Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which, after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1971, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Wyndham, more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder, a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Kununurra Fire District to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of The Second Schedule to the Act, immediately below the words "Kojonup Fire District", the words "Kununurra Fire District" and in column two opposite that name, the name of the local authority, "Shire of Wyndham."

Local Government Act, 1960-1973.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 3257/65 (R.3942).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the

Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Shire of Exmouth has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which has been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

REGULATION 12.

Direction No. 1.

I, ALBERT HENRY TOGNOLINI, Deputy Commissioner of Main Roads, being charged with the administration of the above cited regulation, hereby direct as follows:—

- 1. In this Direction-
 - "warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square;
 - "warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "OVERWIDTH", "OVERLENGTH", "OVERHEIGHT" or any combination of those words, as the case may require, in black lettering, 200 millimetres in height, on a yellow ground.
- 2. A limitation imposed by this direction does not affect the power of a member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector to impose additional limitations relating to time, place or circumstance.
- 3. A member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector may, subject to the Traffic (Vehicle Weights) Regulations, 1973, issue permits for the carrying of indivisible loads that will occasion any or all of the dimensions of a vehicle or combination of vehicles, to exceed those, or that project for a greater distance than that prescribed by the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, where—
 - (a) the overall length of vehicle or combination of vehicles and load does not exceed 22 metres or the overall width does not exceed 3.05 metres, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to have a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overwidth, overlength, overheight or any combination of those things, as the case may require, affixed to the front and rear:
 - (ii) warning flags are to be placed at the points of greatest extension of the load or of the vehicle and load;
 - (iii) the vehicle is not to travel during the hours of darkness;
 - (iv) the warning signs provided by this paragraph are to be removed or covered when the movement of the load has been completed;
 - (v) the permit is to be carried on the transporting vehicle; and
 - (vi) the permit is liable to immediate cancellation on the infringement of any condition to which its issue is subject;
 - (b) the width exceeds 3.05 metres but not 4.3 metres, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it; and
 - (ii) the headlights of the transporting vehicle and pilot vehicle are to be kept burning; until the movement of the load is completed;

- (c) the height exceeds 4.3 metres but not 4.9 metres, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to be escorted by a member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector;
 - (ii) the movement is to be made in conformity with the requirements of the State Electricity Commission; and
 - (iii) approval for the movement of the load is to be obtained from the Postmaster-General's Department of the Commonwealth.
- 4. Permits shall not be issued for the carrying of loads that exceed the maximum dimensions, or that project for a greater distance than that mentioned in clause (3) of this direction, without the specific approval of the Commissioner of Main Roads, in each case

I, RONALD HENRY SIMS, Acting Commissioner of Police, acting pursuant to Regulation 1101 (4) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1965 do hereby give the following general direction:

Movement of Agricultural Implements.

- 1. The movement of overwidth and overlength agricultural implements on roads is authorised subject to their being towed by licensed vehicles and to the following conditions, namely:—
 - (a) the movement may be made by virtue of this direction, alone—
 - (i) where the combined length of the towing vehicle and the implement or implements being towed does not exceed 16.8 metres;
 - (ii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3 metres, if a warning flag is affixed at each lateral extremity of the implement; or
 - (iii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 3 metres, but not 4.9 metres, if a warning flag is affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement and a warning sign, indicating that the tow is overwidth, is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement;
 - (b) the movement may be made by virtue of a permit which a member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector is hereby authorised to issue, where the combined length of the towing vehicle and the implement or implements being towed exceeds 16.8 metres but not 21.5 metres, and, or alternatively, where the width of a towed implement exceeds 4.9 metres but not 6.7 metres, if
 - (i) in the case of an overwidth implement or implements, warning flags are affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement or implements;
 - (ii) the movement is preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth, overlength or both overwidth and overlength vehicle follows it and the movement is followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that such a vehicle is ahead of it, unless the issuing authority, having regard to the topography of the area and environment in which the tow is to operate or any other factors likely to affect

the safe movement of the tow, dispenses with the requirement of a following pilot vehicle;

- (iii) a warning sign indicating that the tow is overwidth, overlength or both overwidth and overlength is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement or the rearmost implement; and
- (iv) the permit is carried on the towing vehicle.
- (c) overwidth and overlength signs are to be covered or removed on the completion of the movement:
- (d) a movement is not to be made during the hours of darkness and a tow is not to be parked on the made portion of a road;
- (e) where the tow comprises an overwidth implement or two or more implements, the

- movement is not to be made at a speed exceeding 20 m.p.h.;
- (f) where the tow comprises an implement exceeding 3 metres in width, the movement is not to be made within 25 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, without the approval in writing of the Commissioner of
- 2. The movement of agricultural implements exceeding $6.7~\mathrm{metres}$ in width or of a combined length exceeding 21.5 metres may not be made without my specific authority.
- 3. A permit may be issued in respect of a single movement or in respect of a number of movements, within a period not exceeding twelve months.

PART 30.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR PEDAL CYCLES.

- 3001. A bicycle shall be capable of being braked by either or both of the following means:
 - (a) an effective foot brake operated by turning the pedals in the reverse direction; or
 - (b) an effective hand operated brake fitted to the rear wheel having the operating handle fixed in a position providing for convenient operation.

A bicycle shall have a bell or other effective warning device fixed in a convenient position.

3003. The handle bar of a bicycle shall extend not less than 200 millimetres nor more than 330 millimetres on each side of the centre of the bicycle and the height of the upper most point of the handle bar shall not exceed the height of the upper most part of the seat by more than 300 millimetres.

3004. The horizontal distance between the axle of the front wheel of a bicycle and a line dropped vertically from the centre of the pivot head bearing on the front tube of the frame shall not exceed 250 millimetres.

The overall width of any equipment or load carried on a bicycle shall not exceed 660 millimetres.

(1) A bicycle shall have affixed a reflector which will effectively reflect red light when illuminated by the headlight of a vehicle approaching from the rear and that reflector shall-

- (a) comply with the requirements specified in regulation 503 and have a reflective area of not less than the area of a circle of 38 millimetres diameter;
- (b) be mounted on the rear part of the bicycle at a height which is not less than 330 millimetres nor more than 1 metre;
- (c) be mounted vertically and facing to the rear in such a manner that the light reflected from the headlight of a vehicle approaching from the rear is clearly visible to the driver of that vehicle.
- (2) The reflector may be in the form of a reflecting lens fitted to the rear lamp.
- (3) A bicycle shall not have affixed a reflector capable of reflecting red light in the forward direction.

 3007. (1) Where ridden during the hours of darkness a

bicycle shall have affixed thereto-

- (a) upon the front of the bicycle, a lighted headlight showing a clear white light to the front visible under normal atmospheric conditions at all distances up to 200 metres;
- (b) upon the rear of the bicycle, a lighted rear light showing a clear red light to the rear visible under normal atmospheric conditions at all distances up to 200 metres.
- (2) The head and tail lights shall be fixed in positions such that the vertical distances from the ground to the centres of the lights shall not be less than 330 millimetres.

3008. Where a rear mudguard is fitted to a bicycle the surface of the mudguard facing to the rear shall be white or silver in colour.
