Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Northam.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the dates referred to below to clear firebreaks on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the following and thereafter to

maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1975:—

- (1) You shall on or before 15th day of October 1974, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) You shall on or before 15th day of October 1974, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width in such positions as to divide properties of more than 200 hectares into separate sections of no more than 200 hecetares completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least two metres in width; and
- (3) You shall on or before 15th day of October 1974, clear of all infiammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings and/or haystacks; and
- (4) You shall on or before the 29th day of November, 1974 in the Western section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land west of the dividing line described hereunder) and on or before the 15th day of November 1974, in the Eastern section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land east and south of the dividing line described hereunder), clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width immediately surorunding all areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined in such positions so as areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined of more than 100 hectares are divided into separate areas of no more than 100 hectares.
- (5) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1974, clear of all infiammable material two firebreaks of at least two metres in width and approximately twenty metres apart inside and along all property boundaries which abut a Railway Reserve (other than the Railway Reserve specified in paragraph (6) hereof) on which railway traffic is operating and where the Railway Reserve is situated outside a townsite boundary.
- (6) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1974, clear of all infiammable material firebreaks of at least three metres in width inside and along all property boundaries which abut the Standard Gauge Railway Reserve between East Northam and the Eastern boundary of the Shire district.
- (7) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1974, clear of all infiammable material (including standing and fallen trees, branches and undergrowth) firebreaks of at least three metres in width along and as close as possible to all external boundaries of each separate area of undeveloped land and in such extra positions so as areas of undeveloped land of more than 200 hectares are divided into areas of no more than 200 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (8) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1974, completely clear of all infiammable material all separate townsite lots where the lot is 4 000 square metres or less in area.

Alternative Breaks: If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove infiammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 7th October 1974, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Penalty: The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Alternative Breaks: All approvals for alternative positions of firebreaks are cancelled. The Council is compiling a new register of approvals for alternative positions of firebreaks and if you have previously obtained permission you are required to re-apply this year.

Definition and Clarification: For the purpose of correct interpretation of this notice please note that:—

(1) Cropped Land:

- (a) If several paddocks of standing crop or standing crop and pasture total no more than 100 hectares then a firebreak completely surrounding the several paddocks is sufficient.
- (b) If a single paddock comprises several areas of standing crop divided by pasture, timbered, stony or other areas and the total area of the paddock is no more than 100 hectares, then a firebreak surrounding the paddock is sufficient.
- (c) If a single paddock of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined is more than 100 hectares in area, then additional firebreaks would have to be provided so as to divide the paddock into separate areas of no more than 100 hectares, with each separate area being surrounded by a firebreak.

(2) Undeveloped Land:

- (a) Undeveloped land should be regarded as land which is virtually still in its virgin state and includes land on which development has commenced but has not been completed to any final stage. The term is not intended to apply to areas of bush or semi bush which have been left uncleared within a developed property because of the nature of the terrain or for shelter or similar purposes. Land which is developed to a "Parkland" state should be considered as developed land.
- (b) An area of undeveloped land means an area, irrespective of shape or size which is not completely or partially divided by developed land. This means if two undeveloped areas, whether of the same location number or not, are separated by developed land, they must be regarded as separate areas and should be treated acordingly.

(3) Owner or Occupier: An owner or occupier is considered by this Office to be the person registered in Council's ratebook as such, irrespective of whether the land concerned is subject of Conditional Purchase Agreement, Contract of Sale, Mortgage, etc.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954. Town of Bunbury.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Town of Bunbury.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 14th day of December, 1974 and thereafter up to and including the 14th day of March, 1975 to have a fire-break clear of all inflammable material at least 3 metres wide or to remove from the land, owned or occupier by you, all inflammable material as outlined hereunder:—

(1) Townsite Land:

- (a) Where the area of the land is 2024 square metres or less and the land is not used for agricultural or grazing purposes, all inflammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- (b) Where the area of land is 2024 square metres or less and the land is used for agricultural or grazing purposes, you are required to have a firebreak clear of all inflammable material at least 3 metres wide, immediately inside and around all boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.
- (c) Where the area of the land is more than 2 024 square metres, you are required to have a firebreak clear of all inflammable material at least 3 metres wide, immediately inside and around all boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

(2) Rural Land:

- (a) Where the area of the land is more than 2024 square metres, you are required to have a firebreak clear of all inflammable material at least 3 metres wide, immediately inside and around all boundaries of the land.
- (b) Where there are buildings or haystacks situated on the land, all infiammable material shall be cleared within 20 metres of the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks or groups of buildings and haystacks so as to completely surround the buildings or haystacks or groups of buildings and haystacks.
- (3) Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned and/or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall have the land clear of all infiammable material.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to have firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 15th day of November, 1974 for permission to have firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the Owner or Occupier by the date required by this notice.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Gnowangerup.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required on or before 1st day of November, 1974 to clear of all inflammable material firebreaks as stated hereunder and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1975:—

- (1) Prepare firebreaks, not less than TEN feet wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land and uncleared land which is fenced and immediately inside all external boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land abutting roads bounding or intersecting any holding other than on land situate in any townsite within the Shire.
- (2) Where the total area of each property or holding exceeds 600 acres additional firebreaks must be provided in such positions so as to divide cleared or part cleared land into areas not exceeding 600 acres, with each area to be completely surrounded by a firebreak not less than TEN feet wide.
- (3) Prepare firebreaks, not less than TEN feet wide, immediately surrounding all buildings or haystacks on the land.
- (4) Prepare firebreaks not less than THIRTY feet wide immediately around the perimeter of any scrub or timber which has been logged, chained, or otherwise prepared for burning.
- (5) In respect of land within any Townsite within the Shire you shall—
 - (a) where the area is one half of one acre or less, remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land.
 - (b) where the area of land exceeds one half of one acre, firebreaks not less than SIX feet wide, shall be prepared immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land.

It is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this Notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to clear such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any variation will only be granted where a Bush Fire Control Officer has first signified his approval of the variation.

It is an offence to provide firebreaks on a road reserve without the approval of the Council, or Main Roads Department in the case of declared Main Roads.

- 1.2 in such other positions as is necessary to divide the land in excess of five hundred (500) acres (202 hectares) into areas not exceeding five hundred (500) acres (202 hectares) each completely surrounded by a firebreak and;
- 1.3 immediately surrounding any part of the land used for crop and;
- 1.4 within 66 feet (20.12 metres) of and parallel to the common boundary between the land the road, railway, river or uncleared land where part of any cleared or partly cleared land used for pasture or crop abuts on, or is intersected by public roads, railways, rivers or areas of uncleared land.
- 2. Buildings and Haystacks:
 - A firebreak, eight feet wide shall be cleared one chain from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and homesteads by the 25th October, 1974, and the area between the firebreak and the building or haystack shall be cleared of all infiammable materials by 31st October, 1974. If it is intended to clear the area around the buildings by burning a permit must be obtained from the Local Bush Fire Control Officer.
 - If it is impracticable for any reason to complete the clearing of firebreaks in the positions, or by the date required by this notice, application must be made not later than the 25th October, 1974, to the Quairading Shire Council for permission to place the breaks in an alternative situation or to complete the clearing of breaks by a later date to be determined by the Council.
- 3. Townsites: On or before the 25th October, 1974, all town lots within the Shire of Quairading area are required to be cleared of all debris of inflammable nature.

- (2) Material constituting a fire hazard to be cleared from all other Townsite lots.


