##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1971, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said Section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid: And Whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 32415 (Norseman Lot 580) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Sisters of Mercy Perth (Amalgamated) Incorporated to be held in trust for "Schoolsite (Roman Catholic)". #### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

## Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.C.B. 447/65.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas the Dampier Mining Company Limited of 37 St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Section has, duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the Section and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability and has deposited at the Treasury a security to wit, a bond for Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Dampier Mining Company Limited from the operation of Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973

for a period terminating on the 31st day of October, 1975 provided that as from the 1st day of May, 1970 the said Company shall obtain from the State Government Insurance Office and maintain for the balance of the duration of this exemption a policy of insurance for the full amount of its liability to pay compensation to its workers in respect of Pneumoconiosis.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1972, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Shires of Bayswater and Bassendean.

610 mm Main in Grey Street, Bayswater, Walter Road to Clune Street.

The construction of a 610 mm diameter water main approximately one thousand five hundred and thirty metres in length, with valves and all other necessary apparatus, and shown on plan M.W.B. 12319.

  - Part XI.—Fees and Penalties (Rules 34-36).
  - Part XII.—Common Seal (Rule 37).
  - Part XIII.—General Penalty (Rule 38).
  - First Schedule—Forms.
  - Second Schedule—Fees.
3. In these rules—
  - (a) "the Act" means the Dental Act, 1939-1972; and its amendments;
  - (b) a form referred to by number means the form so designated in the First Schedule to these rules or a form to the like effect with such variations as the circumstances may require.

## PART II.—MEETINGS.

4. (1) Where, in order to discharge the business of the Board, it is necessary to hold an ordinary meeting of the Board, the meeting shall be held on the first Friday of the month, at such time and place as the Board appoints; but, if that day is a public holiday or is, for any other sufficient reason, not convenient, the Board may by resolution appoint some other day for the holding of the meeting.
- (2) Unless the Board resolves otherwise, the order of business at every ordinary meeting shall be:—
  - Confirmation of Minutes of the previous meeting.
  - Applications for registration.
  - Ordinary Business, including postponed and adjourned matters.
  - Special business.
  - Correspondence and Committee reports.
  - Letters and business arising therefrom.
  - Financial statement.
  - Accounts for payment.
  - Registrar's report.
  - Notices of motion.
  - Any other competent business.
5. A special meeting of the Board shall be summoned by the Registrar on the written requisition of the President or of any two members, and the Registrar shall give three days' notice of the meeting and that notice shall indicate briefly the business of the proposed meeting.
6. Every complaint against a dentist or dental therapist shall be dealt with by a special meeting of the Board convened by the Registrar for the purpose.
7. (1) Four members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.
- (2) Where, after the expiration of thirty minutes from the time appointed for the commencement of a meeting, a quorum is not present, the meeting shall be adjourned to such day and time, being not more than seven days from the date of the adjourned meeting, and to such place as the members, or a majority of the members, or, if only one, as that member and the Registrar, then present shall appoint; and notice of that meeting shall be given in the manner prescribed by rule 5 of these rules for special meetings.

A resolution, act, matter or thing done or authorised to be done at a prior meeting shall not be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intended rescission or amendment is contained in a notice given to members in the manner prescribed by rule 5 of those rules for special meetings.

9. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar and those minutes, if and when confirmed, shall constitute a record of the proceedings to which they relate.

10. Proceedings at any meeting of the Board are not invalidated by reason only of the omission to give due notice of the meeting to one or more members of the Board or of the non-receipt of a notice by a member.

#### PART III.—THE REGISTRAR.

11. The Registrar appointed to that office by the Board shall—

- (a) hold office subject to the Act and these rules and during the pleasure of the Board;
- (b) discharge the duties imposed upon him by the Act and these rules;
- (c) be in attendance at his office on such days and during such hours as the Board directs;
- (d) consult the President on any business requiring attention between meetings of the Board;
- (e) be responsible for the safe custody of all documents and property belonging to the Board;
- (f) present at every ordinary meeting of the Board a statement of the financial transactions of the Board since the presentation of the last prior statement, together with such proof of moneys held or deposited on behalf of the Board, as the Board may require;
- (g) present a balance sheet of the affairs of the Board to the 30th day of June each year, at the ordinary meeting of the Board held in the month of August in that year.
- (h) within two working days after the receipt of any moneys payable to the Board, pay those moneys to the credit of the Board at such Bank as the Board may, from time to time, direct; and
- (i) discharge such other duties as the Board may, from time to time, direct.

