### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1972, that the Governor may, by proclamation, constitute and define the boundaries of any water reserve or catchment area for the purposes of that Act, and may vest such reserve or catchment area in the Metropolitan Water Supply,

Sewerage, and Drainage Board: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, do hereby constitute a water reserve to be known at the Gnangara Water Reserve and define the boundaries of that water reserve to be such as are set out in the schedule to this Proclamation and further vest the said water reserve in the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Board.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

#### ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1971, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

3. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation A.02 of Part A and substituting the following regulation :—

**A.02.** PRESERVATIVES.  
**A.02.001.**

"Preservative" means any substance which is capable of inhibiting, retarding, masking or arresting the process of fermentation, putrefaction, acidification or any other decomposition in or on any food and includes for the purposes of these regulations, boric acid, borax, benzoic acid, sulphites, metabisulphites, formaldehyde, nisin, sorbic and propionic acids or their salts and any peroxide, but does not include prescribed antioxidants, salt, saltpetre, (sodium or potassium nitrate), nitrites, sugars, acetic acid or its sodium salt, vinegar, alcohol or potable spirits, glycerine, herbs, hop extracts, spices or essential oils used for flavouring purposes or any substance added to food by the process of curing known as smoking.

**A.02.002.**

The addition of a preservative to any article of food, except as specifically permitted in these regulations is prohibited.

**A.02.003.**

Where more than one preservative is added to any article of food in accordance with these regulations, the sum of the fractions obtained on dividing the quantity of each preservative used by the maximum quantity of such preservative permitted to be present, if used alone, shall not exceed unity.

**A.02.004.**

Unless otherwise permitted by these regulations, articles of food prepared in part from food in which preservatives are permitted shall not contain a greater amount of preservatives than results from the addition of the food or foods containing preservatives in permitted amounts.

**A.02.005.**

Labelling.

(a) There shall be written in the label on or attached to every package containing any food mixed with preservative in letters of not less than 8 points measurement the words :—

"PRESERVATIVE ADDED"

(b) The declaration of the presence of added preservative is not required in the case of dried fruits, bread, confectionery, pastry, ice cream, flavoured ices and ice blocks prepared in part from food in which a preservative is specifically permitted, or beverages sold in open containers for immediate consumption.

(c) There shall be written in the label on or attached to every package containing any substance intended for use as a food preservative, a statement showing the chemical name of the substance for which preservative action is claimed and the proportion present in the following form :—

"This package contains (chemical name of substance) .....% by weight".

**A.02.006.**

In any regulation where a preservative is permitted to be added to any food which may naturally contain such preservative, the total amount of preservative contained in the prepared food shall not exceed the proportion permitted by that regulation.

(b) Prescribed modifying agents may be added to foods where permitted in these regulations and to the foods listed in subregulation A.13.005 of regulation A.13 of these regulations, but where a specific regulation limits the maximum proportion of particular prescribed modifying agents, such modifying agents shall not exceed that maximum proportion.

**A.11.002.**

**Prohibition.**

A person shall not add any modifying agent to food, or sell, offer or expose for sale, or have in his possession for sale any food containing added modifying agents unless permitted by these regulations.

5. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation A.11 the following regulation :—

**A.12. FOODS NOT ELSEWHERE STANDARDISED.**

**A.12.001.**

**Descriptions.**

(a) A food not elsewhere standardised is a food for which a standard has not been prescribed elsewhere in these regulations and which is prepared, manufactured or processed wholly or in part from two or more wholesome foods either in their natural state or as standardised by these regulations.

(b) Foods not elsewhere standardised may contain flavouring, prescribed modifying agents as listed in regulation A.11 and colours as permitted in regulation A.04 of these regulations.

**A.12.002.**

**Prohibitions.**

A food not elsewhere standardised shall not have added to it any food additives unless specifically permitted by these regulations.

