Local Government Act, 1960-1975.

RIGHTS IN WATER AND IRRIGATION ACT, 1914-1972.

THE Minister for Water Supplies with the approval of the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers con-ferred on him as an Irrigation Board under the provisions of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1972, has been pleased to-

(a) revoke the By-laws for the Harvey No. 1 Irrigation District, Waroona Irrigation District, Harvey No. 2 Irrigation District and Collie Irriga-tion District published in the Government Gazette on the 30th July, 1937 and all amendments thereto; and

(b) make the regulations set forth in the Schedule below,

so that both the revocation and the by-laws take effect on and from the date of the publication of this notice in the Government Gazette.

Schedule.

BY-LAWS.

Citation.

These by-laws may be cited as the Harvey, Waroona and Collie River Irrigation Districts By-laws, 1975.

Application.

2. These by-laws apply in the Harvey Irrigation District, the Waroona Irrigation District and the Collie River Irrigation District as constituted from time to time under the Act.

Interpretation.

In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears-

"annual district allocation" means the quantity of water allo-cated by the Minister by notice under by-law 4 for each hectare of rated land in the district in relation to which the notice applies;

"authorized person" means an officer or other person appointed for the purposes of carrying out these by-laws;

"by-law" means one of these by-laws;

"District Officer" means the officer appointed as the District Officer or other officer carrying out the duties of district officer in relation to a district;

"Form" means a form in the Second Schedule;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to these by-laws;

"section" means a section of the Act;

"the Act" means the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914;

"watering programme" means the zone periods specified by the Minister by notice under by-law 4 in relation to which the notice applies;

"zone period" means a period of time specified in the watering programme applicable to a district during which water will be supplied to an occupier under these by-laws.

Notice of area allocation, watering programme and zone periods.

(1) The Minister may by notice in relation to a district to which these by-laws apply-

- (a) determine the period during which water will be supplied to the district;
- (b) declare the quantity of water, to be known as the annual district allocation, that will be supplied for each hectare of rated land in the district; and
- (c) set out a watering programme specifying the periods of will be supplied and the days or the dates before or on which, as the case requires, applications shall be made for the supply of water in the district.

(2) A copy of the notice referred to in sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law shall be posted on the official notice board of the Minister in the district to which the notice relates not less than seven days before the date of the first zone period specified in the watering programme set out in the notice and the notice shall be kept posted at that place for the duration of the period to which the watering programme applies the watering programme applies.

(3) A notice given under sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law may be amended or revoked by subsequent notice by the Minister and any amendment to the notice shall be kept posted at the office of the Minister in the district to which it relates for the duration of the period to which the amendment applies.

Application for water.

5. (1) An occupier who desires to be supplied with water under these by-laws shall apply to the Minister in the form of Form 1giving the particulars required by that form.

(2) An application referred to in sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law shall be lodged with the District Officer at the office of the Minister in the district in which the land the subject of the application is situate-

(a) where the land is to be supplied with water in accordance with the watering programme for that district, not less than three days before the commencement of the zone period to which the application relates:

SCHEDULE—continued.

(b) in any other case, not less than three days before the occupier requires the water applied for.

(3) An occupier who makes an application to be supplied with water later than the last day prescribed under paragraph (a) of sub-bylaw (2) of this by-law for the making of that application shall pay the late application charge prescribed in item 1 of the First Schedule.

(4) An occupier who desires to amend an application made pursuant to this by-law shall give the District Officer of the district not less than six hours' notice of his intention to amend his application.

(5) Where an occupier has applied to be supplied with water and does not take the water when offered, he may be required to lodge a fresh application for water and pay the late application fee prescribed by item 1 of the First Schedule.

Supply of water.

(1) Subject to these by-laws, where an occupier who desires to be supplied with water under these by-laws has made an appli-cation therefor in accordance with these by-laws the Minister may supply water to the land of the occupier in accordance with the application.

(2) Supplies of water under these by-laws shall be made only to those supply points of an occupier's land as are approved by the Minister and water so supplied shall be taken at those supply points at the times and in the manner approved by the Minister.

(3) Except when he does so at the direction of an authorized person, a person other than an authorized person shall not operate a supply point.

(4) The Minister may refuse to supply water to any head ditch or other distribution channel constructed or located within—

(a) 40 metres of a river; or

(b) 5 metres of any other works.