#### PART IV.—THE REGISTER.

12. The Registrar shall keep the Register in Form 1.

13. The Register shall be open to inspection by any person at the office of the Registrar, between the hours of ten o'clock and eleven o'clock in the forenoon on every Monday, Wednesday and Friday (holidays excepted), on payment of a fee of fifty cents, as provided by section 22 of the Act.

#### PART V.—REGISTRATION OF DENTISTS OR DENTAL THERAPISTS.

14. (a) For the purposes of subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of Section 44 of the Act, the following dental qualifications are prescribed:—

A primary qualification in dental surgery or dental science of the:—

University of Singapore established as the University of Malaya;  
University of Alberta, Canada;  
University of Manitoba, Canada;  
Dalhousie University, Canada;  
University of Toronto, Canada;  
McGill University, Canada;  
University of Montreal, Canada;  
University of British Columbia, Canada;  
University of Western Ontario;  
University of Saskatchewan;  
University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, South Africa;  
University of Pretoria, South Africa.

(b) For the purpose of paragraph (d) of subsection (2) and of subsection (3) of section 44B, the following dental therapy qualification is prescribed:—

A Diploma in Dental Therapy, Western Australian Institute of Technology.

15. A person desiring to be registered as a dentist or dental therapist shall:—

- (a) make an application on Form 2;
- (b) tender the registration fee prescribed by the Second Schedule to these rules;
- (c) produce proof of his or her identity to the satisfaction of the Board;
- (d) lodge with the Board the relevant diplomas, degrees or certificates, and any other evidence the Board may require in support of the application;
- (e) have attained, in the case of a dental therapist the age of eighteen years or in the case of a dentist twenty one years before applying for registration.

16. For the purposes of considering an application for registration the Board may require the applicant—
- (a) to attend a meeting of the Board and there produce such further evidence as may be required by the Board, in support of the application and there answer any relevant question put to him by the Board; and
  - (b) to support any document or statement relating to the application, by making a statutory declaration as to the validity and correctness of the document or statement.
17. A person who is registered by the Board as a dentist or dental therapist shall be issued with a Certificate of Registration in Form 3.
18. A dentist or dental therapist shall notify the Registrar of any change of address within fourteen days of such change.
19. A person requiring his name to be withdrawn from the Register may make application in Form 4.
20. Any person requiring his name to be re-entered in the Register shall—
- (a) make application in either Form 5 or Form 6 as the case may require; and
  - (b) pay the fee prescribed therefor by the Second Schedule to these rules.
21. A person may make an application in Form 7 for a written statement of the reasons of the Board for—
- (a) its refusal to register him;
  - (b) causing his name to be struck off the Register;
  - (c) its refusal to re-enter his name in the Register;
  - (d) his suspension; or
  - (e) the imposition of a penalty.

#### PART VI.—PRACTICE OF DENTISTRY AND DENTAL SPECIALITIES.

22. (1) A dentist shall not—
- (a) pay, or agree to pay, a remuneration of any kind for the direct or indirect introduction of patients or for the services of any person acting as an intermediary for the procuring of patients;
  - (b) solicit patients or dental work, whether personally, by means of canvassers, by the distribution of cards, or otherwise;
  - (c) insert any advertisement or be a party to any advertisement relating to his profession or the practice thereof beyond an announcement of change of address, commencement or resumption of practice unless the Board has given its consent in writing.
- (2) (a) In each advertisement, the type shall not be larger than that appearing in the body of the leading article of the newspaper in which the advertisement appears and any qualifications shown shall be restricted to those appearing in the Register.
- (b) Each particular advertisement shall not be inserted more than four times.
- (c) A dentist shall not insert an advertisement in a newspaper which is not distributed in the area within which the dentist practices or intends to commence practice.
- (d) notwithstanding the provisions of these rules the Board shall have the right to exempt any person from those relating to advertising where the circumstances are such that the Board considers an alteration or variation should be made.
- (3) A dental therapist has no right of private practice and shall not be a party to any advertisement or exhibit any plates, notice boards, signs, or letter heads in connection with the practice of dentistry.
- (4) A dental therapist shall not give a general anaesthetic, and shall not carry out any procedure while a general anaesthetic is being given unless assisting a dentist in a dental procedure.
- (5) Prior to a dental therapist commencing treatment a dentist shall after examination of a patient issue an instruction in writing to the dental therapist, detailing the actual treatment to be undertaken by the dental therapist.
- (6) Where a dental therapist undertakes a treatment a dentist shall re-examine the patient after a period of not more than six months to ensure that the treatment has been carried out.

