DEATH DUTY ASSESSMENT ACT, 1973.

State Taxation Department,
Perth, 27th December, 1973.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Death Duty Assessment Act, 1973, and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1972, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Death Duty Assessment Act Regulations.

2. These regulations apply to and in relation to the death and estate of every person dying on or after the date of the coming into operation of the Act.

3. In these regulations:—

“the Act” means the Death Duty Assessment Act, 1973.

4. Every statement required to be filed under section 13 of the Act, or ordered to be filed under section 14 of the Act, shall be in the form of the statement set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

5. Where property comprised in the estate of a deceased person for the purposes of the Act—

(a) passes to a person for an estate for life; or

(b) passes by way of the accrual by survivorship of a beneficial interest in an annuity,

the Commissioner may require the age of the life tenant or annuitant to be verified by the production of a birth certificate or other satisfactory evidence.

6. An assessment of duty is not required to be raised for any amount not exceeding five dollars.

7. The following fees are prescribed in relation to the following matters—

(a) for inspecting any statement filed for the purposes of the Act in the office of the Commissioner by any administrator or other person	2.00
(b) for supplying a copy of any statement referred to in paragraph (a) of this regulation in addition to the fee payable under that paragraph	1.00
(c) for supplying a copy of any schedule attached to the statement referred to in paragraph (b) of this regulation— per page	0.20
(d) for certifying the copy or extract of any statement to be a true copy or extract thereof in addition to the fees payable under paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this regulation	1.00

8. (1) A body corporate that, pursuant to section 45 of the Act—

(a) satisfies any policy of life assurance; or

(b) registers, records or gives effect to any dealing with any policy of life assurance,

without the consent of the Commissioner shall—

(c) direct the attention of the person to whom the proceeds of the policy are paid, or in whose favour the dealing is registered, recorded or given effect, to the provisions of the Act relating to the filing of a statement and liability for duty; and

(d) forthwith furnish to the Commissioner a return giving particulars to the satisfaction or dealing.

(2) Where it has not been necessary for a body corporate carrying on the business of life assurance in this State to furnish any return pursuant to sub-regulation (1) of this regulation during a period of six months ending on the last day of the month of June or December in a year, that body corporate shall furnish to the Commissioner as soon as practicable after that last day of June or December, as the case may be, a return stating that no satisfaction of, or dealing with, a policy requiring the consent of the Commissioner under section 44 of the Act has been made, registered, recorded or given effect to by it during that period without his consent.

9. (1) A bank that, pursuant to section 46 of the Act,—

(a) makes any payment pursuant to section 139 of the Administration Act, 1903; or

(b) allows any withdrawal to be made by a surviving owner of a joint account,

without the consent of the Commissioner shall—

(c) direct the attention of the person to whom the payment is made, or who makes the withdrawal, to the provisions of the Act relating to the filing of a statement and liability for duty; and

(d) forthwith furnish to the Commissioner a return giving particulars of the payment or withdrawal.

(2) Where it has not been necessary for a bank to furnish any return pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation during a period of six months ending on the last day of the month of June or December in a year, that bank shall furnish to the Commissioner as soon as practicable after that last day of June or December, as the case may be, a return stating that no payment or withdrawal requiring the consent of the Commissioner under section 44 of the Act has been made or allowed by it during that period without his consent.

(3) In this regulation the term "bank" has the same meaning as it has for the purposes of section 46 of the Act.

10. Returns required to be filed under regulations 8 and 9 of these regulations shall be made on, or substantially in the form of, such forms as the Commissioner may approve from time to time for use in connection with those regulations.

11. (1) Where administration has been granted the Master of the Supreme Court may by order under his hand, require any person to attend before him at such time and place as he may direct, for examination on oath for obtaining information to aid the administrator in carrying out any of the objects of the Act.

(2) A person upon whom an order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation has been served shall not, without lawful excuse, neglect or fail to attend before the Master in accordance with the order or refuse to answer any question lawfully put to him at the examination.

12. A person, body corporate, or bank who or which contravenes or fails to comply with any of these regulations commits an offence.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.

