Model Health By-laws—Amendment.

P.H.O. 810/61/1; Ex. Co. 3099.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Health Act, 1911 (as amended), the Mayor and Councillors of the City of South Perth do hereby order that the Model Health by-laws as adopted by the City of South Perth and as amended from time to time pursuant to the said Act be now amended as follows:—

PART I.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

By-law 29A is revoked and a new by-law 29A substituted:—

29A. (1) The owner or occupier of any land shall not keep thereon or permit to be kept thereon any poultry, provided that if the provisions of clauses 29AB and 29AC are complied with, poultry may be kept on a lot of land if there is erected thereon a single detached dwelling house and—

- (a) poultry are being kept thereon at the date this by-law comes into force; or
- (b) such lot of land is not adjoined by a lot of land on which is erected a residential building other than a single detached dwelling house.

(2) The owner or occupier of land who has been keeping poultry on a lot of land on which is erected a single detached dwelling house may continue to keep poultry thereon notwithstanding that after this by-law comes into force a residential building other than a single detached dwelling house is erected on an adjoining lot.

(3) If at any time poultry ceases to be kept on a lot of land on which poultry is permitted to be kept by reason of the provisions of subclause (1) (a) or subclause (2) of this clause the owner or occupier of such lot shall not thereafter keep poultry on such lot unless the provisions of subclause (1) (b) of this clause are fulfilled.

29AB. The owner or occupier of any one lot of land shall not keep thereon or permit to be kept thereon more than fifteen poultry including not more than two ducks. For the purposes of this clause ducks shall be deemed to include geese.

29AC. Any person who keeps any poultry or permits any poultry to be kept shall ensure that—

- (a) the poultry are kept in a poultry house having a concrete floor at least 50 millimetres thick finished to a smooth cement surface and laid with a fall of at least one in fifty to the doorway and having a roofed area of at least one-sixth of the area of the poultry house provided that a poultry house may be so constructed as to permit the use of the deep litter system or the laying cage system;
- (b) if a poultry yard is provided in addition to a poultry house the same is enclosed by fencing constructed to at least the following specifications:

- (i) posts, if of timber shall be jarrah, wandoo or blackbutt with a cross section of at least 75 millimetres by 50 millimetres: If of reinforced concrete shall have a cross section of at least 75 millimetres by 50 millimetres: If of metal shall be at least 3.0 millimetres in thickness and shall have an inside diameter of at least 25 millimetres. All posts shall be adequately strutted to maintain stability, shall extend to at least 610 millimetres below ground level, and shall have centres not more than 2.4 metres apart;
- (ii) enclosing wire netting shall be galvanised wire netting of at least 1.0 millimetres and maximum 50 millimetres mesh extending at least 150 millimetres below ground level and at least 1.7 metres above ground level supported on wire strands of adequate strength, strung between the posts and securely connected to the posts;
- (c) the roof, walls and doors of a poultry house and the fencing and gates of a poultry yard are maintained in good and efficient condition;
- (d) no part of a poultry house or a poultry yard is less than:
- (i) one metre from any boundary of the land;
 - (ii) twenty-four metres from the street which the land fronts;
 - (iii) nine metres from any street which abuts a side boundary of the land;
 - (iv) nine metres from any dwelling house;
- (e) at all times all poultry are confined in a poultry house or poultry yard constructed in accordance with these by-laws.

RULES.

1. In these rules the Painters' Registration Board Rules, 1962 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th December, 1962 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal rules.

2. Regulation 8 of the principal rules is amended—

(a) as to subrule (1), by adding after the word "Board" in line two the words "for persons desiring to be registered under paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 12 of the Act"; and

(b) by adding after subrule (1) the following subrule:—

Conditions for the introduction of pig semen. 3. Semen may be introduced into this State on the following conditions:—

- (a) the approval of the Chief Veterinary Surgeon shall be obtained prior to the introduction of the semen into this State;
- (b) the herd of origin of the board supplying the semen shall have been under regular testing for swine brucellosis with all reactors promptly removed therefrom;
- (c) the donor boar shall have been subjected to the serum agglutination test for swine brucellosis and any other health tests required by the Chief Veterinary Surgeon, and shall have been held in isolation for 30 days prior to those tests being performed and the collection of semen shall have been made within seven days of the completion of the tests while the board was still in isolation;
- (d) the semen shall only be used on swine in Western Australia owned by the person introducing the semen; and
- (e) the semen shall be accompanied by a certificate acceptable to the Chief Veterinary Surgeon, in which the owner of the board declares that the tests referred to in paragraph (c) of this regulation have been carried out with negative results and a certificate to that effect is provided by a Government Veterinary Officer.

