land on which the sign is erected and the sign shall be removed within 60 days of the issue of that letter.

5.1.10 Where a person fails to comply with the provisions of this Part, the Council may remove the sign and recover from the person in default such costs as the Council has incurred in so doing.

5.2 Mining, Quarrying and Extractive Industries:

5.2.1 No person shall mine or excavate or extract, or quarry, sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone, ore, minerals or similar substance or process or treat such substances without the written approval of the Council.

5.2.2 Council may approve an application under 5.2.1 or refuse it or approve it subject to conditions.

5.2.3 Applications for approval under 5.2.1 of this Part shall be in writing and shall include the following information:

- (i) the proposed method of mining or nature of extractive process;
- (ii) the contours of the land, the probable depth and extent of the proposed excavation and the location of these in relation to existing developments;
- (iii) the estimated depth and extent of the overburden to be removed;
- (iv) the ancilliary works proposed;
- (v) the estimated use of existing roads and other services;
- (vi) the estimated workforce of the project;
- (vii) the applicants intentions for the rehabilitation and restoration of the land together with an estimate of the costs of such works and appropriate plans;
- (viii) the nature and quantities of noxious byproducts;
- (ix) the arrangements made with the owner of the land or the Crown for rehabilitation.

5.2.4 In exercising its discretion under 5.2.2 of this Part, the Council shall have regard to:

- (i) the current use of the land, if any;
- (ii) the proposed use of the land subsequent to mining;
- (iii) the cost of restoration relative to the overall economics of the project;
- (iv) the practical aspects of restoring the land subsequent to mining;
- (v) the need to ensure that land made unsightly and/or derelict by mining operations is restored as near to its original state as possible or to a state or use acceptable to Council having regard to the amenity of the area as a whole.

5.2.5 In applying conditions of approval under section 5.2.2 the Council shall have regard to the following:

- (i) the control of dust, grit, smoke and other pollutants;
- (ii) the protection of, watercourses, drainage lines and roads;
- (iii) the prevention of toxic or discolouring materials escaping into watercourses and underground water;
- (iv) contribution to road maintenance where roads are extra-ordinarily damaged, by heavy traffic associated with the workings;
- (v) the safety of workings prior to restoration;
- (vi) the stock-piling of overburden for eventual replacement;
- (vii) landscaping and draining subsequent to mining;
- (viii) re-forestation;
- (ix) bonds or sureties or agreements and penalties thereto.

5.2.6 Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 5.2.5, where the applicant has made arrangements with the owner of the land or the Crown covering the matters contained in that clause and the Council is satisfied with such arrangement it shall not impose conditions of development.

5.3 Roadhouses on Major Roads:

5.3.1 In the Rural Zone the Council shall not permit a roadhouse within 15 miles of an existing roadhouse on the same side of a major road or within 15 miles of the boundary of an urban zone.

5.3.2 An approved sign advertising the presence of a roadhouse may be erected approximately one mile on either side of the roadhouse.

PART VI.—ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.2 Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council in the exercise of its discretionary powers may appeal to the Hon. Minister for Town Planning within 30 days of the Council's decision.

6.3 The procedure for the lodgement and determination of appeals by persons aggrieved by a decision of the Council exercising its discretionary power pursuant to the provisions of this Scheme shall be in accordance with Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act (as amended) and the Regulations made under that Act.

6.4 Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given therein, is liable to such penalties as are prescribed in the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended).



- (b) Coogee: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area measuring 75 metres along the foreshore and extending 370 metres to seaward and situated immediately south of the Anchorage Abattoir, Coogee.
- (c) Jervoise Bay: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 75 metres south of the "Alacrity" wreck, thence extending 310 metres in a westerly direction, thence 370 metres in a southerly direction, thence 245 metres in an easterly direction, thence 270 metres in a northerly direction, thence in an easterly direction to the shore. Provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the shoreline except at the take-off area and which extends 100 metres along the foreshore from the point of commencement.
- (d) Kwinana: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore at the Rockingham Main Light and extending 310 metres to seaward, thence 370 metres in a northerly direction, thence 245 metres in an easterly direction, thence 270 metres in a southerly direction, thence easterly to the shore. Provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the shoreline except at the take-off area and which extends 100 metres along the foreshore north of the Rockingham Main Light.
- (e) Palm Beach: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 75 metres west of the Palm Beach Boat Launching Ramp (west) thence in a northerly direction for 750 metres, thence in a westerly direction for 840 metres, thence in a southeasterly direction for 950 metres to a point on the foreshore 210 metres west of the Boat Launching Ramp.

(2) Limits the speed of motor boats to that of four knots within the following area:—

Rottnest Island—Thomson Bay: All the waters of Thomson Bay, contained within an area commencing from Bathurst Point, thence in a 120 degree direction for 1400 metres towards Phillip Rock, thence in a 220 degree direction to the Army Jetty, with the exception of the defined swimming area immediately north of the Rottnest Passenger Wharf.

(3) Limits the speed of motor boats to that of eight knots within the following areas:—

- (a) Within the Fremantle Harbour.
 (b) Within that part of the Fremantle Outer Harbour eastward of an imaginary line extending from the North Mole Lighthouse to a point where the northern boundary of the Outer Harbour meets the shore of the mainland.
 (c) Within one-half mile radius of the oil refinery jetties at Kwinana.

(d) Within one-half mile radius of the Rockingham Jetty, situated at the foot of Railway Terrace, Rockingham.

(4) Defines and sets aside the following areas of navigable waters for the purpose of swimming only and orders that boating shall be prohibited therein:—

- (a) Rottnest Island: All the waters of Thomson Bay contained between the Beard Cottage Jetty and the Main Wharf and extending for a distance of 60 metres eastwards from the sea wall.
 (b) Rottnest Island: All the waters contained within the area known as "The Basin". No boat shall approach within 90 metres of the foreshore within this area.
 (c) Rottnest Island: All the waters contained within the area known as Little Parakeet Bay. No boat shall approach within 60 metres of the foreshore within this area.