**A.12.003. Labelling of Foods not Elsewhere Standardised.**

(a) A complete list of ingredients shall be declared in the label, in descending order of proportion, in letters of not less than 8 points measurement, except in the case of dehydrated foods that are intended to be reconstituted by the addition of water, in which case the ingredients may be listed in order of proportion in the reconstituted product under the heading of a statement such as "ingredients when reconstituted".

(b) Where an ingredient of a food has more than one component, the names of the components shall be included in the list of ingredients, except where such an ingredient is a food for which a standard has been prescribed elsewhere in these regulations and that standard does not require a complete list of ingredients.

(c) The common name shall be used for ingredients in the list of ingredients except that :—

(i) ingredients falling into the following classes may be referred to by their respective class titles :—

animal fats	herbs
animal oils	spices
vegetable fats	starches (except modified starches)
vegetable oils ;	

(ii) substances falling into the following classes and appearing under regulations A.02, A.03, A.04, A.11 and A.13 of these regulations may be referred to by the following class titles :—

anti-caking agents	preservatives
anti-oxidants	stabilisers
bleaching agents	thickening agents (including modified starches)
colours	vegetable gums
emulsifiers	food acids
flavours	mineral salts
maturing agents	humectants

(d) Added water shall be declared in the list of ingredients except when the water is a component of an ingredient such as brine, syrup or broth used in a compound food.

(e) Statements required to appear in the label by virtue of this regulation shall be clear, prominent and readily legible by the consumer under normal conditions of purchase and use. Such information shall not be obscured by designs or by other written, printed or graphic matter and shall be in a contrasting colour to that of the background. The letters stating the name of the food shall be in a size reasonably related to the most prominent printed matter on the label. Where the container is covered by a wrapper, the wrapper shall carry the necessary information, or the label on the container shall be readily legible through the outer wrapper and not obscured by it. The name and net content of the food shall appear on that portion of the label normally intended to be presented to the consumer at the time of sale.

(f) Food not elsewhere standardised shall not be described or presented in such a manner or by a name or pictorial or other device which is suggestive of another article of food.

(g) Statements in any advertisement or label for any food not elsewhere standardised shall not contain any comparison, as to the ingredients therein, or the nutritional value thereof, with any other food.

(h) A food not elsewhere standardised shall not be advertised, labelled, described or sold other than in accordance with the requirements of this regulation.

6. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation A.12 the following regulation :—

**A.13. FOOD ADDITIVES.****A.13.001. Food Additives Prohibition.**

No person shall add any colouring, flavouring, preservative, anti-oxidant, emulsifier, stabiliser or modifying agent as prescribed in these regulations or any other additive to food, or sell food containing any such substance unless the addition or presence of such substance is specifically permitted by these regulations.

Nothing in this regulation shall preclude the addition of wholesome food in its natural state or as standardised by these regulations to produce a food not specifically standardised by these regulations.

**A.13.002. In this regulation :—**

- (a) Codex means the Food Chemicals Codex, latest edition, including the latest supplements. (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, Washington D.C.) ;
- (b) B.P. means the latest edition of the British Pharmacopoeia and addendum ;
- (c) B.P.C. means the latest edition of the British Pharmaceutical Codex, including amendments thereof ;
- (d) B.S. means Standards of the British Standards Institution.

**A.13.003.**

Food additives shall be manufactured, distributed and sold in accordance with good commercial practice for use in foods. Food additives which are included in either the Codex, the B.P., the B.P.C., or the B.S., shall conform with the limits for lead, arsenic and other metals prescribed for them in the Codex, B.P., B.P.C. or B.S. They shall contain no other toxic substances or toxic intermediates.

Wherever a food additive is included in the Codex and the B.P., or the B.P.C., or the B.S., the standard of the Codex shall prevail.

Wherever a food additive is included in the B.P. and the B.P.C. or the B.S., but not in the Codex, the standard of the B.P. shall prevail.

Wherever a food additive is included in the B.P.C. and the B.S. but not in the Codex or B.P., the standard of the B.P.C. shall prevail.

