- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations, 1975 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th May, 1975 are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 3 amended. 2. Subregulation (1) of regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended—
(a) by adding after the interpretation "licensee" the following interpretations—
"ordinary plates" means identification tablets or number plates that are not personalised plates;
"personalised plates" means identification tablets or number plates being reflective plates consisting of no more than seven characters, the first being a letter and the last being the letter "P"; ; and
(b) by deleting from line two of the interpretation "reflective plates" the word "white".
- Reg. 22 substituted. Authority to provide number plates. 3. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 22 the following regulation:—
22. (1) The Authority shall provide and issue identification tablets or number plates in respect of every vehicle that is licensed under Part III of the Act other than a taxi-car licensed under the Taxi-cars (Co-ordination and Control) Act, 1963.
(2) The Authority shall make the following charges for the issue of identification tablets and number plates, namely—
\$
(a) for the issue of ordinary plates at the time a vehicle licence is taken out 2.00
(b) on application for the issue of personalised plates 30.00
(c) for the issue of ordinary plates to replace other ordinary plates 2.00
(d) on application for the issue of personalised plates to replace personalised plates bearing the same characters 8.00
(3) Notwithstanding the charges imposed under subregulation (2) of this regulation, every identification tablet or number plate remains the property of the Authority and shall be returned thereto by the person being the owner, or other person in possession of the vehicle in respect of which it was issued, forthwith upon the cancellation of, or the disqualification of the licensee from holding, the licence, or within fifteen days of the expiry of the licence, in respect of which the identification tablet or number plate was issued.
(4) A person who wishes to obtain personalised plates to replace ordinary plates previously issued in respect of a vehicle shall return those ordinary plates to the Authority.
(5) Except in a case referred to in subregulation (6) of this regulation a person who wishes to obtain ordinary plates to replace personalised plates previously issued in respect of a vehicle shall return those personalised plates to the Authority.

(6) A person to whom a set of personalised plates has been issued may, with the approval of the Authority, and on payment of a fee of \$3.00 to the Authority, transfer those plates to another vehicle owned by him and shall, where the vehicle from which the personalised plates were removed, is still licensed, obtain a set of ordinary plates from the Authority and affix those plates to the vehicle.

(7) Before transferring a vehicle in respect of which a set of personalised plates has been issued the transferor shall obtain a set of ordinary plates and affix those plates to the vehicle.

4. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 24 the following regulation:—

24. (1) Subject to subregulations (2) and (3) of this regulation identification tablets or number plates shall display such words, letters and numerals as the Authority, with the approval of the Minister may determine and in each case have the expression "W.A." above the words, letters and numerals.

(2) Where a vehicle is owned by the State Government or by a State Board the expression "W.A. GOVT." shall appear above the letters and numerals on the identification tablets or number plates unless the Minister approves the use of identification tablets or number plates in accordance with subregulation (1) of this regulation.

(3) Identification tablets or number plates may be issued by the Authority displaying a letter or letters approved by the Authority indicating the district in which the owner of the vehicle resides, together with a numeral or numerals and shall in addition have the expression "W.A.", painted or placed above the letter or letters and numeral or numerals.

(4) Any identification tablet or number plate issued pursuant to subregulation (3) of this regulation to an owner residing in the district of a Shire, shall have enamelled or painted in the same colour as the lettering and numerals, a circular figure in the shape of a disc of approximately thirty-eight millimetres in diameter, between the lettering and the numerals.

(5) Identification tablets and number plates shall bear the prescribed characters enamelled or painted thereon, in the colour and on the ground approved by the Authority for the class of tablets or plates concerned.

(6) The Authority may, by notice served on a licensee, require the licensee to surrender to it any identification tablets or number plates specified in the notice that are not reflective plates and on receipt of the appropriate charge prescribed in regulation 22 for the issue of plates, issue to the licensee a set of reflective plates by way of replacement.

(7) For the purposes of subregulation (6) of this regulation, a notice may be served on a licensee by—

- (a) personally serving the notice upon him;
- (b) by serving the notice upon him through the ordinary course of the post; or
- (c) by leaving the notice addressed to the licensee, without naming him or stating his address, in, upon or attached to the vehicle to which, are affixed the identification tablets or number plates to which the notice relates.

(8) A licensee who fails, within fourteen days after the service on him of a notice pursuant to subregulation (6) of this regulation, to surrender to the licensing authority, the identification tablets or number plates specified in the notice commits an offence.

