WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1970, that the Governor, on the recommendation of the Poisons Advisory Committee may at any time and from time to time by proclamation prohibit the sale, supply or use of any poison or substance, whether specified in a schedule to that Act or not, either

absolutely or except upon and subject to such conditions and for such period or periods as the Governor may think fit; and whereas it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 22 of that Act that a proclamation made under that section may be cancelled by a subsequent proclamation; and whereas the Poisons Advisory Committee has recommended to the Governor that analgesic preparations containing salicylic acid; its salts; its derivatives and their salts, phenacetin or paracetamol when sold without prescription be prohibited in accordance with section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1970 unless the principal label of the package or container bears one of the following statements: "WARNING. THIS MEDICATION MAY BE DANGEROUS WHEN USED IN LARGE AMOUNTS OR FOR A LONG PERIOD." or "CAUTION. THIS PREPARATION IS FOR THE RELIEF OF MINOR OR TEMPORARY AILMENTS AND SHOULD BE USED STRICTLY AS DIRECTED. PROLONGED USE WITHOUT MEDICAL SUPERVISION COULD BE HARMFUL.", and that one of these warnings should appear in bold face sans serif capital letters of not less than five points face measurement: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1970, and on the recommendation of the Poisons Advisory Committee, do hereby—

- (a) prohibit in accordance with section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1970, the sale, supply or use of analgesic preparations containing salicylic acid; its salts; its derivatives and their salts, phenacetin or paracetamol when sold without prescription unless the principal label of the package or container bears one of the following statements: "WARNING. THIS MEDICATION MAY BE DANGEROUS WHEN USED IN LARGE AMOUNTS OR FOR A LONG PERIOD." or "CAUTION. THIS PREPARATION IS FOR THE RELIEF OF MINOR OR TEMPORARY AILMENTS AND SHOULD BE USED STRICTLY AS DIRECTED. PROLONGED USE WITHOUT MEDICAL SUPERVISION COULD BE HARMFUL.", in bold face sans serif capital letters of not less than five points face measurement; and

(b) cancel the proclamation made pursuant to that section on the 3rd September, 1969 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th September, 1969.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant

to that Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State, by any person; and whereas such types of bread as are respectively specified in the Schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, excluding Rottnest Island, and that is within a radius of twenty-eight miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the Schedule to this proclamation.

The wrapping referred to is wrapping of polythene, cellophane or waxed paper and which is done at the point of manufacture. It is an implicit provision in the maximum price abovementioned that where two one pound (1lb.) ordinary loaves of bread are sold at the same time to the same person, the price shall not exceed the price of one two pound (2lb) ordinary loaf.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1972.

Metropolitan Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 605441/73.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1972, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor have power to construct provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Town of Mosman Park.

Mosman Park Water Tower.

Construction of an elevated concrete water tower complete with all necessary pipework and apparatus, and shown on plan M.W.B. 12432.

SCHEDULE.

HEALTH ACT, (SCHOOL DENTAL THERAPISTS) REGULATIONS, 1974.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Health Act (School Dental Therapists) Regulations, 1974.

2. In these regulations the Health Act, 1911-1973, is referred to as the principal Act.

3. For the purpose of training persons as school dental therapists pursuant to subsection (2) of section 337A of the principal Act the course of instruction shall be two years and the curriculum shall include the following—