Wherever a food additive exists in a form varying from that listed in the Codex, or the B.P., or the B.P.C., or the B.S., by virtue of dilution with other substances the limits for lead, arsenic and other metals in the food additive (calculated to an equivalent active matter content compared with that listed in the Codex, or the B.P., or the B.P.C., or the B.S.) shall not exceed those specified for the form of the product listed in the Codex, or the B.P., or the B.P.C., or the B.S.

**A.13.004.**

Wherever a food additive is not included in either the Codex, the B.P., the B.P.C. or the B.S., it shall conform to the following requirements, that is to say it shall contain :—

- (a) not more than 10 parts of lead calculated as the metal per million parts of dry active additive ;
- (b) not more than 1.5 parts of arsenic calculated as  $As_2O_3$ , per million parts of dry active additive ;
- (c) not more than 100 parts of heavy metals other than lead, calculated as the respective metals, per million parts of dry active additive ;
- (d) no other toxic substances or toxic intermediates.

**A.13.005.**

A food listed in this subregulation may contain the groups of prescribed modifying agents set out opposite the name of that food.

(b) No mention shall be made of the presence of calcium sucrose phosphates unless the food contains calcium sucrose phosphates within the corresponding range of percentages of the total food as shown.

7. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation D.01 of Part D and substituting the following regulation :—

**D.01.****DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL.****D.01.001.****Fish.**

Fish is any wholesome fish or the wholesome part of any fish ordinarily used for human consumption and includes crustaceans and molluscs.

**D.01.002.****Fresh or Chilled Fish.**

Fresh or chilled fish is fish that has been maintained in a wholesome condition at a temperature that has not been reduced below 0°Celsius.

**D.01.003.****Frozen Fish.**

(a) Frozen fish is fish that has been maintained in a wholesome condition at a temperature below 0°Celsius.

(b) Frozen fish fillets may contain alkali metal polyphosphates in amount not exceeding 0.3 per centum (calculated as  $P_2O_5$ ).

(c) Frozen fish and frozen prawns may contain ascorbic acid or erythorbic acid (iso-ascorbic acid) or their sodium salts as an antioxidant in an amount not exceeding 400 parts per million calculated as ascorbic acid or erythorbic acid. No reference shall be made on the label or in any advertisement to the presence of such addition.

**D.01.004.****Smoked Fish.**

Smoked fish is fish that has been maintained in a wholesome condition and treated with salt and subjected to the action of wood smoke. It may be coloured with annatto and may contain formaldehyde incidentally absorbed in the processing in proportion not exceeding 50 parts per million.

**D.01.005.****Salted Fish.**

Salted fish is fish that has been maintained in a wholesome condition and treated with salt. Salted fish may be dried and coloured with annatto.

**D.01.006.****Labelling.**

All fish, smoked fish and fish products if sold under a name descriptive of kind, composition or origin, shall correspond thereto, but where a fish product is made from two or more kinds of fish and the kinds of fish are named on the label, the kind first named shall be in greater proportion than any other.

**D.01.007.****Fish Marinades or Fish Semipreserves.**

(a) Fish marinades or fish semipreserves are fish products, not processed by heat to ensure preservation, in which the fish has been marinated with acetic acid or vinegar, or both, with or without salt, spices or other wholesome foodstuffs.

(b) Fish marinades and fish semipreserves may contain benzoic or sorbic acid or their sodium or potassium salts, calculated as benzoic or sorbic acid in amount not exceeding 1000 parts per million.

**D.01.008.****Labelling.**

Fish marinades when sold in a package, shall bear a label on which the word "MARINATED" or "MARINADE" shall precede or follow the name of the product in letters of the same size. There shall also appear in the label the words "STORE AT A TEMPERATURE OF BETWEEN 0°C and 5°C" or words of similar meaning in letters of not less than 12 points measurement, and no other words shall appear in the same line.

substituted.

8. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation D.04 of Part D and substituting the following regulation :—

**D.04.****OYSTERS AND OTHER SHELL-FISH.****D.04.001.**

No person shall pack or sell oysters or other shell-fish which have been taken from an area prohibited under the provisions of any Act of the Commonwealth or of the State, or any regulations under such Act.

**D.04.002.****Labelling.**

(a) A person shall not sell oysters or other shell-fish in a container unless there is attached to that container a label in which is written in letters of not less than 10 points measurement, the following particulars :—

- (i) the name and address of the vendor ;
- (ii) the trade description of the contents ;
- (iii) the date of packing or bottling ;
- (iv) particulars of the source of supply ; and
- (v) from whom and where the contents were obtained.

(b) This subregulation does not apply in respect of oysters sold in the shell, or sold for a meal, or processed and packed in hermetically sealed containers or frozen in bulk as raw material for further processing.

9. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation D.05 the following regulation :—

**D.06. FISH BALLS, FISH RISsoles OR FISH CAKES.**

**D.06.001.**

(a) Fish balls, fish rissoles or fish cakes are fish mixed with cereal with or without condiments or vegetables, or both, and the mixture formed into balls or pats.

(b) Each ball or pat shall not contain less than 51 parts per centum of fish, calculated as raw fish.

**D.06.002.**

**Labelling.**

The label on any package or container containing fish balls, fish rissoles or fish cakes shall have declared thereon the kind or kinds of fish contained in the package or container.

Reg. K.04  
substituted.

10. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation K.04 of Part K and substituting the following regulation :—

**K.04. CHOCOLATE.**

**K.04.001.**

Chocolate, chocolate paste, drinking chocolate, confectioners' chocolate, chocolate coatings and chocolate powder are each cocoa paste or soluble cocoa mixed with sugar, with or without addition or subtraction of cocoa fat and with or without spices or flavourings. Each shall contain not less than fifteen parts per centum of water-free and fat-free cocoa paste, and the water-free and fat-free cocoa content shall conform with the general standard contained in paragraph (b) of subregulation K.03.003 of these regulations.

**K.04.002.**

**Milk Chocolate.**

(a) Milk chocolate is cocoa paste or soluble cocoa mixed with sugar, milk solids and cocoa fat with or without spices or flavourings. It shall contain not less than four and five-tenths parts per centum of milk fat, not less than ten and five-tenths parts per centum of non-fat milk solids and not less than three parts per centum of water-free, fat-free cocoa paste.

(b) When milk chocolate is in the form of Easter eggs, seasonal novelties and other hollow goods, the milk fat may be replaced, either wholly or in part by cocoa fat, if the proportion of milk solids is not less than fifteen parts per centum.

(c) The words, "rich", "fullcream", or "dairy", shall not appear on the label attached to the package containing any milk chocolate unless it complies with the standard prescribed in paragraph (a) of this subregulation.

**K.04.003.**

**Cocoa and Milk and Chocolate and Milk.**

(a) Cocoa and Milk and Chocolate and Milk shall each be prepared from milk or condensed milk, sugar and cocoa, and shall contain not less than eight parts per centum of water-free and fat-free cocoa paste.

(b) Cocoa and Milk and Chocolate and Milk may contain :—

- (i) sodium alginate in an amount not exceeding seven-tenths of one per centum ;
- (ii) one or more of the modifying agents listed in Group 4 (Emulsifiers) of subregulation A.11.001 (a) of these regulations in an amount not exceeding one-half of one per centum ;
- (iii) soluble inorganic phosphate in an amount not exceeding three-tenths of one per centum calculated as  $P_2O_5$ .

**K.04.004.**

**Compound Chocolate.**

Compound chocolate is chocolate as specified in subregulation K.04.001 of this regulation, with the addition of other wholesome foodstuffs including edible fats. It shall contain not less than three parts per centum of water-free and fat-free cocoa paste.

