In these regulations the Fisheries Act Regulations published in the Government Gazette on the 6th May, 1938 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published and reprinted as amended in the Government Gazette on the 30th May, 1967 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices published in the Government Gazette are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Regulation 3C of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted:-
 - 3C. (1) An application made pursuant to subsection (2) of section 35C of the Act for a permit to construct or otherwise establish a processing establishment shall be in the form of Form T1 in the Appendix to these regulations.
 - (2) A permit to construct or otherwise establish a processing establishment shall be in the form of Form B2 (a) in the Appendix to these regulations.
 - (3) An application made pursuant to subsection (1) of section 35CA of the Act for the grant of a processor's license shall be in the form of Form U in the Appendix to these regulations.
 - (4) A processor's license granted pursuant to subsection (1) of section 35CA in respect of a processing establishment shall be in the form of Form B3 in the Appendix to these regulations.

- (5) The holder of a processor's license shall whenever required by the Director furnish the Director with the particulars required in the Form of Form U1 in the Appendix to these regulations together with such other particulars as the Director may require pursuant to the Act.
- (6) The fees specified in the second column of the Schedule to this subregulation shall be payable for the grant, renewal or extension of a processor's license in respect of the type of processing establishments specified in the first column of that Schedule.





1. These regulations may be cited as the Vermin Act (Traps) Regulations, 1975.

Interpretation.

- 2. In these regulations unnecessary month; means calendar month; In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "municipal district" has the same meaning as it has in the Local Government Act, 1960;
 - "trap" means any steel trap, snare or other device (other than a live capture trap) used for the purpose of catching vermin.

Application regulations.

These regulations apply to the setting of a trap on any land within the boundaries of the municipal district of a city, town or shire that is set out in the schedule to these regulations.

- Person setting trap to notify Protection

 4. (1) Any person who intends to set a trap or traps during any month for the purpose of catching vermin shall notify the Chief Vermin Control Officer in writing of his intention.
 - (2) The notification required to be given under subregulation (1) of this regulation shall state-
 - (a) the month during which it is intended to set the trap or traps;
 - (b) the location of the land on which it is intended to set the trap or traps;
 - (c) the species of vermin intended to be trapped; and
 - (d) the number and type of traps that are to be set.

Protection

- (1) Upon receipt of notification given under regulation 4 of Board to acknowledge, these regulations the Chief Vermin Control Officer shall forthwith acknowledge that notification by forwarding to the person from whom the notification was received a notice of acknowledgment.
 - (2) A notice of acknowledgment issued under subregulation (1) of this regulation shall specify the month in respect of which it is issued.

Duties of ersons who person... . set traps.

- Any person who sets a trap shall-
 - (a) ensure that all vermin and other animals or birds caught in the trap are disposed of in a humane manner;
 - (b) inspect the trap at reasonable intervals of time so as to minimize the suffering of all vermin and other animals or birds caught in the trap;
 - (c) exercise reasonable care to prevent animals or birds that are not vermin from being caught in the trap; and
 - on demand made by any officer of the Protection Board, the Department of Agriculture or of The Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Western Australia (Incorporated), produce to that officer a notice of acknowledgment issued to him under regulation 5 of these regulations in respect of the current month.

Offences.

Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of these regulations commits an offence. Penalty: Twenty dollars.
