WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to that Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State by any person; and whereas such types of bread as are respectively specified in the schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, excluding Rottnest Island, and that is within a radius of forty-five kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the schedule to this proclamation.

WHEREAS by section 13 of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1974, it is enacted that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Commissioner,

declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a Main Road and may, in like manner and on the like recommendation, declare that any Main Road shall cease to be a Main Road; and whereas the Governor, by Proclamations, published in the *Government Gazettes* on the 24th day of June, 1927 and the 1st day of July, 1967 declared, *inter alia*, that the roads described in Schedule I hereto shall be Main Roads, and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of the said roads described in Schedule I hereto shall cease to be Main Roads and that the portions of the said roads described in Schedule II hereto shall be Main Roads: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant Governor and Administrator acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that on and after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventy five the portions of the roads described in Schedule I hereto, heretofore declared to be Main Roads as aforesaid, shall cease to be Main Roads and that the portions of the roads, as aforesaid and described in Schedule II hereto shall be Main Roads within the meaning of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1974, that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the Main Roads and that the said Proclamation is hereby varied accordingly.

You shall also clear of all inflammable material all the land within the firebreak required by this paragraph; and

3. Urban Land: (All land within the Gingin Townsite) you shall:—

- (a) Where the area of land is less than 2 hectares (4 acres), clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 1 metre (3 feet) wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and

burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 30th day of April, 1976.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than 14 days prior to the date by which the firebreaks are required to be provided for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. No such application will be considered unless it is made in writing, adequately describes the land, and it is accompanied by written approval of the bush fire control officer for the area in which the land is situated. If permission is not granted by the Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200, a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

REGION SCHEME MAP 13

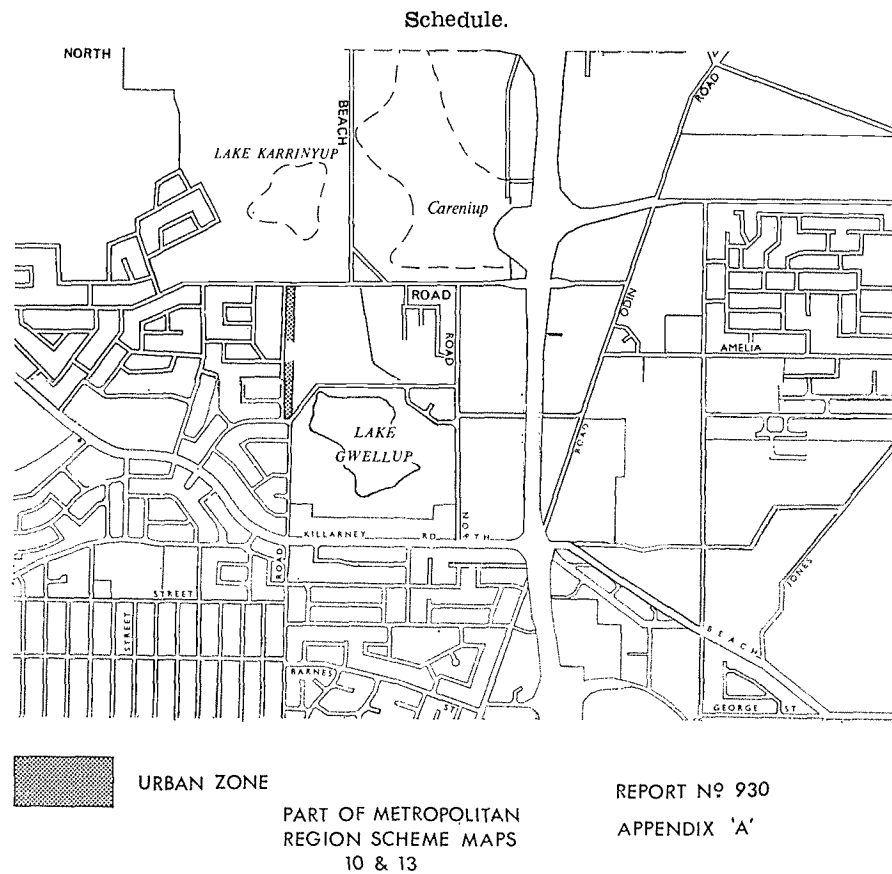

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the fifth day of February, 1975, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws relating to fencing:—

1. The by-laws prescribing what constitutes a sufficient fence published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th of May, 1961 are hereby revoked.

2. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise—

"Business Area" means an area designated under the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme in force for the time being under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) within the Municipal District of the Shire of Gingin.

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Gingin.

"Dangerous Fence" means any fence or wall certified by the Inspector to be dangerous by reason of its faulty design, construction, deterioration of constituent materials, damage by termites, changes in ground level, or other causes subsequent to construction.

"Dividing Fence" means a fence that separates the lands of different owners whether the fence is on the common boundary of adjoining lands or on a line other than the common boundary.

"Industrial Area" means an area designated under the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme in force for the time being under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) within the Municipal District of the Shire of Gingin.

"Fence" means any fence or wall and includes a retaining wall.

"Residential Area" means an area designated under the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme in force for the time being under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) within the Municipal District of the Shire of Gingin.

"Rural Area" means an area designated under the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme in force for the time being under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) within the Municipal District of the Shire of Gingin.

"Sufficient Fence" means a sufficient fence relating to dividing fences on boundaries between lots or other holdings and is more particularly set forth in schedules No. 1 and 2.

"Inspector" means the Building Inspector of the Municipality.

3. A person shall not commence to erect, proceed with the erection, rebuild, reconstruct or alter any fence, hood, pergola or ornamental hood to gateways or attached to a fence exceeding 1 070 mm in height abutting on or within 7.6 metres of a street alignment unless and until he has lodged with the Council two copies of the plan and specification of the proposed fence or the proposed alterations or reconstruction and the Council has approved a copy of the plan and specification.

4. A person shall not commence to erect, proceed with the erection, rebuild, reconstruct or alter any fence exceeding 1.8 metres in height on any boundary line until he has lodged with the Council a copy of the plan and specification of the fence proposed to be built, rebuilt or reconstructed and the Council has approved of that plan and specification.

5. A person shall not erect a fence on the frontage or side of an allotment at the intersection of two streets which exceeds the height of 750 mm for a distance of 9 metres from the intersection. The fence on the side street shall be constructed for a distance from the corner of at least 9 metres along that street of design and materials similar to those on the fence along the frontage of the allotment. In a gazetted Industrial Area a link mesh fence may be permitted of a greater height than 750 mm if the Council is satisfied that it does not materially affect the visibility of the intersection and its approaches in respect of the drivers of vehicles in either street.

6. A person shall not erect or affix or allow to remain upon any fence surrounding property owned or occupied by him in a Residential Area any barbed wire, broken glass, or other wire with spiked or jagged projections, nor shall he erect or affix or allow to remain any such barbed wire, broken glass or other wire with spiked or jagged projections on any fence in a Business or Industrial Area except barbed wire which is not less than 2.1 metres vertically above the level of the ground immediately thereunder. Where the fence is erected on the alignment of a street or public place broken glass shall not be permitted.

7. A person shall not cover any fence with secondhand galvanised iron or other secondhand material unless he shall have received the written consent of the Council, which consent the Council, may, in its discretion, grant or refuse on such terms and conditions as it deems fit, but no galvanised iron shall be used within 7.6 metres of a street in any Townsite.

8. A person may construct a fence of brick concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh or timber sheathed with pickets, palings, boarding or asbestos, new galvanised iron or other materials approved by the Council but no galvanised iron may be used within 7.6 metres of a street. In Rural Areas, in addition to the foregoing materials, a fence may be erected of posts and wire or posts and rails.

9. The owner or occupier of any land on which a fence is located, which is certified by the Inspector to be dangerous, shall at his own expense when required by the Council so to do, take down, repair or rebuild such fence within the period not exceeding 35 days.

10. The owner or occupier of any land on which a fence is located shall keep such fence in good repair. The Inspector may serve on the owner or occupier a notice to repair or to repair and paint or to paint such fence. Any owner or occupier who refuses or neglects within a period of 14 days after the serving of the notice to carry out the repair or painting in accordance with the request, commits an offence under this by-law.

11. A fence constructed to the specifications shown in schedules one and two shall be considered a sufficient fence for the purpose of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961.

12. Any person who does anything in contravention of any provisions of these by-laws or who fails to carry out a duty or requirement under these by-laws commits an offence. Penalty \$200.00.

Schedule one.

Fences in Townsites of Gingin, Guilderton, Seabird, Ledge Point and Lancelin.

(a) Dividing fence alongside boundary:—

For a distance of 7.6 metres from the street alignment the fence shall comprise either:

- (i) a brick or concrete wall of a height of not more than 610 mm; or
- (ii) link mesh or other approved material extending to a height of not more than 1 070 mm above the ground.

