- (4) Each man shall be provided with a heavy fire rake and each three men with at least one knapsack spray with sufficient water for its operation.

4.1.2 The average lot size shall be 1800 square metres, and the minimum lot size shall be 1 600 square metres.

4.1.3 The average frontage of lots shall be 40 metres and the minimum lot frontage shall be 30 metres.

4.1.4 (a) No building shall be erected within 15 metres of a public right of way nor within 5 metres of a side boundary provided that Council may at its discretion vary such mini-mum by no more than 30% of the stated minimum distances.

4.7 (c) Each dwelling unit shall have an approved incinerator.

PART V.-FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

5.1 Owners Association:

5.1.1 (a) For the purposes of assisting the Council in the administration of the Scheme, the owners of land within the Scheme Area shall form and be financial members of an Owners Association with a constitution ap-proved by the Council dealing with but not limited to the specific matters referred to in the Scheme the Scheme.

the Scheme. 5.1.1 (b) All land owners within the Scheme Area shall jointly and severally agree with the Council by virtue of this Scheme that in the event of any transfer of land within the Scheme Area the transferee shall be supplied by the transferor with copies of the Scheme Text and the Constitution of the Owners As-sociation such that the transferee will be aware of his rights and obligations under the Scheme. of his rights and obligations under the Scheme.


