BUSINESS NAMES ACT, 1962.

Direction by the Attorney General.

WHEREAS subsection (1) of section 9 of the Business Names Act, 1962, provides, that except with the consent of the Minister, a business name shall not be registered under that Act if the business name is a name that is in the opinion of the Registrar undesirable or is a name, or a name of a kind, that the Minister has for the purposes of that Act directed the Registrar not to accept for registration: Now, therefore, I, Thomas Daniel Evans, Attorney General, being the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Business Names Act, 1962, and acting under the provisions of the said subsection, hereby revoke any directions previously given under the aforesaid section and do hereby direct the Registrar of Companies not to accept for registration, without the consent of the Attorney General generally or in a particular case, any of the names mentioned hereunder:—

- (1) Names suggesting connection with members of the Royal family or Royal patronage, e.g., names which include the words, "Royal", "King", "Queen", or "Crown".
- (2) Names suggesting connection with the Crown, the Commonwealth of Nations, the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia or of a State or of any other part of the Queen's dominions, possessions or territories, e.g., names which include the words "Commonwealth", "Federal", "State", "Empire", "Imperial", or "National".
- (3) Names suggesting connection with the Government of a foreign country or with the United Nations.
- (4) Names suggesting connection with a government department, authority or instrumentality or a municipal or other local authority.
- (5) Names containing the following words or any words of like import:—

"Trust", "Trustee", "Chamber of Commerce", "Chamber of Manufacturers", "Chartered", "Stock Exchange", "Guarantee", "Co-operative", "Building Society", "Starr Bowkett", "Bank", "Banker", "Banking", "Savings", "Made in Australia", "Executor", "Oxfam".

- (6) Names suggesting connection with ex-servicemen's organisations or that its members are totally or partially incapacitated, e.g. names which include the words "Anzac", "Ex-Servicemen", "Returned Soldier", "Blind" or "Blinded".
- (7) Names that are misleading as to the nature, objects or purposes of the company or in any other manner.
- (8) Names that are blasphemous or likely to be offensive to members of the public.
- (9) Names that are likely to be confused with or mistaken for the name of an existing company, foreign company, registered association, firm, co-operative society or friendly society or a business name.
- (10) Names that are likely to be confused with or mistaken for the name reserved by or on behalf of a company, a foreign company, a proposed company, or a company which it is proposed to register as a foreign company.

Attention is directed to the following additional restrictions on the use of names:—

1. Section 12 of the International Organizations Privileges and Immunities Act, 1963-1966, provides (*inter alia*) that except with the consent in writing of the Minister a person shall not in certain circumstances use the name, abbreviation of a name, seal, emblem or device of an international organization that is declared by the regulations to be an international organization to which the Act applies.

2. Protection of Word "Anzac" Regulations (Statutory Rules, 1921, No. 2, Statutory Rules, 1959, No. 29, Statutory Rules, 1962, No. 79), provide that no person shall, without the authority of the Governor General or of a Minister of State, assume or use the word "Anzac" or any word resembling the word "Anzac" in connection with any trade, business, calling or profession or in connection with any entertainment or any lottery or art union.

3. COMPANIES ACT, 1961-1972.

Direction by the Attorney General.

I, THOMAS DANIEL EVANS, Attorney General, being the Minister for the time being administering the Companies Act, 1961-1972, pursuant to the powers conferred by sections 22 and 353 of the said Act, hereby revoke any directions previously given under the aforesaid sections or either of them and do hereby direct that the Registrar of Companies shall not except with the consent of the Minister for the time being administering the said Act register under the said Act any company or foreign company by a name that is a name of a kind mentioned hereunder but in the case of a foreign company which has been incorporated under a law of another State, or a Territory, of the Commonwealth of Australia which corresponds with the said Act, the Registrar of Companies may notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this direction permit the registration of such foreign company by that name if he is satisfied that the Minister administering the corresponding law in the other State or Territory has consented to the registration of the company by that name in that State or Territory and he is not of the