Thereafter the fence shall be as follows:—

Front corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 1.8 m and rear corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 2.1 m and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm x 2.1 m all spaced not more than 2.7 metre centres.

All posts shall have tops with 38 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 610 mm into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soles and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 450 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Rails shall be 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fence other than of brick or concrete shall be covered for the first 7.6 metres with link mesh or other approved material and for the next bay by 75 mm x 19 mm sawn pickets or palings of graduated length rising from 1 070 mm to 1.5 metres.

Thereafter fence shall be covered with 75 mm x 19 mm x 1.5 m pickets or palings.

All pickets or palings shall be placed 75 mm apart and shall be double nailed to each rail.

(b) Dividing fence along rear boundary:

Corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 2.1 metres and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm x 2.1 metres spaced at not more than 2.7 metre centres.

All posts shall have tops with 38 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 610 mm into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soles and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 450 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Rails shall be 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fence shall be covered with 75 mm x 19 mm x 1.5 metre sawn pickets or palings placed 75 mm apart and double nailed to each rail.

Schedule Two.

Rural Areas.

A fence should be erected as follows:—

Corner posts and gate posts shall have an area of 320 square cm small end by 2.1 metres long, running strainers shall have an area of 180 square cm small end by 1.9 metres long and intermediate posts shall have an area of 83 square cm small end by 1.7 metres long spaced at not more than 10 metre centres with three approved droppers between each post. Strainers shall be placed at not more than 301 metre centres and all posts shall be sunk not less than 500 mm in the ground. Corner posts, gate posts and strainers shall be strutted in approved fashion.

Six rows of sound or new 2.5 mm plain wire shall be strung through intermediate posts, droppers and running strainers and placed around the exterior of corner posts and gate posts and strained to approved tension.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1975.
The Municipality of the Shire of Mundaring.
By-laws Relating to Fencing.

L.G. MG-7-12.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Mundaring hereby records having resolved on the 20th February, 1975 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise

"Council" means the Council of Municipality of the Shire of Mundaring.

"Dangerous Fence" means a fence declared to be in a dangerous condition, by a Building Surveyor by reason of faulty design, location, construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground levels or any other cause.

"Fence" means a fence abutting a road or a fence on a boundary line of an allotment of land and includes a free standing wall or retaining wall.

"Industrial and Commercial Zone", means any portion of the Shire of Mundaring that is classified as: Commercial, Light Industry, Hotel, Fuel Depot, Service Station, Place of Public Assembly and Special Purposes.

"Residential Zone" means any portion of the Shire of Mundaring from time to time classified as a residential zone.

"Rural Zone" means any portion of the Shire of Mundaring from time to time classified as a rural zone.

"Height" in relation to a fence means the distance between the top of a fence at any point and the ground immediately below that point.

"Building Surveyor" means a building surveyor appointed by the Shire of Mundaring.

"Dividing Fence" means a fence that separates the land of different owners whether the fence is on the common boundary of the adjoining land or on a line other than the common boundary.

2. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the First Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a "Sufficient Fence" for the purposes of the Dividing Fence Act, 1961 within those portions of the Shire of Mundaring as are classified as Residential Zones.

3. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a sufficient fence for the purpose of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961, within an Industrial and Commercial Zone.

4. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the Third Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961 within those portions of the Shire of Mundaring as are classified as Rural Zones.

5. Where a fence is erected on the boundary between differing zones, a sufficient fence shall be that prescribed for Residential Zone.

6. A person shall not construct a fence with sheet metal or second hand material unless he shall previously have obtained the written consent of the Council which consent the Council may in its absolute discretion refuse or grant upon such terms and conditions as it deems fit.

7. Within a Residential Zone, front boundary fences may be erected for the full width of the frontage not greater than one metre in height. Fences greater than one metre and not exceeding two metres in height are permitted on front boundaries providing that—

- (i) They do not exceed fifteen (15) metres in total length along the boundary.
- (ii) Splayed lines of sight with two (2) metres dimension along frontage and three (3) metres deep are provided on both sides of every driveway.
- (iii) For each one (1) metre the remainder of such fence is set back behind the front boundary, the length of the wall that can exceed one (1) metre in height may be increased by five (5) metres.
- (iv) By-law 8 is complied with.

No person shall construct any other structure in front of the Building Line in a Residential Zone other than that described in this by-law without first having made written application to, and obtained the written approval of the Council.

