Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to that Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State, by any person; and whereas such types of bread

as are respectively specified in the schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, excluding Rottnest Island, and that is within a radius of twenty-eight miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the schedule to this proclamation.

RIGHTS IN WATER AND IRRIGATION ACT, 1914-1971.

Department of Public Works, Perth, 25th September, 1973.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the by-laws made pursuant to the provisions of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1971, by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (acting as the Irrigation Board for the Ord Irrigation District) set forth in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule. BY-LAWS

Principal by-laws. 1. In these by-laws the by-laws for the Ord Irrigation District published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th July, 1963, and thereafter amended by notices so published are referred to as the principal by-laws.

By-laws 4A 2. The principal by-laws are amended by substituting for by-laws substituted. 4A and 4B the following by-laws:—

4A. A person shall not-

- (a) use a boat on Lake Kununurra within one mile of the Kununurra Diversion Dam without the permission of the Minister when a red warning flag is displayed adjacent to the dam control tower;
- (b) take a boat within 300 feet of the upstream face of the Kununurra Diversion Dam or within the area marked off by buoys adjacent to the spillway on Lake Argyle;
- (c) within 5 miles of the upstream face of the Kununurra Diversion Dam, drive a motor boat at a speed exceeding 5 knots, within 100 feet of the banks;
- (d) moor a boat on Lake Kununurra or Lake Argyle without the permission of the Minister;
- (e) ply for hire with a boat or boats on Lake Kununurra or Lake Argyle without the permission of the Minister;
- (f) moor or navigate a boat on Lake Kununurra or Lake Argyle in such a position or manner as to obstruct, impede or otherwise interfere with or endanger the safety of other boats or persons;
- (g) organise, promote or conduct a regatta or display of aquatic sports on Lake Kununurra or Lake Argyle without the permission of the Minister.
- 4B. (1) The Minister may from time to time set aside and designate, by exhibiting appropriate signs and buoys on the banks and waters of Lake Kununurra and Lake Argyle, areas within which swimming, boating or water-skiing is permitted at all times or is restricted or prohibited.
- (2) The designation of areas under sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law has the effect of prohibiting other areas from being used for that purpose.

By-law 6 amended.

- 3. By-law 6 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for sub-bylaw (2) the following sub-bylaw:—
 - (2) The discharging of firearms and the shooting, trapping or taking of fauna on any works or on any land reserved for or vested in the Minister within a mile of any dam is prohibited.
- By-law 7 4. The principal by-laws are amended by substituting for by-law substituted. 7 the following by-law:—
 - 7. (1) A vehicle, conveyance, item of plant, or animal shall not be driven, operated, taken, or ridden in such a manner as to endanger or damage the channels, structures, channel access roads or any works, or shall not be taken across the same, except at places where crossings are provided.
 - (2) No pumping equipment, pipeline, engine, road, jetty or similar structure is to be installed or constructed on the land abutting any reservoir, river or other works without the permission of the Minister and any such works constructed with the Minister's permission shall be maintained in a state satisfactory to the Minister.
- By-law 8 5. The principal by-laws are amended by substituting for by-law substituted. 8 the following by-law:—
 - 8. (1) A person shall not cast away, throw or deposit or cause to be deposited on any works or in the vicinity of any works any rubbish, litter or other objectionable matter of any kind or in any place where it, or its components is, or is likely to be, or become, a source of pollution.
 - (2) A person shall not carry on any operations or do any act which creates or tends to create any nuisance on or in the vicinity of any works.
 - (3) An occupier of property or a person using a boat shall not allow any sullage or effluent containing—
 - (a) sewage, unless treated to a standard approved by the Minister;

- (b) acidity or alkalinity outside the range of a pH value between pH5 and pH9;
- (c) poisons; or
- (d) any substance which is likely-
 - (i) to contribute to the formation of sludge or other deposit:
 - (ii) to contribute to the formation of scum, fat, oil, grease or floating material;
 - (iii) to contribute to the formation of objectionable odours or discoloration;
 - (iv) to be injurious to marine or animal or human life; or
 - (v) to deplete excessively the oxygen content of waters

to be discharged in or upon any works.

