Corres. 1825/73.—That Reserve No. 32610 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Esperance in trust for the purpose of "Public Pound."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

# Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.



# PARLIAMENTARY SALARIES TRIBUNAL. INTERIM REPORT, 1974

- On the 19th March, 1974 the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly advised the Under Secretary, the Premier's Department, of an impending problem relating to the electorate allowances fixed by the Tribunal's Determination dated the 29th June, 1971. He pointed out that pursuant to the Electoral Districts Act, 1947-65 changes had been made in certain of the electorates set out in the Schedule to Part I (ii) of the abovementation. in the Schedule to Fart I (II) of the abovementioned Determination, which would become effective for the purposes of the General Election to be held on the 30th March, 1974. The relevant changes were as set out in the Western Australian Government Gazette No. 45 of the 14th June, 1972.
- The effect of the changes was that in Group 2. C of the electorates set out in the Schedule, the Blackwood electorate was abolished and the area thereof amalgamated with surrounding electorates. From Group D the Darling Range and Northam electorates have disappeared, and in a general readjustment of boundaries three new electorates Kalamunda, Mundaring and Rockingham, have been created; and in Group E Balcatta has become Balga, Belmont has become Welshpool, Mirrabooka has become Morley, and Wembley has become Scarborough, with some realignment of the respective boundaries thereof.

In addition, the general readjustment of boundaries resulted in several changes of Electoral Districts from one Electoral Province to another. These variations have created some anomalies in that there are now instances where the allowance for a District is different from the allowance for the Province within which it is now included. The changes which have occurred are as follows:-Province within which now

- The Clerk of the sought the authority of the Tribunal to make temporary adjustments so as to bring the electorate allowance payments into line with the amendments above described.
- 4. It is obvious that in order to make the system of electorate allowances workable in respect of the new Parliament, the allowances ought to be paid in respect of the new electorates where this is relevant. There is no change in Group A. In Group D the three new seats are classified within the Agricultural, Mining and Pastoral Area and, in our opinion, are properly classified as coming within Group D. It is, therefore, merely a matter of deleting reference to the Blackwood electorate in Group C and of substituting for the Darling Range and Northam electorates in Group

D the new electorates of Kalamunda, Mundaring and Rockingham, and in Group E of substituting for the four electorates abovementioned the new electorates of Balga, Welshpool, Morley and Scarborough.

The readjustment of boundaries requires the addition of Albany, Geraldton, Kalgoorlie, Moore and Stirling to Group B; Bunbury, Narrogin and Wellington to Group C; and Katanning and Warren to Group D. In Group B the same allowance, \$3,400, is appropriate for the additions to that Group and the same allowance of \$3,100 is appropriate for the additions to Group C. In Group D the same allowance, \$2,700, is appropriate for the three new electorates in that Group and the additions thereto. The same allowance of \$2,000 is appropriate for the four new electorates in Group

- We have felt some doubt in view of the peculiarly restrictive provisions of Section 7 (4), (5) and (6) of the Parliamentary Salaries and (5) and (6) of the Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act, 1967-72 whether an adjustment of our 1971 Determination in order to adapt it to the present situation involves any "revocation" which is technically prohibited until the 16th September, 1974. But we have come to the conclusion that while no doubt it would be desirable that the question should for audit purposes be placed beyond doubt by a short piece of amending legislation, we should act immediately by way of an Interim Determination to provide that the reference in Part I, Section (ii) of our 1971 Determination to the old electorates now no longer relevant should be read as if the seven new relevant electorates were referred to in Groups D and E respectively, the alterations resulting in deletions from Groups C and D and additions to Groups B, C and D, were made and the reference to the Blackwood electorate in Group C were de-
- 6. Accordingly we have made an Interim Determination which is appended hereto as Appendix

- (a) Group B includes the electorates of Albany, Geraldton, Kalgoorlie, Moore and Stirling which, as a result of the readjustment of boundaries, are now within the boundaries of Electoral Provinces in Group B.
- (b) In Group C of the said electorates the Blackwood electorate has been abolished and the area thereof amalgamated with surrounding electorates. The electorates

- of Bunbury, Narrogin and Wellington have been included within the boundaries of Electoral Provinces in Group C.
- (c) From Group D, the Darling Range and Northam electorates have disappeared and in the general readjustment of boundaries three new electorates, Kalamunda, Mundaring and Rockingham have been created and the electorates of Katanning and Warren have been included within the boundaries of Electoral Provinces in Group D.
- (d) In Group E, Balcatta has become Balga, Belmont has become Welshpool, Mirrabooka has become Morley and Wembley has become Scarborough with some realignment of the boundaries thereof:

Now, therefore, the said Tribunal doth hereby make the following Determination, viz.,