opinion that the name of the said foreign company is otherwise undesirable:—

- (1) Names suggesting connection with members of the Royal family or Royal patronage, e.g., names which include the words, "Royal", "King", "Queen", or "Crown".
- (2) Names suggesting connection with the Crown, the Commonwealth of Nations, the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia or of a State or of any other part of the Queen's dominions, possessions or territories, e.g., names which include the words "Commonwealth", "Federal", "State", "Empire", "Imperial", or "National".
- (3) Names suggesting connection with the Government of a foreign country or with the United Nations.
- (4) Names suggesting connection with a government department, authority or instrumentality or a municipal or other local authority.
- (5) Names containing the following words or any words of like import:—
"Trust", "Trustee", "Chamber of Commerce", "Chamber of Manufacturers", "Chartered", "Stock Exchange", "Guarantee", "Co-operative", "Building Society", "Starr Bowkett", "Bank", "Banker", "Banking", "Savings", "Made in Australia", "Executor", "Oxfam".
- (6) Names suggesting connection with ex-servicemen's organisations or that its members are totally or partially incapacitated, e.g., names which include the words "Anzac", "Ex-servicemen", "Returned Soldier", "Blind" or "Blinded".
- (7) Names that are misleading as to the nature, objects or purposes of the company or in any other manner.
- (8) Names that are blasphemous or likely to be offensive to members of the public.
- (9) Names that are likely to be confused with or mistaken for the name of an existing company, foreign company, registered association, firm, co-operative society or friendly society or a business name.
- (10) Names that are likely to be confused with or mistaken for the name reserved by or on behalf of a company, a foreign company, a proposed company, or a company which it is proposed to register as a foreign company.

Attention is directed to the following additional restrictions on the use of names:—

1. Section 12 of the International Organizations Privileges and Immunities Act, 1963-1966, provides (*inter alia*) that except with the consent in writing of the Minister a person shall not in certain circumstances use the name, abbreviation of a name, seal, emblem or device of an international organization that is declared by the regulations to be an international organization to which the Act applies.

2. Protection of Word "Anzac" Regulations (Statutory Rules, 1921, No. 2, Statutory Rules, 1959, No. 29, Statutory Rules, 1962, No. 79), provide that no person shall, without the authority of the Governor General or of a Minister of State, assume or use the word "Anzac" or any word resembling the word "Anzac" in connection with any trade, business, calling or profession or in connection with any entertainment or any lottery or art union.

3. HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Traffic Act, 1919, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Regulations.

Principal regulations.

1. In these regulations the Road Traffic Code, 1965, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd January, 1970 with amendments up to and including the 13th August, 1969 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 202 substituted.

2. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 202 the following regulation:—

202. (1) Every pedestrian and driver shall obey the signal by hand or the reasonable oral direction given by—

- (a) a member of the police force;
- (b) a traffic inspector; or
- (c) a uniformed fireman, if the signal or direction given by him is given for the purpose of facilitating the movement of a fire engine or emergency vehicle,

notwithstanding that the signal or oral direction given by any of them appears to require the pedestrian or driver to act in contravention of these regulations.

(2) It is a defence to any complaint of a breach of these regulations that the defendant was, at the time of the alleged offence, acting in conformity with a signal or direction given under subregulation (1) of this regulation.

Reg. 1807 added.

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 1806 a regulation as follows—

1807. (1) In this regulation—

"King's Park" means all the land set apart as Reserve No. A 1702 under the Land Act, 1933.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision in these regulations, a person shall not, in King's Park—

- (a) drive a vehicle at a speed in excess of 25 m.p.h.; or
- (b) except with the approval of the King's Park Board, drive a goods vehicle with an unladen weight in excess of 1524 kg or a tractor.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION ACT, 1966.

Exemptions.

I, JOHN DOLAN, being the Minister administering the Transport Commission Act, 1966, in exercise of the powers conferred under subsection (2) of section 19 of the Transport Commission Act, 1966, do hereby exempt from the provisions of Part III of that Act any vehicle being used for any of the purposes set out in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions made under subsection (2) of section 19 of the said Act, and published in *Government Gazettes* of the 12th April, 1967, 25th August, 1967, 8th December, 1967, 14th June, 1968, 25th October, 1968, 2nd May, 1969, 22nd August, 1969, 19th September, 1969, 7th November, 1969, 10th April, 1970, 7th August, 1970, 14th April, 1972, 21st July, 1972, 9th March, 1973 and 30th March, 1973 are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE.

