AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth on 19th February, 1975, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Constitution Act, 1889-1970

Whereas section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1970 provides, *inter alia*, that the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Council may vest in heads of departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments to public offices under the Government of the State: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby vests in Bede Edward O'Malley, Manager of Education Supplies Branch, Education Department and in any person temporarily appointed to perform the normal duties of the said Bede Edward O'Malley during his absence or incapacity, the power to make appointments in respect of the Department specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, of employees in the categories specified respectively in Column 2 of the Schedule hereto in relation to the Department, on such terms and conditions as are contained from time to time in the award specified respectively in Column 3 of the Schedule hereto in relation to those categories of employees.

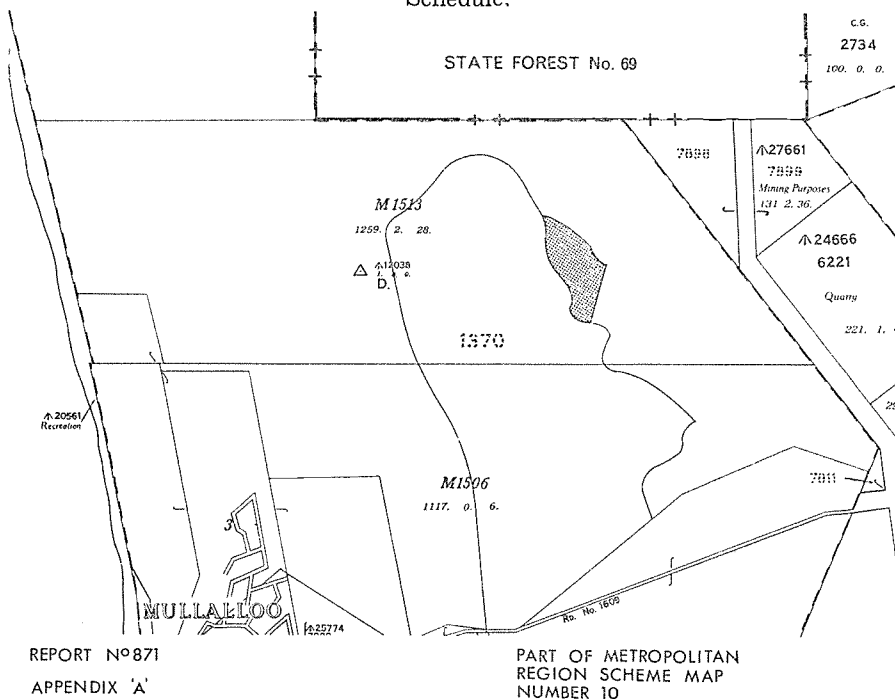

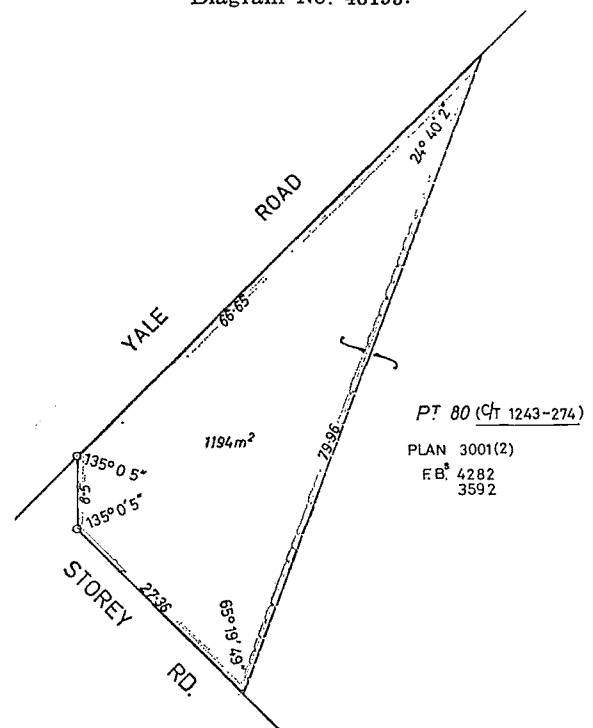