**K.04.005.**

**Labelling.**

There shall be on or attached to every package containing compounded chocolate a label in which shall be written the words, "COMPOUNDED CHOCOLATE" in letters of not less than twelve points measurement, and in a prominent position the name or names of the ingredients added to the chocolate, in letters of not less than eight points measurement.

**K.04.006.**

A person shall not add :—

- (a) any foreign fat, except where specifically permitted ;
- (b) cocoa husks ; or
- (c) paraffin,

to any product of cocoa beans.

**K.04.007.**

**Permitted Addition.**

The addition of the following substances to chocolate is permitted :—

- (a) flavouring substances ;
- (b) lecithin ;
- (c) ammonium salt of phosphatidic acid ;
- (d) purified talc powder B.P.C. in an amount not exceeding two-tenths of one per centum.

**K.04.008.**

**Determination of Crude Fibre in Chocolate.**

The method for the determination of crude fibre in chocolate shall be described in the "Official Methods of Analysis of the Association of Official Agricultural Chemists", 9th Edition 1960, 12.014 except that :—

- (a) two grams of fat-free material shall be used ; and
- (b) any silicone antifoaming agent may be used.

substituted.

11. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation L.01 of Part L and substituting the following regulation :—

**L.01. SPICES, MIXED SPICES AND CONDIMENTS.**

**L.01.001. Spices.**

Spices are the sound, aromatic, vegetable substances commonly used as condiments, in their natural condition, without any reduction or extraction of their natural oils.

**L.01.002. Mixed Spice.**

Mixed spice is a mixture of two or more spices ground and mixed. It shall contain no added substance.

**L.01.003. Cinnamon.**

Cinnamon is the dried inner bark of *Cinnamomum zeylanicum*. It shall contain no foreign substance.

**L.01.004. Powdered Cinnamon.**

Powdered cinnamon :—

- (a) shall not contain any cassia or other foreign vegetable substance ;
- (b) shall not yield more than eight parts per centum of total ash ; and
- (c) shall not contain more than two parts per centum of ash insoluble in hydrochloric acid.

**L.01.005. Cassia and Cassia Buds.**

Cassia and Cassia Buds are respectively the dried bark and the dried immature fruit of *Cinnamomum cassia* and shall contain no foreign substance.

**L.01.006. Cloves.**

- (a) Cloves are the dried flower-buds of *Eugenia carophyllata*.
- (b) Cloves shall not contain :—
  - (i) any exhausted or partly exhausted cloves ;
  - (ii) any foreign vegetable or mineral substance ; or
  - (iii) more than five parts per centum by weight of clove stems.

**L.01.007. Ginger.**

- (a) Ginger is the washed and dried, or the decorticated and dried rhizome of *Zingiber officinale*.
- (b) Ginger shall not contain :—
  - (i) any exhausted or partly exhausted ginger ;
  - (ii) any foreign vegetable or mineral substance ;
  - (iii) more than seven parts per centum of total ash, of which not less than two parts shall be soluble in cold water ;
  - (iv) more than one part per centum of lime calculated as CaO ; or
  - (v) less than twelve parts per centum of cold water extract.

**L.01.008. Limed Ginger or Bleached Ginger**

Limed ginger or bleached ginger is whole ginger coated with calcium carbonate. It shall not contain more than ten parts per centum of ash and not more than four parts per centum of calcium carbonate. The material after the removal of the calcium carbonate shall conform in other respects to the standard for ginger as specified in subregulation L.01.007 of this regulation.

**L.01.009. Ground Ginger.**

- (a) Ground ginger shall be prepared from either ginger or limed ginger.
- (b) Ground ginger shall conform to the standard for limed ginger specified in subregulation L.01.008 of this regulation.

