## Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1971, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act are for the nurposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas the Town of Kalgoorlie and the Shire of Boulder were so declared the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Fire District; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by sub-section (2) of that section that for the purposes

of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Fire District so that the boundaries are in accordance with the description set out in the Schedule to this Order.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the northern corner of Hampton Location 33, and extending southeasterly along the northeastern boundary of that location to the prolongation northerly of the eastern side of Boyle Street; thence southerly to and along that side to the northern side of Bulong Road; thence southerly to the northeastern corner of Late G.M.L. 3451E; thence southeasterly to the northeastern-most corner of Late Saw Milling Site 111/33; thence generally southerly along boundaries of that site, to its southeasternmost corner; thence southwesterly to the northern corner of G.M.L. 5223E; thence northwesterly to the southeastern corner of the South Boulder Suburban Area Boundary; thence westerly, northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that Suburban Area and onwards to the prolongation southerly of the western boundary of the western severance of Reserve 12935; thence northerly along that prolongation to the prolongation westerly of the northern side of Chaffers Street; thence westerly along that prolongation to a point situate south of the southernmost corner of Somerville Suburban Area; thence north to that corner; thence generally northwesterly along southwestern boundaries of that Suburban Area to the southeastern side of the Great Eastern Highway; thence southwesterly along that side to the northeastern side of a Road passing along the southwestern boundary of Hampton Location 7; thence northwesterly along that side to a northwestern side of the Standard Gauge Railway Reserve as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 10791; thence generally northeasterly along that side to a southwestern boundary of the Somerville Suburban Area; thence northwesterly along that boundary and onwards to the pro-longation southwesterly of the northwestern side of Killarney Street; thence northeasterly to and along the porthwestern side of that street to the along the northwestern side of that street to the southwestern side of Keenan Street; thence northwesterly along that side to the southeastern boundary of Hampton Location 51; thence southwesterly, northwesterly and northeasterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the centre line of the Kalgoorlie-Leonora Railway Reserve; thence southerly along that centre line to the prolonga-tion northeasterly of the northwestern side of Premier Street; thence easterly to the western-most corner of Hampton Location 33, aforesaid: and thence northeasterly along the northwestern boundary of that location to the starting point.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1975, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Exceutive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

City of Stirling.

Rising Main, Yokine Pump Station No. 2, Dog Swamp, Lockwood Street.

The construction of a three hundred and eighty millimetre nominal steel diameter rising main, as shown on plan M.W.B. 13241A as amended.

#### SHIRE OF IRWIN TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 2.

THE Irwin Shire Council, under and by virtue of, the powers conferred upon it is in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Planning Scheme for the purpose of:-

- (a) Preserving the amenity of the Scheme Area.
- (b) Controlling land development.
- (c) Controlling the placing of advertising signs and billboards.

#### PART I.-PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Irwin Town Planning Scheme No. 2 here-inafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's approval thereof in the Government Gazette.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 This Scheme supersedes in all respects the Shire of Irwin Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

14 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Irwin, hereinafter called "the Council".

1.5Arrangement of the Scheme:

The Scheme is divided into the following parts:

Part I.—Preliminary. Part II.—Zones. Part III.—Non-Conforming Uses. Part IV.—General Provisions.

- Part V.-Administration.

The Scheme documents comprise this text and the Scheme Map.

- 1.6 Interpretation:
  - (a) Subject to the provisions of subclause (b) of this clause, in this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless specifically stated herein.
  - (b) In this Scheme, unless the context requires otherwise-
    - "extractive industry" means the taking of sand, gravel, clay, soil, rock, stone, ore, minerals or similar substance from the land and also the processing of those materials;

"sign" means any device erected for the purpose of advertising or soliciting a service or a commodity or publicising an event or place or object;

"roadhouse" means a service station with or without public eating facilities.

### PART II.-ZONES.

2.1 The Scheme Area is divided into the following zones:-

Residential.

Extensive Residential.

Commercial.

Industrial.

Recreation

- Special Site.
- Government and Institutional.

(a) Table No. 1 appended to Clause 2.3 of 2.2this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the zones, such uses being deter-mined by cross reference between the list of "Use

Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of Zones at the top of that Table.

(b) Where a use is not specifically stated in the list of Use Classes it shall be included in the most appropriate Use Class or deemed not to be per-mitted in any zone at the discretion of Council.

