WHEREAS by Section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-72, it is provided that the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members and whereas by section 19 (1) (b) (ii) of the said Act, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment: Now, therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint the persons named in the Schedule hereto to be Members of the Children's Court at the place mentioned.

Land Act, 1933-1971. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1971, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 3788/69.—That Reserve No. 31530 should vest in and be held by the City of Stirling in trust for the purpose of "Recreation".

Corres. 3714/69.—That Reserve No. 31532 should vest in and be held by the City of Stirling in trust for the purpose of "Recreation".

Corres. 2847/69.—That Reserve No. 31569 should vest in and be held by the City of Stirling in trust for the purpose of "Recreation".

Corres. 2757/72.—That Reserve No. 32396 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Irwin in trust for the purpose of "Tourist Information Bay".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1971. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 637/70.

WHEREAS by Section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1971, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said Section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid: and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 32398 (Rockingham Lot 1484) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the Shire of Rockingham to be held in trust for "Aged Persons Home Site": Now, therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1169/69 "E".

Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965.

I, ATHOL LOGAN MOORE WEDD, Commissioner of Police, acting pursuant to Regulation 1101 (4) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, do hereby rescind the order published in the Government Gazette of 26th October, 1973, and give the following general direction:—

Movement of Agricultural Implements.

- 1. The movement of overwidth agricultural implements on roads is authorised subject to their being towed by licensed vehicles and to the following conditions, namely:—
 - (a) The movement may be made by virtue of this direction, alone-
 - (i) where the combined length of the towing vehicle and the implement being towed does not exceed 16.8 metres;

- (ii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3 metres, if a warning fiag is affixed at each lateral extremity of the implement; or
- (iii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 3 metres, but not 4.9 metres, if a warning flag is affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement and a warning sign, indicating that the tow is overwidth, is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement.
- (b) The movement may be made by virtue of a permit which a member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector is hereby authorised to issue, where the width of a towed implement exceeds 4.9 metres but not 6.7 metres if—
 - (i) in the case of an overwidth implement warning fiags are affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement;
 - (ii) the movement is preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it and the movement is followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that such a vehicle is ahead of it, unless the issuing authority, having regard to the topography of the area and environment in which the tow is to operate or any other factors likely to affect the safe movement of the tow, dispenses with the requirement of a following pilot vehicle;
 - (iii) a warning sign indicating that the tow is overwidth is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement; and
 - (iv) the permit is carried on the towing vehicle.
- (c) Overwidth signs are to be covered or removed on the completion of the movement.
- (d) A movement is not to be made during the hours of darkness and a tow is not to be parked on the made portion of a road.
- (e) Where the tow comprises an overwidth implement the movement is not to be made at a speed exceeding 20 m.p.h.
- (f) Where the tow comprises an implement exceeding 3 metres in width, the movement is not to be made within 25 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, without the approval in writing of the Commissioner of Police.
- 2. The movement of agricultural implements exceeding 6.7 metres in width may not be made without my specific authority.
- 3. A permit may be issued in respect of a single movement or in respect of a number of movements, within a period not exceeding twelve months.

In respect of land owned or occupied by you within the Townsites of Cuballing, Yornaning, or Popanyinning you shall clear of all infiammable material, firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

3. Fuel dumps.

In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any fuel dump in addition to the requirements of above para, you shall remove all infiammable material from all land occupied by drums used for storage of liquid fuel whether the drums contain liquid fuel or not, including the land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed and to a distance of at least 10 feet outside the perimeter of any drum, stack of drums, or drum ramp.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks on the land as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 26th December 1973 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.