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INSTRUCTIONS TO PERSONS COMPLETING STATEMENT.

A. General Instructions.

(1) Care should be taken to include all the assets and liabilities of the estate as failure to include any asset or part of the estate of a deceased person renders the Administrator liable to a penalty.

(2) Furnish with this Statement—(For persons domiciled in Western Australia only).

- (a) A copy of the will (if any) of the deceased, and all Codicils.
- (b) A copy of the Death Certificate.

(3) Statements and enclosures should be filed with the Commissioner of State Taxation, Central Government Buildings, Cnr. St. George's Terrace, and Barrack Street, Perth.

B. Instructions for Completing Statements of Assets and Liabilities.

(1) Show full details of the various assets and liabilities in numbered schedules and attach schedules hereto. Attach valuations where applicable.

(2) Real Property.

- (a) Give references to Titles and full description of each parcel.
- (b) Furnish a copy of any valuations obtained or show full details of the nature and value of all improvements.

(3) Leasehold Property.

Particulars should be included in a schedule as to the term, rental, improvements, covenants and the basis of valuation, together with a copy of any valuation.

(4) Real Property or Personal Property held in Co-ownership.

Include in a schedule showing whether held as a Joint Tenant or a Tenant in Common, the value of the deceased's interest, date of creation thereof and if such date was within three years of the date of death, the amount contributed by each Joint Owner.

(5) Domicile—

(i) Local—

- (a) Include in Part (A) (i) on page 2, all Real Property and Personal Property (including Notional Property) situated within W.A.
- (b) Include in Part (A) (ii) on page 2, all Personal Property (including Notional Property) situated outside W.A.
- (c) Include in Part (B) on page 2, all Debts, (except debts charged on Real Property situated outside W.A.).
Section 12 (duty free bequest) Deduction and Funeral Deduction (Section 11 (1) (a) (ii)).

(ii) Foreign—

- (a) Include in Part (A) (i) on page 2, all Real Property and Personal Property (including Notional Property) situated within W.A.
- (b) Include in Part (B) on page 2:
 - (i) all debts owed to residents of W.A., or contracted to be paid in, or charged on property in, W.A.;
 - (ii) the value of any duty free bequest, devise or legacy payable from property situated within W.A.

(6) Money in Bank, Building Society or Credit Union.

State the name(s) of the bank(s) Building Society or Credit Union in which money is held and the amount in each account (including interest to the date of death). State also the dates and periods of Fixed Deposits, the rate of interest and the amount of interest accrued to date of death.

(7) Notional Property.

In addition to including the value of outright gifts made within three years before the death of the deceased, if property has been disposed of for valuable consideration to any person, including a relative, by blood, marriage or adoption, of the deceased within three years before such death and the consideration was less than the value of the property, the excess of the value of the property over the amount of the consideration must be included as a gift *inter vivos*. Please note the exemption from duty of certain gifts.—As to notional property generally—Refer Section 10 (2) (a) to (p) and Section 10 (3) to (11).

(8) Dates of Birth of Life Tenants and Annuitants and whether "dependent" (for definitions of "dependent child" and "dependent parent" refer section 5 of the Act) should be included in Item 5 of page 1 or submitted in the form of an appropriate schedule.

Note: Any person making a false statement shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 (see section 60).

SCHOOL BOUNDARIES.

1. Blackmore and Hainsworth Primary Schools: The boundary between Blackmore Primary School and Hainsworth Primary School has been amended as follows:

From the northern side of Warwick Road, south along the north-south alignment of Hudson Avenue and its extension through to the

junction of Nanovich Avenue and Bardsley Avenue, southeast along Bardsley Avenue to Bures Court, southwest along Bures Court and its extension to Beach Road.

Children living in the boundary part of Hudson Avenue (both sides) and east thereof shall attend the Hainsworth Primary School. Children living in the boundary part of Bardsley Avenue (both sides) and west thereof, and in Bures Court (both sides) and west thereof, shall attend the Blackmore Primary School.