Occupier to have efficient distribution system.

An occupier shall construct and maintain on his land an efficient distribution system for the distribution of water on his land. (2) Where the Minister is of the opinion that the distribution system on any land is not efficient he may refuse to supply water to that land.

Trregular watering.

(1) Where an occupier applies for and is supplied with water 8 during a period other than the zone period specified in the water programme for the district in which his land is situate the occupier shall pay the surcharge prescribed in item 2 (a) of the First Schedule in addition to the relevant charge for the water so supplied.

- (2) Where an occupier applies for and is supplied with water-(a) during the zone period specified in the watering programme
 - for the district in which his land is situate but for a time that is out of his normal sequence of watering;
 - (b) during the zone period specified in the watering programme for the district in which his land is situated but for a second or subsequent watering in that zone period,

(1) Where it is possible to supply land whether or not the 11. land is in a district with water by means of works without any other service being rendered by him the Minister may supply water through any works for the purpose of enabling an occupier of land to take water from the works by pumping or other means.

10. An occupier shall take all necessary steps for preventing

waste of water supplied under these by-laws.

(2) An occupier who desires to take water supplied through a work under sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law shall apply to the Minister in the form of Form 2 giving the particulars required by the form.

(3) Where the Minister approves of an application made under sub-bylaw (2) of this by-law the occupier shall not take any water from the works other than at the times appointed and in the manner approved by the Minister.

(4) An occupier who applies to take water under this by-law is liable to pay the costs of any works constructed by the Minister for the purpose of supplying water to his land and a capitalised maintenance charge determined by the Minister.

(5) An occupier who desires to be supplied with water pursuant to this by-law shall at the commencement of each rating year apply to the Minister in the form of Form 1 and shall pay the charges prescribed in item 4 in the First Schedule in respect of the water so applied for.

(6) An application made under sub-bylaw (5) of this by-law shall be lodged with the District Officer at the office of the Minister in the district from which the water is supplied.

(1) Irrigation rates are payable by an occupier of irrigable land within one month of the publication in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper usually circulating in the district of the notice of the order making and levying the irrigation rates in respect of that district.

(2) Irrigation rates are payable in advance of the year in respect of which they are ordered to be made and levied.

17. For the purposes of the Act, the rating year in relation to the irrigation district to which these by-laws apply shall be the period commencing on the 1st September in any year and ending

18. (1) Subject to the Act and these by-laws, every ratepayer is, in respect of rates paid for a rating year as fixed by by-law 17, entitled to a supply of water at the rate of 6,100 cubic metres per hectare of rateable land.

(2) A ratepayer is not entitled to a supply of water pursuant to sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law unless he has first paid the irrigation rates liable to be paid in respect of his land.

(3) The Minister may refuse to supply water to any land in respect of which rates remain unpaid.

19. Where the quantity of water supplied to a ratepayer during a rating year is in excess of the quantity prescribed for each hectare of rated land by by-law 18 the ratepayer is liable to pay for the water so supplied in accordance with the scale of charges prescribed in item 3 of the First Schedule.

20. (1) The minimum quantity of water that may be taken by an occupier through a supply point on any one occasion is 1000 m^3 and where the quantity of water taken through a supply point is less than that quantity the occupier is in any event liable to pay for that quantity.

(2) Where pursuant to an application made by an occupier he is supplied with a quantity of water that is equal to or less than the minimum supply prescribed by sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law the charge payable in respect of such supply is the charge applicable under item 3 of the First Schedule for that quantity having regard to the quantity of water that has been supplied to the occupier at the time of the minimum supply.

(3) This by-law does not apply to water taken by an occupier under by-law 11 or by-law 22.

The occupier of a non-rated area of land within a district to which these by-laws apply or an area of land outside such a district may request the Minister to supply water to the land for irrigation purposes, for domestic purposes and for stock and the Minister may supply water to that occupier on such terms and conditions as he thinks fit.

29. A person other than an authorized person shall not do or danger and interference cause anything to be done that will damage, endanger or inter-with fere with or be likely to damage, endanger or interfere with a work.

30. (1) A person other than an authorized person shall not whether on his land or not plant any trees that will in the opinion of the Minister damage, endanger or interfere with or be likely to damage, endanger or interfere with any works.

(2) An authorized person may request any person to remove a tree on that person's land that in the opinion of the Minister damages, endangers or interferes with or that is likely to damage, endanger or interfere with any works.

