Wanneroo Reservoir No. 1.

The Construction of:-

- (a) A concrete lined excavated service reservoir of approximately 111 700 cubic metres capacity and
- (b) A brick and concrete chlorination building. Works to be complete with pipework, valves and all necessary apparatus, and shown on plan M.W.B. 12881.

  - (ii) a loan to or by an authorized dealer in the short term money market;
  - (iii) a loan to or by a dealer in the unofficial short term money market; or
  - (iv) a loan by one body corporate to another body corporate by way of temporary investment of surplus funds.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and any other powers enabling it, the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Bunbury, hereby records having resolved on the 15th day of October, 1975 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws prescribing Taxi-Car Fares, Charges and Penalties:—

"Driver" in relation to a Taxi-Car includes any person for the time being in charge of a taxi-car.

"Taxi-car" means a vehicle operated as a taxi-car other than a private taxi-car.

"Detention charge" means the charge permitted by these by-laws to be made to the hirer of a taxi-car while no charge is being made under mileage rates. "Flag fall" means the amount of fare recorded by a taxi-car at the commencement of hiring.

"Hirer" means a passenger or other person who engages a taxi-car.

"Licensing authority" means The Municipality of the Town of Bunbury who are empowered by Law to license or register Motor Vehicles. "Mileage rate" means the rate of fare for distance travelled by a taxi-car. "Passenger" means any person carried in or upon a taxi-car, excluding the driver.

"Taxi Stand" means a position or a group of positions set apart by a competent authority by means of signs on or near a road, for the standing of disengaged taxi-cars.

"Authorised person" means an officer employed by the Town of Bunbury or Traffic Inspector.

"Special hiring" means such a hiring, on a time basis, as stipulated by appendix as follows:----

#### The Schedule.

Minimum Fare—50 cents.

Detention Rate-for each 60 seconds or part thereof-5 cents.

Distance Rate—for each kilometer—16 cents—for the return journey by nearest practicable route (for each one kilometre or part thereof 16 cents).

Hourly Rate—for each quarter hour or part thereof—75 cents—fare to be charged at distance rate or hourly rate, whichever is the greater— Minimum charge \$3.00.

Special Hirings-

Weddings—\$17.00 for the first two hours or part thereof plus \$1.50 per quarter hour or part thereof thereafter. Where during the course of a wedding or funeral a taxi-car is required to travel more than 16 kilometres a charge of 20 cents per kilometre shall be paid for each additional kilometre or part thereof.

Funerals—\$8.00 for the first hour or part thereof plus one dollar per quarter hour or part thereof thereafter.

Tours-\$5.00 per hour for the first hour or part thereof, plus one dollar per quarter hour or part thereof thereafter.

After Hour Penalty—between 8.00 p.m. and 8.00 a.m. Monday-Saturday—10%. Public Holidays and Sundays—Surcharge—10%.

Boot Opening Fee-Minimum 10 cents (fiat rate).

Penalties—Every person who by Act or omission, contravenes these By-laws is guilty of an offence and is liable for a first offence to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and, for any subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200).



#### By-law Relating to Noises.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 16th day of September, 1974, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law No. 6:-

1. By-law No. 6 of the City of Perth relating to Street Noises and Nuisances published in the *Government Gazette* on the eleventh day of August, 1939, is hereby repealed.

2. In this By-law "Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk or Acting Town Clerk of the City of Perth.

3. In this By-law "offensive noise" means any noise whether, made by the human voice or by any gramophone, amplifier, wireless appliance, bell, or other instrument or appliance which causes or is likely to cause a nuisance or inconvenience in the nature of a nuisance to occupiers of neighbouring premises or to persons using any street or public place.

4. A person shall not make any offensive noise on or in any street, way, footpath or other public place or in private property.

5. The owner of any private property or if the owner is not the occupier thereof then the occupier of such property shall at all times ensure that no offensive noise is made in such property.

6. A person shall not make any noise for advertisement purposes or in connection with addressing the public or by the use of gramophones, amplifiers, wireless appliances, bells or other instruments or appliances on or in a street, way, footpath or other public place or (if such noise can be heard in a street, way, footpath or other public place) in private property without the prior written consent of the Town Clerk and if the Town Clerk gives any such consent he may do so on such conditions as to the level of noise that may be made, and the dates, times and places at which it may be made, as he thinks fit.

7. Any person who fails to comply with any conditions imposed by the Town Clerk pursuant to Clause 6 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The owner of any private property or if the owner is not the occupier thereof then the occupier of such property shall at all times ensure that any conditions imposed by the Town Clerk pursuant to Clause 6 hereof are complied with.

9. Any person found guilty of an offence against this By-law will be liable on conviction to a penalty of \$200.00.

By-laws Relating to Hawkers and Stallholders.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 28th day of August, 1974 to revoke the by-laws relating to stalls as published in the *Government Gazette* on 3rd August 1973 and the by-laws relating to control of hawkers as published in the *Government Gazette* on 22nd April 1968 and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws the terms "hawker", "stall" and "stallholder" shall have the meanings assigned to them by Sections 217 and 242 of the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended). These definitions are as follows:---

"hawker" means a hawker, pedlar or other person who, with or without any horse or other beast bearing or drawing burden, travels and trades and goes from town to town or to other men's houses or is in any street there soliciting orders for or carrying to sell or exposing for sale any goods, wares or merchandise, but does not include—

- (a) commercial travellers or other persons selling or seeking orders for goods, wares or merchandise to or from persons who are dealers therein, or selling or seeking orders for books or newspapers;
- (b) sellers of vegetables, fish, fruit, newspapers, brooms, matches, game, poultry, butter, eggs, milk, or any victuals;
- (c) persons selling or exposing for sale goods, wares or merchandise in any public market or fair lawfully established, or upon any racecourse, agricultural showground, or public recreation ground;
- (d) sellers of goods of their own manufacture;
- (e) persons representing a manufacturer whose goods are sold direct to consumers only and not through the medium of a shop.

