WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Commodore James Maxwell Ramsay, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Distinguished Service Cross, Lieutenant Governor and Administrator.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Road Traffic Act, 1974 that provisions of that Act shall come into operation on such date or such dates as is or are, respectively, fixed by proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the day on which this proclamation is published in the Government Gazette as the date on which sections 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12 of the Road Traffic Act, 1974 shall come into operation.

Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Commodore James Maxwell To Wit:

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to that Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State by

any person; and whereas such types of bread as are respectively specified in the schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, excluding Rottnest Island, and that is within a radius of twenty-eight miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the schedule to this proclamation.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

By-laws of the Shire of Menzies Council relating to the establishment, maintenance and equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Shire or any part of the Shire of Menzies.

Establishment of Brigade.

- 1. (a) On the resolution of the Council to establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954 and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade and application accompanied by the resolution of the Council forming the brigade shall be made to the Bush Fires Board for its registration accordingly. to the Bush Fires Board for its registration accordingly.
- (b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of Officers.

The Council shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade and who, in the Council's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

- 3. The Shire Clerk or such other person as the Council may appoint, shall be the Secretary of the brigade.
- 4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.
- 5. The Council shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the President and Shire Clerk of the Council conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954 and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the powers and duties of the captain.

Membership of Brigade.

- 7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—
 - (a) subscribing members;
 - (b) fire fighting members; and
 - (c) associate members.
- (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade at the following rates:—
 - (i) owner or occupier of land within the brigade area—minimum subscription of—\$1.00.
 - (ii) Other persons—minimum subscription of—\$0.50.
- (3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied members of either sex over 15 years who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
- (4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.
- (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Council.
- (6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council, but the Shire Clerk shall keep record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigades.

9. Meetings will be held as necessary.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1954, were passed by a resolution of the Menzies Shire Council (a Local Authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Menzies on 20th December, 1974.



L.G. 288/72.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Brookton hereby records having resolved on the 15th day of August, 1974, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law.

Regulation of Dog Kennels.

- 1. Where the owner or occupier of any premises keeps or permits or suffers to be kept more than two dogs on the premises at the one time the Council may declare such premises to be premises which the provision of this part of these by-laws apply and on premises so declared dogs shall be kept in an approved kennel or kennels and registered with the Council as hereinafter provided.
- 2. The occupier of any premises whereon more than two dogs are kept or permitted or suffered to remain and such premises have been declared by the Council pursuant to the preceding by-law, shall provide a kennel or kennels which shall comply with the following conditions:—
 - (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
 - (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 10 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
 - (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be any less distance than 24 metres from any road or street.
 - (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 12 metres from any dwelling house, flat, church, school, hall, factory or shop.
 - (e) The walls shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound.
 - (f) The roof shall be constructed of an impervious material acceptable to Council.
 - (g) All external surfaces of material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint.
 - (h) The lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor.
 - (i) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 2 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting.
 - (j) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
 - (k) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 millimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface, it should have a fall of not less than 1 in 100. The entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the Health requirements of the Council.
 - (1) The floor of any yard which is sealed shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in the next proceeding paragraph.
 - (m) For each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 3 square metres.
 - (n) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.
- 3. Council shall not permit the establishment or maintenance of a kennel in any area if in the opinion of the Council such kennel would adversely affect the environment, be a nuisance to other residents or in any way otherwise be detrimental or prejudical.
- 4. The occupier of any premises which have been declared by the Council shall not allow, permit or suffer any dog to be at large or roam outside the kennel or yard.
- 5. No kennel shall be erected unless and until plans, specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel and of the yard appurtenent thereto have been approved by the Council.
- 6. Council may not approve or register a kennel until the occupier of the premises has advertised in a public newspaper his intention to establish a kennel upon the premises and Council has considered any objections raised to the maintenance of the kennel upon the premises.

7. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of by-laws 1 to 7 (both inclusive) of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

L.G. 241/59.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality records having resolved on the 10th day of October, 1974 to revoke the By-laws relating to General Control, Management and Preservation of Public Property, Parklands, Reserves, and other places, the control of which is vested in the Shire, published in the Government Gazette of 19th July, 1956, and make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

- 1. In this by-law:—
 - "Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Roebourne.
 - "Shire Clerk" shall mean the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Roebourne.
 - "Inspector"—Inspector shall mean and include any Inspector in the employ of the Council, and shall also include any Hon. Inspector appointed by the Council to assist the Council to maintain a due observation of the By-laws of the Shire of Roebourne.
 - "Park, Public Reserve, Sports Ground, Recreation Ground or Open Space Areas vested in the Council" includes any land vested in or under the care, control or management of the Shire of Roebourne and used as a Park, Public Reserve, Sports Ground, Recreation Ground and Open Space Areas vested in the Council.
- 2. No person shall destroy, damage or interfere with any tree, tree guard, shrub, flower, plant, fence, building, seat, waterpipe, hose, hose fitting, soil, grass, surface or other property owned by or vested in the Council in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council.
- 3. No person shall carry firearms through any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, or shoot, snare, injure or destroy any bird, fish or animal therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or be upon any tree, shrub, tree guard, wall or fence or upon the roof of any building in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council.
- 5. No person shall tether any animal to any tree, shrub, tree guard, wall or fence in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council.