21. North Eastern and Kimberley Areas:

The carriage of goods by road within that part of the State of Western Australia embracing the Shires of Broome, Hall's Creek, East Pilbara, West Kimberley and Wyndham-East Kimberley and that part of the Shire of Meekatharra north of the twenty-sixth parallel of south latitude, and that part of the Shire of West Pilbara east of 116° east longitude.

22. Meekatharra-Wiluna Area:

The carriage of goods by road between the towns of Meekatharra and Wiluna or within the Shire of Wiluna.

23. Leonora-Laverton Area:

The carriage of goods by road within all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of the townsite of Sandstone and extending north to a point situated east of the northern corner of Cue Lot 109; thence east to the eastern boundary of the State of Western Australia; thence south along that boundary to a point situated east of the south western corner of Malcolm Lot 67; thence west to that corner and onwards to the prolongation southerly of the western boundary to the townsite of Sandstone and thence northerly to and along that boundary to the starting point.

24. Darling Range-Wandering Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle—

- (a) between his farm in the Darling Range-Wandering Area and the Metropolitan Area; and

(b) within the Darling Range-Wandering Area;
of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption—

“Metropolitan Area” means the area within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office at Perth; and

“Darling Range-Wandering Area” means all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of the Great Northern Highway with the left bank of the Swan River and extending generally easterly upwards along that bank and the left bank of the Avon River to a line westward of and at all points 16 kilometres from the centre line of the Great Southern Railway; thence generally southerly along that line to a line northward of and at all points 16 kilometres from the centre line of the Brunswick Junction-Narrogin Railway; thence generally westerly along that line to the centre line of Albany Highway; thence west to a point situated south of the intersection of the prolongation westerly of the westernmost northern boundary of Williams Location 13101; with the centre line of Albany Highway; thence north to the centre line of Albany Highway aforesaid; thence generally northwesterly along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Helena Street (Midland); thence northerly to and along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of the Great Northern Highway aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that centre line to the starting point.

25. Nyabing-Pingrup Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle—

- (a) from his farm in the Nyabing-Pingrup Area to the towns of Nyabing or Gnowangerup or to any town situated on that part of the Great Southern Railway between Katanning and Albany, of primary produce produced on such farm; and
- (b) from any such town to such farm, of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon; and,
- (c) within the Nyabing-Pingrup Area, of primary produce produced on such farm and supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption, the “Nyabing-Pingrup Area” shall mean all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point situated 8 kilometres east of the northwestern corner of Nyabing Lot 11 and extending north to a northern boundary of the Shire of Kent; thence generally easterly along boundaries of that Shire to a western boundary of Williams Location 15055; thence generally northerly along western boundaries of that location to the southern boundary of Location 13928; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southern boundary of Location 12601; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southern boundary of Location 14024; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location and onwards along the northernmost eastern boundary of Location 11098 to the prolongation westerly of the westernmost northern boundary of Location 12289; thence easterly to and easterly, northerly and again easterly along boundaries of that location to the northwestern corner of the southern severance of Location 13979; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of that severance and Locations 14367 and 14983 and onwards to the western boundary of Location 14982; thence northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to and along the northern boundary of Roe Location 2810 (Reserve 28173) to the prolongation southerly of the western boundary of Location 2174; thence northerly to and northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the western boundary of Location 2596; thence northerly and generally easterly along boundaries of that location to the northwestern corner of Location 2595; thence generally easterly along northern boundaries of that location and Locations 2608 and 2583 to the western corner of Location 2582; thence generally northeasterly and southeasterly along boundaries of that location to the northwestern boundary of Location 2569; thence northeasterly and southeasterly along boundaries of that location to the northern corner of Location 2570; thence southeasterly along the northeastern boundary of that location and onwards to the northern corner of Location 2557, a point on the boundary of the Shire of Kent aforesaid; thence generally southerly and easterly along boundaries of that Shire of the northeastern corner of Location 2551; thence easterly to the southern corner of Location 80; thence northeasterly along the southeastern boundary of that location to the easternmost northern corner of Location 2299; thence generally southeasterly along boundaries of that location and Locations 2301, 2457, 2303, 2306 and 2458 and onwards to a southeastern boundary of the Shire of Lake Grace; thence generally southwesterly along boundaries of that Shire to the easternmost eastern corner of the Shire of Kent aforesaid; thence generally southwesterly and generally westerly along boundaries of that Shire to a point situated south of the point situated 8 kilometres east of the northwestern corner of Nyabing Lot 11 aforesaid and thence north to the starting point.