8. No person shall on an allotment of land situated at the corner of two streets erect a fence or any other structure on or adjacent to the street boundary greater than 0.75 metre in height within ten (10) metres of the street corner.

9. No person shall erect a dividing fence behind a building line in a Residential Zone greater than two (2) metres in height without first having made written application to, and obtained the written approval of the Council.

10. A person shall not commence to erect or proceed with the erection of a retaining wall which abuts a road or is on a boundary line unless and until he has lodged with the Council two copies of a plan and specification thereof and in the case of a retaining wall exceeding one (1) metre in height, when required by the Council, engineering calculations in respect thereof and the Council has approved a copy of the plan and specification.

11. No person shall erect a fence wholly or partly of barbed wire except in accordance with these by-laws. A fence may be erected wholly or partly of barbed wire—

- (i) in a Rural Zone;
- (ii) in an Industrial and Commercial Zone if no barbed wire is used below a height of 1 800 mm from the ground;
- (iii) in any other part of the Shire of Mundaring with the permission of the Council and only if no barbed wire is used below a height of 1 800 mm from the ground.

12. No person shall erect a fence which is dangerous.

13. The owner and occupier of land on which a fence is erected shall maintain the fence in good condition and in such manner as to prevent it from becoming dangerous, in bad condition and repair, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the property in or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood.

14. The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or the occupier of any land upon which is erected a fence which is dangerous, in bad condition and repair, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the amenity or value of the property in or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood or is contrary to the provisions of by-laws, requiring such owner or occupier to pull down, remove, repair, paint or maintain such fence within the time stipulated in the notice.

15. Where the owner or occupier of land who has been given notice under by-law 14 of these by-laws fails to comply therewith, the Council may enter upon such land and carry out works specified in the notice and costs and expenses incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from such owner or occupier in a Court of Competent Jurisdiction.

16. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by laws or shall be guilty of an offence shall be liable to—

- (i) a maximum penalty of One Hundred Dollars (\$100); and
- (ii) in addition a maximum daily penalty of Ten Dollars (\$10) for each day during which the offence continues.

17. The use of broken glass or other potentially dangerous material on the top of fences in the Shire of Mundaring is expressly prohibited.

First Schedule—Residential Zone.

All fences shall be as follows unless subject to the provisions of bylaws 7 and 8 where height limitations of one metre or 0.75 metre may apply:—

Corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 2150 mm and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm x 2150 mm spaced at not more than three (3) metre centres.

All posts shall have tops with 60 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 600 mm into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm sole plates and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 460 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Rails shall be 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fences shall be covered with 75 mm x 20 mm x 1500 mm sawn pickets placed 75 mm apart, double nailed to each rail.

Second Schedule—Industrial and Commercial Zones.

A fence consisting of railless link or chain wire mesh to a height of 1800 mm on top of which are three strands of barbed wire carrying the fence to a height of not less than 2100 mm supported by galvanised iron posts of a minimum diameter of 30 mm and sunk in the ground a minimum of 600 mm encased in concrete having a minimum diameter of 150 mm.

Third Schedule—Rural Zones.

The fence shall be erected from standard iron star pickets; sawn, split or round wooden posts set not less than 600 mm in the ground and not less than 1200 mm out of the ground and spaced not more than 3500 mm apart with strainer posts set at all corners, gateways, and fence line angles but not exceeding 200 metres apart. Each fence post shall be bored with not less than five 10 mm diameter suitably spaced holes to be threaded with not less than five plain galvanised wires. Wire shall be wrapped around strainer and strained tight.

The following materials shall be used:—

(a) Wire—shall not be less than 2.5 mm diameter.

(b) Posts to be standard iron star pickets or if of jam, white gum, jarrah or other indigenous timber, be cut not less than 1800 mm long by 100 mm diameter at small end if round or 125 x 60 mm if split or sawn.

(c) Strainer posts—not less than 2300 mm long and 150 mm diameter at small end shall be cut from indigenous timbers or to be tubular steel 50 mm diameter and sunk in the ground a minimum of 1000 mm encased in concrete having a minimum diameter of 300 mm.

Statute Number No. 15.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE SENATE—GENERAL PROCEDURE.

1. This Statute applies to all elections of members of the Senate in accordance with the provisions of section 12, paragraphs (1) (d), (1) (e) and (1) (f) of the Act, except to the extent that it is expressly modified by any other Statute relating to the election of a particular member or members of the Senate.