23. (1) A dentist shall not refer to himself as an Oral Surgeon, Orthodontist, Pedodontist, Periodontist, or Prosthodontist unless he has applied for and obtained the permission of the Board, in writing.

(2) The Board shall not grant the permission mentioned in subrule (1) of this rule, unless the applicant satisfies the Board that he is possessed of a recognised, higher academic qualification applicable to the specialty in question and further satisfies the Board that he has undertaken at least two years in general practice followed by a period of not less than four years (including any time spent in preparation for the examination for that higher qualification) during which he devoted a substantial part of his time to the practice of such specialty.

(3) Every dentist who practises a specialty with the permission of the Board shall confine his practice to that specialty and shall not practise in partnership or association with any dentist other than a dentist who is registered in the same specialty unless the Board has directed otherwise in writing.

(4) For the purposes of this rule, the term "specialty" means any dental work in Oral Surgery, Orthodontics, Pedodontics, Periodontics or Prosthodontics.

## PART VII.—EXAMINATIONS GENERALLY.

24. Every examination shall be conducted by such person or persons in such manner and at such times and places as the Board may from time to time appoint or direct.

25. An application to sit for any examination shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed by the Second Schedule to these rules, and no fee shall be returned or utilised for a subsequent examination where the candidate fails to gain sufficient marks to satisfy the Board or fails to present himself for examination.

## PART VIII.—LICENCES.

26. (1) Every licence issued pursuant to section 46 of the Act expires (as therein provided) on the 31st day of December in each year next following the date of issue and, so long as his name appears in the register, a dentist shall take out a licence during the month of January following the expiry of the former licence.

(2) A licence shall be in Form 8 and the fee payable on the issue of a licence is such amount, as is set out in the Second Schedule to these rules.

## PART IX.—PLATES, NOTICE BOARDS AND OTHER SIGNS.

27. (1) A dentist shall be entitled to exhibit at the place at which he carries on his profession such plates, notice boards or fixed lights as the Board may approve, bearing only his title as approved by the Board, his name, his business names approved by the Board, his qualifications as entered in the Register, the word Dentist or Dental Surgeon, his hours of attendance and telephone number.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subrule (1) of this rule, a dentist, if authorised by the Board to practise a dental specialty, may, with the consent of the Board, exhibit such of the words, "Oral Surgeon", "Orthodontist", "Pedodontist", "Periodontist" or "Prosthodontist", as he may be authorised by the Board, in lieu of the words, "Dentist" or "Dental Surgeon".

(3) No dentist shall practice under a firm name, unless he has submitted details to the Board together with evidence that the firm name has been registered under the Business Names Act 1962, and has received the authorisation of the Board so to do.

28. (1) The size of the letters and figures on any plate, notice or sign exhibited by a dentist shall be no greater than 10 centimetres in height.

(2) A dentist's name and address shall appear in ordinary type only in the telephone directory.

29. Except as provided in these rules, a dentist shall not be a party to any other form of advertisement or display relating to his profession as a dentist.

## PART X.—COMPLAINTS AGAINST DENTISTS OR DENTAL THERAPISTS.

30. (1) A complaint, or allegation of misconduct, against a dentist or dental therapist may be made by any person or by the Board of its own motion.

(2) Every person making a complaint or allegation against a dentist or dental therapist shall furnish the Board with a statement in writing setting out the grounds of complaint and the matters alleged.

(3) The Board shall consider every complaint or allegation made pursuant to this rule and where, in its opinion, the complaint or allegation is such as requires to be answered, it shall give to the dentist or dental therapist notice to furnish his or her answer, in duplicate, within the space of fourteen days following receipt of the notice.

31. (1) Where the Board, after considering the answer of a dentist or dental therapist, furnished under rule 30 of these rules, decides that an inquiry is warranted or where the dentist or dental therapist does not, within the time limited, furnish such an answer, the Registrar shall cause a summons, in Form 9, to be served on the dentist or dental therapist or to be sent to him at the address shown in the register by such registered post as requires an acknowledgment of receipt.

(2) A summons such as is mentioned in subrule (1) of this rule shall set out the particulars of the complaint or allegation made against the dentist or dental therapist and the date, time and place of the inquiry that the person is required to attend.

(3) Where the dentist or dental therapist has furnished an answer pursuant to notice given under subrule (3) of rule 30 and the Board decides that an inquiry is warranted, the Registrar shall post a copy of the answer to the person making the complaint or allegation, together with an advice of the date, time and place of the inquiry.