26. Borden-Jerramungup Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle—

- (a) between his farm in the Borden-Jerramungup Area and Gnowangerup or Albany; and
- (b) within such area;

of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption, "Borden-Jerramungup Area" means all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point situated 16 kilometres east of the western corner of Gnowangerup Lot 87 and extending north to a northern boundary of the Shire of Gnowangerup; thence generally easterly, generally northeasterly and generally southerly along boundaries of that Shire to a point situated east of a point situated 16 kilometres south of the northern corner of Ongerup Lot 117; thence west to the lastmentioned point; thence southwesterly to a point situated 16 kilometres south of the northwestern corner of Borden Lot 77; thence northwesterly to the intersection of a line southward of and at all points 16 kilometres from the centre line of the Tambellup-Gnowangerup Railway with an arc having a radius of 16 kilometres from the western corner of Gnowangerup Lot 87 and thence generally northeasterly along the lastmentioned arc to the starting point.

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle—

- (b) within such area;

of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption—

"South Stirling Area" means all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of a line southward of and at all points 16 kilometres from the centre line of the Tambellup-Gnowangerup Railway with an arc having a radius of 16 kilometres from the western corner of Gnowangerup Lot 87 and extending southeasterly to a point situated 16 kilometres south of the northwestern corner of Borden Lot 77; thence northeasterly to a point situated 16 kilometres south of the northern corner of Ongerup Lot 117; thence east to the shore of the Southern Ocean; thence generally southwesterly along that shore to a line eastward of and at all points 16 kilometres from the centre line of the Great Southern Railway; thence generally northerly along that line to a line southward of and at all points 16 kilometres from the centre line of the Tambellup-Gnowangerup Railway aforesaid and thence generally easterly along that line to the starting point.

28. Esperance Area:

The carriage of goods between any two places within all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the shore of the Southern Ocean with the prolongation southeasterly of the Number 1 Rabbit Proof Fence and extending northwesterly to and generally northwesterly along that fence to a point situated west of a point situated 65 kilometres north of the western corner of Esperance Lot 19; thence east to the last-mentioned point and onwards to the shore of the Southern Ocean aforesaid and thence generally southwesterly along that shore to the starting point.

29. Badgingarra Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle—

- (a) between his farm in the Badgingarra Area and the Metropolitan Area; and
- (b) within the Badgingarra Area;

of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption—

"Badgingarra Area" means all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the shore of the Indian Ocean with the prolongation westerly of the centre line of the Green Head-Coorow Road and extending easterly to and generally easterly along the lastmentioned centre line to the prolongation northerly of the western boundary of Melbourne Location 3622; thence southerly to and along that boundary to a point situated east of the southeastern corner of the southern severance of Location 3805; thence west to that corner and generally westerly along southern boundaries of that location and Locations 3846, 3845, 3844, 3808, 3807, 3806, 3861, 3860 and 3961 to the southwestern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence west to the shore of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that shore to the starting point.

"Metropolitan Area" means the area within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth.

30. Fremantle Zone:

The carriage of goods by road within all that portion of land comprised within a circle having a radius of 35 kilometres, with its centre situated at the northern corner of Fremantle Lot 128, being the site of the Post Office in Short Street, Fremantle.