**L.01.010. Mace and Nutmeg.**

- (a) Mace is the dried arillus of *Myristica fragrans*. It shall not contain the arillus of any other variety of *Myristica*, including *M. malabarca* or *fatua* (Bombay mace) and *M. argentea* (wild mace).
- (b) Nutmeg is the dried seed of *M. fragrans* deprived of its testa.
- (c) Mace or ground nutmeg shall not contain any foreign substance.

**L.01.011. Black Pepper.**

- (a) Black pepper is the dried immature berry of *Piper nigrum L.*
- (b) Black pepper when ground shall not :—
  - (i) yield more than seven parts per centum of total ash ;
  - (ii) contain less than six parts per centum of extract soluble in ether ;
  - (iii) contain less than eight parts per centum of extractive matter soluble in absolute alcohol ; or
  - (iv) contain any foreign substance.

**L.01.012. White Pepper.**

- (a) White pepper is the dried mature berry of *Piper nigrum L.* from which the outer coating has been removed.
- (b) White pepper when ground shall not :—
  - (i) yield more than three and five-tenths parts per centum of total ash ;
  - (ii) contain less than six parts per centum of extract soluble in ether ;
  - (iii) contain less than seven parts per centum of extract soluble in absolute alcohol ;
  - (iv) contain more than five parts per centum of crude fibre ; or
  - (v) contain any foreign substance.

**L.01.013.****Ground Mixed Pepper.**

Ground mixed pepper is a mixture of ground white and ground black pepper and shall not contain any foreign substance. The proportion of ground black pepper shall not exceed fifty parts per centum by weight, of the whole.

**L.01.014.****Cayenne Pepper.**

- (a) Cayenne pepper or cayenne is the dried fruit of species of *Capsicum*, powdered or ground.
- (b) Cayenne pepper shall not :—
  - (i) yield more than six parts per centum of total ash ;
  - (ii) contain less than fifteen parts per centum of ether extractives ; or
  - (iii) contain any foreign substance.

**L.01.015.****Prohibition.**

The addition of starch or colouring matter, or any other foreign substance, to black pepper or to white pepper or cayenne pepper is hereby prohibited.

**L.01.016.****Mustard.**

- (a) Mustard is the ground seed of *Sinapsis alba*, *Brassica juncea*, or *Brassica nigra*.
- (b) Mustard shall not :—
  - (i) yield more than eight parts per centum of total ash ;
  - (ii) contain more than two and five-tenths parts per centum of starch ; or
  - (iii) contain any foreign substance.

**L.01.017.****Compound Mustard.**

Compound mustard is mustard mixed with flour or starch with or without turmeric. It shall contain not more than twelve parts per centum of starch and not more than three-eighths of one part per centum of turmeric.

**L.01.018.****Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to any package containing Compound Mustard :—

- (a) the word "COMPOUND" either immediately before or immediately after the word "MUSTARD" in letters of the same size as those comprising the word "MUSTARD" ; and
- (b) the statement "CONTAINS NOT MORE THAN TWELVE PER CENT OF ADDED STARCH" in letters of not less than eight points measurement.

**L.01.019.****Mustard Paste and Prepared Mustard.**

- (a) Mustard paste and prepared mustard is mustard, or mustard seed, or both of them, mixed with water, salt, verjuice, wine, vinegar, tartaric acid, citric acid, malic acid, sugar, glycerine, turmeric, spices and spice oils, singly or in combination.
- (b) Mustard paste and prepared mustard shall not contain any substance or substances other than those specified.

**L.01.020.****Salt and Table Salt.**

- (a) Salt is sodium chloride which is free from foreign materials and on a water-free basis shall not contain :—
  - (i) more than one part per centum of sulphates ;
  - (ii) more than one-tenth part per centum of matter insoluble in hot decinormal solution of hydrochloric acid ; and
  - (iii) more than one-half of one per centum of total calcium and magnesium chlorides.

