W.A. 48635 as kept in the Public Works Department, to be a proclaim area for the purposes of the said section. section 18 of the said Act.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 17th day of October, 1974, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas The Broken Hill Proprietary Company Limited, a company incorporated in the State of Victoria, having its registered office in the State of Western Australia at T. & G. Building, 37 St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond to the value of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25 000) charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Broken Hill Proprietary Company Limited from the operation of Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973, for a period expiring on the 31st day of August, 1976.

#### Schedule.

#### RULES.

- 1. These rules may be cited as the Optometrists Registration Board Rules (Amendment) Rules, 1974.
- 2. In these rules the Optometrists Registration Board Rules, 1941, published in the *Gazette* on the 23rd May, 1941, as amended from time to time, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published in the *Gazette* on the 15th July, 1966, as amended by a notice so printed on the 28th November, 1968, are referred to as the principal rules.
  - 3. Rule 3 of the principal rules is amended-
    - (a) by adding after the regulation designation "3." the subregulation designation "(1)"; and
    - (b) by adding four new subregulations as follows-
      - (2) In these rules, a reference to an optometrist includes a reference to any person, firm or company carrying on, or purporting to carry on, the practice of optometry.
      - (3) In these rules, where an optometrist is prohibited from any course of action the prohibition extends to prohibit him from authorising, permitting or allowing that course of action to be taken by any other person in his name or on his behalf.
      - (4) For the purpose of these rules, a person shall be taken to practise optometry if—
        - (a) he practises optometry personally on his own account;(b) he employs a person who practises optometry; or
        - (c) he practises optometry in the employ of another person,
      - and any firm or company which employs a person who practises optometry shall also be taken to practise optometry.
      - (5) In these rules, "approved qualifications" means qualifications acceptable to the Board pursuant to the Act and such other qualifications as may be approved by the Board from time to time for the purpose of these rules.
- 4. Rule 30 of the principal rules is revoked and a new rule substituted as follows:—
  - 30. (1) Subject to the provisions of this rule and of the Act and regulations made under the Act, the qualifications which are sufficient to qualify a person holding them for registration under subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 35 of the Act are—
    - (a) in relation to qualifications from the States or Territories of the Commonwealth—
      - (i) registration as an optometrist (or optician or certified optometrist or certified optician) with any Australian Board of Optometrical Registration or its equivalent prior to 1st January, 1974;
      - (ii) the degree of Bachelor of Optometry of the University of New South Wales;
      - (iii) the Diploma in applied science (Optometry), previously known as the Associate Diploma in Optometry of the Queensland Institute of Technology;
      - (iv) the degree of Bachelor of Science in Optometry of the University of Melbourne;
    - (b) in relation to qualifications from New Zealand-
      - (i) registration with the New Zealand Opticians Board and the Diploma in Optometry of the University of Auckland between the years 1965 and 1970; or

- (ii) the Diploma in Optometry of the University of Auckland since 1970;
- (c) in relation to qualifications from the United Kingdom-
  - Current registration, first effected on or after 1st January, 1965, with the General Optical Council as an ophthalmic optician, following training and qualification in the United Kingdom at an institution\* approved by the General Optical Council.;
- (d) in relation to qualifications from Canada or the United States of America-
  - Current registration in any Province or territory of Canada or State or territory of the United States of America, following completion of training on or after 1st January, 1966, in either of those two countries at an institution; accredited by the Council on Optometric Education of the American Optometric Association.

- (e) in relation to qualifications from places other than those referred to in the preceding paragraphs of this subrule—
  - (i) current registration with a board of optometrical registration or its equivalent; and
  - general and optometrical education and experience which is, in the opinion of the Board, of a standard not less than the standard required in relation to a person possessing the qualification referred to in paragraph (a) of this subrule other than subparagraph (i) thereof.
- (2) In relation to any application for registration the Board may determine that the qualifications of a person are not sufficient unless that person also completes to the satisfaction of the Board—
  - (a) further training; or