(3) Where a person does not carry out a request to remove a tree made pursuant to sub-by-law (2) of this by-law an auth-orized person may with the approval of the Minister enter the land of that person and remove, dig and destroy the tree or plant.

Litter.

Bathing, fishing or using boats.

Unauth orized use of water.

Penalty and damages. 31. A person shall not throw, cast or deposit any litter or rub-bish in or upon any works other than in a place or receptacle set aside for that purpose.

32. A person shall not bathe, fish or use a boat in or upon any works except in a portion set aside by the Minister for that purpose.

33. Except with the prior approval of the Minister, water in any works shall not be taken or used and a person shall not cause or permit any water in a work to be taken or used.

34. (1) A person who commits a breach of these by-laws is liable to a penalty not exceeding forty dollars and where the breach is a continuing breach, to a further penalty not exceeding ten dollars for each day the offence continues after notice thereof has been given by or on behalf of the Minister to the offender. (2) In addition to any penalty imposed by a court any expense incurred by the Minister in consequence of the breach of a by-law shall be paid by the person committing the breach.

(i) No person shall erect or have or permit to be erected on any land owned by him any wall, fence, hedge, tree, shrub or other obstruction of a greater height than 0.75 m measured from

the level of the footpath, road, or right of way immediately adjoining the same within the area enclosed by the boun-daries of the streets, roads or rights of way and a line joining the points located at a distance of 6 m measured horizontally along each street, road or right of way boun-dary from the point of intersection of the streets, roads or rights of way or from the point of intersection of a prolonga-tion of the said boundaries except that this by-law shall not apply to intersections or junctions having the standard truncation of 8.5 m or more.

(ii) Where any such obstruction is found upon any land in conwhere any such obstruction is found upon any land in con-travention of sub-bylaw (i) hereof, the Town Clerk may serve upon the owner of the land notice in writing requiring him within thirty days from the receipt of the notice to alter or amend such obstruction so as to bring the same into conformity with the said by-law, and upon receipt of such notice the owner of the land shall within the time afore-raid duy comply with the requisitions thereof said duly comply with the requisitions thereof.

(2) By inserting after clause 2 a new clause numbered 2A. 2A. Fences erected forward of the front setback line: No person shall erect a fence more than 0.75 m high above natural ground level in front of the setback line unless Council has signified its approval in writing and subject to the following:—

- (a) No fence shall be more than 1.8 m high unless approval shall have been granted by resolution of Council, having regard to exceptional circumstances relating to the lot.
- (b) Not more than 60% of the lineal frontage of the lot shall be occupied by any fence over 0.75 m high.
- (c) Every vehicular driveway, including those on adjoining lots, shall be provided with a truncation $2.4 \text{ m} \times 1.5 \text{ m}$ (the 1.5 mdimension being on the front boundary line) so as to provide a line of sight from vehicles driving or reversing to the streets.
- (d) The 60% restriction on length may be increased by 8% for each 0.3 m the fence is set back from the front street boundary but subject to the requirements of subclause (c) being complied with.

 - (i) The lot frontage is less than 14 m.
 - (ii) There is an unusual ground configuration.

IN pursuance of powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 14th day of May, 1975, to make and submit for confirmation of the Governor the following by-laws—

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Town of Geraldton By-laws (Removal and disposal of Obstructing Animals or Vehicles).

2. (1) In these by-laws—

"Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960;

- "appointed place" means a yard or other piece of land set aside as a place to which obstructing vehicles may be removed, pursuant to these by-laws;
- "authorised person" means a person appointed by the Council to seize animals or vehicles, pursuant to these by-laws;

"public place" has the meaning given it by the Act.

(2) An animal that is secured in any portion of a public place wherein animals may lawfully be secured and a vehicle that is parked in any portion of a public place wherein vehicles may lawfully be parked is not obstructing, for the purposes of these by-laws, unless, in the case of an animal, it is so secured for any period exceeding eight hours and, in the case of a vehicle, it is so parked for any period exceeding twenty-four hours, without the consent in writing of the Clerk of the Council.

3. A person shall not leave an animal or vehicle in a public place so as to obstruct any portion of that place.

4. A person who leaves an animal or vehicle in a public place, contrary to the provisions of by-law 3 of these by-laws commits an offence.

