AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 10th day of January, 1973, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Local Government Act, 1960-1972.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 3640/70 (R.3632).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the City of Perth has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

- (b) red kangaroos and euros—20 cents each skin and 20 cents each carcass;
- (c) emus—20 cents each; and
- (d) all fauna other than grey and red kangaroos, euros and emus—50 cents each.

(b) by deleting subregulation (7) and substituting a new subregulation as follows—

(7) Any skin or carcass of any kangaroo or euro or skin of any emu or other fauna taken for gain or reward in any area, which does not have a tag duly affixed thereto may be seized by any warden and retained until the royalty due has been paid.

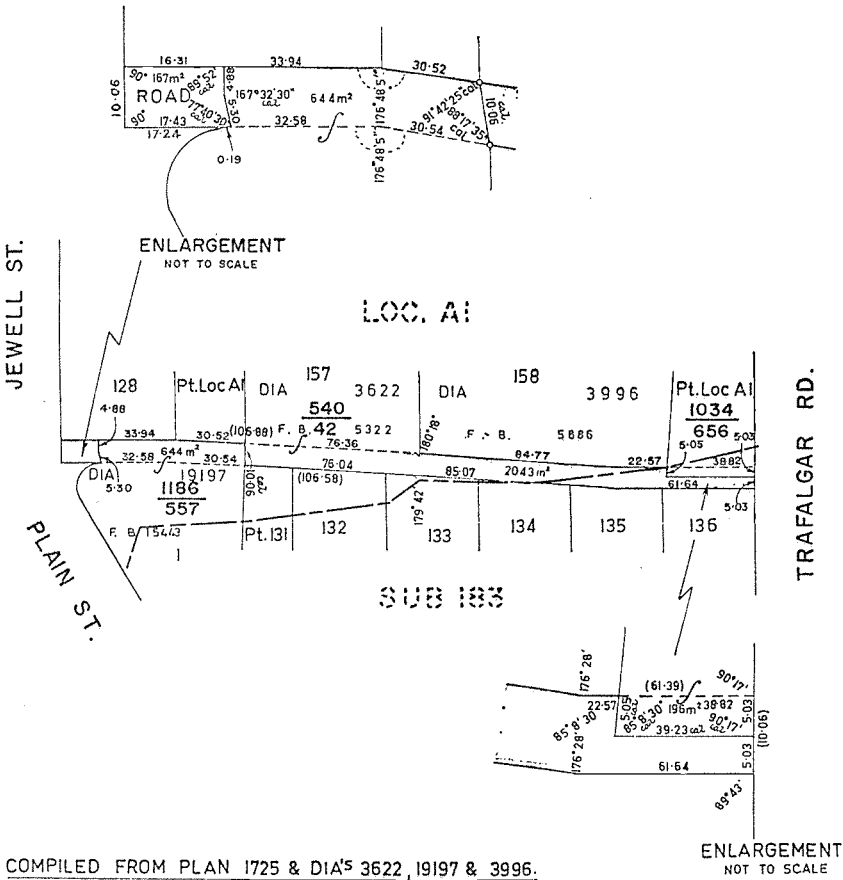

Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960 as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

Division 4 of Part II revoked. 2. The principal regulations are amended by revoking Division 4 of Part II.

Regulation 100 amended. 3. Subregulation (3) of regulation 100 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following subregulation substituted:—

(3) (a) As from the first day of January, 1974, a teacher who has accepted promotion to a school outside the metropolitan area is not entitled and shall not be permitted to retrogress to a school of lower status, or to transfer to a school of the same status, within that area unless and until he has served for a minimum of two years in the former school unless the Director-General otherwise decides, but a person who has served for not less than two years as a headmaster in a school outside the metropolitan area is entitled, when applying for a transfer to a school of the same status in any area of his choice, to precedence over any person who has applied to be promoted to a school of the same status within the area chosen by that firstmentioned person.

(b) As from the first day of January, 1974, a teacher who has applied for and accepted either promotion or transfer to the position of headmaster of a school within the metropolitan area is not entitled and shall not be permitted to transfer to a school of the same status in that area unless and until he has served for a minimum of three years in the former school unless the Director-General otherwise decides.
