- (1) These regulations may be cited as the Auction Sales Act mencement. Regulations, 1974.
 - (2) In these regulations the Auction Sales Act, 1973, is referred to as "the Act".

Forms.

The forms prescribed for the purposes of the Act are set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

Applica-tions.

(1) The application forms referred to in the first column of the table hereunder shall be used for the purposes respectively specified in relation thereto in the second column, and the fee payable for the purpose shall be at the rate specified in the third column.

(4) The form of transfer of a licence shall be in Form 13 and shall be endorsed on the original licence t_Q which it relates.

Renewals.

- 4. (1) The fee payable on the renewal of a licence shall, subject to apportionment in respect of periods of less than twelve months, be the fee payable on application for that kind of licence as set out in the table to subregulation (3) of regulation 3 of these regulations.
 - (2) A licence shall not be renewable as of right.
- (3) An application for the renewal of a licence shall be made in the same manner as an application for the grant of a licence, save that the applicant is not required to lodge character testimonials.

Method of application.

- 5. (1) An application for the grant, renewal or transfer of a licence shall be made in the manner provided by section 11 of the Act by lodging with the Clerk of a Court of Petty Sessions the prescribed fee together with—
 - (a) where the application is made for a licence to be used for the benefit of a firm or corporation, four copies; and
- (b) in any other case, three copies, of the relevant application form.
- (2) Where the application is for the transfer of a licence the application shall be made in Form 7 by the proposed transferee and shall be endorsed with the consent of the proposed transferor and on behalf of the firm or corporation (if any) named in the original licence as that for the benefit of which the licence is to be used.

Notice of application.

6. The notice of an application required to be published pursuant to subsection (5) of section 11 of the Act shall be in Form 14.

Notice of objection.

7. A notice of objection to the grant, renewal or transfer of a licence is not required to be given in a prescribed form.

Police inquiries.

- 8. On receipt of a copy of the application for the grant, renewal or transfer of a licence from the Clerk of a Court of Petty Sessions, the senior police officer stationed within the police district shall—
 - (a) inquire as to the character and suitability of the applicant;
 - (b) inquire as to the fitness and repute of the persons responsible for the management of that firm or corporation where the licence is sought for the benefit of a firm or corporation;
 - (c) inquire as to the circumstances and the likelihood of the occasion occurring, where an occasional licence is sought;
 - (d) inquire as to the genuineness of the incapacity by a medical certificate or other evidence, where an interim licence is sought;
 and
 - (e) report in writing to the court the result of his inquiries.

Stock register.

- 9. (1) The register to be kept for the purposes of section 30 of the Act shall be in Form 15.
- (2) On the same day as a sale of stock is conducted, the auctioneer shall cause to be entered in the register the following particulars as a separate entry for each lot of animals offered for sale—
 - (a) the number of the pen where the animals were held when auctioned;
 - (b) the name and address or identifying code of the vendor of the animals so auctioned;
 - (c) the quantity of animals auctioned in that lot;
 - (d) a description of the breed and type of animal auctioned;
 - (e) except in the case of goats and young animals not required by law to be branded, the brand or identifying mark as required by the Stock (Brands and Movement) Act, 1970;
 - (f) if sold by auction, the price per head of each animal when knocked down to the purchaser, and the name and address or identifying code of the purchaser of the animal; and
 - (g) if passed in or sold by private treaty, a description of the means of disposal and the name and address of any purchaser.
- (3) The auctioneer conducting the sale shall append his signature in the place provided, signifying that the particulars contained in that sheet are, to the best of his knowledge, accurate particulars of all stock offered for sale by him.
- (4) Where any alteration to particulars entered on the register appears, the auctioneer shall initial each alteration as being correct.

Unbranded stock.

10. A person who sells by auction or submits for sale by auction any stock, other than goats or the young of any stock not required to be branded, in relation to which the waybill referred to in section 46 of the Stock (Brands and Movement) Act, 1970, is not furnished commits an offence.

Misrepresentation. 11. A person who wilfully makes any representation or statement which is false or misleading in a material particular in relation to any application, objection, register or other matter or proceeding under the Act or these regulations commits an offence and is liable to the penalties provided by section 35 of the Act.

- (c) When any cleared, or partly cleared land abuts a railway reserve a firebreak not less than 6 feet wide shall be cleared within 10 feet and parallel to the common boundary.
- (d) A firebreak 10 feet wide shall be cleared not less than 1 chain and not more than 5 chains from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks, homesteads and fuel storage areas by 30th November, 1974, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or haystack cleared of all infiammable material by 15th December, 1974.
- (e) The control officer can approve a well burnt roadside as a substitute for a firebreak inside the property. No burning to be done on road verges of the Donnybrook-Kojonup Road.


