## Local Government Act, 1960-1973. ORDERS IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

  - (d) for the purposes of section seven B of the Act the maximum amount which an approved institution shall advance to a borrower on the giving of a first mortgage of a new house or the maximum amount of the purchase moneys which an approved institution shall permit to remain payable under a contract for sale and purchase of a new house before an indemnity is given by the Treasurer under the Act, is seventy per centum (70%) of the value of a new house, as defined in the Act.

# CITY OF NEDLANDS TOWN PLANNING SCHEME AMENDMENT No. 42.

THE City of Nedlands under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it, in that behalf, by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, (As Amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme Amendment for the purpose of "varying the car parking requirements" as follows:—

- a. By the deletion of Clauses 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3 of the Scheme Text and the substitution thereof by the following:—
  - 5.1. Vehicle Parking and Loading:

The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic in any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of land or building, shall make provision in accordance with the requirements of Table II hereunder for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees, or other persons), to stand on the site, or in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the site but not on the street while being unloaded loaded or awaiting use.

Size and location of car spaces:

The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be 5.5 metres x 2.5 metres. In the case of a parking area with a minimum access width of 7.32 metres or, 5 metres x 3 metres in the case of a parking area with a minimum access width of 6.7 metres. When considering any development or building application, the Council shall have regard to and impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces. In particular, the Council shall take into account and may impose conditions concerning:—

- (i) the proportion of car spaces to be roofed or covered,
- (ii) the proportion of car spaces to be below natural ground level,
- (iii) the means of access to each car space and the adequacy of any vehicular manoeuvring area,
- (iv) the location of car spaces on the site and their effect on their amenity of adjoining development including the potential effect if those spaces should later be roofed or covered,
- (v) the locations of proposed public footpaths, vehicular crossings, or private footpaths within the lot and the effect on both pedestrian and vehicular traffic movement and safety,
- (vi) the suitability and adequacy of proposed screening or natural planting,
- (vii) the suitability of and adequacy of elevated structural decks for development and service as a proportion of the required area for natural planting and pedestrian space.

Number of Parking and loading spaces to be provided:

The number of spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by Council, having regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volumes of goods, materials, or people moving to and from the site, and where the use is stipulated, not less than the number of spaces set down in Table II hereunder.

It shall be lawful for Council to enter into agreements with owners in a locality for the purposes of rationalising parking on nearby adjoining sites. Council may purchase land, obtain rights of way or rights of carriage-way through any lot, agree to a concession on numbers of vehicles to be provided in return for access, arrange for reciprocal parking uses on adjacent or nearby lots. Any expenses incurred in these negotiations or the purchase of land are recoverable by Council from those persons benefiting from the parking arrangements.

## TABLE II.—NUMBER OF PARKING SPACES TO BE PROVIDED.

- (1) Dwellings dual accommodation and duplex houses as set down in Section 3.2.
- (2) Flats. The provision of Table 213B of the Uniform Building By-laws shall apply but one additional space for every four flats shall be provided and set aside for visitor parking.

- (3) Licensed Premises, Dining Rooms, Restaurants and Reception Lodges.
  - (i) Hotel or Tavern:
    - (a) Bedrooms:

1 car parking space for each bed-room.

- (b) Bars: 1 car parking space for each 1.3 m² of all bar areas and all other areas to which the public has access excluding only tollets and clearly defined passages which are not capable of being used as an extension of the bar area.
- (c) Plus 1 car parking space reserved for each employee on duty.
- (ii) Lounge, Dining Room, Restaurant (licensed or not):

The greater of the following:





"Council" means the Council of the City of Nedlands;

- 2. No person shall provide or conduct any amusements within the district unless that person has applied for obtained and holds a current licence.
- 3. Any person who desires to provide or conduct amusements within the district shall make application in writing to the Council for a licence so to do, stating the type or types of amusements for which a licence is desired and the premises at which or the land or the place upon which it is intended to provide or conduct such amusements.
- 4. The Council may grant a licence to the applicant in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto, or it may refuse to grant the licence in its absolute discretion.
- 5. A licence granted by the Council shall remain in force until the 31st day of December next after the issue of the licence unless previously revoked.
- $6.\ \,$  The fees set out in the Second Schedule shall be payable to the Council in respect of each licence.
- 7. The Council may at any time revoke any licence issued by it in its absolute discretion and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, may revoke such licence if the licensee—
  - (a) has committed a breach of these by-laws;
  - (b) is not conducting the licensed amusements in a respectable or sober manner;
  - (c) has assigned his licence or does not himself carry on the licensed amusements; or
  - (d) is not regularly carrying on the amusements for which the licence is issued.
- 8. The premises upon which or the land or the place at which the amusements are provided or conducted must at all reasonable times be open to inspection by any one or more of the officers of the Council.
- 9. No dice, cards or games of chance of any description shall be played for any gain on premises or on the land or at the place upon which amusements are provided or conducted pursuant to a licence or licences.
- 10. No person shall be permitted or suffered to enter or remain upon premises or within the proximity of the land or place where amusements are provided or conducted who is drunk or uses any profane, indecent or obscene language or who may in anyway offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
  - 11. No person shall provide or conduct any amusements-
    - (a) without being the holder of a licence issued by the Council;
    - (b) in any part of the district other than that specified by the licence;
    - (c) in respect of amusements of a type not specified in the licence;
    - (d) except between the times as stated in the licence; or
    - (e) otherwise than in accordance with any conditions imposed by the Council when granting the licence.
  - 12. No person shall provide or conduct any amusements so as to-
    - (a) create or be a nuisance to any passerby or to any inhabitant in the neighbourhood of the premises in which or the land or the place upon which such amusements are provided or conducted;
    - (b) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway; or
    - (c) act in an offensive manner.
- 13. The Council may, by its officers, workmen or agents, enter into any premises or upon any land or place for the purpose of abating any nuisance prohibited by these by-laws and may do any act or thing reasonably required to abate such nuisance.
- 14. The licensee shall carry his licence with him and produce it upon demand to any employee of the Council or to a member of the Police Force.
- 15. The Council at the time of issue of the licence may require a licensee to have his name, the number of his licence and the words "licensed amusements" legibly painted on some conspicuous part of the amusements.
- 16. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws shall be liable to—
  - (a) a maximum penalty of \$200; and
  - (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day.

