Declaration of School Boundaries Pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 21.

Children who live within the areas and boundaries stated shall attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless directed otherwise or unless an option is provided. Children who live outside the areas and boundaries shall not attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless written approval for such admission is obtained from the undersigned.

SCHOOL BOUNDARIES.

- Allenswood Primary School: The boundary for the above school is as follows:— From the junction of Warwick Road and Wanneroo Road, west along Warwick Road to Allenswood Drive, in a generally northerly direction along Allenswood Drive to Hepburn Avenue, in a generally easterly direction along Hepburn Avenue to Wanneroo Road, and south along Wanneroo Road to the junction with Warwick Road.
 - The boundary parts of Warwick Road (north side), Hepburn Avenue (south side) and Wanneroo Road (west side), and the boundary street of Allenswood Drive (east side) are included in the area for the Allenswood Primary School.

- Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 3 inclusive in 1976 and living within the area for the Allenswood Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Allenswood Primary School.
- 2. Brookman Primary School:
 - The boundary for the above school is as follows:— From the Canning River southwest along the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway to a point opposite Langford Park and on the south side of Cortis Way, in a generally northwesterly direction crossing Langford Park to Langford Avenue, in the same direction southwest of Towton Way to Brookman Avenue, in the same direction between Foxwood Way and Letson Way on the northeast and Rouse Court and Turley Way on the southwest to Nicholson Road north and northeast along Nicholson Road to the Canning River, and in a generally southeasterly direction along the Canning River to the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway.
 - The boundary parts of Nicholson Road (east side only) and the Roe Freeway (west side only) are included in the area for the Brookman Primary School.
 - Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1976, and living within the boundary for the Brookman Primary School as provided above, shall attend the Brookman Primary School, except that children from the abovedefined area who were in Year 6 at Langford Primary School in 1975 may remain at their present (1975) school or may transfer to the Brookman Primary School at the beginning of the 1976 school year.
 - The area bounded on the northeast by Spencer Road, on the southeast by the Standard Gauge Railway, on the soutwest by Cameron Street, and on the northwest by the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway is an optional area between Langford Primary School and Yale Primary School, with the boundary parts of Spencer Road (southwest side only), Roe Freeway (southeast side only), and Cameron Street (northeast side only) being included in the optional area. Children from this optional area are excluded from attendance at the Brookman Primary School.
- 3. Churchlands Primary School:
 - The boundary for the above school is as follows:— From Selby Street, west along the extension of Hale Road east of Pearson Street and west and northwest along Hale Road to Unwin Avenue south and southeast along Unwin Avenue to the junction with Ailsa Street, south along the northsouth alignment of Ailsa Street and its extension to Empire Avenue, southeast along Empire Avenue to Alyth Road, south along Alyth Road to The Boulevard, east along the extension of Peebles Road west of Caithness Road and along Peebles Road to Turriff Road, and northeast along Turriff Road and its extension to Selby Street.
 - The boundary streets of Turriff Road (both sides) and Alyth Road (both sides) are to be included in the area for the Churchlands Primary School, while the boundary parts of Peebles Road (both sides), Empire Avenue (both sides), the northsouth alignment of Ailsa Street (both sides), Unwin Avenue (both sides), and Hale Road (both sides) are to be excluded from the area for the Churchlands Primary School.
 - The area bounded on the north by Hale Road, on the west by Unwin Avenue and the northsouth alignment of Ailsa Street and its extension to Empire Avenue, on the south by Empire Avenue, and on the east by Tuscany Way and Lucca Street is to be an optional area. The boundary parts of Hale Road, Unwin Avenue, Ailsa Street

and Empire Avenue (both sides in all cases) are to be excluded from the optional area while the boundary parts of Tuscany Way and Lucca Street (both sides in each case) are to be included in the optional area. Children living in the optional area so defined may attend Kapinara Primary School, Woodlands Primary School or Churchlands Primary School.

- Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive and living within the boundary for the Churchlands Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Churchlands Primary School, except that children living in the optional area as designated above, may attend either Kapinara Primary School, Woodlands Primary School or Churchlands Primary School.
- 4. Dudley Park Primary School:
 - - The boundary part of Pinjarra Road (south side only) and the boundary part of Wanjeep Street (both sides) are included in the area for the Dudley Park Primary School.
 - Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 4 inclusive in 1976 and living within the area for the Dudley Park Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Dudley Park Primary School.
- 5. Lynwood Primary School:
 - - The boundary parts of Metcalfe Road (east side only), High Road (east side only), Kenton Street (both sides), Fleetwood Road (both sides), Nicholson Road (west side only), and New High Road (northeast side) and the boundary street of Edgeware street (both sides) are included in the area for the Lynwood Primary School.
 - The area bounded on the northwest by High Road, on the southwest by Lynwood Avenue, on the east by Nicholson Road, and on the north by Fleetwood Road, Kenton Street and Edgeware Street, shall be optional in respect of children in Years 2 to 7 inclusive in 1976 who attended Kinlock Primary School in 1975. Such children may remain at the Kinlock Primary School in 1976 and complete their primary schooling at the Kinlock Primary School or may transfer to the Lynwood Primary School at the beginning of the 1976 school year. The boundary parts of High Road (east side only), Nicholson Road (west side only), Fleetwood Avenue (both sides) and Kenton Street (both sides), and the boundary streets of Lynwood Avenue (both sides) are included in the optional area as defined above.
 - Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1976 and living within the area for the Lynwood Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Lynwood Primary School except that children in Years 2-7 inclusive in 1976 and living in the optional area defined above

shall have the option of attending either the Kinlock or Lynwood Primary Schools, if they attended Kinlock Primary School in 1975.