2.3 The symbols used in Table No. 1 appended to this Clause have the following meaning.

- "P" - a use that is permitted.
- "AA" a use that is permitted only if special permission is granted by Council.
- "IP" a use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominent use as decided and ap-proved by Council.
- "X" a use that is not permitted.

## PART III-NON-CONFORMING USES.

3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent-

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was lawfully used at the time of coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), any other law authorising to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part II a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 3.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may not be extended without the written consent of Council and then only to the limits prescribed in the Uniform Building By-Laws or to these limits prescribed in Schedule 1 of the or to those limits prescribed in Schedule 1 of the Scheme.

3.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the area than the existing use, or is in the opinion of Council closer to the intended uses of the area of the zone.

3.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discon-tinued such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property or by payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or both owner and occupier of the property and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART IV—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

4.1 Within the Residential Zone the following provisions shall apply:-

- (a) the provisions of Table 213A (GR4) of the Uniform Building By-Laws, 1965, as amended.
- (b) Minimum landscaping of 30% of the site. Within the Extensive Residential Zone the 4.2following provisions shall apply:-
  - - (a) a minimum lot size of 1 hectare (b) minimum setbacks from boundaries:-
    - Front-15 metres
      - Sides—15 metres Rear—15 metres

provided that Council may vary these requirements where the dimensions of the lot or some physical feature would result in undue hardship.

4.3 Within the Commercial Zone:

- (a) Service for shops shall be provided by vehicle access to the rear of such shops and such access will be screened from public view to the satisfaction of the Council.
- (b) One on-site parking space shall be provided for every 18 square metres of gross floor area.

Within the Industrial Zone the following 44 provisions shall apply:-

- (a) A maximum site coverage of 70%.
- (b) Minimum setbacks from boundaries-Front-12 metres.
  - Sides-3 metres.
  - Rear-12 metres.
- (c) Minimum of 1 car parking space for every 2 persons employed.
- (d) The area between the front boundary and the front setback line shall only be used in accordance with the following formula-
  - Lot Frontage-
    - 3 metres: landscaping and means of access.
    - 3-12 metres: landscaping and/or means of access and/or car parking and/or loading and unloading of vehicles.
- 4.5 Within the Special Site Zone:
  - (a) Provisions for on-site parking, landscaping, setbacks from boundaries shall be at the discretion of the Council which shall have regard to the provisions specified for the various uses in Schedule 1.
  - (b) Design and building materials shall be in harmony with the natural environment.

4.6 Within the Government and Institutional Zone: Provisions relating to on-site parking, landscaping and setbacks from boundaries shall be at the discretion of the Council which shall have regard to the provisions specified for various uses in Schedule 1.

- 4.7 Signs, Hoardings, Billboards, etc.:
  - (a) No person shall erect any sign within the Scheme Area without the prior written approval of the Council.
  - (b) The Council shall not approve the erection of any sign for a service or commodity which is not offered, or produced or sold on the lot on which the sign is to erected, except as provided in the section 4.7 (e) of this Part.
  - The Council shall not approve the erection (c) of any sign which is to be affixed to a tree or a fence-post.
  - (d) In exercising its discretionary power under this section, Council shall have regard to:
    - (i) the design and colour of the sign; (ii) a maximum area of 1.5 square
    - metres; (iii) the location of the sign and its effect on the scenic attraction of the area;
    - and (iv) the distractive effect that the sign may have on motorists.
  - (e) Temporary signs: Council may approve the erection of a sign for a specific period and the provisions of this section shall apply to such signs.
  - (f) Where a person has been given permission to erect a sign, he shall remove it after the service or commodity offered or solicited is no longer offered or solicited.
  - (g) Council may specify an area where approved signs may be erected.
  - (h) Clause 4.7 (a) of this Part shall not apply to road signs and other signs erected by public authorities.
  - (i) The Council may order the removal of a sign which has been erected contrary to the provisions of this Part by sending a registered letter to that effect to the owner of the land on which the sign is erected and the sign shall be removed within 60 days of the issue of that letter.
  - (j) Where a person fails to comply with the provisions of this Part, the Council may remove the sign and recover from the person in default such costs as the Council has incurred in so doing.

