- (b) at least fifty feet wide immediately surrounding any drum or drums situated on the land which are normally used for storage or fuel, whether they contain fuel or not, and also immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land.

The firebreaks shall be properly ploughed with the soil turned completely over, and all bush, grass, debris, etc., cleared off the said break or all bush, grass and all other infiammable materials shall be completely removed from the break by other means. The break shall be constructed under or through all intervening fences, in order that a continuous break is established.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 1st November, 1973, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be carried out in accordance with section 18 (2) of the Bush Fires Act.

## Notice to All Owners and/or Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, you are hereby required on or before the first day of October, 1973, to clear of all infiammable material firebreaks not less than seven feet wide in the following positions on all land owned or occupied by you and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of infiammable material up to and including the fifteenth day of April, 1974:—

- (1) Around the boundaries of all land owned or occupied by you which has been cleared for agricultural purposes including land under pasture, stubble or crop.
- (2) Inside and along the common boundaries with any road or railway which intersects the land.
- (3) Within five chains of the perimeter of each building or haystack or group of buildings or haystacks and enclosing the same.
- (4) Immediately surrounding any building or haystack on such land.

### Townsites of Dongara and Denison.

Owners or occupiers of land in the townsites of Dongara and/or Denison are hereby required to remove infiammable material or to clear firebreaks on the land prior to the thirty-first day of October, 1973, and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks or the land free of infiammable material until the fifteenth day of April, 1974, as follows:----

- (a) Where the area of land is one-half of an acre or less all infiammable material on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land; and
- (b) where the land exceeds one-half of an acre in area firebreaks at least seven feet wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material immediately inside all external

boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

- (1) where the area of the land is one-half of one acre or less all infiammable material on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land; and
- (2) where the land exceeds one-half of one acre in area, firebreaks at least 10 feet wide shall be cleared of all infiammable material immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove infiammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 1st October, 1973, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Infiammable material" is defined for the purpose of this notice to include bush, timber, boxes, cartons, paper and 'ike infiammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The prohibited burning period will be from 1st October, 1973, to 30th April, 1974.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

#### (Section 33.)

#### Shire of Mullewa

PURSUANT to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of October, 1973 to plough, scarify, cultivate, or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free from all infiammable material until 31st March, 1974, firebreaks of not less than 7 feet in width in the following positions of the land owned or occupied by you:—

- (1) Inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the porperty or properties owned or occupied by you.
- (2) Around all paddocks under crop.
- (3) Where buildings or haystacks are situated on property, additional firebreaks, not less than 7 feet in width, must be provided within 5 feet of the perimeter of such buildings or haystacks, in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings or haystacks. If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be obtained to construct such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any such variation will only be granted where the Bush Fire Control Officer for the area has first signified his approval to the variation.

Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts a constructed road, the owner or occupier has, after obtaining the approval of the Authority which has the control and management of such road, burned or cleared the bush between the road formation and the boundary of his land, such firebreak will be accepted as complying with the requirements of this notice as far as it applies to the abutting boundaries of the property.

SHIRE OF BASSENDEAN TOWN PLANNING SCHEME, No. 2-NORTH WESTERN AREA SCHEME

THE Shire of Bassendean under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

#### SCHEME TEXT.

#### Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Bassendean Town Planning Scheme No. 2—North Western Area Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

### Responsible Authority.

2. The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Bassendean (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following Maps form part of this Scheme:—

- (1) 6 Chain Key Plan.
- (2) 200 ft. Land Use Map.

(3) Sheet A 100 ft. Land Use Map.

- (4) Sheet B 100 ft. Land Use Map.
- (5) Sheet C 100 ft. Land Use Map.
- (6) Sheet D 100 ft. Land Use Map.
- (7) 200 ft. Scheme Map.
- (8) Sheet A 100 ft. Scheme Map.
- (9) Sheet B 100 ft. Scheme Map.
- (10) Sheet C 100 ft. Scheme Map.
- (11) Sheet D 100 ft. Scheme Map.

#### Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the lands which are coloured blue on the 6 chains key plan. The said Area is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. The remainder of the Scheme Area is hereinafter referred to as "the Subdivisional Area".

