PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, J. M. RAMSAY, Lieutenant Governor and Administrator. [L.S.]

By His Excellency Commodore James Maxwell Ramsay, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Distinguished Service Cross, Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 46 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935–1975, that the Governor may by proclamation declare that such places in Western Australia as he thinks fit are circuit towns; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 10 of the Juries Act, 1957–1975, that the jury district for the Supreme Court and for each Circuit Court, shall consist of such Assembly District or Districts or such part or parts of such Assembly District or Districts, as the Governor determines and declares, and is thereby authorized to determine and declare by proclamation from time to time; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 10 of the Juries Act, 1957–1975 that where a circuit town is declared after the coming into operation of that Act pursuant to the power conferred by section 46 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935 or any other Act for the time being in operation, the Governor may by the proclamation declaring the circuit town, or by subsequent proclamation, declare what Assembly District or Districts or part or parts of an Assembly District or Districts, shall constitute the jury district for the Circuit Court of the circuit town so proclaimed: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and under the provisions of section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918–1974, do hereby, with effect on and from the 1st January, 1976—

- (a) determine and declare that the jury district for the Supreme Court shall consist of the Assembly Districts specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this proclamation;
- (b) assign to the jury district specified in the second column of the First Schedule the name specified in the third column of that Schedule:
- (c) declare that such places in Western Australia as are specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this proclamation are circuit towns;
- (d) determine and declare the jury district for a Circuit Court of a circuit town specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this proclamation shall constitute the Assembly District or Districts or part or parts of the Assembly District or Districts specified opposite and corresponding to that circuit town in the second column of that Schedule;
- (e) assign to a jury district specified in the second column of the Second Schedule the name specified opposite and corresponding to that jury district in the third column of that Schedule.

PART I-GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

By inserting a new By-law,

13A. No person shall place any house or trade rubbish or refuse arising from the use of any premises in any litter bin or receptacle provided by the Council or any other authority in any street or way for use by the public generally.

By-law 19 is amended by deleting clause (6) and inserting in its place the following new sub-clause:

- 19. (6) The driver of a vehicle upon entry on land set aside by the Council for the purpose of depositing refuse, garbage or rubbish, shall make payment of a fee as follows:-
 - (a) Per vehicle of less than 2 tonnes aggregate weight depositing rubbish arising from premises within the City of South Perth, provided that persons who are ratepayers and occupiers produce the identification card as issued by the City of South Perth— No Charge.
 - (b) Per vehicle of more than 2 tonnes aggregate weight—\$5.00.
 - (c) Per trailer or per utility depositing rubbish arising from premises not within the City of South Perth-\$1.00.
 - (d) Lesser loads of rubbish arising from premises not within the City of South Perth-0.50 cents.

By-law 29B is amended by inserting after the words "this by-law" appearing in the fourth line of paragraph (1) the words "save on land on which is erected a single detached dwelling house if such land is not adjoined by land on which is erected a residential building other than a single detached dwelling house and".

Firebreak Requirements 1975-1976.

Notice to all Owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Northam.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the dates referred to below to clear firebreaks on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1976:—

- (1) You shall on or before 15th day of October 1975, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) You shall on or before 15th day of October 1975, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width in such positions as to divide properties of more than 200 hectares into separate sections of no more than 200 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least two metres in width; and

- (3) You shall on or before 15th day of October 1975, clear of all infiammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings and/or haystacks; and
- (4) You shall on or before the 29th day of November, 1975 in the Western Section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land west of the dividing line described hereunder) and on or before the 15th day of November 1975, in the Eastern Section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land east and south of the dividing line described hereunder), clear of all infiammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width immediately surrounding all areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined in such positions so as areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined of more than 100 hectares are divided into separate areas of no more than 100 hec-
- (5) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1975, clear of all infiammable material two firebreaks of at least two metres in width and aproximately twenty metres apart inside and along all property boundaries which abut a Railway Reserve (other than the Railway Reserve specified in paragraph (6) hereof) on which railway traffic is operating and where the Railway Reserve is situated outside a townsite boundary.
- (6) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1975, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least three metres in width inside and along all property boundaries which abut the Standard Gauge Railway Reserve between East Northam and the Eastern boundary of the Shire district.
- (7) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1975, clear of all infiammable material (including standing and fallen trees, branches and undergrowth) firebreaks of at least three metres in width along and as close as possible to all external boundaries of each separate area of undeveloped land and in such extra positions so as areas of undeveloped land of more than 200 hectares and divided into areas of no more than 200 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (8) You shall on or before the 15th day of October 1975, completely clear of all infiammable material all separate townsite lots where the lot is 4 000 square metres or less in area.

Alternative Breaks: If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 7th October 1975, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Penalty: The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Dividing Line: An imaginary line commencing at the northeastern corner of Avon Location 1779, then running south and southeast along the western boundaries of Buckland Road (No. 25) and Irishtown Road (No. 109) to the northwestern boundary of the Town of Northam, thence northeast along the said boundary, along the northeastern and southeastern boundaries of the said town to its intersection of the Avon River, thence south along the said Avon River to the southeastern boundary of the Shire.