Salt other than table salt may contain potassium ferrocyanide in proportion not exceeding fifty parts per million.
- (b) Table salt is fine grained refined crystalline salt with the addition of harmless agents to secure free running properties in a total amount not exceeding two parts per centum.
- (c) The harmless agents in table salt shall include :—
  - (i) sterile diatomaceous earth in a proportion not exceeding one part per centum which has been subjected to a screen analysis and not more than one part per centum is retained on a British Standards Institution 30 mesh screen ;
  - (ii) calcium silicate, sodium (or sodium calcium) silico aluminate, magnesium carbonate, tricalcium phosphate, calcium hydroxyphosphate and amorphous silicon dioxide having a maximum particle size of ten microns which substances together shall not exceed one part per centum.
- (d) Table salt on a water free basis shall not contain more than six-tenths part per centum of sulphates and the total amount of calcium and magnesium chlorides shall not exceed one-quarter part per centum.
- (e) For the purpose of this subregulation, sulphates shall be calculated as  $\text{Ca SO}_4$ , calcium chloride as  $\text{Ca Cl}_2$ , and magnesium chloride as  $\text{Mg Cl}_2$ .

**L.01.022.****Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every package containing table salt in letters of not less than twelve points measurement, the words, "TABLE SALT".

**L.01.023.****Iodised Salt.**

Iodised salt is salt or table salt containing potassium or sodium iodide or iodate in proportion equivalent to not less than twenty-five and not more than forty parts of iodine (I) in every million parts of salt.

**L.01.024.****Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every package containing iodised salt, either immediately before or immediately after the word "SALT" the word "IODISED" in letters of not less than twelve points measurement and at least equivalent in size to the letters comprising the word "SALT".

12. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation L.03 of Part L and substituting the following regulation :—

**L.03. VINEGAR.**

**L.03.001. General Standard for Vinegar.**

(a) Vinegar is the liquid produced by acetous fermentation, with or without alcoholic fermentation of one or more of the following :—malt, spirit, wine, cider, alcoholic liquors, fruit, honey, glucose, sugar (including unrefined crystal sugar and refinery syrups) or molasses, with or without caramel or natural flavouring substances.

(b) Vinegar shall contain not less than four per cent, weight per volume, of acetic acid.

(c) Vinegar may contain sulphur dioxide in amount not exceeding 25 parts per million, except in the case of wine vinegar which may contain not more than 100 parts per million of sulphur dioxide.

**L.03.002. Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every container containing vinegar, in letters of not less than twelve points measurement :—

(a) for vinegar produced from more than one substance, the words :—

“ VINEGAR MADE (OR BREWED) FROM (here insert in descending order of the proportions present, the name or names of the substances from which the vinegar was produced) ” ; and

(b) for vinegar produced from one substance, the words :—

“ (here insert the name of the substance from which the vinegar was produced) VINEGAR ”.

**L.03.003. Distilled Vinegar.**

(a) Distilled vinegar is the liquid produced by the distillation of vinegar and may contain caramel, natural flavouring substances, or both.

(b) Distilled vinegar shall contain not less than four per cent weight per volume of acetic acid.

**L.03.004. Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every container containing distilled vinegar the words :—

“ DISTILLED VINEGAR

DISTILLED FROM (here insert the source of the vinegar) ”,  
in letters of not less than twelve points measurement.

**L.03.005. Blended Vinegar.**

(a) Blended vinegar is the liquid produced by mixing vinegar with distilled vinegar. It shall contain not less than fifty parts per centum of vinegar as defined in subregulation L.03.001 of this regulation.

(b) Blended vinegar shall contain not less than four per cent weight per volume of acetic acid.

**L.03.006. Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every container containing blended vinegar the words :—

“ BLENDED VINEGAR ”,

in letters of not less than twelve points measurement.

**L.03.007. Flavoured Vinegar.**

(a) Flavoured vinegar is the liquid produced by adding flavouring to any type of vinegar as defined in this regulation.

(b) Flavoured vinegar shall contain not less than four per cent weight per volume of acetic acid.

**L.03.008. Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every container containing flavoured vinegar the words :—

“ FLAVOURED (type of vinegar) VINEGAR ”,

in letters of not less than twelve points measurement.