5. The Council may appoint a person as an authorised person for the purposes of these by-laws.

6. The Council may appoint a yard or other piece of land as a place to which vehicles may be removed pursuant to these by-laws and shall give notice in the *Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating within its district of the situation of any appointed place.

7. Where an authorised person or a member of the Police Force finds an animal or vehicle left in a public place, contrary to the provisions of by-law 3 of these by-laws, he may remove the animal or vehicle therefrom and shall, thereupon—

(a) in the case of an animal, place it in a public pound;

(b) in the case of a vehicle, place it in an appointed place.

8. Where an authorised person places an animal in a public pound, pursuant to by-law 7 of these by-laws, the animal shall thereafter be dealt with according to law.

9. Where an authorised person places a vehicle in an appointed place, pursuant to by-law 7 of these by-laws, he shall enter in a register to be provided by the Council for that purpose, details of the time and date, a description of the vehicle, and of the place from which it was removed; and shall notify the Clerk of the Council.

10. The Clerk of the Council shall exhibit on the Notice Board of the Council a notification that a vehicle therein described has been placed in the appointed place and shall, unless the vehicle is sooner recovered, keep that notification exhibited for a period of not less than seven days.

11. (1) A person may recover a seized vehicle from an appointed place, by paying to the Clerk of the Council:—

(a) the cost incurred by the Council in removing the vehicle thereto; and

(b) the sum of five dollars per day for each day or part of a day that the vehicle has remained in the appointed place; and upon payment of that cost and charge the Clerk, if satisfied that the person is the owner of the vehicle or is a person entitled to possession of the vehicle, shall permit him to remove it.

(2) Every person who removes a vehicle from an appointed place without the authority of the Clerk commits an offence.

12. Where a vehicle, placed in an appointed place, in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws, has not been recovered by the owner or a person entitled thereto within one month from the day upon which it was there placed, the Council may cause the vehicle to be offered for sale by public auction or by public tender and thereupon accept the best offer made; and where no offer is made for the purchase of the vehicle, the Council may cause it to be destroyed.

13. A person is not entitled to any claim, by way of damages or otherwise, against the authorised person, member of the Police Force, or the Council in respect of any vehicle or animal seized and dealt with under the provisions of these by-laws or against ωny person who purchases a vehicle sold by a Council under the provisions of by-law 12 of these by-laws.

14. (1) The proceeds of the sale of a vehicle under the provisions of by-law 12 of these by-laws shall be applied by the Council:—

- (a) firstly, in meeting the costs of the sale; and
 - (b) secondly, in meeting the cost of removal of the vehicle to the appointed place, and a sum of one dollar for each day or part of a day that the vehicle remained in that place; and those sums shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.

(2) Any surplus of the proceeds of the sale shall be paid by the Council into its trust fund, and may be paid within ten years, to any person who satisfies the Council that he was the owner of the vehicle at the time of its sale by Council.

(3) Any surplus of the proceeds of the sale may, if not paid to the owner within ten years, be paid into the Municipal Fund.

15. A person committing a breach of these by-laws is liable to a penalty not exceeding forty dollars.

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Council" means the Brookton Shire Council.

(b) "Continuous Service" means service in the employment of the Council during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Council for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Council.

2. All employees of the Council shall after a period of 10 years continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing 1st day of January, 1946, be entitled to three months' long service leave. Long service leave is to be taken at the convenience of the Council, which will, as far as possible, meet the wishes of the employee, but the Council may require the employee to take his leave by giving him not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in the continuous service, providing the period of absence shall not be longer than three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Council.

4. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary or wage paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Council may at its discretion either:-

- (1) pay to the employee his salary or wages periodically during long service leave or
- (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his salary or wages for the period of his long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' service. After the completion of the first 10 years, employees will then be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Council before the next period is completed. 6. In the event of the resignation, retirement or death of an employee, the Council may pay to such employee (or in the case of death to his personal representative or if there be none, to his dependants), a sum of money equal to his salary or wages for the period of long service leave which the Council was empowered under these by-laws to grant such employee at the date of his retirement, resignation or death, or if the Council after consideration of all circumstances, direct that the death of the employee be presumed, the Council may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of salary or wages which would under this by-law have been granted to the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by Council.