- 6. Phoenix Primary School:
 - - Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 5 inclusive in 1976 and living in the boundary part of Rockingham Road (west side only) and west thereof shall attend the Phoenix Primary School.
- 7. South Newman Primary School:
 - - From Great Northern Highway, west and northwest along Fortescue Avenue to Newman Drive, and southwest along Newman Drive.
 - Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive and living in the boundary streets of Fortescue Avenue and the boundary part of Newman Drive (south side only in both cases) and south thereof shall attend the South Newman Primary School.
- 8. South Thornlie Primary School:
 - The boundary for the above school is as follows:— Berehaven Avenue from the junction with Murdoch Road, northeast along Berehaven Avenue to Spencer Road, southeast along Spencer Road to Warton Road, southwest along Warton Road to Bullfinch Street.
 - The boundary parts of Spencer Road (west side only) and Warton Road (west side only) are included in the area for the South Thornlie Primary School. The boundary street of Berehaven Avenue (both sides) is excluded from the area for the South Thornlie Primary School.
 - Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1976 and living within the area for the South Thornlie Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the South Thornlie Primary School, except that children from the above defined area who were in Year 6 at Thornlie Primary School in 1975 may remain at the present (1975) school or may transfer to the South Thornlie Primary School at the beginning of the 1976 school year.
- 9. South Willetton Primary School:
 - The boundary for the above school is as follows:— Collins Road from the junction with Riley Road, west northwest and west along Collins Road and its extension west of Lincoln Avenue to Salmon Gum Rise, south along Salmon Gum Rise to Paperbark Drive, west along Paperbark Drive to Pinetree Gully Road, north along Pinetree Gully Road to Albatross Pass, west along Albatross Pass to Burren Gate, north along Burren Gate to Wren Close, southwest along Wren Close and its continuation to The Taffrail, west along The Taffrail to The Quarterdeck, north and west along The Quarterdeck to The Escarpment and continuing west to Karel Avenue, south along South Street to the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway, northeast along the Roe Freeway to Riley Road, and north along Riley Road to the junction with Collins Road.
 - The boundary parts of Collins Road, Pinetree Gully Road, Burren Gate, The Quarterdeck (both sides in each case), and Karel Avenue (east side only), South Street (north side only), the Roe Freeway (west side only), and Riley Road (west side only), and the boundary streets of Paperbark Drive, Albatross Pass and The Taffrail (both sides in each case) are included in the area for the South Willetton Primary

School. The boundary part of Salmon Gum Rise and the boundary street of Wren Close (both sides in each case) are excluded from the area for the South Willetton Primary School.

- Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1976 and living within the area for the South Willetton Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the South Willetton Primary School.
- 10. Wembley Downs Primary School:
 - The boundary for the above school is as follows:-From the Indian Ocean east along the extension of Ventnor Street west of West Coast Highway and along Venthor Street to Corbett Street, south along Corbett Street to Sonia Street, south along Sonia Street to Weaponess Road, south along Weaponess Road to Doric Street, east along Doric Street to Cornelian Street, south along Cornelian Street to Bower Street, east along Bower Street to Shearn Crescent, southeast along Shearn Crescent to Queenscliffe Road, south along Queenscliffe Road to Williamstown Road, southwest from the junction of Queenscliffe Road and Williamstown Road to the northern point of the northsouth alignment of Unwin Avenue, south and southeast along Unwin Avenue to Maisie Crescent, southwest, west and northwest along Maisie Crescent to Glenelg Avenue southwest along Glenelg Avenue to Brix Street, northwest along Brix Street to Quorn Street, southwest along Quorn Street to Weaponess Road and from Weaponess Road west along Ken Street to Buxton Road, north along Buxton Road to Tandarra Place, in a generally westerly direction along Tandarra Place to Brompton Road, north along Brompton Road to Hale Road, and west along Hale Road and its extension to the Indian Ocean.
 - The boundary streets of Ventnor Street, Sonia Street, Doric Street and Bower Street (both sides in all cases), and the boundary parts of Weaponess Road, Cornelian Street and Unwin Avenue (both sides in all cases) and Hale Road (north side only) are included in the area for the Wembley Downs Primary School. The boundary streets of Tandarra Place, Ken Street and Quorn Street (both sides in each case), and the boundary parts of Brompton Road, Buxton Road, Brix Street, Glenelg Avenue, Maisie Crescent, Queenscliffe Road, Shearn Crescent and Corbett Street (both sides in each case) are excluded from the area for Wembley Downs Primary School.
 - Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive and living within the boundary for the Wembley Downs Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Wembley Downs Primary School.