Appearance of Buildings: All buildings shall be maintained by the owner and occupier thereof so as to preserve the amenities of the locality and their harmony with the appearance of neighbouring buildings.

4.9 Prohibition of Unsightly Objects: No person shall cause, allow or permit to be placed on any buildings or land which is visible from any public place or from any other land or building, any article or object which in the opinion of Council, is unsightly, offensive or otherwise considered det-rimental to the amenity of the area.

### PART V.-ADMINISTRATION.

5.1 Any application for development required under any provision of the Scheme and any apunder any provision of the Scheme and any ap-plication for a Building Permit required under the Local Government Act where the development is listed as "P" in a particular zone, shall be in writing and be accompanied by such plans, sketches and specifications as to fully illustrate the proposal to the satisfaction of the Council.

5.2 Such applications shall be approved, conditionally approved or refused by the Council.

5.3 The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council in the use of its discretionary powers under the Scheme, may appeal in accordance with Part V of the Town Planning and Developement Act and the Regulations made thereunder.

5.5 Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein, is liable to such penalties as are prescribed in the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 25th day of March, 1975, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

Application.

1. These By-laws shall apply to and be in force within the whole of the Area of the district of the Shire of Esperance.

#### Interpretation.

2. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise indicates or requires, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Act"—The Air Navigation Acts, 1920-1973, of the Commonwealth of Australia or other Act or Acts of the Commonwealth relating to air navigation for the time being in force.

"Aerodrome"—Any area of land under the control of the Council as an aerodrome whilst and so long as licensed for the purpose of an aerodrome under the Regulation.

"Aerodrome Manager"—The officer appointed by or under the authority of the Council for the time being directing and controlling the traffic of aircraft on any aerodrome or of persons having business with aircraft on any aerodrome.

"Council"—The Council of the Shire of Esperance.

"Groundsman"—Any person appointed by or under the authority of the Council to control and supervise the use generally of any aerodrome, or for the time being acting in the discharge of such duties.

"Local Government Acts"—The Local Government Acts, 1960 to 1975 or any Act for the time being in force amending or in substitution therefor.

"Owner"—Includes lessee, charterer, and person for the time being in control of the aircraft.

"Pilot"—The person actually controlling an aircraft at the relevant time. If there is no such persons, then the person entitled to such control.

"Regulations"—The Air Navigation Regulations made under the Act and for the time being in force by virtue of the Act.

Any term defined in the Act or Regulations shall have the same meanings in these by-laws.

## Use by Aircraft.

3. (i) The owner of every aircraft shall be entitled, upon and subject to compliance with these by-laws, to use any aerodrome for the landing, servicing and departure of his aircraft and the embarkment and disembarkment of aerial passengers and freights.

(ii) Unless nd until so determined by the aerodrome manager, any aerodrome shall not be open to use by flying where the surface of the aerodrome may be or may reasonabily be expected to be unsafe for landing or departure of aircraft.

Provided that, in the case of emergency, landings may be made, entirely at the owner's risk, upon such aerodrome.

#### Buildings, Notices, Etc.

- 4. Subject to the Act and Regulations, the Council may:---
  - (i) Erect, make, or place upon any aerodrome in such positions as it may see fit such buildings, structures, barriers, conveniences, amenities, signposts, notices, markings and other things as it may see fit for the more complete, effective, convenient, and safe use and enjoyment of any aerodrome as a public landing ground for aircraft.
  - (ii) Grant to any person, upon application, permission to erect buildings, refuelling sites, or any other structure or thing consistent with the use of the land as an aerodrome, subject, if the Council considers fit, to the payment of a rental for the use of the land upon which such buildings, refuelling sites, or other structure or thing are or is erected. Such permission may be granted by the Council subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem fit.

## Right of Entry to Aerodrome.

- 5. (i) Save as herein provided, a person other than:---
  - (a) persons lawfully employed upon duties in or about the supervision and control of any aerodrome or in or about the arrival, departure, or servicing of, or other attention upon aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome; or
  - (b) passengers or intending passengers by aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome;

shall not enter or be upon any aerodrome or any part thereof.

