TO HIS HONOUR JUDGE LAURENCE FRED-ERICK JOHN JOHNSTON, of 5 Hawthorn Crescent, Hazlewood Park in the State of South Australia: I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you LAURENCE FREDERICK JOHN JOHNSTON to be a Royal Commission to do the following things, namely:—

- (a) to inquire into and report whether it is desirable to alter the number of municipalities within the metropolitan area of Perth, or to alter the boundaries of the districts of any such municipalities for which purpose you shall consider the metropolitan area of Perth as comprising the districts of
 - the cities of Perth, Fremantle, Melville, Nedlands, South Perth, Stirling, Subiaco,
 - the towns of Canning, Claremont, Cock-burn, Cottesloe, East Fremantle, Gosnells, Mosman Park,
 - Armadale-Kelmscott, shires of the Bassendean, Bayswater, Belmont, Kalamunda, Kwinana, Mundaring, Peppermint Grove, Rockingham, Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Swan and Wanneroo,

and, in this respect, to have regard not only to the proposals made in the Local Government Boundaries Commission's Report on Metropolitan Municipal Bound-aries, 1972, but also to any evidence or sub-mission in opposition thereto, whether made by way of alternative proposals or otherwise. otherwise;

- (b) where your report recommends that there should be a new municipality or that the boundaries of the district of any existing municipality should be altered, to make a recommendation as to-
 - (i) the boundaries of the new or altered municipality;

(ii) the name to be used by the new or altered municipality;

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- (iii) whether the new or altered municipality should have the status of city, town or shire;
- (iv) the date on which any new municip-ality should come into existence and on which any alteration to existing boundaries should take effect; and
- (c) to make recommendations as to anything you consider necessary or desirable for the purposes of facilitating or expediting the purposes of facilitating or expediting the implementation of your recommendations and in particular to advise as to the am-endments to the Local Government Act, 1960-1973, that are necessary to permit your recommendations to be implemented without the need for the presentation of petitions by the municipalities concerned.

And I hereby declare that by virtue of this Com-mission you may, in the execution of this Commission, do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission or members of a Royal Commission may lawfully do and exercise whether under or pursuant to the Barul Commission act 1000 or during the second Royal Commissions Act, 1968, or otherwise.

When permission has been obtained from the fire control officer to provide firebreaks in alternative positions it is your responsibility to advise the Council in writing that such approval was given. If permission is not granted you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act.

THE Shire of Belmont, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 as amended, hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Scheme Text.

Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may 1. be cited as Shire of Belmont Ascot Town Planning Scheme (No. 8), (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme").

2. Responsible Authority: The authority re-sponsible for the administration and enforcement of the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Belmont (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

3. Maps: The following maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:---

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are as follows:

- (a) to rationalise the land use pattern and the road system within the Scheme Area,
- (b) to facilitate the acquisition and exchange of land within the Scheme Area in order that new roads may be laid out, new lots created and that new and existing roads may be constructed to achieve a safe and efficient traffic network between the Garratt Road Bridge and the Great Eastern Highway,
- (c) to facilitate the co-ordination of parking areas and access thereto, adjacent to and nearby the Ascot Racecourse,

- (d) to ensure the proper drainage of roads and all lots within the Scheme Area,
- (e) to facilitate the relocation of Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board local service mains where such relocation may be necessary as a result of other Scheme works and otherwise to adequately protect the alignment of existing service mains to the satisfaction of the Board.

6. Method of Carrying Out Objects: It is intended that the Council will negotiate with owners of land within the Scheme Area and with the Crown to acquire and to exchange land or if necessary compulsorily to acquire land within the Scheme Area and, subsequently to carry out all of the Scheme works in accordance with the layout of roads and lots which is shown on the Scheme Map. The Scheme Map shall be the basis of the Council's negotiations with land owners and the Crown and shall also be the basis for the construction of new roads, the rearrangements of land holdings and the provision of access to individual lots within the Scheme Area, but, the Council may alter or vary the provisions of the said map where, in its opinion, circumstances justify minor alteration or variation.

7. Subdivision: The Scheme does not dictate a final pattern of subdivision. An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land either alone or in conjunction with others shall submit a plan of the proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act. However, the Council shall have regard to the details of the Scheme Map and to the intention of the Scheme when it considers applications for subdivisional approval.

8. New Roads and Footpaths: All new roads and footpaths within the Scheme Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the Council.

9. Powers and Authorities of the Council: In carrying out the provisions of this Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) to enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area,
- (b) to make agreements with the owners or occupiers of the land within the Scheme Area in respect of any matters affecting the Scheme,
- (c) to make agreements with the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board, the State Electricity Commission, or other Government instrumentalities concerning any matter relating to the Scheme. Without limiting its powers to make agreements with any other Government instrumentality, the Council shall negotiate with the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to ensure that all lots within the Scheme Area can be adequately serviced to the satisfaction of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board, having regard to the location and capacity of existing service mains and to the normal operating policies of the Board,
- (d) to resume any land within the Scheme Area for the purpose of making land available for roads or for Local Authority purposes in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme Map, or for the purpose of exchange for other land which is required for roads or for Local Authority purposes as aforesaid,
- (e) to dispose of any land, whether by sale or exchange or otherwise, to which it becomes entitled through the operation of the Scheme,
- (f) to charge costs incurred by Council in the preparation, administration and implementation of the Scheme as Scheme costs.

10. Twenty-eight days' written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Town Planning and Development Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

11. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred upon it as the responsible authority by section 13 of the said Act.

12. Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of the Scheme may be made within six months of the Scheme coming into operation.