2. (1) The Secretary shall keep a roll of electors showing their names and addresses. The roll shall be divided into classes appropriate to the electors' qualifications to vote, and the roll for each class shall be in alphabetical order.

(2) The roll of electors for any election shall be that which exists on the day after the date on which nominations for that election close in accordance with section 5.

3. (1) In all elections, the Secretary shall act as Returning Officer.

(2) Subject to any Regulation, the Returning Officer may prescribe any necessary procedures or forms required for the purposes of this Statute.

4. (1) Whenever any election is to be held, the Returning Officer shall—

(a) fix the date and time for holding the election being at least six weeks after the date of the notice; and

(b) publish the fact by notice posted on the notice board at the office of the University and in such other manner as he considers appropriate.

(2) The notice mentioned in paragraph (1) (b) of this section shall also—

(a) call for nominations of candidates to be lodged with him on or before the date specified in the notice being at least fourteen clear days after the date of the notice;

(b) fix the date for ascertaining the roll of electors; and

(c) state that voting papers will be delivered or posted to each elector at the address appearing on the roll of electors or at the University.

5. (1) Nominations of qualified persons shall be lodged with or posted to the Returning Officer not later than 4.00 p.m. on the date specified in the notice referred to in Section 4 (1) (b) at which time nominations shall close. No nomination shall be valid unless it is received by the Returning Officer before the close of nominations.

(2) Nominations shall—

(a) be signed by two persons qualified to vote;

(b) contain the written consent of the candidate to his nomination;

(c) specify the class of election for which the candidate is nominated; and

(d) specify the qualification of the candidate and of the nominators.

6. (1) If the nominations received by the close of nominations do not exceed the number of vacancies, the candidates so nominated shall thereupon be deemed to be duly elected, and the Returning Officer shall make a declaration accordingly. If the nominations received exceed the number of vacancies, there shall be a ballot held in accordance with this Statute.

7. Whenever a ballot is to be held, the Returning Officer shall—

(a) within seven days after the date on which nominations close post on the notice boards of the University a notice setting out the names of the candidates who have been nominated for the election, and a statement to the effect that voting papers will be sent by him to all persons entitled to vote at such election; and

(b) at least fourteen clear days prior to the date of the election, deliver or post to each elector at his address on the roll of electors or at the University a voting paper, a form of declaration and a biography of each candidate in accordance with section 8 of this Statute.

8. (1) Every voting paper shall contain the names of all duly nominated candidates arranged in an order determined by the Returning Officer by lot, and a rectangle shall be printed opposite and to the left of the name of each candidate. The voting paper shall also specify the method by which voters shall signify their votes.

(2) Every voting paper shall be initialled by the Returning Officer, and no voting paper or declaration other than that initially issued shall be accepted, except that when the Returning Officer is satisfied that any voting paper or declaration has been lost or destroyed, a duplicate shall be supplied on written application to the Returning Officer.

(3) Every voting paper shall be issued by the Returning Officer, together with—

(a) a form of declaration to be completed by the voter, to contain his full name, such particulars of his qualification to vote as may be required by the Returning Officer and his signature.

(b) two envelopes, one envelope to be marked "voting paper" and the other addressed to the Returning Officer, at the University.