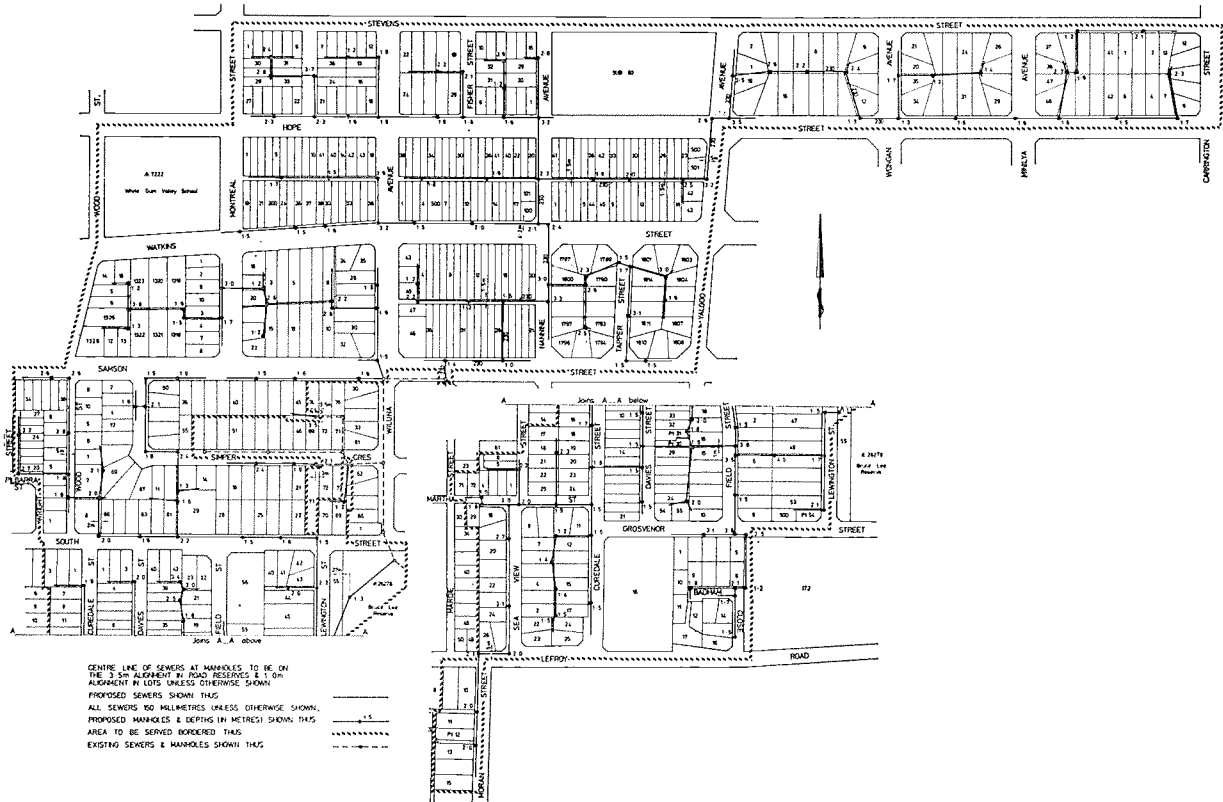

STOCK DISEASES (REGULATIONS) ACT, 1968-1974.

Department of Agriculture,
South Perth, 30th July, 1975.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Executive Council acting under the provisions of the Stock Diseases (Regulations) Act, 1968-1974, has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the schedule below.

Schedule.
Regulations.

1. In these regulations the Enzootic Diseases Regulations, 1970, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th June, 1970 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published and reprinted as so amended pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th March, 1974 and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th May, 1974, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Subregulation (1a) of regulation 30 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following subregulation substituted:—

(1a) A person shall not bring or attempt to bring cattle or sheep into the State for the purposes of immediate slaughter at an abattoir situate—

(a) in the Kimberley Division of the State unless he first furnishes the declaration and certificate referred to in paragraph (a) in the Third Column of the Second Schedule opposite item E; or

(b) in any portion of the State outside the Kimberley Division unless he first obtains the approval and furnishes the declaration and certificates referred to in paragraph (b) in the Third Column of the Second Schedule opposite item E.

3. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is amended by deleting the passage commencing with the word "Where" and ending with the passage "Inspector." under the column headed "Conditions Governing" opposite and corresponding to item "E.—Cattle or sheep" under the column headed "Animals" and substituting the following passage:—

Where the cattle or sheep are intended for immediate slaughter at an abattoir situate—

(a) in the Kimberley Division of the State—

(i) declaration from the person having possession of the stock in the form of Form No. 6 in the Third Schedule; and

(ii) certificate from the person having possession of the stock that the cattle or sheep are not under surveillance on account of disease, and that they will be consigned on a transport approved by the Chief Inspector; or

(b) in any portion of the State outside the Kimberley Division—

(i) prior approval for the introduction from the Chief Inspector;

(ii) all animals shall be distinctly identified by a paint or wool brand;

(iii) declaration and certificate referred to in subparagraph (i) and subparagraph (ii) respectively of paragraph (a) of this column of this item; and

(iv) in the case of cattle certificate from the District Veterinary Officer for the district of the State or Territory from which the cattle will be brought into this State that—

(A) each female and entire male bovine animal not derived from an accredited brucellosis free herd has been subjected to a serological test for brucellosis with negative results on two occasions at least 30 days apart within 44 days prior to movement and was isolated from other cattle during the 44 days in question; and

(B) each bovine animal not being introduced from an accredited tuberculosis free herd has been subjected to an intradermal tuberculin test for bovine tuberculosis with negative result within 14 days of movement.

AMENDING STATUTE No. 1 of 1975.

1. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 8—THE FACULTIES:

(a) Clause 10 is amended by the deletion of the words “the Principal of the Secondary Teachers’ College and two principals of primary teachers’ colleges nominated by the Director-General of Education”.

(b) Clause 11 is amended by the insertion of the words “who must be a student enrolled in the Faculty of Economics and Commerce” after the words “President of the Society or his nominee”.

(c) Clause 14 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 14 and the substitution of the following clause in its place:—

14. The Faculty of Agriculture shall consist of the professors and lecturers in the Institute of Agriculture, two full time members of the teaching staff of the Faculty of Science nominated annually by that Faculty, one full time member of the teaching staff of the Faculty of Economics and Commerce nominated annually by that Faculty, two members of the Agriculture Club of the University enrolled in the Faculty of Agriculture elected annually by the members of that Club, and such other persons who are involved in the teaching or business of the Institute of Agriculture, as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

(d) Clause 17 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 17 and the substitution of the following clause in its place:—

17. The quorum for meetings of a Faculty shall be twenty-five members or one-third of the number of the members in the Faculty, whichever is the less. In calculating the numbers required for a quorum members of the Faculty on approved leave from the University will be excluded.

(e) Clause 18. (4) is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 18. (4) and the substitution of the following clause in its place:—

18. (4) The quorum for each Advisory Board shall be one-fourth of the number of members of the Board excluding those on approved leave from the University.

(f) Clause 18. (1) (c) is amended by—

(i) the insertion of the words “and the Sub-Dean” after the word “Dean” in Sub-clause 18. (1) (c) (i); and

(ii) the substitution of the words “nineteen” and “four” for the words “twenty” and “five” respectively in Sub-clause 18. (1) (c) (vi).

2. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 11—ACADEMIC DRESS:

Clause 4. (b) is amended by the insertion of the words “Jurisprudence—Heliotrope (B.C.C. 178)” after the words “Japanese Studies—Gold Brown (B.C.C. 74)”.

3. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 19—PROFESSORIAL BOARD:

(a) Clause 1 is amended by the insertion of a new Subclause (iii) as follows:—

(iii) for the purposes of this clause the term lecturers includes senior tutors and senior demonstrators;

(b) Clause 15 is amended by the insertion of the words “associate professor” before the word “reader” and the words “associate professorship” before the word “readership”.

4. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 20—GUILD OF UNDERGRADUATES:

The existing Statute No. 20 is to be repealed and replaced by a new Statute No. 20 as follows:—

STATUTE No. 20—GUILD OF UNDERGRADUATES.

1. Throughout this Statute unless otherwise indicated, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them, respectively:—

“Guild”—the Guild of Undergraduates referred to in Section 28 of the University of Western Australia Act;

“Guild Council”—the Council of the Guild referred to in Clause 7 of this Statute;

“regulations”—regulations made by the Guild under the authority of Clause 11 of this Statute;

“by-laws and rules”—by-laws and rules made by the Guild under the authority of Clause 7 of this Statute;

“General Meeting”—Any general meeting of members of the Guild held under the authority of Clause 8 of this Statute at which all ordinary members of the Guild may vote;

“Referendum”—Any ballot on any subject held under the authority of Clause 8 of this Statute at which all ordinary members of the Guild may be required to vote;

“student society”—Any club, society or association within the University of Western Australia having an initial membership of ten or more members of the Guild and having a membership of not less than five members of the Guild at all subsequent times and which is registered by the Guild in the manner prescribed in the regulations.

“ordinary members”—Ordinary members of the Guild by virtue of Clause 5.