#### General Objects.

- 6. The general objects of the Scheme are:---
  - (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
  - (b) To make suitable provision for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
  - (c) To make suitable provision for roads and traffic transportation and residences within the Scheme Area.
  - (d) To ensure the proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage and to provide adequate drainage areas and drainage compensating basins.
  - (e) To provide for the reticulation of water to and throughout the Scheme Area.
  - (f) To make provision for land to be used for public open space public recreation and local authority purposes within the Scheme Area.
  - (g) To facilitate the supply of gas in the Scheme Area.
  - (h) To make provision for deep sewerage throughout the Scheme Area.

#### Scheme Works.

7. The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—

- (a) The Scheme Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such minor variations as may with the approval of the Town Planning Board be determined by the Council.
- (b) The lands shown as roads on the Scheme Map of which the carriageway is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earthworks undertaken.
- (c) All roads within the Scheme Area shall where considered desirable by the Council be repaired and reconstructed.
- (d) The lands shown as footways on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for that purpose and shall be paved.

- (e) Levelling filling and drainage works shall be carried out where necessary or desirable.
- (f) The lands coloured light blue on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for drainage purposes and drainage reserves.
- (g) The lands coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for public open space and local authority purposes.
- (h) Basic development of public open space within the Scheme Area will be carried out provided that no such development shall be carried out until all the land to be set aside for public open space has been acquired.
- (i) Those buildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision will be demolished or otherwise removed and in cases considered desirable by the Council such fences and buildings may be reerected.
- (j) Facilities shall be provided for the disposal of sewage by connecting the lands to a sewer.

#### Acquisition of Land.

8. The land within the Scheme Area (or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme) shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

#### Closure of Roads and Rights-of-Way.

9. Those roads and rights-of-way which are shown on Land Use Map but are not shown on the Scheme Map or are shown thereon as closed roads and closed rights-of-way shall be closed and the land used for the purpose shown on the Scheme Map.

#### Valuations.

10. The lots shown on the Land Use Map (hereinafter called "old lots") shall be valued as at the 8th day of December, 1965, on which date the Council passed a resolution to prepare the Scheme and each owner will as soon as the valuation has been made be notified of the value so placed on his old lot. Any parcel of land on the Land Use Map having an area of less than one acre which either as one parcel or in conjunction with contiguous land held in common ownership has subdivisional potential prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme shall be valued on an area basis substantially in proportion to the value of one acre parcels of land in similar positions and the shape and position of the subject land shall be taken into consideration in making the valuation.

11. The lots within the Subdivisional Area created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "New Lots") shall be valued as at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme as residential land on Sheets A, B and C and as Industrial Land on Sheet D, on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out.

12. The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him to ascertain the value of the land assuming that there are no buildings, structures or fences thereon.

13. If an owner objects to the value placed on his Old Lot he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been served with notice of the said value or revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner, the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

14. If a value placed on a lot shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the value placed on the other lots and make such re-valuations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected shall forthwith be notified of any change in value so made.

#### Owner's Value Ratio.

15. From the sum of the values of the New Lots within the Subdivisional Area shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the New Lots. The Owner's Value Ratio is the relationship between the sum of the values of the Old Lots within the Subdivisional Area and the net values of the New Lots within the Subdivisional Area.

#### Owner's Interest in Scheme.

16. Each owner of an Old Lot or portion of an Old Lot in the Subdivisional Area shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in the Scheme of a value equal to the value of his Old Lot or the portion thereof within the Subdivisional Area increased in the ratio of the Owner's Value Ratio determined in accordance with Clause 15 hereof if the net values of the New Lots exceeds the sum of the values of the Old Lots and decreased in the said ratio if the net value of the New Lots is less than the sum of the value of the Old Lots.

#### Council's Land.

17. The land described in Part 1 of the First Schedule hereto has been acquired by the Council for the purposes of the Scheme and shall be made available by the Council upon payment to it of all costs relative to the purchase or acquisition of the lands and improvements thereon together with compound interest thereon from the date of each expenditure until the repayment at the rate of eight per cent (8%).

18. The Council shall in respect of the land described in Part 11 of the First Schedule have similar rights to an increase value ratio replacements lots and otherwise as have other owners of land within the Scheme Area.