2. Coolbellup Primary School:

The western boundary for the Coolbellup Primary School has been amended as follows:

Extending it northwards along Follington Avenue from Winterfold Road to South Street.

Children living on the east side of Follington Avenue and east thereof north of Winterfold Road, and attending a Government school shall attend the Coolbellup Primary School.

3. Coolbinia Primary School:

The boundary previously designated for the Coolbinia Primary School is hereby cancelled.

4. Craigie Primary School:

The boundary for the above school is as follows:

From where Mullaloo Drive meets the north-western corner of the Beenypup Sewerage Treatment Works Reserve, southwest along Mullaloo Drive to Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue to Whitfords Avenue, east along Whitfords Avenue to the northwestern corner of the Pinnaroo Cemetery Reserve, north along the extension northwards of the western boundary of the Pinnaroo Cemetery Reserve and north and then northeast along the western boundary of the Beenypup Sewerage Treatment Works Reserve to Mullaloo Drive.

The boundary parts of Mullaloo Drive (south side), Marmion Avenue (east side) and Whitfords Avenue (north side) are included in the area for the Craigie Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in grades one to three inclusive in 1974, and living within the boundary for the Craigie Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Craigie Primary School.

Children from this area who will be in grade four, five, six or seven in 1974 shall attend the Springfield Primary School.

5. Davallia Primary School:

The boundary for the above school is as follows:

From the junction of Everingham Street with North Beach Road, north along Everingham Street and its extension northwards to Warwick Road, east along Warwick Road to the alignment of the proposed Stephenson Freeway, southeast along the alignment of the proposed Stephenson Freeway to the intersection with the proposed North Perimeter Highway, west along the alignment of the proposed North Perimeter Highway to Okely Road, south along Okely Road to North Beach Road, and west along North Beach Road to Everingham Street.

The boundary parts of Everingham Street (both sides), Warwick Road (south side), Okely Road (both sides) and North Beach Road (north side) are included in the area for the Davallia Primary School.

The area bounded on the south by Warwick Road, on the west by Okely Road, and on the east by the alignment of the proposed Stephenson Freeway is to be an optional area between Davallia Primary School and Sorrento Primary School for 1974.

Children attending Government schools and in grades one to five inclusive in 1974, and living within the boundary for the Davallia Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Davallia Primary School, except that children living in the optional area, as designated above, and in grades one to five in 1974, may attend either the Davallia Primary School or the Sorrento Primary School in 1974, and children in grades one to four inclusive in 1973

from the area bounded by Everingham Street, North Beach Road and Okely Road and who are currently (1973) attending the North Beach Primary School, shall have the option of continuing at their present (1973) school or transferring to the Davallia Primary School at the beginning of the 1974 school year.

6. East Maddington Primary School:

The boundary for the above school is as follows:

Ellis Brook from where it is crossed by Rush-ton Road, along Ellis Brook in a general south-westerly direction to Albany Highway, north-west along Albany Highway to Helm Street, northeast along Helm Street to Westfield Street, north along Westfield Street to Revesby Street, northeast along Revesby Street and its extension to Dellar Road.

The boundary part of Albany Highway (east side) and Westfield Street (both sides), and the boundary streets of Helm Street (both sides), and Revesby Street (both sides) are included in the area for the East Maddington Primary School.

The area bounded by Weston Street, Maddington Road, Alcock Street, Revesby Street, Westfield Street and Helm Street is to be an optional area between East Maddington Primary School and Maddington Primary School. The boundary part of Alcock Street (both sides) is included in the optional area. The boundary street of Weston Street (both sides) and the boundary part of Maddington Road (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in grades one to four inclusive in 1974 and living within the boundary for the East Maddington Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the East Maddington Primary School, except that children living in the optional area, as designated above, and in grades one to four inclusive in 1974, may attend either the East Maddington Primary School or the Maddington Primary School in 1974.

7. Glendale Primary School:

The boundary for the above school has been amended as follows:

The western boundary is the alignment of the proposed Stephenson Freeway between Beach Road on the north and Balcatta Road on the south, and the northern boundary is Beach Road between the alignment of the proposed Stephenson Freeway on the west and Wanneroo Road on the east.