- (c) a biography of each candidate not exceeding 250 words in length, and containing such information as may appear to the Returning Officer to be relevant to the qualifications of the candidate concerning his election, and to the publication of which the candidate has consented. If a candidate does not consent to the publication of the biography prepared by the Returning Officer within seven clear days after the last date for lodgement of nominations, no biography shall be published.
9. Each voter shall post to or deliver to the Returning Officer at the University the declaration and the envelope or envelopes containing the voting paper or papers both or all to be enclosed in an outer envelope addressed to the Returning Officer.
10. The Returning Officer shall, if he is satisfied that the declaration is duly signed by a qualified voter, place the accompanying envelope or envelopes containing the voting paper or papers with other similar envelopes remaining unopened. Immediately after the time fixed for the election on the date of the election, the Returning Officer shall then ascertain the result of the election as provided in this Statute.
11. The Returning Officer shall not in any way whatever directly or indirectly disclose how any voter has voted in any election.
12. No voter shall before or after voting transfer or part with his voting paper or declaration to, or permit it to be used by, any other person.
13. No voting paper shall be taken into account at any election unless it is received by the Returning Officer not later than the time fixed for the election on the date of the election.
14. (1) The method of voting shall be that the voter shall mark his vote on the voting paper by placing—
- (a) the figure 1 in the rectangle opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference; and
 - (b) the figures 2, 3 and 4 and so on, as the case requires, in the rectangles opposite the respective names of such of the remaining candidates as he may desire, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference for all or any such candidates.
- (2) The voting paper shall be rejected if the voter has not placed the figure 1 against the name of any one candidate, but the voting paper shall be valid notwithstanding that the voter has not placed any other figures on the voting paper or figures against the names of all the candidates, and has not indicated any preference as between the remaining candidates or any one or more of them.
15. (1) An absolute majority of votes in any count means a number greater than one half of the total number of valid voting papers (excluding voting papers which are exhausted).
- (2) a remaining candidate means a candidate not already elected or defeated.
- (3) where in any count the voting papers counted to a candidate already elected or defeated have to be distributed amongst the remaining candidates and any such voting paper does not indicate the voter's next succeeding preference of a remaining candidate, such voting paper shall be deemed to be exhausted.
- (4) where there is any repetition of a figure or any break in the consecutive numbering of the preferences marked by a voter on his voting paper, only the preference or preferences preceding such repetition or break shall be taken into account.
16. Immediately after the time fixed for the election on the date of the election, the Returning Officer shall—
- (a) open the envelopes containing the voting papers;
 - (b) decide whether any voting paper shall be rejected as invalid;
 - (c) arrange into parcels all valid voting papers on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate; and
 - (d) count all first preference votes given for each candidate.
17. At an election where only one member is to be elected and there are only two candidates, the result of the election shall be ascertained as follows:—
- (a) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall be duly elected.
 - (b) If the two candidates have received an equal number of votes, the candidate to be elected shall be determined by the Returning Officer by lot.
18. At an election where only one member is to be elected, and there are more than two candidates, the result of the election shall be ascertained as follows:—
- (a) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes, if that number constitutes an absolute majority of the votes cast, shall be duly elected;
 - (b) If no candidate has an absolute majority of the votes cast, the Returning Officer shall—
 - (i) declare the candidate who has received the fewest first preference votes, a defeated candidate;

- (ii) distribute the voting papers counted to such defeated candidate among the remaining candidates next in order of the voters' preference.
- (iii) after such distribution, again ascertain the total number of votes given to each remaining candidate.
- (c) The candidate who has then received the greatest number of votes, if such number constitutes an absolute majority of the votes cast, shall be duly elected.
- (d) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes, the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes a defeated candidate and distributing the voting papers counted to such defeated candidate amongst the remaining candidates next in order of the voters preference shall be repeated, and votes shall be re-counted after every such re-distribution until one candidate has received an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall be duly elected.
- (e) Whenever two or more candidates have an equal number of votes, and one of them has to be a defeated candidate, that candidate shall be determined by the Returning Officer by lot.
19. At an election where two or more members are to be elected, the result of the poll shall be ascertained as follows:—
- (a) The first vacancy shall be filled in the manner provided in section 18.
- (b) The second vacancy shall be filled in the following manner:—
- (i) the Returning Officer shall re-arrange all the voting papers (other than the voting papers which are exhausted) under the names of the other candidates in accordance with the first preference indicated thereon, except that each voting paper on which a first preference for the already elected candidate is indicated shall be placed in the parcel of the candidate next in order of the voter's preference, and ascertain the total number of votes given to each candidate.
- (ii) the candidate who has received the greatest number of votes if that number constitutes an absolute majority of the votes cast shall be duly elected.
- (iii) if no candidate has an absolute majority of the votes cast, the Returning Officer shall apply the same procedure as provided in section 18, paragraphs (b) to (e) inclusive (with necessary alterations).
- (c) A third or subsequent vacancy shall be filled in the manner provided in paragraph (b) of this section for filling the second vacancy (with necessary alterations).
20. (1) The Returning Officer may appoint one or more scrutineers and each candidate may appoint one scrutineer by written notice to the Returning Officer all scrutineers being persons who are electors, but not candidates.
- (2) Each scrutineer may be present at the counting of votes.
21. After the completion of the counting of votes, the Returning Officer shall declare the result of the election.
22. An election to fill a casual vacancy under section 16 (2) of the Act shall be held at such time as shall be decided by the Senate. If a casual vacancy occurs, and the unexpired portion of the term of office left vacant is less than six months, the Senate shall decide whether it is necessary that an election should be held to fill the casual vacancy.
23. Statute Number 2—Method of Election of Members of the Senate by Members of the Academic Staff—is hereby repealed.