#### Costs of Scheme.

19. The Scheme shall be debited with-

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the scheme.
- (b) The costs of the works to be carried out, less any contributions received from the Shire of Bayswater in respect of works carried out on roads on the boundary of that Shire.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation and any payment to be made under Clause 24 hereof.
- (d) The estimated compensation and costs payable under Clause 20 hereof.
- (e) The cost of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (f) The costs of the land described in Part 1 of the First Schedule hereto and interest thereon in accordance with Clause 17 hereof.
- (g) The costs of extension of water mains and any contribution made or to be made to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board in respect of sewerage and drainage works.

- (h) The cost of altering existing electricity water sewerage drainage or telephone services or of providing exceptional services rendered necessary by the Scheme to the extent to which and in cases where the Council considers the cost justified.
- (i) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to complete the Scheme.

#### Estimate of Compensation.

20. In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots pursuant to the provisions of this Scheme the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

#### Allocation and Disposal of New Lots.

- (a) The lots shown in the Second Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "salable lots") shall be set aside and subject to the provisions of Clauses 35, 36 and 37 hereof shall be sold to pay the costs of the Scheme.
- (b) The owners of the old Lots in the Subdivisional Area in Column No. 1 of the Third Schedule hereto will be offered the New Lots shown opposite in Column No. 2.

#### Nature of Offers.

22. The offer mentioned in paragraph (b) of Clause 21 hereof will be made either with an offer of payment of money or subject to the owner making a payment of money in order that the total value of the New Lot or Lots offered and the new value of any land within the Scheme Area not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner together with or subject to a payment in money is equal to the owner's interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with Clause 16 hereof. The offer may be made in the alternative giving the owner the right to accept either a lot or lots subject to a payment by him or to accept no lots or a lesser number of lots with a payment by the Council to him.

23. The owners from whom land has been resumed but to whom no offer of land is made shall be offered a cash payment equal to that owner's interest in the Scheme.

24. If an owner shall in the opinion of the Council suffer any additional damage or inconvenience by reason of the reduction in size of the lot on which a dwelling-house is erected or by reason of the proximity of a road or lot boundary to such dwelling-house the Council shall offer to such owner such sum (if any) as it (acting on the advice of the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department) considers equitable. The said offer shall be made with the offer mentioned in Clause 22 hereof to the intent that the owner may not accept the offer mentioned in Clause 22 either wholly or in part without accepting the offer in this clause mentioned.

25. The offers mentioned in the above Clauses shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by registered post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Councill and shall specify the New Lot or Lots (if any) the subject of the offer and the Old Lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owner's interest in the Scheme, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be, and how the amount is calculated. 26. If a pipe drain has been or is to be laid across land within a New Lot such New Lot may be offered or sold expressly subject to the condition that the transferee shall grant to the Council or to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board as decided by the Council a drainage easement over so much of the lots as is required for the drain. If the Council shall itself have granted an easement to the said Board the lot shall be transferred subject to such easement.

27. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

28. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall unless the time shall have been extended by the Council be deemed to have been rejected.

29. If an owner does not accept all the lots offered to him the lots accepted by him shall be treated as being in payment on account of the owner's interest in the Scheme. The remainder of his interest in the Scheme shall be paid in cash.

30. An owner who accepts the offer shall be liable to pay to the Council all rates which would have been payable on the land acquired from him if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the New Lots to him.

31. If an offer be accepted wholly or in part it shall be accepted by the owner on the basis that such acceptance is a complete bar to any claim for compensation which the owner may have had in respect of the resumption from him of the Old Lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of the Scheme but shall not bar him from participating in the profits of the Scheme.

32. If an owner does not accept an offer wholly or in part he shall not be entitled to any interest under the Scheme or to participate in the Scheme profits.

#### Registration of Transfers.

33. The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with the Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893 as amended and return it to the Council for registration or if the owner shall fail to make payment of any money which may be due by him to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the Transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for a cash payment equal to his interest in the Scheme and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

#### Salable Lots and Rejected Lots.

34. Any lot offered to but not accepted by an owner in accordance with the Scheme or the subject of a transfer not completed as aforesaid may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears.

