#### Child Welfare Act, 1947-1972.

##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

- (c) appoint such persons, male or female, as he thinks fit, to be Members of any particular Children's Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, in exercise of the powers conferred by the abovementioned provisions of the said Act and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth—

- (a) establish a special Court to be called a Children's Court at Wickham, to exercise jurisdiction within the area known as the Carnarvon Magisterial District; and

(b) appoint—

- (i) Ronald Fred Rasmussen, Stipendiary Magistrate, Carnarvon, to be Special Magistrate for; and
- (ii) Mervyn Edward Baker, Frederick McLeod and Keith Eustace Mullet, to be Members of,

the Children's Court at Wickham.

- (a) by deleting paragraph (f); and
- (b) as to the Schedule—

- (i) by deleting the word "Yilgarn", in column 4 opposite the item "Kalgoorlie Valuation Appeal Court";
- (ii) by adding the passage "Bruce Rock," after the passage "Brookton," in column 4 opposite the item "Narrogin Valuation Appeal Court";

#### Schedule A.

##### Addition to the West Ward.

Lands and Surveys Corres. 2552/71.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation south-easterly of the south-western side of Gairdner Street with the north-western boundary of Avon Location P, a point on the present boundary of the West Ward, and extending north-easterly along the north-western boundary of Location P aforesaid to the north-western corner of Lot 3 of Location P, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 8095; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundaries of that lot and part of Lot 63, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 4875, and onwards to a line parallel to and 412 metres south-easterly from the north-western boundary of Location P; thence generally south-westerly along that line to the eastern side of Road Number 9151; thence generally northerly along that side to the north-western boundary of Location P aforesaid, a point on the present boundary of the West Ward, and thence generally north-easterly along that boundary to the starting point.

##### Addition to the Central Ward.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the westernmost corner of Avon Location 62, a point on the present boundary of the east Ward, and extending south-easterly along the south-western boundary of that location to a line parallel to and 412 metres south-easterly from the north-western boundary of Location P; thence generally south-westerly along that line to the prolongation south-easterly of the north-eastern boundary of Lot 2 of Location P, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 19147; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary to the north-western boundary of Location P; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the prolongation south-easterly of the north-eastern side of Burgoyne Street, a point on the present boundary of the East Ward, and thence generally north-easterly along that boundary to the starting point.

Declaration Under and Pursuant to Section Seven F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act, 1957-1972.

I, THE HONOURABLE JOHN TREZISE TONKIN, the Treasurer, having been requested under the provisions of section seven F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act, 1957-1972 (in this notice called "the Act") to do so, do by this notice declare the following matters, that is to say:—

- (a) the maximum amount which the Treasurer may guarantee under the Act during the period commencing the 19th May, 1958, and ending the 31st December, 1974, is the sum of twenty six million dollars (\$26,000,000);

- (d) for the purposes of section seven B of the Act the maximum amount which an approved institution shall advance to a borrower on the giving of a first mortgage of a new house or the maximum amount of the purchase moneys which an approved institution shall permit to remain payable under a contract for sale and purchase of a new house before an indemnity is given by the Treasurer under the Act, is seventy per centum (70%) of the value of a new house, as defined in the Act.