32. Where the Board is satisfied that each party to a complaint or allegation has received notice of the date, time and place of the inquiry, it may, in the absence of any party, proceed to hear and determine the complaint or allegation; and may, from time to time, adjourn the inquiry, as it thinks fit.

33. (1) Where the complainant, the dentist, dental therapist or the Board requires the attendance of any person to give evidence or to give evidence and produce documents at an inquiry, the Registrar shall issue a summons to that person in Form 10.

(2) Attendance money in an amount sufficient to meet the expense of the forward journey to the inquiry shall be tendered to every person summoned under this rule.

## PART XI.—FEES AND PENALTIES.

34. The fees, payable to the Registrar, under the Act or these rules, are those set out in the Second Schedule to these rules.

35. The penalty payable upon the restoration of a name to the Register pursuant to section 47 of the Act is \$2 per month or part of a month from the time the first unpaid annual fee for a licence became payable, but such a penalty shall not exceed twenty dollars.

36. (1) For attendance at each ordinary meeting but not exceeding twelve meetings per year—

- (a) the Chairman shall be paid \$15.00; and
- (b) members other than the Chairman shall be paid \$10.00.

(2) For attendance at an inquiry conducted by the Board in accordance with the rules—

- (a) the Chairman shall be paid \$25.00 for every day on which the Board sits to conduct the inquiry; and
- (b) members other than the Chairman who are in attendance shall be paid \$20.00 for every day on which the Board sits to conduct the inquiry.

(3) When any member of the Board is required to use his own vehicle when engaged on the business of the Board he shall be paid mileage at the ruling rate for the State Public Service.

(4) When any member of the Board is required to travel to any place beyond a fifteen mile radius of the G.P.O., Perth, he shall be paid a travelling allowance at the higher scale prescribed for the State Public Service.

## PART XII.—COMMON SEAL.

37. (1) The common seal of the Board shall be in such form as the Board may from time to time determine, and shall be kept in the office of the Board, in the custody of the Registrar who is responsible for its safety.

(2) The common seal shall not be affixed to any document, except pursuant to a resolution passed at a meeting of the Board; and shall be so affixed by the Registrar in the presence of the President, and evidenced by their subscribing the document.

(3) A record of all documents to which the common seal has been affixed shall be kept by the Registrar.

## PART XIII.—GENERAL PENALTY.

38. Every person committing an offence against these rules is liable to a penalty not exceeding forty dollars.

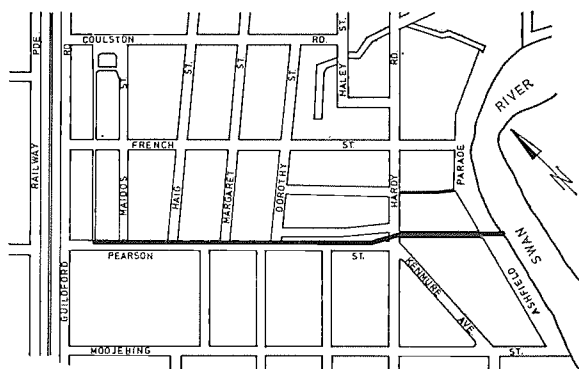

## Interpretation.

## 1. In these by-laws—

“Committee” means the Frankland District Hall Management Committee, appointed pursuant to Section 181 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973.

“the Hall” means and includes the Frankland Hall, Supper Room and Kitchen, and any room or corridor, or stairway, or annexe of such hall or kitchen, and the furniture and equipment therein.

“Secretary” means the Secretary or acting or assistant Secretary to the Committee.

“Council” means the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Cranbrook.

## Applications for Hire.

2. Applications for the hire of the hall, or any portion thereof, shall be made to the Secretary not less than 24 hours before the hour at which hiring is desired, and shall state the purpose for which hiring is desired.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall, or any portion thereof, shall be given in the application for hiring.

4. The Committee reserves the right to refuse to let the hall, any portion thereof, to any applicant for the hiring of the same without assigning any reason for such refusal and may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of the Hall, or portion thereof.

5. Nothing in these by-laws shall be construed to prevent the long term leasing of the hall, or portion thereof, if the Committee so deems expedient on whatever terms the Committee decides.

## Fees and Deposit.

6. Hiring of the Hall, or supper room portion thereof, shall be at the rates set out in the Schedules hereunder except that the Committee may resolve to grant use of the hall, or the supper room portion thereof to an organisation free of charge—

(i) on application, for a specific occasion, or

(ii) in circumstances which meet policy requirements as may be set down, by resolution, by the Committee.

7. The Committee may at any time demand that the hirer shall prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of engagement.