31. General Transport by Farmers:

The carriage by a primary producer of requisites for his domestic use or for use by him in the production of livestock, poultry, fruit, vegetables, dairy produce or other perishable commodities, or grain or seed, to the place of production in a vehicle owned by such producer and used solely for the purposes of such production.

31A. Grain and Seed:

The carriage of livestock for sale or agistment or perishable commodities, grain, seed, hay or straw for sale from the place where they are produced to any other place in a vehicle owned by the producer thereof, and, on the return journey, the carriage of requisites for the domestic use of the producer or for use by him in the production of the commodities herein named.

32. Fertiliser Distribution:

The carriage of fertiliser from the place of its manufacture to any other place within a radius of 80 kilometres therefrom and for use at such lastmentioned place.

33. Bags of Fertiliser:

The carriage by a primary producer in his own vehicle of empty bags from his own farm to a fertiliser works for subsequent use in supplying the fertiliser requirements of such farm.

34. Clover Seed:

- (a) The carriage of clover seed in a vehicle owned by the producer thereof from the place of production to any other place and return in the course of procuring the grading or cleaning or both of such seed for the purpose of its subsequent use at such place of production.
- (b) The carriage of clover seed within a radius of 80 kilometres from the place of its production.

35. Transport of Fodder and Machinery Between Farms:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle of grain, seed and fodder produced by him and of his farm machinery from one farming property owned or leased by him to another such property for use in his farming activities thereon.

36. Farm Machinery for Repairs:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle of his own farm machinery in the course of procuring the repair of such machinery.

37. Firewood Produced on Farms:

The carriage from any farming property to any other place of firewood, including mallee roots, produced on such property.

38. Firewood Carried Outside South West Land Division:

The carriage of firewood within the area outside the South West Land Division of Western Australia.

39. Fruit and Vegetables Within 65 Kilometres from G.P.O.

The carriage of fruit and vegetables within a radius of 65 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, between the place of production and any place within the Metropolitan Area, and the carriage on the return journey of supplies purchased by primary producers for their own use in the course of production of fruit and vegetables, but not supplies intended for sale.

For the purposes of this exemption—

“Metropolitan Area” means the area within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth.

40. Shearing Plant:

The carriage of shearing plant to or from any shearing shed by a shearing contractor in his own vehicle in the course of his business.

41. Livestock:

The carriage of livestock.

42. Bricks from Cardup:

The carriage of bricks from brick kiln situated at Cardup, being portion of Cockburn Sound Location 521 as comprised in Certificate of Title, Volume 1159, Folio 549, to any place within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth.

43. Tradesmen's Tools:

The carriage by any tradesman in his own vehicle of hand tools, buckets, ladders, wheelbarrows, mortar boards, vices or hand-sawing supports, or a concrete mixer of a capacity not exceeding sixty litres, where such articles are to be used, or have been used, by him in carrying on his occupation as a tradesman.

44. Land Survey Equipment:

The carriage to a survey site and return of survey instruments, equipment and materials used, or intended to be used, for the carrying out of land surveys by a surveyor licensed under the Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909.

45. Coal and Coke:

The carriage of coal and coke for domestic use.

46. School Children and Supervisors:

The carriage of school children and supervisors in any passenger vehicle which operates pursuant to a contract with the Department of Education of Western Australia for the carriage of school children, while such vehicle is so operating or is operating at the request of the Department of Education on routes where, or at times when, there is no regular transport service which could cater satisfactorily for such transport.

47. Fishing Gear:

The carriage by a licensed fisherman in his own vehicle of his nets, boats and other fishing gear and requisites to and from estuaries and beaches.

48. Airline Passengers and Baggage:

The carriage of the passengers of an airline operator and their baggage between an airport and the nearest town in a vehicle owned by such airline operator, or chartered by such operator for that purpose.

49. Emergency Transport of Airline Passengers and Freight:

The carriage by road of passengers, baggage and freight by or on behalf of an airline operator for the purpose of completing a journey frustrated by aircraft failure, adverse weather conditions or other circumstances beyond the control of the operator of the aircraft.