7. An employee dismissed by the Council, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

8. Long Service Leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Council.

Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Council to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Delete Clauses 5, 6 and 7 and substitute the following:---

5. Subject to the provisions of By-law 7 hereof after the conclusion of each 10 years of continuous service, an employee will be entitled to a pro rata payment for the term of any further continuous service. In the event of the death of an employee or if Council, after the consideration of all circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Council may authorise the payment to his personal representative, or if there be none, to his dependants, of a sum equivalent to the amount which would, under these By-laws, have been granted to the employee immediately prior to the date of his death or presumed death.

6. Any employee leaving the service of the Council on account of sickness, retrenchment, resignation, retirement, death or for any other cause which the Council thinks reasonable—

(a) in the case of an employee who commenced continuous service prior to the 1st July, 1974, after three (3) years' continuous service;

(b) in the case of an employee who commenced continuous service on or after the 1st July, 1974, after five (5) years' continuous service the Council may pay that employee Long Service Leave pay on a pro rata rate in respect of the employee's period of continuous service with Council.

7. An employee dismissed by Council, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid or be entitled to any sum in respect of Long Service Leave.

Swimming Pool By-laws.

L.G. LA-7-13.

1. In these By-Laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:---

"Pool Manager" means the person for the time being employed by the Council to control and to manage the Pool Premises and includes his assistant or deputy.

"Attendant" means an employee of the Council performing duties in connection with Pool Premises.

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Laverton. "Pool Premises" means Laverton Aquatic Centre and all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such centre or used in connection therewith.

2. (a) The Pool Premises shall be open for admission of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time determine.

(b) The Pool Premises or any part thereof, may at any time at the discretion of the Manager, endorsed by Council, be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

3. The Council may from time to time and for such periods as it determines close the Pool Premises to the Public.

4. The Council may refuse any person admission to the Pool Premises at any time and children under the age of six (6) years shall be refused admission unless accompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years.

5. The charges for admission to the Pool Premises shall be set from time to time by resolution of the Council.

6. The Council may issue or authorise the issue of concessions for such period at such cost and upon such conditions as it shall from time to time determine.

7. If an article which has been hired is returned in good order and condition the deposit paid in respect thereof shall be refunded to the person returning the article. If any such article is not returned on the day of hire or is returned in a damaged condition then without prejudice to any other remedies of the Council the whole or such part of the deposit as the Pool Manager or Attendant shall decide shall be forfeited to the Council.

8. Every person using the Pool Premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager or Attendant with regard to such use.

9. The Pool Manager or Attendant may temporarily suspend admittance to clear the Pool Premises or any part thereof of all or any persons or person if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

10. If any person shall appear in public and in the opinion of the Pool Manager or Attendant to be indecently or insufficiently clad the Pool Manager or Attendant shall direct that person forthwith to resume his or her ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with that direction.

11. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager or Attendant who is hereby so empowered and directed, to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool Premises any person who in the opinion of the Pool Manager or Attendant—

(a) Is a child under the age of six (6) years and is unaccompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years or;

- (b) Is by his past or present conduct undesirable, or;
- (c) Is under or apparently under the influence of alcoholic liquor or drugs, or;
- (d) Is apparently suffering from any contagious, infectious, offensive disease or skin complaint,

and any such person shall upon the request of the Pool Manager or Attendant to withdraw from the Pool Premises quietly and peaceably and do so immediately.

12. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool Premises or has been requested to leave the Pool Premises and who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager or Attendant may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk against such action. The Council shall consider the objection and give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit. The right of appeal given by this By-Law shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council or Pool Manager or an Attendant arising out of such refusal of admission or direction to leave the Pool Premises.

13. No person shall for profit teach, coach or train any person in the Pool Premises unless with the prior written consent of the Council.

14. The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

15. (1) No person, club, association or organization shall conduct a carnival at the Pool Premises unless with prior consent of the Council.

(2) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

(3) A person, club, association or organization conducting any carnival at the Pool Premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool Premises and that these By-Laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

(4) Any person, club, association or organization conducting any carnival held at the Pool Premises shall pay to the Council such charges as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

16. Every person, finding within the Pool Premises any article which may have been left or lost therein shall immediately deliver it to the Pool Manager or Attendant who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose and any person claiming the article who satisfies the Pool Manager or Attendant that he is the lawful owner of the article shall upon payment of a charge of ten cents (10c) and upon signing a receipt for it have the article returned to him.