(ii) The Council may from time to time set apart any specified part or parts of any aerodrome—

- (a) to which persons other than those mentioned in subclause (a) of clause (i) of this By-law shall not be admitted;
- (b) to which the general public, or any limited classes of the general public, may be admitted, either at all times or at specified times, or for limited periods and generally upon such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.
- (c) to which no vehicle may be admitted, or to which vehicles may be admitted only on such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.

(iii) Suitable notices shall be placed by the Council indicating the limits of any part of any aerodrome set apart for any special or limited use under this By-law.

(iv) Notwithstanding the provisions of this By-law and By-law II the Council may on special occasions, such for instance, as an aerial pageant or other event of public interest, make such arrangements for the control of any aerodrome and charge such fees for participation and for admission as it may by resolution impose. (v) No person shall bring, or permit to stray, on to any aerodrome any horse, cattle, sheep or goats, without authority from the Council. Any such animal so found trespassing without authority may be removed from the aerodrome by any officer or employee of the Council, or by any person authorised so to do. Any person bringing, or permitting any such animal to stray, on to any aerodrome without authority shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

6. It shall be an offence, punishable by a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) for any person, without permission of the Council, to enter or be upon any part of any aerodrome to which he is not entitled under the provisions of By-law 5 to admission.

## Conduct of Persons on Aerodrome.

7. Every person admitted to or being upon any aerodrome shall whilst thereon behave himself in a proper and becoming manner and so as not to cause any annoyance or inconvenience to any other person lawfully thereon, and shall obey any directions reasonably given to him by the groundsman or any person acting under him, for the purpose of preserving order or promoting or facilitating, the lawful use and enjoyment of any aerodrome. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

8. All passengers and intending passengers by any aircraft shall, whilst upon any aerodrome, obey the directions of the groundsman or aerodrome manager as to their conduct and movements.

9. Any person, whether or not a passenger or intending passenger by an aircraft, who the groundsman or aerodrome manager may consider to be intoxicated or so under the influence of liquor as to make his presence on any aerodrome dangerous to himself or others, or offensive to others, or otherwise undesirable, may be refused admission to any aerodrome, or if upon any aerodrome may be removed by the groundsman or aerodrome manager or any person acting under the direction of the groundsman or aerodrome drome manager.

10. A person shall not use any building, structure, convenience, or amenity provided upon any aerodrome for any purpose other than that for which it is provided or intended, or destroy, remove, obliterate, deface, alter or otherwise interfere with any barrier, notice, sign, or marking designed or intended for the direction, guidance, warning or information of persons using any aerodrome.

#### Fees, Charges, etc.

11. (i) The Council may require the owner of every private or commercial aircraft using any aerodrome to pay fees as per the attached schedule of charges and approved by the Department of Transport. Provided that, if at any time the scale of fees permitted by the Act and Regulations to be charged for the use of an aerodrome as a landing ground for aircraft be less in any particular than the scale set out by Council, then the fee in any such particular shall be that which is so permitted to be charged.

(ii) In the case of a regular air service, the Council may allow payment of an annual charge in respect of such service, of such amount as it may see fit, such charge not to exceed the total fees that would be payable in respect of the service for the year at daily rates.

(iii) If any aircraft remains on any aerodrome more than twenty-four (24) hours, a fee shall be payable as for one landing for each day after the first day during which it so remains. Provided that this provision shall not apply to aircraft parked within leased hangars or on leased sites.

(v) The owner of any aircraft not running to a regular schedule, which it is intended shall land upon or depart from any aerodrome, shall give the Council groundsman notice of sufficient length of time (where practicable, at least an hour) before the time of anticipated arrival or departure, to enable the necessary arrangements to be made. Where extra expense is incurred by the Council through failure to give adequate notice, the owner of the aircraft shall on demand pay the Council the extra expense so incurred.

12. The fees payable under clause (i) of By-law 11 shall be payable at or before the time of landing of the aircraft or at such time as may be specially fixed by the Council; other charges and expenses under that By-law shall be payable upon demand, for the purpose of which demand the pilot may be treated as the agent of the owner.

(i) Any fee, charge, or expense payable in accordance with these By-laws shall constitute a debt due by the owner of the aircraft concerned, and may be recovered by the Council from him in any court of competent jurisdiction.

#### General.

13. A person who in any respect contravenes or fails to comply with any of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and where no other penalty is provided, liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and in addition such person may, if upon any aerodrome be summarily removed therefrom by any police officer, groundsman, or aerodrome manager, or any person acting under the direction of the groundsman or aerodrome manager.