8. In any event of the hiring being cancelled, the hiring fee or deposit may be forfeited at the discretion of the Committee; any deposit or such portion of any deposit as is not forfeited under this by-law shall be repaid by the Council, at the request of the Committee, to the hirer.

9. The hirer of the hall, or any portion thereof, shall maintain and keep order and decent behaviour therein, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these by-laws, and for any damage done to the hall, fixtures or fittings, and shall pay damages as shall be assessed by the Committee. Any article of cutlery or crockery ware not accounted for or in broken or cracked condition shall be paid for at current rates of prices.

10. The hirer of the Hall, or any portion thereof, shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act or any Act or regulations in force for the time being and applicable to the hiring and use of the building. If in the opinion of the Committee, all necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the said Act, or any Acts in force, the Committee may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement, forbid and prevent the use of the hall or portion thereof. The hirer must accept full responsibility in the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions or necessities of this by-law or the non-compliance therewith.

11. In the event of the use of the hall or portion thereof being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding by-law the hirer shall forfeit the full amount of the hire charge and the Committee shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage sustained.

12. No spirituous liquors, wines, ales or spirits shall be brought into or consumed in the hall except when permitted by the Committee in writing and then only in the terms of the permit.

13. No person shall remove the piano from the floor of the main hall to the stage or vice versa, without the permission of the Committee.

14. The driving of nails, tacks or screws into any of the woodwork or walls of the hall is strictly forbidden.

15. No offensive impersonations, or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot or breach of peace, shall be permitted in the hall.

General Behaviour and Conduct.

16. No person shall, in any part of the hall—

- (a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (c) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building; (any person who does, permits or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damages in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws).

17. The Secretary of the Committee or Police Officer shall be permitted free ingress to the Hall or any part thereof, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these by-laws.

18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these by-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable to a penalty.

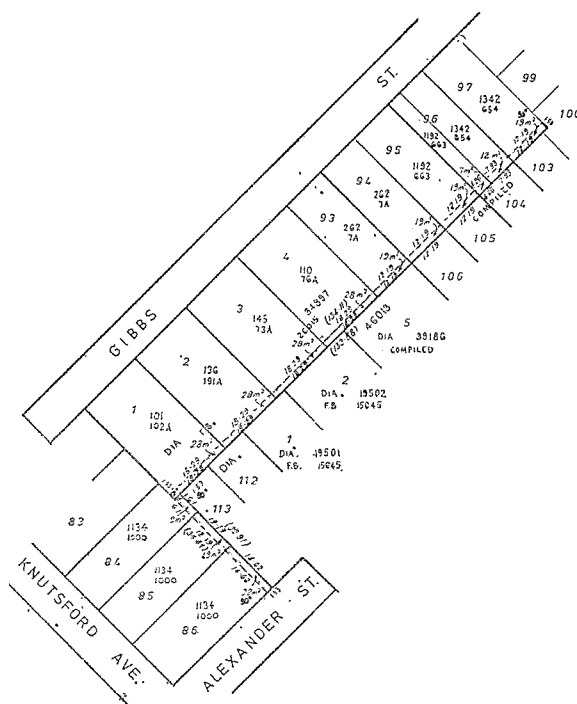
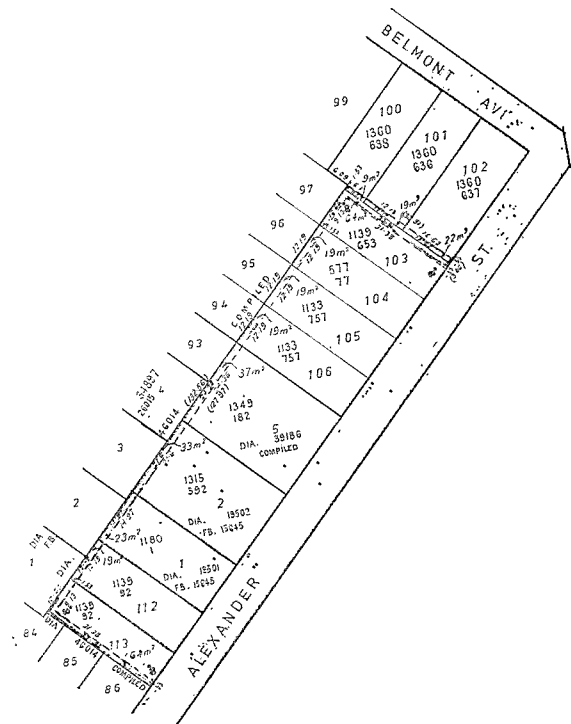