35. The Council may sell the salable lots and the rejected lots either by public auction tender or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained. 36. If in the opinion of the Council it shall not prove necessary to sell all the salable lots in order to pay the costs of the Scheme the Council may re-allocate some or all of the lots unsold to owners where it considers it just and equitable so to do and the cash payment to be made or received under Clause 22 shall be adjusted accordingly.

37. The Council may instead of selling all or any of the salable lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

#### Profits of Scheme.

38. If the Scheme shall show a profit such profit shall be distributed among each of those owners of land within the Scheme Area who accept wholly or in part the offers mentioned in Clauses 21 to 24 in the proportion which the value of the owner's Old lot or portion thereof within the Scheme Area bears to the total value of the Old Lots within the Scheme Area whose owners have accepted wholly or in part the offer made to them pursuant to Clauses 21 to 24. For the purpose of this clause the values shall be those finally made pursuant to Clauses 10 and 12 hereof. The right to participate in the profits shall not in the absence of agreement devolve to any person not the owner of the land who accepted an offer made by the Council pursuant to this Scheme.

39. If an owner or other person entitled to portion of the profits of the Scheme cannot be found the Council may after the expiration of six (6) years from the date on which the owner's share in the profits was ascertained expend the amount of his portion of the profits in the improvement of the Scheme Area and thereafter such owner shall have no claim in respect of such money.

#### Encumbrances on Title.

40. In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser mortgagee chargee or lessee the Council shall not make any payments to nor transfer a New Lot to the owner without the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance or unless subject to similar encumbrances.

#### Rates and Taxes and Moneys owing to Council.

41. The Council shall deduct from any moneys payable to an owner the amount of any unpaid rates or taxes and any other moneys owing by the owner to the Council. Except in the case of pensioners no new lot shall be transferred to an owner unless all moneys owing by him for rates and taxes have been paid.

### Powers of Council.

42. The Council in the conduct and management of the Scheme shall in addition to the powers and authorities hereinbefore mentioned have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land or buildings within the Scheme Area.
- (e) To agree to the extension of time for payment of any moneys payable to it and to accept security for the payment thereof.

Second Schedule.

- (f) To postpone the implementation of the Scheme for such period as it thinks fit or to implement the Scheme in stages dealing with portions of the Scheme Area from time to time as the Council considers proper in the circumstances.
- (g) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (h) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of the land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specific parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specific purpose.
- (i) To enter into such agreements and arrangements with the Crown the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board or other Government instrumentality or Statutory Authority as seem proper to the Council for any purpose connected with this Scheme or the carrying out of any works within the Scheme Area.
- (j) To remove alter or demolish any building which obstructs the observance or carrying out of this Scheme.
- (k) To make minor variations to the survey design where necessary or desirable.
- (1) To let or lease on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit any land or buildings acquired by it pursuant to this Scheme.

### Development of Scheme Area in Sections.

43. The Council may if it so desires proceed with the application and implementation of this Scheme in respect of the portion of the Scheme Area lying north of Walter Road or the portion of the Scheme Area lying south of Walter Road in such order as it thinks fit.

#### Arbitration.

44. Any dispute or difference as to the valuation of land under Clause 13 hereof may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council.

#### Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.

45. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of the Scheme shall be made within six months of the coming into operation of the Scheme or if a notice of resumption or a notice of rescission under Clause 33 hereof has been given to a claimant claims may be made within six months of the issue of such notice.

2. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended-

- (a) by substituting for the words "one inch", in line two of subregulation (1), the passage "25 millimetres";
- (b) by substituting for the passage "4 of an inch nor greater than 1 inch", in lines one and two of paragraph (b) of subregulation (2), the passage "6 millmetres nor greater than 25 millimetres";
- (c) by substituting for paragraph (a) of subregulation (5) the following paragraph-
 - (a) each letter and numeral whether upright or horizontal shall be not less than 75 millimetres in height or length as the case may be, and shall be spaced not less than 20 millimetres from any adjacent letter or numeral and the overall size of any wool brand shall be not less than 175 millimetres by 75 millimetres.

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 9 the following regulation:—

9A. (1) The brand on a horse shall be not less than 100 millimetres long and 30 millimetres in height when the animal is fully grown.