17. All articles left in the Pool Premises and not claimed within a period of three (3) calendar months shall be disposed of by the Council by first offering the article to the finder and if he shall refuse it, the Council shall then dispose of the article in any manner it thinks proper.

18. (1) No person shall enter any portion of the Pool Premises set apart exclusively for the opposite sex. Nor shall any person without the consent of the occupier enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing box or other compartment which is already occupied.

(2) No person upon the Pool Premises shall in any way interfere with any other person therein or with any other person's use thereof nor throw nor push or attempt to throw or push any person into the swimming pool or throw any stones, sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any person using the Pool Premises.

(3) No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of the users of the Pool Premises, provided that nothing herein contained apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports organized and conducted on the Pool Premises by any club, association or organization or other person at such time and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council.

(4) No person being the owners of or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall cause or allow such dog or animal to enter or remain in or about the Pool Premises.

19. No person shall-

- (a) not being an officer or employee of the Council in the course of his duties, or a pensioner on production of his pension card enter the Pool Premises without having first paid the Pool Manager or an Attendant the proper charge for admission;
- (b) obstruct the Pool Manager or Attendant in carrying out his duties;
- (c) enter or depart from any part of the Pool Premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose;
- (d) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume except in a dressing enclosure provided for that purpose;
- (e) appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such a nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person;
- (f) enter or be in the Pool Premises while in an intoxicated condition induced by liquor or drugs;
- (g) take into the Pool Premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor or drugs;
- (h) use any soap in any part of the Pool Premises other than in the dressing room or shower recess;
- (i) in any part of the Pool Premises behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous or indecent manner, swear or use any indecent, obscene, offensive or abusive language or gamble or misconduct himself or herself;
- (j) climb up to or upon any roof, fence, wall or partition of the Pool Premises;
- (k) deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the Pool Premises except in places set aside for that purpose;
- (1) except in the specified areas consume any food or drink;
- (m) wastefully use the water or leave any taps dripping in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the Pool Premises;
- (n) spit or expectorate in the swimming pool or on any part of the Pool Premises or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such premises;
- (o) use any substance or preparation whereby the water of the swimming pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers;
- (p) foul or pollute water in any shower, bath or in the swimming pool, or soil, damage, injure, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any dressing room, closet or compartment, or other part of the Pool Premises, or any furniture or other article of equipment therein;
- (q) damage, improperly use or interfere with any tap, valve, locker or other fitting or appliance in or about the Pool Premises, or discharge litter of any description on, in or about the Pool Premises or bring or deposit any filth or rubbish onto or in the Pool Premises;
- (r) smoke, unless permitted by the Pool Manager, in any buildings, dressing room or other compartment in the Pool Premises;
- (s) whilst suffering from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use or attempt to enter or use the swimming pool or the Pool Premises or any part thereof;
- (t) soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume;
- (u) enter the swimming pool unless wearing the approved bathing costume.

20. A person shall not pay nor shall any Pool Manager or Attendant or Officer or Servant of the Council receive any fee for admission to or for the use of any facility in the Pool Premises except upon such person being permitted to pass through a turnstile which automatically registers such admission or except in exchange for a printed ticket bearing the name of the Council or in exchange for a ticket issued from a cash register of the Council.

21. Every person shall when leaving the Pool Premises, if requested to do so produce his or her bathing costume or towel for inspection by the Pool Manager or Attendant.

22. No ticket, token, license or receipt issued as provided by these By-Laws shall be transferable and no person other than the person to whom it was originally issued shall enjoy any benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

23. Neither the Council nor the Pool Manager or Attendant or Officers of Employees of the Council shall in any way be responsible for any article or money lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool Premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the Pool Premises.

24. (1) A person who infringes any of the provisions of these By-Laws or shall attempt any breach thereof, may be summarily removed from the Pool Premises or any part thereof by the Pool Manager or an Attendant, and if committing a breach of the Act or these By-Laws may be arrested by the Pool Manager or an Attendant and given into the custody of a Police Officer.

The Pool Manager or Attendant may refuse to admit to the Pool Premises any person who shall have been convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of these By-Laws until such time as the Council may decide that such person may be admitted.