Town of Bunbury.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

L.G. 116/60.

PURSUANT to section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1973, and in exercise of all other powers thereto enabling it the Municipality of the Town of Bunbury doth hereby make the following By-laws for the control of dogs within the Town:—

The By-laws as gazetted on the 8th February, 1957 and all amendments to the original By-laws are hereby repealed and the following substituted:—

- 1. In these By-laws the term "Council" shall mean the Bunbury Town Council.
- 2. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1973.

- 3. The pound to be used by the Council is established on part of Lot 472 of Reserve 26119 Little Street Bunbury and is an approved pound situated within the Council area.
- $4.\ \ A$  dog seized by the police or by an officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.
- 5. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Council shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
- 6. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then upon payment of the fees specified in the schedule hereto, the dog shall be released to such person.
- 7. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
- 8. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
- 9. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 72 hours of its being seized, or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 72 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner, the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council may sell such dog.
- 10. Upon sale of a dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.
- 11. If within the times mentioned in by-law 9 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog, the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid, and the said fees paid, and if no offer has been received for its purchase, the dog may be destroyed.
- 12. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1973, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Town Clerk of the Council if in the opinion of the Town Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.
- 13. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the Schedule hereto.
  - 14. No person shall:—
    - (a) unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
    - (b) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
    - (c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

Any person who shall commit a breach of this clause shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding the maximum as set down in section 35 of the Act.

- 15. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.
- 16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
  - (a) A public building.
  - (b) A theatre or picture gardens.
  - (c) A house of worship.
  - (d) A shop or other public business premises.
  - (e) The foreshore of the Indian Ocean between Fraser Street and Joel Crescent, excluding the section between William Street and Beach Road, and the whole of the foreshore of Koombana Bay for a distance of 40 metres East of Point McLeod, and for a distance of 18 metres North-West of the Bunbury Harbour Jetty.
- 17. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—
  - (a) A sportsground.
  - (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
  - (c) A car park.
  - (d) A school.
  - (e) Any land vested in or under the control of the Council, other than a road.
  - (f) The foreshore of the Indian Ocean between William Street and Beach Road, and North of Fraser Street.

- 18. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or a member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1973, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.
- The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.
- 20. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding the maximum as set down in section 35 of the Act.

- 4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a Pound, the Keeper of the Pound or other Officer authorised by the Council shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
- 5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of the dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then upon payment of the fees prescribed in the Schedule hereto, the dog shall be released to such person.
- 6. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the poundkeeper, or other Officer authorised by Council, the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
- 7. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 72 hours of its being seized, or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration disc for the current year affixed thereto, shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner, the pound-keeper or other officer authorised by the Council may either sell the dog or have it destroyed. Any costs incurred by the Council in seizing and disposing of the dog shall be recoverable by the Council from the owner.
- 8. If the dog is sold the proceeds of the sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of the dogs sold in pursuance of these By-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.
- 9. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the Dog Act 1903, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Clerk or the Council, if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or too noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.
- 10. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fee prescribed in the Schedule hereto.
  - 11. No person shall-
    - (a) Unless a poundkeeper or any other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound.
    - (b) Destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog poof any pound.
    - (c) Destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with any vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.
- 12. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903, or the Regulations made in pursuance of these provisions.
- 13. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention, or destruction of a dog shall not relieve its owner of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of the By-laws.
- 14. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of By-laws 6 to 12 (inclusive) of these By-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.

#### PART II.—GENERAL CONTROL.

- 15. No person shall permit a dog to wander at large and shall keep such dog chained or under effective control at all times.
- 16. The owner of a dog, or person responsible for its keeping, shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
  - (a) A public building.
  - (b) A Theatre or picture garden.
  - (c) A house of Worship.
  - (d) A shop or other public business premises.
- 17. The owner of a dog, or person responsible for its keeping, shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places, unless on a leash held by a person:—
  - (a) A sportsground.
  - (b) An area set aside for public recreation.

- (c) A car park.
- (d) A school.
- (e) Any land vested in or under the control of the Council, including a road or street.
- 18. The owner of a dog, or person responsible for its keeping, shall prevent that dog from interfering with the welfare of other residents either by its continuous barking or by physical trespassing.
- 19. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of By-laws 15 to 18 (inclusive) of these By-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.
- 20. Dogs used in the droving, tending or in the management of livestock under the control of the owner or employees shall not be deemed to come within the provisions of By-law 17 (e) of this Part.