**L.03.009. Imitation Vinegar.**

(a) Imitation vinegar is a mixture of water and acetic acid with or without vinegar, caramel, or natural flavouring substances.

(b) Imitation vinegar shall contain not less than four per cent weight per volume of acetic acid.

**L.03.010. Labelling.**

(a) There shall be written in the label on or attached to every container containing imitation vinegar the words :—

“ IMITATION VINEGAR ”,

in words of not less than twelve points measurement.

(b) Wherever the word “ vinegar ” occurs on the label it shall be preceded by the word “ imitation ” in the same size, style and colour of type.

**L.03.011. Sweetened Spiced Vinegar.**

(a) Sweetened spiced vinegar is the liquid produced by adding sugar and spices to any type of vinegar defined in this regulation.

(b) Sweetened spiced vinegar shall contain not less than four per cent weight per volume of acetic acid.

**L.03.012. Labelling.**

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every container containing sweetened spiced vinegar, the words :—

“SWEETENED SPICED (type of vinegar) VINEGAR”,  
in letters of not less than twelve points measurement.

**L.03.013. Essence of Imitation Vinegar.**

(a) Mixtures sold for the purpose of making imitation vinegar by dilution with water shall be mixtures of acetic acid with water, containing not more than twenty-eight per cent weight per volume of acetic acid, with or without caramel.

(b) Essence of imitation vinegar shall not contain any mineral acid.

(c) When diluted with water as directed in the label the resultant fluid shall contain not less than four per cent weight per volume of acetic acid.

**L.03.014. Labelling.**

(a) There shall be written in the label on or attached to every package containing essence of imitation vinegar, the words :—

“ESSENCE OF IMITATION VINEGAR”,  
in letters of not less than twelve points measurement.

(b) The label shall include direction for dilution with water so that the resultant fluid shall contain not less than four per cent weight per volume of acetic acid.

**L.03.015. Prohibition.**

Pictorial representation suggesting malt, wine or any other substance from which vinegar may be made is prohibited except on labels attached to containers of vinegar or blended vinegar containing more than sixty per centum of vinegar made from the substance so represented.

**L.03.016. Permitted Addition.**

Diethyl pyrocarbonate may be used in the production of cider vinegar in an amount not exceeding 200 parts per million.

13. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation P.13 of Part P and substituting the following regulation :—

**P.13. BREWED SOFT DRINKS.****P.13.001.**

Brewed soft drinks are beverages prepared by a fermentation process and shall be composed of potable water with vegetable extractives or infusions, and sugar, with or without the addition of glucose, vegetable flavouring substances, the modifying agents of Group 3 of subregulation A.11.001, permitted colouring as prescribed in regulation A.04 and permitted preservative as prescribed in regulation A.02 of these regulations.

Brewed soft drinks shall contain not more than 1.15 per centum volume per volume of alcohol at 15.56°C.

**P.13.002.**

The addition of artificial sweetening substances to brewed soft drinks is permitted as prescribed by regulation A.05 of these regulations.

**P.13.003. Preservatives and Diethyl Pyrocarbonate.**

(a) Brewed soft drinks may contain either sulphur dioxide in proportion not exceeding 115 parts per million or benzoic acid and or sorbic acid as their potassium or sodium salts, in total proportion not exceeding 400 parts per million.

(b) Diethyl pyrocarbonate may be used in the production of brewed soft drinks in an amount not exceeding 200 parts per million.

**P.13.004. Labelling.**

(a) The label attached to every package of brewed soft drink shall contain the words “BREWED SOFT DRINK” immediately preceding or following the name of the drink in letters of not less than twelve points measurement.

(b) Words such as beer, lager, champagne and wine or other words suggesting that the product is an alcoholic drink shall not appear on the label of any brewed soft drink other than ginger beer, ginger ale, kola beer, root beer, hop beer and horehound beer.