- THAT, pending the next triennal Determination of the Tribunal, to come into force in September, 1974, the aforesaid Determination dated the 29th day of June, 1971, shall, as from the 31st day of March, 1974, be read as if, in the aforesaid schedules to Part I, Section (ii) of the said Determination—
  - (a) the reference to the Blackwood electorate and the allowance relating thereto were deleted;
  - (b) the Darling Range and Northam electorates and the allowance relating thereto were deleted and in lieu thereof there were substituted the electorates of Kalamunda, Mundaring and Rockingham, with the same allowance, viz., \$2 700, provided for each; and
  - (c) the electorates of Balcatta, Belmont, Mirrabooka and Wembley were deleted and in lieu thereof were substituted the electorates of Balga, Welshpool, Morley, Scarborough, with the same allowance, viz., \$2 000, provided for each:
  - (d) the electorates of Albany, Geraldton, Kalgoorlie, Moore and Stirling were deleted from Group C and included in Group B with the allowance of \$3 400 provided for each;
  - (e) the electorates of Katanning and Warren were deleted from Group C and included in Group D with an allowance of \$2 700 provided for each; and
  - (f) the electorates of Bunbury, Narrogin and Wellington were deleted from Group D and included in Group C with the allowance of \$3 100 provided for each.

This Determination shall be deemed to have come into force and to have taken effect as from the 31st day of March, 1974, being the day following the date of the general election of Members of the House of Assembly.

Processions and Public Meetings.

- 1611. (1) A person shall not, without the authority in writing of the proper authority, conduct a procession or parade; and a person shall not take part in a procession or parade that
- has not been authorised pursuant to this regulation. (2) The proper authority shall authorise the conduct, subject to such lawful conditions and limitations as it sees fit to impose, of a lawful procession or parade unless it is satisfied that the procession or parade will-
  - (a) give rise to an obstruction that is too great or too prolonged, in the circumstances;
  - (b) occasion damage to a road; or
  - (c) create a public nuisance.
- (3) Every person who conducts a procession or parade, or who takes part in a procession or parade that is, to his knowledge, conducted contrary to any condition or limitation imposed by the proper authority pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation commits an offence.
- (4) A person shall not hold or address any public meeting upon any roads or address any public meeting assembled on any road, from any public or private place adjacent thereto, unless he has first obtained written permission from the proper authority and except on the date and at the time and place specified in such written permission.
- (5) For the purposes of this regulation "the proper authority" in relation to-
  - (a) a road within the Metropolitan Traffic Area or any district for which the Director is the local authority, means the Commissioner of Police; and
  - (b) a road that is not within the areas referred to in paragraph (a) of this subregulation, means the local authority of the district.



  - (4) If two or more teachers are equal by virtue of service as principal of a Class I district high school and they have no secondary promotional service, they shall be distinguished by length of service as principal of a Class II district high school
  - (5) If two or more teachers have the right to equal placement on the list in accordance with subregulations (1), (3) and (4) of this regulation their placement on the list shall be determined by their seniority as determined by section 37AF of the Act.
  - (6) (a) To be eligible to have her name added to the list, a principal mistress's—
    - (i) seniority as determined by section 37AF of the Act must be at least equal to the average seniority of those deputy principals who become eligible to have their names included on the list in that year and in the previous year and who apply to be placed on the list:
    - (ii) continuous service in promotional positions in high and senior high schools must be at least equal to the average continuous service in such positions of the deputy principals referred to in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph; and
    - (iii) continuous service as a principal mistress must be at least equal to the average continuous service as a deputy principal of the deputy principals referred to in paragraph (i).
  - (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) of this subregulation, no principal mistress shall be placed higher on the list than any deputy principal whose continuous service as a deputy principal of a high or senior high school is longer than her continuous service as a principal mistress of a high or senior high school.

(1) In determining the order of placement on the promotion list for principals of Class II district high schools, when the names of two or more teachers are added at the same time service as a headmaster of a Class III primary school, or as a senior master or senior mistress, or as deputy headmaster or principal mistress of a district high school or a Class IA primary school shall rate as equivalent in experience and status.

- (2) The names shall be listed in order of such equivalent service, the longer service determining the higher listing.
- (3) If two or more teachers have the right to equal placement on the list in accordance with subregulations (1) and (2) of this regulation, their placement on the list shall be determined by their seniority as determined by section 37AF of the Act.

Reg. 102DAD 15. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 102DAC the following regulation:—

102DAD. (1) The Director-General shall fill every third vacancy that occurs in district high schools by the appointment of a teacher recommended by the Board irrespective of the position of his name on the promotion list for those schools.

- (2) In determining whether a teacher is eligible for special promotion, the Board will have regard to his special qualifications, aptitude and experience for the discharge of the duties of the position to be filled and of the teacher's willingness to accept an appointment in any part of the State.