"stall" means a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services;

"stallholder" means a person in charge of a stall.

2. Any person who desires to hawk any goods, wares or merchandise, or to be a stallholder within the District, shall make application in writing to the Council for a licence so to do.

3. The Council shall not entertain any application for a hawker's licence (other than an application for a licence by way of renewal of a licence) unless the applicant produces a certificate signed by two Justices of the Peace certifying that the person sought to be licensed is of good character and reputation and is a fit person to exercise the trade of a hawker.

4. The Council may grant a licence to the applicant; or the Council may refuse to grant the licence on any of the following grounds:—

- (a) that the applicant has committed a breach of any of these By-laws;
- (b) that the applicant is not of good character or has been convicted of a criminal offence;
- (c) that the needs of the District or the portion thereof for which the licence is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have been issued;
- (d) that the stall is untidy, in disrepair or of insufficiently sound construction for use as a stall;
- (e) that the stall or the customers thereof will cause an obstruction to pedestrians or vehicular traffic;
- (f) that the stall will adversely affect the amenities of the area;
- (g) that inadequate parking space is available to the customers of the stall.

5. The licence granted to a hawker by the Council may be in respect of the whole District, or for any portion of the District specified in the licence. The licence may be granted upon the condition that the licensee shall not carry on business within a specified radius of any shop which sells commodities similar to those to be sold by the licensee.

6. The licence to a stallholder shall describe the things or services which are authorised by the licence to be sold at the stall and the place at which the stall is authorised to be set up and conducted.

7. A licence granted by the Council shall remain valid until the 31st day of December next after the issue of the licence unless previously revoked.

8. The fees set out hereunder shall be payable to the Council in respect of each licence—

Hawkers Licence —\$20.00. Stallholders Licence—\$40.00.

9. The Council may revoke any licence issued by it on any of the grounds set out in By-law 4 hereof, or on the grounds—

- (a) that the licensee has committed a breach of the terms or conditions of the licence;
- (b) that the licensee is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
- (c) that he has assigned his licence or does not himself carry on the business; or
- (d) that he is not regularly carrying on the business for which the licence was granted; or
- (e) that the stall does not comply with these by-laws.

10. No person shall hawk goods, wares or merchandise or act as a stall-holder—

- (a) without being licensed by the Council;
- (b) in any part of the District other than that specified in the licence;
- (c) in respect of commodities of a type description or place of origin not authorised by the licence; or
- (d) otherwise than in accordance with any conditions imposed by the Council when granting the licence.

11. No stallholder shall have a stall in any place other than that specified in the licence.

12. No hawker or stallholder shall-

- (a) sell or offer for sale any commodity excepting between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11.30 p.m.;
- (b) deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle or on the roadway or footpath;
- (c) shout his wares or make any violent outcry noise or disturbance;
- (d) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway; or
- (e) act in an offensive manner.

13. No person shall conduct a stall in such a manner that the stall or the customers cause an obstruction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

14. The person to whom a stallholders licence is issued shall maintain the stall in good order and condition.

15. No person shall conduct a stall on private property unless there is adequate provision on the private property adjacent to the stall for the parking of customers' vehicles.

16. A hawker or stallholder shall carry his licence and badge with him and produce it upon demand to any employee of the Council or to a member of the Police Force.

17. A stallholder shall have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.

18. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these By-laws or who shall be guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws shall be liable to—

(a) a maximum penalty of \$200.00; and

- (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20.00 per day; and
- (c) a minimum penalty of one-tenth of the maximum penalty and of one-tenth of the maximum daily penalty for the breach.

## PLANT DISEASES (ANNUAL RYE GRASS) REGULATIONS, 1974.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Plant Diseases (Annual Rye Grass) Regulations, 1974.

2. The object of these regulations is to prevent the spread within the State of the bacterium Corynebacterium sp. and the nematode Anguina lolli Price.

3. A person shall not bring or send, into any portion of the State specified in the Schedule to these regulations, from any of the other portions of the State so specified, the seed of annual rye grass (Lolium rigidum Gaud.) harvested in a municipal district mentioned in item 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7 of that Schedule unless—

- (a) a sample or samples of that seed has been taken by, or forwarded to, the Department of Agriculture; and
- (b) a statement in writing signed by, or purporting to be signed by, the Director of Agriculture, has been issued certifying that the seed contained in the sample or samples has been examined and that the bacterium *Corynebacterium* sp. and the nematode *Anguina lolli* Price were not detected.

4. Where, contrary to these regulations, the seed of annual rye grass is brought or sent or attempted to be brought or sent into any of the portions of the State specified in the Schedule to these regulations that seed may be seized by an inspector and dealt with in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1973.