  - (b) examinations, oral or in writing; or
    (c) a test of his command of the English language; or
  - (d) two or more of those requirements,
- to the extent necessary to ensure that the applicant attains a standard not less than the standard required in relation to a person possessing the qualifications referred to in paragraph (a) of subrule (1) of rule 30 other than subparagraph (i) thereof.
- Rule 43A of the principal rules is revoked and a new rule substituted as follows:-
  - 43A. (1) Subject to subrule (2) of this rule, an optometrist may advertise in approved newspapers that-
    - (a) he conducts his practice at the address or addresses specified in the advertisement;
    - (b) he has or is about to commence practice;
    - (c) he has taken over a practice of another optometrist;
    - (d) another optometrist has taken over his practice;
    - (e) he has entered into, dissolved or altered his partnership;(f) he has changed the address of his practice, or has an additional address;
    - (g) he has changed the name of his practice;
    - (h) he will be absent from his practice temporarily;(i) he has returned to practice; or(j) he has ceased to practise.
  - (2) An optometrist may repeat an advertisement permitted by subrule (1) of this rule, not being an advertisement that he conducts his practice at the address or addresses specified in the advertisement, from time to time within the period of six months from the date of the issue of the newspaper in which the advertisement first appeared.
  - (3) An advertisement that an optometrist conducts his practice at the address or addresses specified in the advertisement shall contain only-
    - (a) the name of the optometrist and if that is the case the firm or company for which he practises optometry;
    - (b) the address or addresses where he may be consulted;

- (c) all or any of the approved qualifications set out opposite to his name in the register;
- (d) any specialised branch of optometry in which he practises;
- (e) his hours of attendance and telephone number; and(f) any one or more of the titles "Optometrist", "Optical Dispenser" or "Dispensing Optician".
- (4) An optometrist who visits a town or district outside the metropolitan area may announce the time and place of his visit by means of an advertisement in an approved newspaper circulating in the town or district no earlier than one month before the visit and may repeat the advertisement throughout the period commencing on that date and ending on the last date of consultation in the town or disrict.
- (5) An advertisement under subrule (4) of this rule may contain all or any of the details, allowed in subrule (3) of this rule and may only include in addition the dates and times of attendance in the town or district, place of consultation and where an appointment may be made.
  - (6) Advertisements published in a newspaper under this rule shall-
    - (a) be limited in size to two inch double column or four inch single column
    - (b) be printed only in black lettering on a white background; and
    - (c) appear no more than once in any one issue of the newspaper.
- Rule 43B of the principal rules is revoked and a new rule substituted as follows:
  - (1) Where an optometrist visits a town or district outside the metropolitan area in which there is no resident optometrist he may affix a notice or sign-
    - (a) on the day of consultation only to the premises where he practises: and
    - (b) for one month preceding the visit to the premises of his booking agent and on the town or district Public Notice Board,

containing only the matters referred to in subrule (3) and subrule (5) of rule 43A.

- (2) An optometrist may have no more than two signs located at and attached to the front of the premises in which he practises, and such signs shall contain only the information set out in subrule (3) of rule 43A together with an insignia of a professional association approved by
- (3) An optometrist may have window or show case displays only at permanent place of practice and such displays shall not include the display of prices or certificates.
- (4) An optometrist may cause or permit his name to appear in the telephone directory-
  - (a) in the style and size of type ordinarily used for private subscribers:
  - (b) in the usual bolder faced type in the name under which he practises together with one of the descriptions "Optometrist", "Optician", "Optical Dispenser" or "Dispensing Optician" or an abbreviation;
  - (c) in the style and size of type ordinarily used for private subscribers under the headings of "Optometrists" or "Optician" and "Optical Dispenses." Optical Dispensers".
- (5) An optometrist may not issue an appointment card to a patient which contains any matter other than his name, qualifications, the name of his firm or company, address, telephone number and any matters relating to the appointment.
- (6) An optometrist may communicate with individual patients by use of direct postal mail in the form of a personal letter or business card specifically addressed to them, but recall notices may only be sent to those patients previously refracted by him.
- (7) An optometrist may cause or permit his name, qualifications, the name of his firm or company, address and telephone number to appear on any container he provides for the safe keeping or storage of any optical appliance.
- (8) An optometrist's stationery heading shall be limited to and contain only the information as set out in subrule (3) of rule 43A together with an insignia of a professional association approved by the Board.