- (a) If several paddocks of standing crop or standing crop and pasture total no more than 100 hectares then a firebreak completely surrounding the several paddocks is sufficient.
- (b) If a single paddock comprises several areas of standing crop divided by pasture, timbered, stony or other areas and the total area of the paddock is no more than 100 hectares, then a firebreak surrounding the paddock is sufficient.
- (c) If a single paddock of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined is more than 100 hectares in area, then additional firebreaks would have to be provided so as to divide the paddock into separate areas of no more than 100 hectares, with each separate area being surrounded by a firebreak.

(2) Undeveloped Land:

- (a) Undeveloped land should be regarded as land which is virtually still in its virgin state and includes land on which development has commenced but has not been completed to any final stage. The term is not intended to apply to areas of bush or semi bush which have been left uncleared within a developed property because of the nature of the terrain or for shelter or similar purposes. Land which is developed to a "Parkland" state should be considered as developed land.
- (b) An AREA of undeveloped land means an area, irrespective of shape or size which is not completely or partially divided by developed land. - 2.3 You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1975, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than 3 metres wide immediately surrounding any drums or bulk tanks situated on the land which are normally used for the storage of fuel whether they contain fuel or not.
- 3. Townsite Land (i.e. Myalup and Binningup townsites).

- 3.1 You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1975, clear of all infiammable material, firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.
- 3.2 You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1975, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 3 metres wide immediately surrounding any drums or bulk tanks situated on the land which are normally used for the storage of fuel whether they contain fuel or not.





(1) A person concerned with the working of the electric staff system must apply all rules and instructions appertaining to that working to both large and miniature types of instruments as required.

- (2) The Association may conduct a Trifecta Totalisator on such races at such meetings as it shall determine.
- (3) The following definitions shall apply to the Rules in relation to the Trifecta Totalisator:—
  - "Dividend" means the dividend calculated as hereinafter provided in relation to a unit of investment of FIFTY CENTS (\$0.50).
  - "Place" in relation to a race refers to the placing of a horse in a race after all clear shall have been given.
  - "Pool" means the sum remaining after there shall have been deducted from the total of the moneys invested on the Trifecta Totalisator on the particular race the sum of—
    - (a) any amount which is liable to be refunded to investors under the provisions of this or any other by-law (hereinfater called "refunds");
    - (b) fifteen per centum (15%) of the moneys remaining after the refunds shall have been deducted from the total of the moneys so invested.

"Ticket" means a unit of investment of FIFTY CENTS (\$0.50).

- (4) The investor on the Trifecta conducted on the totalisator shall nominate three horses to fill first, second and third places in the correct order in which he forecasts that they will be placed. A horse shall be nominated by reference to its official number for the race.
  - (5) A winning combination shall be-
    - (a) in the event of there being no dead-heat for first second or third place the combination of the horses placed first, second and third in the correct order in which they are placed;
    - (b) in the event of there being a dead-heat for first place, second place or third place a combination which is deemed to be a winning combination under the provisions of this by-law.
- (6) In the event of a dead-heat for first place, second place or third place the following rules shall apply to determine what is a winning combination. A winning combination shall consist of—
  - (a) In the event of there being a dead-heat between two horses for first place each combination nominating the horses which so dead-heat in first and second place and the horse placed third in third place shall be deemed a winning combination.
  - (b) In the event of there being a dead-heat between three horses for first place each combination nominating the three horses which so dead-heat for first in first, second and third places shall be deemed a winning combination.
  - (c) In the event of there being a dead-heat for first between more than three horses each combination consisting of any three of the horses which so dead-heat (irrespective of the order in which these horses are so nominated) shall be deemed a winning combination.
  - (d) In the event of there being a dead-heat between two horses for second place each combination which nominates the horse placed first in first place and which nominates for the second and third places the horses which dead-heat for second place (irrespective of the order in which it nominates those two horses) shall be deemed a winning combination.
  - (e) In the event of there being a dead-heat between more than two horses for second place then each combination which nominates:—
    - (i) the horse placed first in first place; and
    - (ii) two of the horses which dead-heat for second in second and third place (irrespective of the order in which those two horses are nominated),

shall be deemed a winning combination.

- (f) In the event of there being a dead-heat for third place then irrespective of the number of horses which so dead-heat for third place a combination which nominates—
  - (i) the horse placed first in first place;
  - (ii) the horse placed second in second place; and
  - (iii) one of the horses which so dead-heats for third place,

    - (i) there shall be one winning combination and no ticket is taken on that winning combination; or
  - (ii) there is more than one winning combination and no ticket is taken on any of the winning combinations,

the pool shall at the discretion of the Committee of the Association either be carried forward and added to the Trifecta Totalisator pool of a race upon which a Trifecta Totalisator is to be conducted at that meeting or to the Trifecta Totalisator pool of a race upon which the Trifecta Totalisator is to be conducted at a later meeting or at such discretion as aforesaid shall be divided into such number of parts as the Committee of the Association shall in its sole discretion determine and each such part shall be carried forward and added to the pool of the Trifecta Totalisator in respect of such race upon which the Trifecta Totalisator is to be conducted by the Association as the Committee shall determine either at that meeting or at some later meeting to be conducted by the Association.