- (a) *Approximately 60 lectures in Human Relations:* An introductory course in general psychology. A follow up course in psychopathology and special applications of psychology in relation to behaviour modification, assessment, counselling techniques, community mental health and the general management of behavioural problems in children. ;
- (b) *Approximately 30 lectures and 30 hours practical in Physiology:* General physiology of cells, biochemistry of the body, the cardio vascular, respiratory, alimentary, cutaneous, renal, endocrine and nervous systems. ;
- (c) *Approximately 30 lectures and 30 hours practical in Anatomy:* General and head and neck anatomy including growth and development of the skull. ;
- (d) *Approximately 30 lectures and 30 hours practical in Histology:* Instruction in general histology and an introduction to dental histology covering embryology, the teeth supporting structures, tongue, lining of the mouth, pharynx and salivary glands. ;
- (e) *Approximately 30 lectures and 30 hours practical in Bacteriology:* A classification and description of bacteria, fungi and viruses. The essentials for growth of bacteria infection including transmission of infection, mechanism of infection, cross infection and focal infection. Immunity both natural and acquired. Oral bacteriology. ;
- (f) *Approximately 50 hours practical in Art and Craft:* ;
- (g) *Approximately 20 lectures and 100 hours practical in Dental Anatomy:* Anatomy of the teeth and supporting structures, morphology of individual teeth, dental physiology and tooth arrangement. ;
- (h) *Approximately 20 lectures and 40 hours practical in Dental Instruments, Equipment and Materials:* Description, care and maintenance of hand instruments and dental equipment. The structure and properties of materials. The composition, properties and manipulation of dental materials.
- (i) *Approximately 100 lectures and 1350 hours practical in Clinical Dentistry:* This course will cover assistance to the dentist, equipment and instruments, preventive measures, irreversible hydrocolloid impressions, restorative dentistry including the principles and details of cavity preparation for amalgam and plastic like materials, pulp protection, insertion and finishing of a restoration, moisture control, restoration in deciduous teeth, child behaviour and management, local analgesia, extraction of loose deciduous teeth, biological considerations in restorative dentistry, classification and emergency treatment of traumatic injuries to the teeth, restoration of badly broken down teeth and clinical emergencies. ;
- (j) *Approximately 30 lectures in Preventive Dentistry:* The nature of dental disease. Prevention of dental caries, prevention of periodontal disease, and dental health education. ;
- (k) *Approximately 10 lectures in Dental Radiography:* Biological effects of X-radiation, Intra oral radiographic technique, Radiographic processing and Radiographic interpretation. ;
- (l) *Approximately 20 lectures in Pharmacology and Therapeutics:* Weights and measures, methods of administering medicines, coverage of various types of drugs likely to be encountered in clinical practice. ; and

- (m) *Approximately 35 lectures in general pathology and clinical medicine:* An outline of the types of diseases, inflammation and repair, infectious diseases, general diseases, deficiency diseases, endocrine dysfunction, circulatory disturbances, blood diseases, nervous diseases, allergies, tumors and cysts.
4. (1) A school dental therapist shall possess the qualifications following:—
- (a) a certificate, in Form 1 in the Schedule to these regulations, issued on the authority of the Minister and evidencing the satisfactory completion of a course of instruction pursuant to these regulations; or
 - (b) subject to subregulation (2) of this regulation a certificate, diploma, degree, licence, or other title, status or document granted by any body or institution, the holding of which in the opinion of the Minister establishes that the holder has the knowledge and skill required to carry out the duties of a school dental therapist in Western Australia.
- (2) A person possessing a qualification of the kind referred to in paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation may, if the Minister so directs, be required, prior to commencing employment in the School Dental Service, to complete satisfactorily a period of not less than one month's in-service training in the Public Health Department School of Dental Therapy.
5. A school dental therapist shall not commence treatment for any school child unless—
- (a) in the case of initial treatment,
 - (i) a medical questionnaire including consent to treatment, in Form 2 in the Schedule to these regulations, has been completed and signed by a parent or guardian of that child and has been read by the supervising dental officer; and
 - (ii) that supervising dental officer has prescribed the necessary treatment; or
 - (b) in the case of subsequent treatment,
 - (i) a medical questionnaire has been completed showing no change in health status and has been seen by the therapist; and
 - (ii) a supervising dental officer has examined the child within the preceding two years.
6. A school dental therapist may perform the following duties and acts of dentistry—
- (a) established procedures associated with chairside assisting and clinic management;
 - (b) dental radiography for routine dental examination;
 - (c) cleaning and polishing of teeth and restorations including the removal of dental plaque and calculus and the topical application to the teeth of preventive agents;
 - (d) administration of infiltration and inferior dental nerve block analgesia;
 - (e) application of rubber dam;
 - (f) the preparation of cavities in deciduous and permanent teeth of pre school and school children;
 - (g) the restoration of deciduous and permanent teeth of pre school and school children with material other than porcelain, gold foil or cast alloys;
 - (h) the emergency treatment of pulp exposures;
 - (i) Forceps extraction of loosened deciduous teeth under local analgesia;
 - (j) the taking of impressions for study casts.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by virtue of Section 17 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1971, I hereby cancel the directions to licensing officers relating to the taking of salmon issued by me on 7th December, 1973, and which were published in the *Government Gazette* of 14th December, 1973.