WHEREAS it is provided in the Health Act, 1911-1973, as amended, that a local authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series "A" have been prepared and amended from time to time and reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the Government Gazette of the 17th July, 1963 and further amended by notice published in the Government Gazette on 21st December 1973; Now, therefore, the Shire of Mundaring being a local authority within the meaning of the Act, and having adopted the Model By-laws, Series "A", as so reprinted in the Government Gazette of the 17th July, 1963, doth hereby resolve and determine that the amendment as published in the Government Gazette on the 21st December, 1973, and on 22nd March, 1974, shall be adopted and doth further provide that the said adopted By-laws shall be amended as follows:—

#### PART I.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

Substitute for By-law 28 a new by-law to read as follows:—

28. In this By-law "Cattle" shall mean horses, camels, bulls, cows, steers, donkeys, mules, sheep and goats.

- (1) On land of 0.2 hectares or less which is zoned urban, the keeping of cattle except for one sheep or one female goat shall be generally prohibited. Provided that where an owner can demonstrate a sufficient buffer of vacant lots surrounding his land the Council may have discretion to allow the keeping of one item of cattle if satisfied no nuisance will result and until such time as the adjoining land is developed. Any approval granted by Council may be withdrawn.
- (2) On land greater than 0.2 hectares which is zoned urban, the Council may grant approval for keeping of a specified number of cattle but before granting such approval Council may require the applicant to either advertise intention to apply for approval or notify all adjoining landholders or both. Such advertisement shall be placed in a newspaper circulating in the district at least 30 days before the matter is considered by Council.
- (3) Under this By-law where one owner has two or more contiguous lots aggregating more than 0.2 hectares Council shall have regard to the total area of such land.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of October, 1974, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Shire or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

after to maintain such firebreaks clear of all inflammable material until the 15th day of April, 1975, with the following requirements:—

- 1. Rural Lands: Firebreaks of not less than two (2) metres wide in the following positions:—
  - (1) Inside and along the boundaries of all pastures of grass lands.
  - (2) Inside and along the common boundaries of all land where this land abuts public roads on which there is a road formation.
  - (3) On all land not less than two(2) metres in width and within a minimum of one chain and parallel to any boundary of a Railway Reserve and Timber Tramway Reserve.

Firebreaks in the situation described hereunder be accepted as complying with requirements of this notice, so far as it applies to the common boundary between the land of an owner or occupier, and the abutting land referred to hereunder:—

- (a) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on a public road and the owner or occupier has burned or cleared to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer, the bush between the road formation and the common boundary.
- (b) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown Land or Reserve, the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide, on the Crown Land or Reserve along the common boundary.

#### 2. Town Site Lands:

- (1) Townsite lots having an area of not more than half an acre shall be completely cleared of all material of an inflammable nature and maintained free of such material.
- (2) On townsite lots having an area of more than half acre, firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide shall be provided and maintained inside and along the boundaries of the lots. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner and/or occupier the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lots.
- 3. Rural and Townsite Lands:
  - (1) Firebreaks of not less than three (3) metres wide must be provided immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks, fuel depots, drum ramps and drums both full and empty.

If, for any reason, it is considered impracticable to comply with any provision of this notice, a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Council and must reach the Shire Clerk before the 22nd day of November, 1974.

Any such application must bear the signature of the Fire Control Officer of the area signifying his agreement to the variation. If permission for variation is not granted the terms of the notice must be complied with.

The penalty for failure to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200 in addition to which the Council may have the works carried out and may recover the costs of such work from the owner and/or occupier. Firebreak Order, 1974-1975.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, you are hereby required, on or before the 15th day of November, 1974, to scrape plough or burn, or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until the 31st day of May, 1975, firebreaks of a width, and in the positions specified hereunder.

- 1. Firebreaks of not less than eight feet in width must be constructed in the following positions:—
  - (a) Immediately adjacent to and completely surroundings all land which has been cleared.
  - (b) Where the total area of cleared land owned or occupied, exceeds 600 acres in one parcel, additional firebreaks must be constructed in such positions as to divide the cleared land into areas not exceeding 600 acres and where possible three hundred acres shall be subdivided, with each such land area surrounded by a firebreak.
  - (c) Inside and along all the boundaries of land where such land is contiguous to the boundary of the Railway Reserve for the Collie-Narrogin railway, the Albany Highway, the Narrogin-Quindanning Road, Congelin Road, Clayton Road, Williams-Darkan Road, and the Wandering Road.
- 2. Firebreaks, not less than six feet in width must be constructed within one chain of the perimeter of any haystacks, buildings, or group of buildings, so positioned as to completely surround such haystack, building or group of buildings and the land between the firebreak and the haystack or buildings must be completely cleared of all inflammable material.
- 3. Firebreaks, not less than ten feet in width must be constructed within 5 chains of low water mark on all properties adjoining the Williams river. If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to construct such firebreaks in an alternative position.
