

Regulations.

PART I.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Grain Marketing Act Regulations 1975.

Interpretation.

- 2. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears:—
 - "Act" means the Grain Marketing Act, 1975;
 - "barley" includes a sample of barley containing not less that sixty per centum of barley grain or seed;
 - "Board" means the Board of Directors of The Grain Pool of W.A. established under the Act;
 - "certificate" means a certificate issued by the Board in respect of a grain received by The Grain Pool for a pool;
 - "closing date" means the date on or before which grain for a pool may be delivered to The Grain Pool or a licensed receiver;
 - "grain" means the seed of any crop or pasture species;
 - "Grain Pool" means The Grain Pool of W.A. established under the Act;
 - "licensed receiver" means a person who has under section 34 of the Act a licence to receive and handle grain on behalf of The Grain Pool;

SCHEDULE—continued.

"lupin" means—

- (a) the Uniwhite, Uniharvest, and Unicrop cultivars of Lupinus angustifolius L. (narrow-leaved lupin); and
- (b) the Weiko III cultivar of Lupinus luteus L. (yellow lupin);

"pool" means a pool established under the Act for the marketing of a grain; "season" means the period between the 1st April in any one year and the 31st March in the next following year.

PART II.

Receipt for Grain and Claims for Compensation.

3. All claims for compensation for grain accepted by the Board and all certificates issued by the Board for the receipt of such grain shall be made in accordance with Form No. 1 in Appendix I to these regulations.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS ACT, 1929-1974.

THE UNDERSIGNED MINISTER FOR AGRI-CULTURE, being the Minister charged with the administration of the Agricultural Products Act, 1929-1974, acting in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by Section 3D of the said Act and on the recommendation of the Stone Fruit Sales Advisory Committee constituted under the Act, do hereby prohibit the sale, except for the purposes of export, of all stone fruits of kinds and varieties listed in Column 1 of the schedule hereto that are below the minimum sizes specified in Column 2 of the schedule, from the 24th day of November, 1975, until further notice.

The provisions of this notice shall be read in conjunction with the Agricultural Products (Stone Fruit Grading) Regulations 1973.

A person shall not sell, except for the purpose of export from the State, any stone fruit of which the sale is, pursuant to the provisions of Section 3D of the Act prohibited, and any person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.

MARKETING OF EGGS ACT, 1945-1975.

Reduction of Licence Allocations Section 32 FA. SECTION 32 FA of the Marketing of Eggs Act as amended by the 1975 Amendment Act provides-

Where the Board is of the opinion that the number of eggs likely to be produced during any part of a licensing year will be in excess of the requirements of the Board, the Board may, with the approval of the Minister, by notice published in the Government Gazette, rateably reduce the number of fowls authorised to be kept during the licensing year by persons who are the holders of a license or supplementary license under this part of this Act, and thereupon each such license or supplementary license shall be deemed to baye mentary license shall be deemed to have been so varied.

The Western Australian Egg Marketing Board gives notice to all persons holding licenses in the South West Land Division granted under section 32E of the Marketing of Eggs Act, 1945-1975, that in terms of section 32FA the Board has with the approval of the Minister rateably reduced the number of fowls authorised to be kept as from the 20th November, 1975, by 5% of the authorised number of fowls as at the 9th October, 1975.

MURDOCH UNIVERSITY ACT, 1973.

Statute No. 12-Board of Research and Postgraduate Studies.

- 1. There shall be a Board of Research and Postgraduate Studies.
- For the purposes of this Statute-
 - "postgraduate studies" means studies leading to a degree of Master or Doctor:
 - "postgraduate student" means a student enrolled for a degree of Master or Doctor.
- The Board shall be responsible to the Academic Council for administering postgraduate studies.
- The Board shall be responsible for giving advice to the Vice-Chancellor and the Academic Council on University research policy, including the following matters
 - (a) assessment of the needs of research in terms of financial allocation;
 - (b) consideration of the ethical implications of research;

- (c) development of criteria for the assignment of University research support within the University;
- (d) co-ordination with the postgraduate student programme to ensure that the resources allocated to studentships are matched with the resources allocated for research equipment and maintenance;
- (e) assessment of the priorities for purchasing, maintenance and replacement of large and expensive items of equipment which have a primary research role including special library collections for research;
- (f) all matters relating to research and in particular the provision of research assistance to staff;
- (g) development of policy guidelines and support for research projects from outside funds;
- (h) promotion of the public dissemination of the results of research by staff and students.
- 5. The Board shall consist of:
 - (a) a Chairman and two other persons appointed by the Academic Council;
 - (b) the vice-Chancellor ex officio;
 - (c) one member of the academic staff, recently a postgraduate student, appointed by the Academic Council;
 - (d) one person appointed by the Chairman of each of the Schools of study, on the recommendation of the Board of the School;
 - (e) two postgraduate students elected by the postgraduate students.
- 6. (i) All members of the Board other than the ex-officio member and post-graduate student members shall hold office for a term of three years. Post-graduate student members shall hold office for a term of one year.
- (ii) A year of office shall be deemed to commence on 1 June in each year. (iii) A member of the Board shall not be appointed or elected for more than two consecutive terms.
- 7. A casual vacancy shall be filled by a new appointment or election. The term of office of a person appointed or elected to fill a casual vacancy shall expire on the expiration of the year of office in which the vacancy occurs.
- 8. The Board shall meet at least twice in each semester. Meetings of the Board may be convened by the Chairman or the Vice-Chancellor at any time by not less than seven days' notice (unless all the members otherwise agree) and shall be convened by the Secretary on the written request of at least three members by not less than 21 days' notice.
- 9. Subject to the provisions of this Statute, any Meetings Statute for the time being in force shall apply to meetings of the Board. The quorum for meetings shall be five. In all other respects, the Board may regulate its meetings as it thinks fit.
 - 10. Statute No. 6-Board of Postgraduate Studies-is hereby repealed.
- 11. The Board shall replace and be deemed to be the successor of the Board of Postgraduate Studies established by Statute No. 6, and it shall take over all the responsibilities, functions and activities of the Board of Postgraduate Studies. All members of the Board of Postgraduate Studies immediately prior to the date of this Statute comes into force shall be deemed to be members of the Board of Research and Postgraduate studies and each of their terms of office shall expire on 1 June in the year in which their terms of office as members of the Board of Postgraduate Studies would have expired in accordance with Statute No. 6.