14. Provided further that the Council, in its absolute discretion, may, either generally or for specific use, waive all or any of the requirements of these by-laws.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Executive Council acting under the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, 1897-1972, has been pleased to approve of the amendment, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, by the Balbarrup Cemetery Board of the by-laws made by the Board under the Act and published in the Government Gazette on 11th November 1938 and emended on 3rd July 1953 and on 19th February 11th November, 1938, and amended on 3rd July, 1953, and on 19th February, 1971.

The abovementioned by-laws are amended by amending Schedule A, line six to read:-

For sinking grave for any adult-\$30.00.

CEMETERIES ACT, 1897-1972. The Municipality of the Shire of Carnarvon. By-laws Relating to the Carnarvon Public Cemetery.

LG. 776-53.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the twenty-fourth day of April, 1974, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:-

1. The Carnarvon Public Cemetery By-laws published in the Government Gazette on the 9th January, 1962, are hereby revoked.

2. In these by-laws "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Carnarvon, the "Shire Clerk" means the person for the time being employed by the Council as the Clerk of the Council, and such person shall, subject to the Council, exercise general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the directions of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the directions of the Council.

3. The charges payable to the Council as set forth in Schedule "A" hereto shall be paid at the times and in the manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise directed.

Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make 4 application in the form contained in Schedule "D" hereto and shall pay the appropriate fees as set out in Schedule "A".

5. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Council in such time as to allow at least eight working hours' notice being given to the Shire Clerk at the office prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made as set forth in Schedule "A" hereto.

The Council shall cause all graves to be dug and any vaults, brick graves, 6 or other graves to be re-opened as and when required.

7. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise permanently inscribed in legible characters thereon. Any coffin not complying with these by-laws shall not be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

8. Every grave shall be at least 1.8 metres deep at the first interment unless the presence of rock shall make it impracticable in which event the minimum depth shall be 1.35 metres and the actual depth shall be recorded, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 1 metre from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

9. Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Council in writing specifying the location of the grave. If it is proposed to inter within the remains of any deceased person the name of such person must be shown in the application. If the application is approved by the Council a Grant of Exclusive Right of Rurial shall be issued in the form of Schedule "B" hereto.

10. No brick grave or vault shall be constructed in any plot in respect of which an Exclusive Right of Burial has been issued unless the Council shall have first approved plans and specifications of the proposed work and the execution thereof.

[22 August, 1975.

11. Every grant of the Exclusive Right of Burial shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being in force, and no interment in any grave or vault within an area covered by such grant shall be allowed unless upon production of an Order of Burial in the form of Schedule "C" hereto nor shall any such grave or vault be opened unless with the prior written permission of the Council.

12. (1) Subject to sub-by-law (2) hereof a person shall not bring a dead body into the Cemetery unless he, or his representative, has first handed to the Shire Clerk for inspection and return a medical certificate of death or a Coroner's order for burial in respect of the body.

(2) Where an undertaker or his representative, for good reason, is unable to produce a medical certificate or Coroner's order as required by sub-by-law (1) hereof and he has given to the Shire Clerk a written undertaking to produce the certificate or order within three days he may bring the body into the cemetery.

(3) A burial shall not be permitted in the cemetery unless the provisions of this by-law have been complied with.

(4) If an undertaker or his representative has given a written undertaking as referred to in sub-by-law (2) hereof and he has failed to produce the certificate or Coroner's order within the required period of three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such medical certificate or Coroner's order is produced.

13. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be submitted with the application.

14. If an application is made for an interment in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of the grantee or of his assignee shall be submitted with the Exclusive Grant of Right of Burial.

15. No interment shall be allowed on a Sunday unless with the prior written permission of the Council or unless it is certified in writing by a Medical Officer of Health, or by a Magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons or special religious reasons, it is necessary or desirable that the burial take place on that day.

16. The hours for burial shall be as follows, namely, week days, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturdays, 8 a.m. to 12 noon. No burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except with the prior written permission of the Council.

17. The time fixed for a burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

18. (1) Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery proper or stand opposite the entrance gates.