- (4) Without limiting the generality of the provisions of subbylaw (3) of this by-law, wastes shall not be discharged into any of the waters in any works—
 - (a) if it is reasonably practicable to dispose of them satisfactorily, in some other manner;
 - (b) unless every reasonable and practicable step has been taken to improve the quality and appearance of the wastes, prior to discharge; and
 - (c) unless they conform with a bacterial, physical chemical composition approved by the Minister.

By-law 10 amended.

- 6. By-law 10 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for sub-bylaw (1) the following sub-bylaw-
 - (1) A person shall not, without the consent of the Minister-
 - (a) trespass upon, injure or interfere in any way with any works:
 - (b) do or cause to be done anything likely at any time to injure or interfere with any works;
 - (c) plant any tree or noxious weed within such distance from any works that any part of the tree or noxious weed or any roots thereof at some or any future time will be likely to injure or interfere with any works;
 - (d) fish from the structure of the Kununurra Diversion Dam or from any part of the bed of the river for a distance of 10 chains downstream of the Diversion Dam structure.

By-law 26 amended.

- 7. By-law 26 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for sub-bylaw (2) the following sub-bylaw:
 - (2) Subject to the payment of \$3.00 for each acre foot applied for, the water right referred to in this by-law is-

Three acre feet of water per acre of holding.

By-law 31A added.

The principal by-laws are amended by adding after by-law 31 the following heading and by-law-

Pipe and Pump Supplies.

- 31A. (1) The Minister may in respect of any land not subject to an irrigation rate but within the irrigation district, grant to the owner or occupier of that land, or to both of them, permission to take water from any work by means of pumping, or may construct works to supply water to that land, subject in either case to the condition that the water is taken as and when it is available in the channel, drain, watercourse or other work and no special service for the individual consumer by the Department is involved.
- (2) The annual charges for water taken or supplied in accordance with the provisions of sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law shall be as follows
 - (a) For irrigation of land-
 - (i) if the supply of water is from works installed and is a gravity supply to the property—\$6.50 per acre (or part thereof) charged on the maximum area watered in any one year;
 - (ii) if the supply of water is pumped by temporary or permanent equipment from any work where supplies are generally sufficient to provide an assured service—\$4.00 per acre (or part thereof) charged on the maximum area watered in any one year, but if supplies are intermittent as in a drain-\$3.00 per acre (or part thereof) charged on the maximum area watered in any one year.
 - (b) For household supplies, including a garden cultivated in conjunction with the house and for stock water supplies to non-rated properties other than feed lots
 - (i) if supplies are generally sufficient to provide a continuous service such as from a channel— \$15.00 per service;
 - (ii) if supplies are intermittent as in a drain-\$11.00 per service.

- (c) For supplies to feed lots for stock-water and dust prevention \$40.00 for up to 10 acres of feed lots plus \$8.00 for each 2 acres (or part thereof) of feed lots in excess of 10 acres, on the maximum area of feed lot operated during the year.
- (d) For supplies other than those set out in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this sub-bylaw as determined by the Minister but not less than those set out in paragraph (b) of this sub-bylaw.
- (3) (a) The Minister may from time to time limit either or both the area of land to be watered and the amount of water to be supplied under the provisions of this by-law.
- (b) The Minister may at any time at his discretion cancel any permission granted by him under sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law.
- (4) (a) Where it is necessary for the Minister to construct works for the purpose of supplying water under the provisions of this by-law, either or both the owner and occupier shall be liable to pay the cost of constructing those works, plus a capitalised maintenance charge determined by the Minister.
- (b) Access to the offtake, pump or other means of supply shall be constructed in a manner approved by the Minister and maintained to his satisfaction.
- (c) The owner or occupier of land supplied with water in accordance with the provisions of sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law shall be responsible to safeguard his plant and equipment from any damage which may result from the operation of the Minister's works.
- (d) Where any offtake, pump or other means of supply has been installed or left in place without the Minister's permission and where the owner or occupier has been notified in writing to remove same and has not done so within 14 days then the Minister may direct removal forthwith and may confiscate the plant and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or occupier.
- (e) The Minister may remove forthwith any offtake, pump or other means of supply which are endangering works or hindering operation of works and may recover the cost of so doing from the owner or occupier.