(2) The Council may issue a written direction to the Pool Manager that any person named in such direction shall not be admitted to the Pool Premises, and whilst such direction remains in force, the Pool Manager or an Attendant shall not admit such person to the Pool Premises or permit him to be therein, and such person shall not with the knowledge that such direction is in force, enter or attempt to enter the Pool Premises.

25. Any person who shall commit a breach of these By-Laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$100.

2. No person shall dispose of a disused motor vehicle, an old motor vehicle body or parts, or any old machinery except at a place set aside or approved of by the Council for that purpose.

By-laws relating to the Care and Control of Reserve No. 9610.

L.G. WI-7-9.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all the other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Wickepin hereby records having resolved on the 10th day of January, 1975, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise the following terms shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—

- (a) "Shire Clerk" means that person for the time being employed by the Shire of Wickepin, as Shire Clerk.
- (b) "Council" means the Municipality of the Shire of Wickepin.
- (c) "Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960-1975 (as amended).
- (d) "Lake Yealering" means that portion of Reserve No. 9610 named Lake Yealering.

2. (a) The Shire Clerk shall, subject to these by-laws and the Council, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Reserve, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws.

(b) The directions of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and have been the direction of the Council.

(c) The Council may, from time to time, appoint one or more persons to act as Rangers with power to carry out or enforce any or all of these by-laws, cancel such appointment or amend the Authority granted to such rangers by either increasing or decreasing the Authority previously granted.

(d) For such services the ranger may receive from the Council an agreed Annual Fee.

(e) No person employed by the Council shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatsoever, other than the remuneration or fee he receives from the Council, and any such person found guilty of accepting such gratuity shall be liable to summary dismissal.

- 3. No person shall, whilst within the boundaries of the reserve:-
 - (a) Drive a motor vehicle of any kind, whether towing a boat or caravan or not, other than upon a defined road or on an approved parking area:—
 - (i) at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) kilometres per hour,
 - (ii) in a reckless, negligent or dangerous manner, or
 - (iii) Whilst under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
 - (b) Deposit any rubbish in a place other than in the receptacle provided.
 - (c) Light a fire for any other purpose than that of cooking and then only in the fireplace provided, without the written Authority of a Fire Control Officer appointed by the Council under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act.
 - (d) Remove or damage any tree, shrub or flower except it be a tree, shrub or flower declared to be a noxious weed under the provisions of the Noxious Weed Act.
 - (e) Shoot or capture, or attempt to shoot or capture by trapping, snaring or other means any bird or animal, except such birds or animals as have been declared vermin under the provisions of the Vermin Act.
 - (f) Without the written consent of the Council; promote or advertise, sell or expose for sale any goods, or carry on any business or calling by any means whatsoever.
 - (g) Wear a bathing or other costume that violates the rules of propriety or decorum.
 - (h) Park a caravan on any part of the reserve other than that set aside for that purpose. Such person shall also pay the fee which the Council may levy, from time to time, for the use of such caravan parking facilities.
 - (i) Commit any nuisance, use any foul or indecent language, be in a state of intoxication, or create or take part in any disturbance which is offensive or injurious to the enjoyment of the reserve by any other person.

4. For the purpose of bathing, water skiing, sailing, roving or driving a motor powered boat on Lake Yealering, no person shall:---

- (a) Launch a boat onto Lake Yealering, at any other place than that provided for that purpose. Such person shall also pay the fee which the Council may levy, from time to time, for the use of such boat launching facilities.

Regulations.

Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960, as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971, and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 57B

2. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for substituted. 2. The principal regulation:-regulation 57B the following regulation:-

57B. (1) This regulation applies to grants payable, under paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 9A of the Act, to efficient schools at which fees are payable for the tuition of scholars.

(2) Where an efficient school wishes to apply for grants under this regulation, the application shall be made by the headmaster of the school in February and July of each year in such form as the Minister, from time to time, determines.

(3) (a) As soon as practicable after 1st January in each year, the Minister shall assess the average cost in a Government school of a scholar in a primary course and of a scholar in a secondary course.

(b) The assessment under paragraph (a) of this subregulation shall be made by dividing the estimated expenditures for primary and secondary courses in Government schools during the current financial year by the actual enrolments in those courses in Government schools on the 1st August of the immediately preceding calendar year.

(c) Subject to subregulation (5) of this regulation, the Minister shall pay eleven and one half percentum of the average cost, ascertained under paragraph (a) of this sub-regulation to each efficient school for each scholar enrolled at that school, according to the course in which he is engaged and as soon as practicable after the average cost has been ascertained.