Following the hearing of appeals by persons who considered themselves aggrieved by not having been named as a concession holder, the receipt of representations by organisations representing the

fishing industry, and for the purpose of ensuring good management and orderly fishing in the fishery the following directions are now issued:

1. The taking of salmon by means of fishing nets in Western Australian waters between Busselton and Cape Beaufort on the south-west coast of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the South-west Coast Salmon Fishery) shall be managed as a concession or limited entry fishery and for this purpose the following conditions shall apply:
 - 1.1 A professional fisherman, shall not take salmon by means of fishing nets in the South-west Coast Salmon Fishery unless he holds a professional fisherman's license which has been specifically endorsed "South-west Coast Salmon Fishery".
 - 1.2 A licensing officer shall not issue any person with a license endorsed to take salmon in the South-west Coast Salmon Fishery unless the Director of Fisheries has agreed that such an endorsed license may be issued to that person.
 - 1.3 A fishing boat shall not be used and a person shall not allow or suffer it to be used for the taking or transporting of salmon in the South-west Coast Salmon Fishery unless the license for that boat has been endorsed to allow it to be so used.
2. The names of persons who may be licensed as concession holders authorised to take salmon by means of fishing nets in the South-west Coast Salmon Fishery subject to the conditions and restrictions as shown, during the period from January 1, 1974 to December 31, 1976, are as follows:

Concessions to take salmon by means of fishing nets in the South-west Coast Salmon Fishery shall not be transferred between one person and another, nor shall a concession holder be replaced by any other person, except with the express approval of the Director of Fisheries, who may approve or refuse either such a transfer or replacement at his discretion.
5. Any concession holder or authorised member of a salmon fishing team who holds a professional fisherman's license which has been endorsed with an authorisation to engage in salmon fishing in the area specified in this notice shall not engage in salmon fishing in any other area.

6. Any concession holder or authorised member of a salmon fishing team who, in the opinion of the Director, commits a breach of any condition of his license or fails to observe any condition imposed by this notice, may lose his concession temporarily or permanently as the Minister directs.

PLANNING SCHEME No. 1 (DERBY).

THE Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of:—

- (a) controlling land development;
- (b) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

Part I—Preliminary.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of West Kimberley Town Planning Scheme No. 1 (Derby) hereinafter called "The Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the Derby townsite.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of West Kimberley (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:—

Part I—Preliminary.

Part II—Zones.

Part III—Non-Conforming Uses.

Part IV—General Provisions.

Part V—Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

Scheme Map; Land Use Map.

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

Part II—Zones.

2.1 Subject to clause 2.2, the Scheme area is divided into the following zones:—

Residential;
Public Purposes;
Commercial;
Warehouse;
Industrial;
Special Use;
Recreational and
Rural.

2.2 All of the land outside the zones delineated on the Scheme Map, but within the Scheme area, is classified Rural except that the land known as Reserve 26818 is reserved for Harbour Works.

2.3 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 2.4 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table excepting the Special Use Zone where the permitted use is limited to that specifically shown against the land on the Scheme Map.

2.4 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

"P" = A use that is permitted under this Scheme.

"AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.

"IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.

"X" = A use that is not permitted.

3.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

(a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 3.3 when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, for a sufficient period which in the Council's opinion proved that the owner or the occupier intended to cease the non-conforming use, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

(b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

Part IV.—General Provisions.

4.1 Within the Scheme Area no sign, hoarding, bill-board, advertising device or like structure shall be erected save with the written approval of the Council.

4.2 The Council shall not approve the erection of any of the structures or devices referred to in clause 4.1 of this Part if it proposes to offer a service or commodity which is not sold or produced on the same lot on which the structure would be erected save for this section.

4.3 In exercising its discretionary powers under Part II of this text the Council shall have regard to the nature of the use proposed, the amount of pedestrian and motor traffic generated, preservation of the amenity of the area and the need for the provision of building setbacks, landscaping and off-street car parking.

Part V.—Administration.

5.1 Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council in exercising its discretionary powers under the terms of Part II or Part IV may appeal to the Hon. Minister for Town Planning within 30 days of the Council's decision and the Minister's decision shall be final.

5.2 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

5.3 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

Part III—Non-Conforming Use of Land.

3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent:—

- the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 3.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-Laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

3.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

(3) Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice is served under by-law 2 of these by-laws, shall comply with such notice within the time therein specified and any owner or occupier of land who fails to comply with the terms of the notice so served shall be guilty of an offence.

(4) Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove such refuse, rubbish, litter, old vehicles, disused material or second hand building materials as required by a notice given by the Council, the Council is authorised without payment of any compensation in respect thereof to remove it and dispose of it at the expense of and recover in a Court of competent jurisdiction, the amount of the expenses from the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

(5) Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws shall be liable to:—

(a) a maximum penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100); and

(b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of ten dollars (\$10) per day.