“subordinate organs of the Guild”—Organs established from time to time by the Guild Council and subject to its control.

2. The objects of the Guild shall be—

(a) to foster all that tends to the advancement of learning and the ennoblement of life;

(b) to afford means of social intercourse to students at the University;

(c) to provide or conduct or manage such educational, cultural, sporting, welfare, recreational or commercial facilities or activities which shall be intended for the benefit either directly or indirectly of members of the Guild;

(d) generally to further the common interest of students at the University.

3. For the purposes of carrying out its objects the Guild shall have power—

(a) to expend and invest moneys;

(b) to operate banking accounts;

(c) to transact such financial business as may be necessary to implement the objects of the Guild;

(d) to borrow, raise or secure the payment of money for any of the objects of the Guild from time to time and in particular by mortgaging or charging the property of the Guild or any part thereof;

(e) to enter into contracts on behalf of the Guild or any student society, the terms of which have been approved by the Guild Council;

(f) to lend moneys to ordinary members of the Guild;

(g) to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property and to sell, let, mortgage or dispose of the same;

(h) to exercise a general supervision and control over all student societies;

(i) to register student societies with the Guild and affiliate them with subordinate organs of the Guild;

(j) to assume the care control and management of the property and financial affairs of any student society, either pending a further resolution of the Guild Council or for such period as the Guild Council deems fit;

(k) to engage and dismiss employees;

(l) to incorporate or cause to be incorporated any student society under the Associations Incorporation Act or under the Companies Act or any like legislation for the benefit of the members of that society and to limit the liability of the Guild, and to hold shares in any company so incorporated;

(m) to hold licences under any legislation for the time being in force;

(n) to admit to associate membership, honorary associateship or honorary life associateship persons other than ordinary members of the Guild;

(o) in the manner prescribed in the regulations, to impose fines upon members of the Guild, upon members and officers of student societies and on student societies, for breaches of the provisions of this Statute, or regulations, by-laws or rules authorised to be made under this Statute, provided that the limits of all such fines shall be clearly stated in the regulations, by-laws or rules;

(p) generally, to act in all other matters authorised by this Statute or necessary or convenient for giving effect to this Statute.

4. Subject to this Statute and the regulations made hereunder, the Guild Council shall have the entire control and management of the affairs and concerns of the Guild and may act in all matters concerning the Guild in such manner as appears to it best calculated to promote the interests of the Guild.

5. All undergraduate students enrolled for any unit or part unit of a course for a Bachelor's degree shall be ordinary members of the Guild provided that such a student may be exempted by the Vice-Chancellor from all obligations of membership, but not from payment of the Guild subscription on the grounds of conscience or any other grounds approved by the Vice-Chancellor and provided also that any other student of the University may be an ordinary member of the Guild. No other person shall be an ordinary member of the Guild.

6. The annual subscription to the Guild shall be such sum as shall be approved by the Senate after report and recommendation by the Guild.

7. (1) The Guild shall be governed by a Council to be termed the Guild Council. The number of members from time to time of the Guild Council, and the manner of election of those members, shall be prescribed in the regulations.

(2) The Guild Council may in the manner prescribed in the regulations make alter or repeal by-laws and rules but may only do so when the power to do so is specified in a regulation and then only to the extent so specified.

(3) The Guild Council shall make provision for the control and management of any property from time to time owned or occupied by the Guild.

8. (1) A General Meeting of the Guild may debate any issue of concern to members of the Guild.

(2) Resolutions passed at any General Meeting of the Guild may be in the form of a recommendation to the Guild Council.

(3) Any referendum held by the Guild shall determine Guild policy on the issues submitted to the referendum, which shall bind the Guild Council.

9. The Guild shall be the recognised means of communication—

(a) between the students or any section of them and the governing authority of the University;

(b) between the students of this University or any section of them and other tertiary institutions.

10. The Guild Council shall provide for the safe custody of the Common Seal which shall only be used by the authority of a resolution of the Guild Council and in the presence of the President of the Guild who shall sign every instrument to which the Seal is affixed and every such instrument shall be countersigned by the Secretary of the Guild or some other person appointed by the Guild Council.

11. The Guild, in the manner prescribed in this Statute, may make alter and repeal regulations to provide for—

(a) (i) the administration organisation and finances of the Guild;

(ii) the interpretation, subject to an appeal to the Guild Council, or a committee comprising not less than three members of Guild Council appointed for the purpose, and subject to a further appeal to the Senate, or a committee of not less than three members of the Senate appointed for the purpose, of the provisions of regulations, by-laws and rules;

(iii) the detailed implementation of the objects and powers of the Guild and the provisions of this Statute;

(iv) any other matter requiring regulation for the purpose of this Statute.

