"Infiammable Material" is defined for the purpose of the order relating to Townsite Lands to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act) timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like infiammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens, or lawns.

FREMANTLE PORT AUTHORITY **REGULATIONS**, 1971.

Notice of Water Ski, Bathing and Speed Limit Areas.

> Fremantle Port Authority, Fremantle, 9th August, 1974.

ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 367B of the Fremantle Port Authority Regulations 1971 as amended, the Fremantle Port Authority by this notice:-

(1) Defines and sets aside the following areas of the Outer Harbour of the Port of Fremantle for the purpose of water ski-ing only and orders that bathing shall be prohibited therein :--

Island—Thomson (i) Rottnest Bay: Commencing at a point 15 metres east of the Army Jetty; thence in a 045 degree direction for 610 metres; thence easterly to Phillip Rock; thence in a SSW direction to Phillip Point provided that no boat or water skier shall approach within 45 metres of the foreshore except at the take-off area 60 metres in width and situated immediately eastwards of the aforesaid commencement point.

- (ii) Coogee: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area measuring 75 metres along the foreshore and extending 370 metres to seaward and situated immediately south of the Anchorage Abattoir, Coogee.
- (iii) Jervoise Bay: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 75 metres south of the "Alacrity" wreck; thence extending 310 metres in a westerly direction; thence 370 metres in a southerly direction; thence 245 metres in an easterly direction; thence 270 metres in a northerly direction; thence in an easterly direction; thence in an easterly direction to the shore provided that no boat or water skier shall approach within 60 metres of the shoreline except at the take-off area which extends 100 metres along the foreshore from the said point of commencement.
- (iv) Kwinana: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore being the prolongation of the southern side of Weld Street, Kwinana and extending 310 metres to seaward; thence 370 metres in a southerly direction parallel to the foreshore; thence 245 metres in an easterly direction; thence 270 metres in a northerly direction parallel to the foreshore; thence easterly to the shore provided that no boat or water skier shall approach within 60 metres of the shoreline except at the take-off area which extends 100 metres along the foreshore south of the aforesaid starting point.
- (v) Palm Beach: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 75 metres west of the Palm Beach Boat Launching Ramp (west); thence in a northerly direction for 750 metres; thence in a westerly direction for 840 metres; thence in a southeasterly direction for 950 metres to a point on the foreshore 210 metres west of the said Boat Launching Ramp.

And imposes as a condition of water ski-ing in any of the aforementioned areas of the Port that every person engaged therein shall conform with the rules of the West Australian Water Ski Association for the time being in force.

- (2) Defines and sets aside the following area of the Outer Harbour of the Port of Fremantle for the purpose of bathing only and orders that boating shall be prohibited therein:—
  - Rottnest Island: All the waters of Thomson Bay contained between the Board Cottage Jetty and the Main Wharf and extending for a distance of sixty metres eastwards from the seawall.
- (3) Limits the speed of motor boats to that of four knots within the following area of the Outer Harbour of the Port of Fremantle:—
  - Rottnest Island: All the waters of Thomson Bay contained within an area commencing from Bathurst Point; thence in a 120 degree direction of 1 400 metres towards Phillip Rock; thence in a 220 degree direction to the Army Jetty, with the exception of the gazetted bathing area immediately north of the Rottnest Passenger Wharf.
- (4) Limits the speed of motor boats to that of eight knots and prohibits water ski-ing within the following areas of the Port of Fremantle:—
  - (i) within the Inner Harbour;
  - (ii) within that part of the Outer Harbour eastward of an imaginary line extending from the North Mole Lighthouse to a point where the northern boundary of the Outer Harbour meets the shore of the mainland;
  - (iii) within 0.8 kilometres radius of the oil refinery jetties at Kwinana;
  - (iv) within 0.8 kilometres radius of the Rockingham Jetty situated at the foot of Railway Terrace Rockingham; and
  - (v) in any navigational channel or within forty-five metres of any buoy or beacon marking any such channel.