50. Aerial Spraying, Crop-Dusting, etc.:

The carriage by air of equipment and materials solely in the course of aerial spraying, crop-dusting, seed sowing, fertiliser distribution, photography, aerial surveying, dog baiting, whale and fish spotting and "flying doctor" medical services.

51. Kalgoorlie Area:

The carriage of goods by road solely within that portion of land comprised within a circle having a radius of 60 kilometres, with its centre situated at the intersection of the centre line of Forrest Street with the prolongation north-westerly of the centre line of Windsor Street, Kalgoorlie.

52. Household Furniture:

The carriage of household furniture from the residence of a householder where such furniture—

- (a) has been accepted in payment or part payment for household furniture which has been sold by a vendor to such householder; and
- (b) is carried on the return of a vehicle which has delivered the last-mentioned household furniture to the residence of the purchaser in accordance with paragraph 8 of the First Schedule of the Transport Commission Act, 1966-1972.

For the purposes of this exemption, the term "household furniture" includes the household and personal effects of the householder or a member of his family.

53. Local Transport:

The carriage of goods by any vehicle wholly within a radius of 40 kilometres from the place of business of the owner of the vehicle where such place of business is situated beyond a radius of 65 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, and subject to the condition that goods shall not be transferred, whether directly or indirectly, from such vehicle to another vehicle or from another vehicle to such vehicle in the course of or for the purpose of the carriage of goods to or from places beyond such radius of 40 kilometres.

54. Yuna Area:

The carriage of farm produce from any farm situated within the Shire of Chapman Valley to Geraldton and the carriage of farming requisites from Geraldton to any such farm.

55. Eneabba Area:

- (1) The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle—
 - (a) between his farm situated wholly in the Eneabba Area and Geraldton via the Dongara-Cliff Head Road; and
 - (b) within the Eneabba Area;of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.
- (2) The carriage to Perth or Fremantle by a farmer in his own vehicle of primary produce produced by him on his farm in that portion of the Eneabba Area situated more than 35 kilometres from the Perth-Geraldton Railway, and the carriage on the return journey of requisites for use in production on such farm.

For the purposes of this exemption, "Eneabba Area" means all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the shore of the Indian Ocean with the prolongation westerly of the northernmost northern boundary of Dongara townsite and extending easterly to and along the last-mentioned boundary to the centre line of the Narngulu-Millendon Railway; thence generally easterly along that centre line to a line southwestward of and at all points 35 kilometres from the Mingenew-Coorow section of the aforesaid Railway; thence generally southeasterly along that line to the centre line of the Coorow-Green Head Road; thence generally westerly along that centre line and onwards to the shore of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that shore to the starting point.

56. Esperance-Albany Wool Transport:

The carriage of wool from any farm situated in the Shires of Esperance or Ravensthorpe to Albany, in a vehicle owned by the producer of such wool and used by him solely for the purposes of his own farming operations.

57. Geraldton Area Fish Transport:

The carriage to Geraldton by a licensed fisherman in his own vehicle of fresh fish or crayfish from any place within that portion of land comprised within the arc of a circle having a radius of 80 kilometres, with its centre situated at the northern corner of Geraldton Lot 255.

58. Aircraft Operations from One Landing Ground:

The carriage of passengers or goods by air in the course of a flight which commences from, and terminates at, the same place without any intermediate landing.

59. Fire Prevention Equipment:

The carriage of fire prevention or control equipment in a vehicle owned by the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board.

60. West Dandaragan Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle between his farm in the West Dandaragan Area and any place within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption, "West Dandaragan Area" means all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the shore of the Indian Ocean situated west of the southwestern corner of Melbourne Location 3961 and extending east to the lastmentioned corner; thence generally easterly along the southern boundaries of that location and Locations 3860, 3861, 3806, 3807, 3808, 3844, 3845, 3846 and 3805 to the southeastern corner of the southern severance of the lastmentioned location; thence east to intersect the arc having a radius of 25 kilometres from the intersection of the prolongation easterly of the centre line of Dandaragan Street with the centre line of Padbury Street, Moora; thence generally southerly along that arc to a point situated east of the southeastern corner of Location 3517; thence west to that corner and generally westerly along southern boundaries of that location and Locations 3828 and 3830 to the westernmost southwestern corner of the last-mentioned location; thence west to the shore of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that shore to the starting point.