12. The power to make alter and repeal regulations under this Statute shall be exercised in the manner following, that is to say—

(a) a resolution to make alter or repeal regulations shall in the first instance be passed by an absolute majority of Guild Council;

(b) the resolution as so passed shall be posted on the official Guild notice board and published in "Pelican" or any other publication produced under the authority of the "Pelican" editor and financed in part or in whole from the moneys set aside in the "Pelican" account, in both cases notice being given to the ordinary members of the Guild that they are entitled to have the resolution considered at the general meeting of the Guild if notice in that behalf is given within 14 days;

(c) if no such notice is given the resolution shall take effect after the expiration of the said period of 14 days;

(d) if notice is so given to the Secretary of the Guild within the said period of 14 days, the resolution shall be considered at the next general meeting of the Guild or at a special general meeting convened for the purpose;

(e) provided that notwithstanding paragraph (c) no proposed alteration or repeal of any regulation dealing with the raising and expenditure of the revenue of the Guild will become operative unless it has the consent of a two-thirds majority of the ordinary members present at a duly constituted general meeting of the Guild;

- (f) at such general meeting the resolution may be confirmed or amended, in either event by a two-thirds majority of the ordinary members present. If so confirmed the resolution shall forthwith take effect;
- (g) if the resolution is amended at such general meeting, the amended resolution shall be considered at the next meeting of Guild Council, and if accepted by an absolute majority of the Guild Council, shall thereupon take effect;
- (h) once having been referred to a general meeting, no resolution to make alter or repeal a regulation shall take effect unless and until it has, in its final form, received the approval of both an absolute majority of Guild Council and a two-thirds majority of the ordinary members present at a general meeting;
- (i) where a regulation is made altered or repealed in the manner outlined in (a), (b) and (c) above, the Guild President shall prepare and sign a certificate setting forth the resolution and the manner of compliance with (b) above, such certificate to be presented at the next general meeting of the Guild for that meeting's information;
- (j) without derogation from the foregoing, if at a general meeting of the Guild a resolution is passed that a proposal to make later or repeal a regulation be submitted to referendum, the Guild Council shall cause the proposal to be submitted to a referendum of the ordinary members of the Guild either at the next forthcoming general election or by-election or at such other time decided upon by the Guild Council, provided such time is not subsequent to the next forthcoming general election. If the proposal meets with the approval of a majority of those voting at the referendum, the Guild Council shall at its next meeting pass a resolution that regulations be so made altered or repealed as the case may be, and the resolution shall take effect forthwith.
- (k)
 - (i) any regulation so made, altered or repealed shall be forwarded to the office of the Registrar, and a receipt therefor shall be signed by the Registrar, or on his behalf;
 - (ii) the Registrar shall submit such regulations for consideration at the next ordinary meeting of the Senate, or at a special meeting of the Senate convened for the purpose;
 - (iii) the Senate may disallow the regulations in whole or in part, but in the event that the regulations are not disallowed within a period of three months after the first meeting of the Senate at which they are considered, they shall be deemed to have been allowed at the expiration of that period;
 - (iv) subject to the foregoing, the regulations shall be of full force and effect as from the date the same are allowed by the Senate.

13. An audited copy of the Annual Balance Sheet and Statement of Income and Expenditure of the Guild shall each year be transmitted to the Senate.

14. (1) A copy of this Statute and any amendments thereof and a copy of any regulations, by-laws and rules made under this Statute and any amendments thereof shall be enrolled upon a Statute Book.

(2) An entry upon the Statute Book of this Statute or any alterations thereto signed by the Registrar shall be *prima facie* evidence that the subject matter thereof was duly approved by the Senate.

(3) An entry upon the Statute Book of any regulation made under this Statute, or any alteration thereto, signed by the Registrar and the President of the Guild, shall be *prima facie* evidence that the subject matter thereof was duly submitted to the Senate following approval by the Guild and not disallowed.

(4) An entry upon the Statute Book of any by-law or rule made under this Statute or any alteration thereto signed by the President of the Guild shall be *prima facie* evidence that the subject matter thereof was duly approved by the Guild.

15. (1) This Statute shall come into operation on the day it is published in the *Government Gazette*, and thereupon the existing Statute No. 20 is hereby repealed.

(2) All regulations, by-laws and rules made under the authority of Statute No. 20 prior to the date of publication of this Statute in the *Government Gazette* shall be deemed to have been made under the authority of this Statute.