(4) (a) As soon as practicable after 1st August of each year, the Minister shall assess the average cost in a Government school of a scholar in a primary course and of a scholar in a secondary course.

(b) The assessment under paragraph (a) of this sub-regulation shall be made by dividing the actual expenditures for primary and secondary courses in Government schools in-curred during the immediately preceding financial year by the actual enrolments in those courses in Government schools on the 1st August of the current year.

(c) Subject to subregulation (5) of this regulation, the Minister shall pay eleven and one half percentum of the average cost, ascertained unde rparagraph (a) of this sub-regulation to each efficient school for each scholar enrolled at that school, according to the course in which he is engaged and as soon as practicable after the average cost has been ascertained.

(5) (a) Grants payable under subregulations (3) and (4) of this regulation may be made by monetary payments or by way of goods and services supplied to, or paid for by the Min-ister in relation to, a scholar at the school.

(b) The total value of amounts paid and goods and services supplied under this regulation in respect of a scholar shall not be less than, in the case of a scholar who is in any year of a course of primary education, thirty dollars per annum, and in the case of a scholar who is in any year of a course of secondary education, forty dollars per annum.

(6) Amounts are payable under this regulation only in respect of a scholar-

- (a) who is engaged in a course of primary or secondary education at the school which applies for grants under this regulation;
- who is six years of age or more, or will attain during (b) the year for which payment under this regulation is sought, the age of six years;
- (c) who has not attained the age of nineteen years; and
- (d) who, being a resident of the State, has a parent or guardian also resident of the State, or who, being a resident of the State but not having a parent or guardian so resident, is determined by the Minister to be a scholar for the purposes of this regulation.

Schedule-continued.

Reg. 57C

3. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for substituted. regulation 57C the following regulation:-

57C. (1) This regulation applies, pursuant to paragraph (f) of subsection (1) of section 9A of the Act, to the paying to prescribed scholars at efficient schools prescribed amounts for the purpose of assisting those scholars in the purchase of text books, such an amount being hereinafter referred to as a "text book subsidy".

(2) The prescribed amounts of a text book subsidy shall be-

- (a) in the case of a scholar who is in the first, second or third year of a course of secondary education, five dollars per annum; and
- (b) in the case of a scholar who is in the fourth year of a course of secondary education, twenty-five dollars per annum; and
- (c) in the case of a scholar who is in the fifth year of a course of secondary education, fifteen dollars per annum.

(3) Text book subsidies are payable under this regulation only in respect of a scholar-

- (a) who is engaged in a full-time course of secondary education at an efficient school;
- (b) who has not been awarded a Commonwealth Scholarship or granted assistance under the Secondary Allowances Scheme or the Aboriginal Secondary Grants Scheme;
- (c) who has not been provided with free text books by the Education Department for the Department for Community Welfare;
- (d) whose permanent residence is ordinarily within the Commonwealth of Australia;
- (e) who applies to the Minister for a subsidy through his parents or guardian in such form as the Minister from time to time determines; and
- (f) who has not previously received a text book subsidy under this regulation for the year for which application is made.

(4) On receipt of the application a text book subsidy shall be paid on behalf of a scholar to his parents or guardian who shall undertake that the subsidy will be used to purchase text books for that student.

Reg. 57D added.

4. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 57C the following regulation:-

57D. (1) This regulation applies, pursuant to paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of section 9A of the Act, to the reimbursement of efficient schools in respect of interest paid by those schools on money borrowed by them for prescribed purposes, such reimbursement being hereinafter referred to as an "interest subsidy".

(2) Subject to subregulation (3) of this regulation, the prescribed purposes in relation to which an interest subsidy may be paid are—

- (a) the construction of residential accommodation at an efficient school for scholars attending that school;
- (b) the construction of classroom accommodation at an efficient school for scholars attending that school.

(3) Where an efficient school wishes to apply for a subsidy under this regulation, the application shall be made to the Department by the headmaster of the school and shall include such information as the Minister, from time to time, determines.

(4) The Department shall consider each application for an interest subsidy and shall make recommendations thereon to the Minister.

(5) On receiving the recommendation the Minister may approve the payment of an interest subsidy to such extent and upon such conditions as the Treasurer of the State determines.