Children in grade six and grade seven in 1974, and living within the area for the Davallia Primary School, shall attend either the Glendale Primary School or the North Beach Primary School.

8. Hillman Primary School:

The boundary for the above school is as follows:

From the junction of Ennis Road with Dixon Road, south along Ennis Road to Carvie Street, east along Carvie Street to Milina Street, south and southeast and northeast along Milina Street and its extension to Dixon Road.

The boundary parts of Ennis Street (both sides) and Carvie Street (both sides) and the boundary street of Milina Street (both sides) are included in the area for the Hillman Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in grades one to six inclusive in 1974, and living within the area for the Hillman Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Hillman Primary School.

9. Langford Primary School and Yale Primary School:

The following has been approved as an optional area between the above two schools:—

The area bounded on the southwest by Cameron Street, on the southeast by the railway, on the northeast by Spencer Road, and

on the northwest by the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway.

The boundary parts of Cameron Street (northeast side only) and Spencer Road (south-west side only) are included in the optional area.

10. Lymburner Primary School:

The boundary for the above school is as follows:

From the coast, east along Whitfords Avenue to Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue to the alignment of Hepburn Avenue, west along the alignment of Hepburn Avenue to the coast.

The boundary part of Whitfords Avenue (south side only) and the boundary part of Marmion Avenue (west side only) are included in the area for the Lymburner Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in grades one to seven inclusive in 1974 and living within the boundary for the Lymburner Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Lymburner Primary School.

11. Montrose Primary School:

The boundary for the above school is as follows:

Amberton Avenue from the junction with Warwick Road, south and then southwest along Amberton Avenue to Hainsworth Avenue, southeast and south along Hainsworth Avenue to Beach Road, east and then southeast along Beach Road to Uganda Road, north along Uganda Road to Warwick Road, northwest and then southwest and west along Warwick Road to Amberton Avenue.

The boundary parts of Amberton Avenue (east side), Beach Road (north side), Uganda Road (both sides) and Warwick Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Hainsworth Avenue (east side) are included in the area for the Montrose Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in grades one to seven inclusive, in 1974, and living within the area for the Southwell Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Southwell Primary School, except that children living in the optional area, as designated above, and in grades one to seven in 1974, may attend either the Southwell Primary School or the Hamilton Hill Primary School in 1974, and children in grade seven in 1974 from the area defined above and currently attending Hamilton Hill Primary School may remain at their present (1973) school or may transfer to the Southwell Primary School at the beginning of the 1974 school year.

14. Springfield Primary School:

The boundary for the above school has been amended as follows:

The eastern boundary is Marmion Avenue between Mullaloo Drive on the north and Whitfords Avenue on the south, and the southern boundary is Whitfords Avenue between Marmion Avenue on the east and the coast on the west.

15. Warwick Primary School:

The boundary parts of Westfield Road and First Road are optional to either Westfield Park Primary School or Kelmscott Primary School. The boundary parts of Third Avenue (both sides) and Blantyre Way (both sides) are included in the area for the Westfield Park Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in grades one to seven inclusive in 1974 and living west of the boundary for the Westfield Park Primary School, as defined above, shall attend the Westfield Park Primary School, except that children living in the boundary parts of Westfield Road and First Road, as designated above, shall have the option of attending either the Westfield Park Primary School or the Kelmscott Primary School.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations the regulations made under the provisions of the Public Trustee Act, 1941-1972 as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th July, 1956 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
2. These regulations shall come into operation on the 1st January, 1974.
3. Part A of the Second Schedule of the principal regulations is amended:—
 - (a) by deleting the expression "3 per centum," in line two of paragraph 1 and substituting the expression "3½ per centum," ;
 - (b) by deleting the expression "2½ per centum;" in line two of subparagraph (a) of paragraph 1 and substituting the expression "3 per centum;" ; and
 - (c) by deleting the expression "3 per centum," in line three of paragraph 2 and substituting the expression "3½ per centum,".