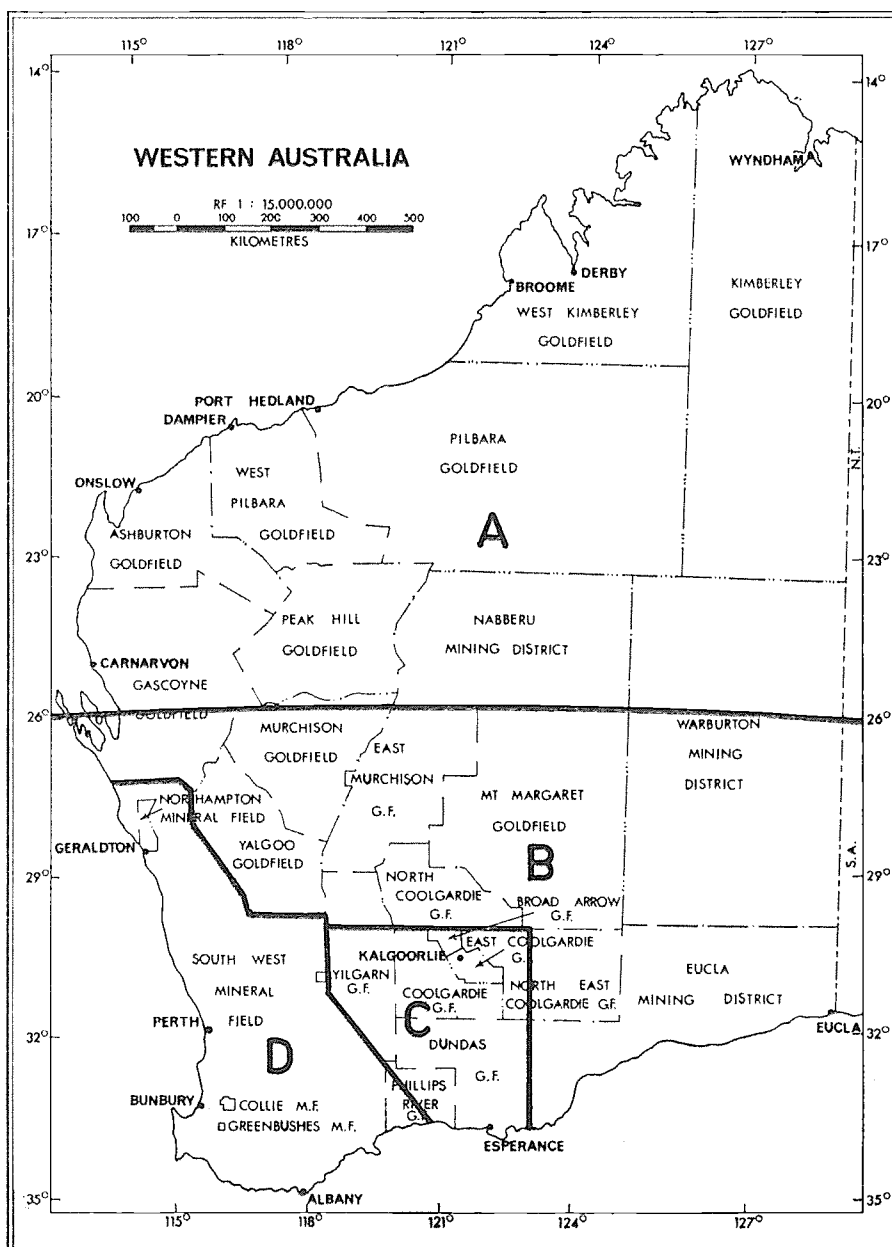
