WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 8 of the Prisons Act, 1903-1969, that the Governor may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare any building, enclosure, or place to be a gaol and that every gaol so proclaimed shall thereupon be a prison within the meaning of that Act; and whereas by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th August, 1971 the Wooroloo Training Centre and the enclosure surrounding those buildings, being the land described as Reserve No. 14073 was declared to be a gaol; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 8 of the Act that any proclamation made under that section may be altered or revoked by the Governor; now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby alter the proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th August, 1971 by including in the enclosure surrounding the buildings known as the Wooroloo Training Centre the land described as Swan Location 8176 and Avon Location 28302 the subject of Conditional Purchase Lease 386/525.

Corres. 4417/74.—That Reserve No. 33043 should vest in and be held by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board in trust for the purpose of "Water Supply".

By-laws Relating to the Control of Dogs.

L.G. 494/74.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Shire hereby records having resolved on the 20/9/74 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these By-laws the term Council shall mean the Greenough Shire Council.
2. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provision of the Dog Act, 1903-1973.
3. A dog seized by a Police Officer or an Officer of the Council may be placed in the pound.
4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorized by the Council shall if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
5. If the owner or person apparently in charge of the dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of fees specified in the schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.
6. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
8. If a dog shall not be claimed and the fees paid within forty eight (48) hours of its being seized or if the dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within forty-eight (48) hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Council may sell the dog.
9. Upon the sale of a dog proceeds of the sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these By-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.
10. If within the times mentioned in By-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fees paid and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.
11. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the schedule hereto.
12. No person shall—
 - (a) unless a pound keeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
 - (b) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog proof any pound;
 - (c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog proof any dog cart, vehicle, or container used for the purpose of catching, holding, or conveying dogs which have been seized.
13. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.
14. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
 - (a) a public building;
 - (b) a theatre or picture garden;
 - (c) a house of worship;
 - (d) a shop or other business premises—

Notwithstanding paragraph (d) dogs may be taken into a veterinary or chemists premises for the express purpose of obtaining veterinary treatment or advice.
15. Except for the purpose of taking part in sheep dog trials or dog shows the owner of a dog shall prevent the dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash not exceeding eight (8) feet in length and held by a person—
 - (a) a sportsground;
 - (b) a place set aside for public recreation;
 - (c) a car park;
 - (d) a school;
 - (e) any public swimming area or beach;

(f) any land vested in or under the control of the Council other than a road.

16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from wandering at large without any effective control upon any road being vested in or under the control of the Council.

17. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the said Dog Act any dog seized or impounded may be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Clerk if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease, or sickness.

18. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performing of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

19. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention, or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under the provisions of these By-laws.

20. Any person who commits a breach of these By-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.

By-laws Relating to the Control of Dogs and Relating to Dog Kennels and Breeding of Dogs.

L.G. 243/59.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 10th day of October, 1974, to revoke the By-laws Relating to Dog Pounds, and the Control of Dogs By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 19th December, 1952, and make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws the term "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Roebourne.

2. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act 1903 as amended.

3. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other employees authorised by the Council shall if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

4. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

6. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or employee may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of the dog if made in good faith.

7. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being impounded or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council may sell the dog.

8. Upon the sale of a dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these By-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.

9. If within the times mentioned in By-law 7 thereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fees paid and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.

10. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the said Dog Act 1903 as amended any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Clerk of the Council if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from any injury disease or sickness.

11. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto.

12. No person shall—

- (a) unless a pound keeper or other employee of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
- (b) destroy break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
- (c) destroy break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog proof any dog cart vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

13. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.

14. Subject to the Provisions of Section 21A (3) of the Dog Act 1903. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre, picture gardens or drive-in theatre.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) A shop.
- (e) A sports ground and any buildings on that sports ground.

15. Subject to the Provisions of Section 21A (3) of the Dog Act 1903. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (b) A Car Park.
- (c) Any land vested in or under the control of the Council.

16. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1903 as amended or by the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions or by these By-laws.

17. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of its liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these By-laws.

18. The occupier of premises shall not keep or permit to remain thereon more than two dogs:—

- (a) Unless such dogs are kept in a kennel which complies with these By-laws; and
- (b) if such dogs are kept for breeding purposes, unless he be the holder of a licence from the Council authorising him to do so.

19. A person who keeps more than two dogs shall keep them in a kennel which is registered annually with the Council.

20. Any person who desires to register a dog kennel or to keep more than two dogs for breeding purposes shall make application in writing to the Council in the form of the Second Schedule.

21. The applicant for the registration of a kennel or for a licence to keep more than two dogs for breeding purposes shall before the registration or the granting of the licence advertise in a newspaper circulating in the District of the Council notice of his application and also give notice of the application to every owner of land situated within 270 metres of the proposed kennels. The notice shall state that any person may within 14 days object in writing to the Council to the registration or to the granting of the licence.

22. The Council may grant or refuse a licence to keep dogs for breeding purposes and if a licence be granted the Council may impose such conditions as it thinks fit. The licence shall specify the place where the dogs may be kept. The licence shall be in the form of the Third Schedule.

23. The registration of a dog kennel or a licence to keep dogs for breeding purposes shall remain valid until the 30th June next following the issue thereof but in the case of a licence unless it shall be previously revoked.

24. All applications for the renewal of the registration of dog kennels and for the renewal of licences to keep dogs for breeding purposes shall be made to the Council during the month of June in each year.

25. The fees payable for the registration of a dog kennel and for a licence to keep dogs for breeding purposes is \$10 per year or part thereof.

26. A person who commits a breach of any of the terms or conditions of a licence to keep dogs for breeding purposes commits an offence.

27. Any person being the owner or the occupier of premises whereon more than two dogs are kept shall provide a kennel or kennels which shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 30 metres from the front side or rear boundaries of the lot.
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 15 metres from any dwellinghouse church schoolroom hall shop or factory.
- (d) The walls shall be constructed of concrete brick stone or wood framing sheathed with asbestos or galvanised iron, internally and externally.
- (e) The roof shall be constructed of some impervious material.
- (f) All external surface of material of wood asbestos or galvanised iron shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint.
- (g) The lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor.
- (h) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 2 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron wood or galvanised link mesh.
- (i) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (j) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 millimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finishing to a smooth surface, it shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid ventilated and trapped. The floor shall have a coved upstand at the junction of the floor and the internal wall surface and in the case of a wooden framed building the bottom plate shall rest on a coved concrete upstand 75 millimetres above the floor level and the internal wall sheeting shall finish a minimum of 25 millimetres below the bottom of the floor plate. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the Health requirements of the Council.
- (k) The floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in the next preceding paragraph.
- (l) For each dog kept thereon every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard shall have not less than 25 square metres of floor space.

28. The occupier of any premises where more than two dogs are kept or permitted or suffered to remain shall not allow permit or suffer any dog to be at large or roam outside the kennel and yard.

29. No kennel shall be erected unless and until plans specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.

30. The occupier of any premises where a dog is kept or permitted or suffered to remain shall not allow such dog by continuous barking to be a nuisance to any inhabitant of the neighbourhood.

31. (1) No person shall keep a dog on any premises so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

(2) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels used by dogs shall be maintained in a clean condition and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.

32. Any person who shall commit a breach of any By-laws 1 to 18 shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.

33. Any person who shall commit a breach of any By-laws 19 to 29 shall upon conviction be liable to:

- (a) A maximum penalty of \$100 and
- (b) A maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$10.00 per day.

34. Any person who shall commit a breach of By-law 30 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100 and in the case of a continuing breach not exceeding \$4 for each day that the breach is committed.