(2) Vehicles shall not be allowed to proceed faster than 10 km/h within the cemetery and shall proceed by such roads as directed by the Shire Clerk or other officer of the Council from time to time.

19. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe any lawful directions under these by-laws may be forthwith required to leave the cemetery.

20. A person shall not ride a bicycle or animal within the cemetery.

21. If application be made to the Council to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification or for the purpose of its being interred elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or its family an order from the Governor or warrant of the Coroner or Justice of the Peace issued in accordance with the law authorising the Council to permit the exhumation must be submitted with the application form.

22. Children under the age of 10 years entering the cemetery shall be in charge of some responsible person.

23. Smoking shall not be allowed within the cemetery nor shall any fireworks be discharged therein, nor shall alcoholic liquor be consumed therein except as part of a religious ceremony.

24. No dogs shall be admitted to the cemetery and any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

25. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers) or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit so to do from the Council.

26. No person shall remove or carry out of, or attempt to remove or carry out of the cemetery, any tree, plant, shrub, fiower, earth or any other material without the prior written permission of the Council.

27. No person shall pluck any tree, shrub, flower or plant growing in any portion of the cemetery.

28. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertising whatscever without the written consent of the Council and any person infringing this by-law shall be required to leave the cemetery.

29. No person employed by the Council shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatsoever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery, other than with respect of the remuneration he receives from the Council, and any such person found to be guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work without such permission shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

30. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Council and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897 (as amended).

31. Every tombstone or monument shall be placed in proper substantial foundations.

32. The materials used in every such construction shall be subject to the approval of the Shire Clerk, or other officer appointed by the Council and any material rejected shall immediately be removed from the cemetery. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall immediately be removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same, and the surroundings shall be left clean and tidy, to the satisfaction of the Shire Clerk, who must be informed when work is completed thereon.

33. Should any work by a mason or any other person be not completed before Sunday, he shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Shire Clerk.

34. All materials required in the construction and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Shire Clerk shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials, having wheels less than 100 millimetres wide shall be permitted to enter the cemetery. No sand, earth or other material shall be taken from any part of the cemetery for use in the construction of any monument or work, except with the prior written approval of the council. No vehicle of a weight with load of more than three tonnes shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

35. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the cemetery otherwise than during the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days, provided that on Saturdays work may be done from noon to 6 p.m. with the prior written consent of the Council.

36. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Shire Clerk.

37. All workmen, whether employed by the Council or by any other person, shall be, at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, subject to the supervision of the Shire Clerk and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give and any workmen committing any breach of these by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Shire Clerk shall be removed from the cemetery.

38. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:---

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b) No sand, soil or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave except with the permission of the Shire Clerk.
- (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any materials shall be subject to the supervision of the Shire Clerk.
- (d) Work in all cases shall be carried out with due despatch and only during the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on weekdays, provided that on Saturdays work may be done from noon to 6 p.m. with the prior written consent of the Council.

39. The Council may decorate graves from time to time when desired by the grantee so to do. If the grantee does not desire the Council to carry out this work the grantee may either do it himself or employ any person to do the work subject to approval by the Council.

40. No person except the relatives of the deceased, the Council or those employed by the relatives, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

41. If for the purpose of re-opening any grave the Council finds it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, shrubs and similar material from the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the Council charges fixed by the Council in accordance with the work performed.

42. Notwithstanding anything contained in these by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fees.

43. Free ground may be granted, if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Council that the deceased was a returned sailor, soldier or airman and that he died as a result of injuries received whilst on active service provided however that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of the deceased sailor, soldier or airman shall be interred in the grave.

44. A plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land compartments, sections, situations, and number of graves, and a register of all certificates of Exclusive Rights of Burials shall be kept at the office of the Council.

45. Any person offending the rules of propriety and decorum or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave or erection or in any way infringing these by-laws shall be required to leave the cemetery.

46. A person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws commits an offence and shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40, and in the case of a continuing breach a further sum not exceeding \$4 for every day during which such breach occurs.

47. Any person committing a breach of any by-law shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty as aforesaid, be liable to be removed from the cemetery by the Council or the Shire Clerk or other employee or employees of the Council or by any police officer. If any such person resists removal from the cemetery or, if he shall, unless with the consent of the Shire Clerk, again enter the cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$20.