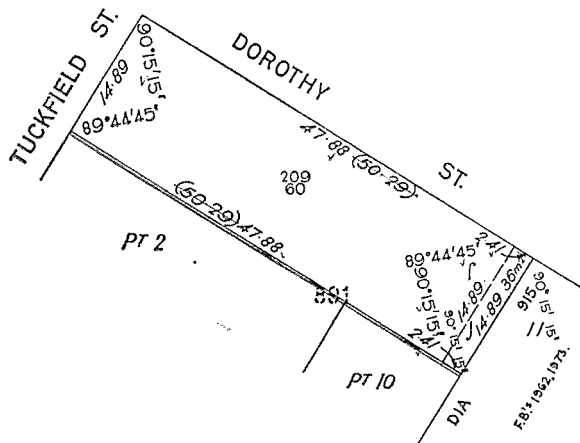

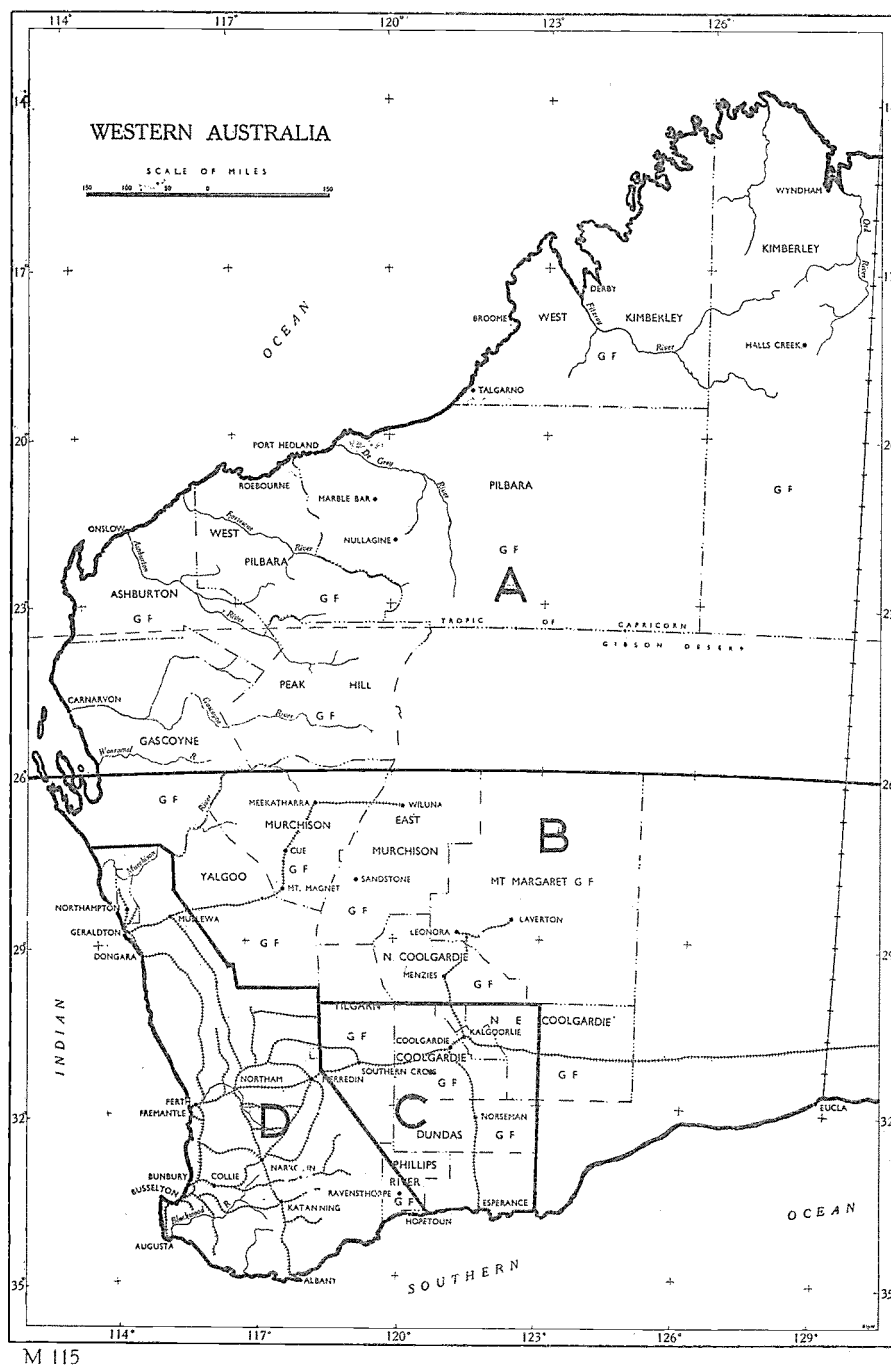