(2) The brand for cattle shall be not less than 150 millimetres long and 50 millimetres in height when the animal is fully grown.

(3) The earmark symbol for cattle shall be not less than 12 millimetres in any dimension when the animal is fully grown.

(4) The earmark symbol for sheep shall be not less than 4 millimetres and not more than 20 millimetres in any dimension when the animal is fully grown.

4. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for subregulation (3) the following subregulation:—

(3) Each symbol of the brand shall be 20 millimetres long by 12 millimetres wide with 20 millimetres between each symbol.

5. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 20, the following regulations:—

20A. (1) The owner of cattle, other than registered stud cattle, imported into the State, shall, within 14 days of importation identify those cattle—

(a) where they are not earmarked, by an earmark or brand;

(b) where they are earmarked, by a brand,

registered under the Act.

(2) The owner of sheep, other than registered stud sheep, imported into the State, shall, within 14 days of importation identify those sheep-

(a) where they are not earmarked, by an earmark and brand;

(b) where they are earmarked, by a brand,

registered under the Act.

20B. The Proprietor or any other person for the time being having the custody and control of any stock of any type prescribed for the purposes of section 46 of the Act which are on a run or on any place where stock are sold or disposed of, may cause or permit the stock to be removed from the run or place without a waybill—

- (a) where the stock is consigned from a saleyard or holding paddock within the Metropolitan Abattoir District declared in accordance with the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1971, to an abattoir within that district or to the port of Fremantle for export and where an application has been made to the Registrar of Brands in the form of Form No. 8 in the schedule to these regulations and the Registrar has issued a certificate of exemption in the form of Form No. 9;
- (b) where an application in the form of Form No. 10 in the Schedule to these regulations has been made and the Registrar of Brands has issued a certificate in the form of Form No. 11 authorising the applicant to issue permits for the movement of the stock when necessary and when such a permit has been issued and contains a description of the stock concerned, their origin, destination and date of movement.

20C. Where, because of the multiplicity of brands or earmarks on stock, a person furnishing a waybill or permit to move stock cannot describe thereon the brands and earmarks as required, the word "various" shall be deemed to be sufficient description except where the animal is carrying a tall tag in accordance with regulation 80 of the Enzotic Diseases Regulations made under the Stock Diseases (Regulations) Act, 1968, in which case the tail tag number shall be recorded on the waybill or permit.

20D. The original and each copy of a waybill or permit to move stock shall be signed by the person having custody of the stock at the time of initiating the movement and by the person taking delivery of the stock.

20E. (1) Subject to regulation 20F of these regulations, the original and first copy of a waybill or permit to move stock shall accompany the stock during the whole of the movement and the original shall be retained by the purchaser or where there is no purchaser by the consignee for a period of six months.

(2) The first copy shall be retained for a period of six months by the carrier or other person delivering the stock.

20F. Where stock are being moved by rail the original waybill or permit to move stock shall accompany the stock, together with the railway consignment note and the person delivering the stock to the railway will retain the first copy for a period of six months.

20G. All waybills, permits to move stock and copies thereof shall be produced on demand to a Police Officer or Stock Inspector during the six months that they are required to be retained.

 - (b) each breeding animal over six months of age, not being introduced directly from a State or Territory free of brucellosis or from an officially accredited brucellosis free herd has been subjected to an approved serological test for brucellosis, not more than 30 days before inovement, with negative results; and
 - (c) each animal is derived from a herd in which brucellosis is not known or suspected to exist;
 - (d) the cattle were derived from herds in which neither Johne's disease nor trichomoniosis has been known or suspected to exist during the five years immediately prior to movement;

- (ii) if the worker does not leave any such dependants, but leaves any dependants in part dependent upon his earnings, such sum, not exceeding in any case the amount payable under the foregoing provisions, as may be agreed upon, or in default of agreement may be determined, by proceedings under this Act, to be reasonable and proportionate to the injury to the said dependants; and
- (iii) if he leaves no dependants, the reasonable expenses of his medical attendance and burial, the cost of which may be awarded to and upon the application of any person by whom the expenses were properly incurred, or to whom the whole or any part of the expenses is owed.