61. The carriage in a motor car, otherwise than for hire, reward or any other consideration, of goods of a total weight not exceeding 150 kilograms at any one time.

For the purposes of this exemption the term "motor car" shall mean a motor vehicle designed primarily for the carriage of not more than six persons and shall include a vehicle of the type commonly known as a "station wagon" but shall not include a vehicle of the type commonly known as a "utility".

62. Boddington-Quindanning Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle, between his farm in the Boddington-Quindanning Area and any place within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption, "Boddington-Quindanning Area" means and includes all that portion of land contained wholly within the Shire of Boddington and including that land within a circle having a radius of 16 kilometres with its centre at the southern corner of Quindanning Lot 25.

63. Northampton Area:

The carriage of farm produce from any farm situated within the Shire of Northampton to Geraldton and the carriage from Geraldton to any such farm of—

- (a) fertiliser;
- (b) farming requisites in a vehicle owned by the owner of such farm.

64. Regans Ford Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle between his farm in the Regans Ford Area and any place within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption, "Regans Ford Area" means all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the shore of the Indian Ocean with the prolongation westerly of the western most southwestern corner of Melbourne Location 3830; thence easterly along that prolongation to the said corner; thence generally easterly along the southern boundary of that location and Location 3828 and 3517 to the southeastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence east to a point situated north of the intersection of the centre line of the Narngulu-Millendon Railway with the centre line of Weld Street, Gingin; thence south to that intersection and onwards to a point on the boundary of the Shire of Gingin; thence generally westerly along that boundary to the shore of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that shore to the starting point.

65. Bindoon-Chittering Area:

The carriage by a farmer in his own vehicle between his farm in the Bindoon-Chittering Area and any place within a radius of 35 kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, of primary produce produced on such farm and of supplies and requisites for use in production thereon.

For the purposes of this exemption, "Bindoon-Chittering Area" means and includes all that portion of land contained wholly within the Shire of Chittering, and that land in the Shire of Gingin situated east of a line extending north-south through the intersection of the centre line of the Narngulu-Millendon Railway and the centre line of Weld Street, Gingin.

66. Helicopters:

The carriage of passengers or goods, where such carriage is being undertaken by means of a helicopter. For the purposes of this exemption, the term "helicopter" means a heavier-than-air aircraft supported in flight by the reaction of the air on one or more normally power-driven rotors on substantially vertical axes.

67. Fertiliser—Margaret River Area:

The carriage of fertiliser from the place of its production within a radius of 16 kilometres from the Bunbury Post Office to any place within the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River.

68. Minerals Exploration:

The carriage, in a vehicle owned by a person engaged in exploration for minerals, of—

- (a) machinery, instruments and other technical or scientific equipment for use in carrying out such exploration; and
- (b) the carriage, within the area embracing the Shires of Coolgardie, Boulder, Dundas, Menzies, Sandstone, Leonora, Laverton, Meekatharra and Wiluna and the Town of Kalgoorlie, of other goods for use in carrying out such exploration at places situated more than 80 kilometres from a railway and more than 16 kilometres from the Malcolm-Laverton Road.

For the purposes of this exemption, the term "exploration" means any one or more of the following:—

- (i) geological mapping, geophysical surveys, systematic search for areas containing minerals and search by drilling or other means for minerals within those areas; and
- (ii) search for ore within or in the vicinity of an ore-body by drives, shafts, cross-cuts, winzes, rises and drilling,

but does not include operations in the course of working a mining or oil producing property.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION ACT, 1966.

(d) A firebreak 10 feet wide shall be cleared not less than 1 chain and not more than 5 chains from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks, homesteads and fuel storage areas by 30th November, 1973, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or haystack cleared of all inflammable material by 15th December, 1973.

(e) The control officer can approve a well burnt roadside as a substitute for a firebreak inside the property. No burning to be done on road verges of the Donnybrook-Kojonup Road.