- 6. No person shall deposit or leave in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council any rubbish, refuse, clothing, paper, glass, china, timber, stone, bricks, sand, gravel, scrap metal or other material whether of the same kind or not, other than in a receptacle provided for the purpose.
- 7. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or using indecent, profane or insulting language or creating or taking part in any disturbance or making an harangue whereby a crowd is collected or committing any act of indecency in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council shall be liable to be removed therefrom forthwith by any officer or servant of the Council or by any member of the Police Force and shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.
- 8. No person shall cause, allow or suffer any horse or cattle to be or to be pastured upon any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council without first having obtained a license from the Counci to do so.
- 9. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Council shall lead, ride or drive any horse, cattle, bicycle, tricycle or vehicle upon or over any portion of any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, except upon a carriageway or an area set aside for the purpose of parking.
- 10. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Council, shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon any part of such park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground, or open space area vested in the Council except upon a carriageway or part of such park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground, or open space area vested in the Council, set aside for the purpose.
- 11. No person shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon a carriageway within any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground, or open space area vested in the Council, except on a duly appointed stand, or thereon for a longer period than is specified by a notice exhibited in such park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council.
- 12. The driver of any vehicle standing on any carriageway in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, shall place and keep the same and any horse or other animal attached thereto close to and parallel with the kerb or footpath on the left of such vehicle, except where channels or other obstructions prevent this from being done.
- 13. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, any goods or articles of any description, without having previously obtained the written permission of the Shire Clerk.
- 14. No person shall, in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, without the written permission of the Shire Clerk, take the photographic portrait of any person for reward or for the purpose of sale.
- 15. No person shall light any fire within any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, except in an area set aside for the purpose without the written permission of the Shire Clerk.
- 16. No person shall deface or write upon or post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted or otherwise affixed, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, writing or picture whatsoever upon any tree, building, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging or path in or around any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, without the written consent of the Shire Clerk first obtained.
- 17. No person shall, except in the course of a game being lawfully played on a park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, throw or discharge anything in, on to or over a park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council.
- 18. No person shall bathe in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council except in such areas set aside for the purpose.
- 19. No person shall in any park or public reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any caretaker, ranger, Inspector or other servant of the Council.
- 20. No person shall take upon or erect or operate upon any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground, or open space area vested in the Council any loudspeaker or other device for the amplification of sound without having previously obtained the written permission of the Shire Clerk.

- 21. No person shall, in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, speak or make any noise so as knowingly to cause such speech or noise to be amplified by any loud-speaker or other device without having previously obtained the written permission of the Shire Clerk.
- 22. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within any park, public reserve, recreation ground, sports ground or open space area vested in the Council.
- 23. No person shall gamble or play pitch and toss, or any other game of chance, in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council.
- 24. No person shall, unless authorised in that behalf by the Council, bring, carry, or take into or have in his possession or under his control in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council any fermented or spirituous liquors nor consume or drink the same therein, provided that this clause shall not apply to any person lawfully exercising or taking advantage of the privileges of a registered club for which is held a current licence granted under the provisions of the Licensing Act, 1911, as amended, with the approval of the Council.
- 25. No person shall camp, lodge or tarry overnight in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council or frequent the same for the purpose of camping lodging, or tarrying overnight therein.

26. No person shall-

- (a) Play at or practise golf in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council except in a park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council set aside for the purpose.
- (b) Play in or at any game between opposing teams or practise at any game in a park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or any open space area vested in the Council without having first obtained the written approval of the Shire Clerk.
- (c) Play at any game in a park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground, or any open space area vested in the Council to the annoyance or disturbance of any other person lawfully using the park, public reserve, recreation ground, sports ground or any open space area vested in the Council or in such circumstances that such play might reasonably be anticipated to cause damage to any tree, tree guard, shrub, flower, plant, fence, seat, building, waterpipe, hose-fitting, soil, grass surface or other property of whatsoever nature or kind owned by or vested in the Council.
- 27. No person or organised club having obtained permission as aforesaid shall practise or play at any such game, except at such times and upon such portions of the parks or public reserves as shall be specified in such permission.
- 28. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant or Inspector of the Council or any member of the Police Force to remove from any park, or public reserve any child under the age of six (6) years who is not under the control or in the care of a parent of such child or other person over the age of eighteen (18) years.
- 29. No person shall train or exercise any horse or dog within any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council, except in such parks, public reserves, sports grounds, recreation grounds or open space areas vested in the Council, or parts thereof as shall from time to time be set aside for the purpose.
- 30. No person shall suffer or allow any dog to enter or remain in any part of any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or any open space area vested in the Council unless on a leash.
- 31. No person shall erect or place within any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council any tent, stall, platform or table for public amusement or for any performance, whether for gain or otherwise, without the written consent of the Shire Clerk.
- 32. No person shall commit a nuisance in any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council or on or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room or other building erected on any part of any park, public reserve, sports ground, recreation ground or open space area vested in the Council.
- 33. No person shall fly any kite for the purpose of displaying advertising material, balloon or model aircraft from or on any park, public reserve, without the written permission of the Shire Clerk, except on such parks, public reserves, sports grounds, recreation grounds or open space areas vested in the Council or parts thereof as shall from time to time be set aside by the Council for the purpose.
- 34. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant or Inspector of the Council or any member of the Police Force to remove from any children's playground or from any kindergarten playground any person who is not entitled to the use thereof.

35. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding \$200.00.

By-laws for the Control and Management of Halls and Equipment and Property Under the Control of the Council.

L.G. 287/59.

IN PURSUANCE of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 30th Day of October, 1974 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws-

"Council" means the Wanneroo Shire Council;

"Building" means and includes any hall, room or corridor, or stairway, or annexe of any such hall or room excluding community recreation centres under the control of the Council;

"Clerk" means Shire Clerk, or other authorised officer of the Council.

- 2. Applications for the hire of any building and furniture shall be made to the Clerk and shall state the purpose for which the building and furniture is required.
- 3. Hiring of the building and property including furniture and equipment shall be at rates set out in the schedules hereunder.
- 4. Either the whole of the appropriate fee or such portion thereof as the Clerk shall determine shall be paid when the application is made.
- 5. If only portion of the fee is paid when the application is made the hirer shall pay the remainder of the fee not less than seven days before the date for which the hall is to be hired.
- 6. If the booking be cancelled by the hirer the fee or the portion thereof paid by the hirer shall be forfeited provided that the Council may in special circumstances authorise the repayment to the hirer of the whole or such portion of the fee as may be determined by the Council.
- 7. The Council may refuse to let a building or any part thereof to an applicant without assigning any reasons for such refusal.
- 8. If more than one application be received for the hire of a building or property or part thereof the Council may in its discretion and without regard to the priority of the applications and without assigning any reason thereof determine to which applicant the hiring shall be granted.
- 9. The Council may require that as a condition of the hiring, the hirer deposit the amount nominated by the Council to cover any damage which may occur to the hall or property or equipment during the term of the hiring. The Council may expend the sum so deposited in making good any damage caused during the hiring and shall return the balance if any to the hirer. The deposit of money pursuant to this clause shall not release a hirer from liability for and damage in excess of the amount deposited.
- 10. The Council may impose such other terms or conditions on the hiring as it considers reasonable generally or in any particular case.
 - 11. No person shall-
 - (a) deface or damage any building;
 - (b) place any nails, pins or screws in the woodwork or any part of the building without the consent of the Council;
 - (c) deface or damage any chattels or equipment the property of the Council, or hired with a building;
 - (d) without the consent of the Council remove or replace any electrical fitting in a building;
 - (e) without the consent of the Council remove from a building any chattels or equipment the property of the Council or hired with a building.
- 12. No person shall in or about a building vested in or under the control of the Council:
 - (a) behave in a disorderly manner;
 - (b) use any profane or indecent language;
 - (c) be in an intoxicated condition;
 - (d) create or take part in any disturbance;
 - (e) cause a nuisance or annoyance to an owner or occupier of any property in the vicinity of a building.
- 13. (1) The hirer of a building vested in or under the control of the Council shall—
 - (a) maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour therein;
 - (b) make good any damage to the building and any loss or damage to the property and equipment hired therewith or situated therein caused during the term of the hiring;
 - (c) be responsible for the carrying out of the terms of and the compliance with these by-laws;
 - (d) permit the Caretaker, a Ranger, and a member of or person authorised by the Council to have free ingress to the building for the purpose of making an inspection or enforcing any of these by-laws;
 - (e) leave the building in a clean and tidy condition after the term of the hiring;
 - (f) at the conclusion of the function turn off at the main switches all electric light and power;
 - (g) at the conclusion of the hiring return the keys of the building to the Caretaker.
- (2) The provisions of this by-law shall be deemed to be a condition of the hiring.
- 14. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these by-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100 for every such offence.
- 15. The Council reserves the right to grant a remission of all or any part of the charges set out in the schedules hereunder to any non-profit making, charitable, cultural or educational organisation.

16. The By-laws for the Control and Management of Halls and Equipment and Property under the Control of the Council published in the Government Gazette on 9th September, 1965, and amended in the Government Gazette on 28th May, 1969 and 19th April, 1973 are hereby revoked.
