WHEREAS by paragraphs (c) and (d) of section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1974, it is provided that where the Commissioner is of the opinion that a proclamation made pursuant to section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1974, should be varied or cancelled he shall make a recommendation to the Governor accordingly and that if of the opinion that the recommendation should be given effect the Governor may by subsequent proclamation vary or cancel a former proclamation; and whereas the Commissioner is of the opinion that a proclamation made pursuant to Section 28A of the said Act should be varied as hereinafter described and has made recommendation to the Governor accordingly; and whereas, I, the Governor of the said State am of the opinion that such recommendation should be given effect: now, therefore, I, the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do proclaim that the land shown stippled on Plan M.R.D.W.A. 7521-260, Roe Freeway (Harvey Road to Riversdale Road Section), shall cease to be Controlled Access Road.

**THE Scheme Text of the above Town Planning
Scheme is amended as follows:—**

1. Inserting after the definition "plot ratio" in Clause 1.9 the following new definition:—

"plumbing fittings" means all pipes, meters or other apparatus used for or in connection with the supply of gas and water and all pipes, cisterns, traps, syphons, vent pipes and all other apparatus connected with the working of any sewerage drain.

2. Deleting the word "development" in the second line of Clause 3.5 (h) and substituting therefor the word "subdivision".

3. Adding after Clause 3.14 the following new clause:—

3.15 Land in any Zone may be used for the keeping of pets provided that:

- (a) Greyhound dogs shall not be kept on any land without the written consent of the Council which consent shall not be given unless the Council is satisfied that the same are not to be used for the purposes of sale or for breeding for the purposes of sale or for or in connection with racing purposes and the Council may at any time revoke such consent if and whenever it is no longer so satisfied.
- (b) No more than two dogs shall in any case be kept on any land unless the number of dogs in excess of two are all under the age of three months.
- (c) Horses, cattle, sheep, goats, donkeys and camels shall not be kept on any land.
- (d) Other animals or birds shall not be kept on any land for the purposes of sale or for breeding for the purposes of sale.

4. Inserting after the word "Zone" in the second line of Clause 5.1 (ga) the passage "Quadruplex Residential QR.5 Zone and Quadruplex Residential QR.6 Zone".

5. Adding after Clause 5.8A a new clause as follows:—

5.8B Storage Facilities for Certain Residential Buildings:—Every dwelling unit in a residential flat building which

unit is provided with a courtyard reserved solely for use by the occupants of that unit and every dwelling unit in a triplex house or quadruplex house and every patio, row and town house shall be provided with storeroom, storeroom or store closet facilities for the storage of gardening equipment and general storage purposes and every such facility shall have an area of not less than three (3) square metres, a minimum depth of one (1) metre and a minimum height from floor level to the underside of the roof covering or ceiling of one point eight (1.8) metres. Every such facility shall have walls constructed of materials similar to those used in the construction of the building to which they are appurtenant unless other materials are approved by the Council. No such facility shall be located wholly within the building to which it is appurtenant unless such facility has a door in an external wall or unless entry can be gained through a laundry which also has a door in an external wall. Notwithstanding the provisions of Tables 3, 4, 5, 5-A, 6, 7, and 8 every such facility whether attached to or detached from a unit or house may be erected not closer than one (1) metre to any side or rear boundary but if the rear boundary of the lot does not form a side boundary to an adjoining lot the Council may in its discretion permit such facility to be erected on the rear boundary.

6. Adding at the foot of Table No. 11 the following additional words:—

Parking requirements for any other uses not specified are to be determined by Council in each particular case.

7. Deleting the words "Commercial B Zone" in the twelfth line of the third column of Table No. 12 and substituting therefor the words "Commercial A Zone".

8. Deleting paragraph (a) of Clause 5.36 and substituting therefor the following:—

5.36 (a) A fence, free standing wall or hedge shall not be erected, grown or maintained to a height exceeding one point eight (1.8) metres above ground level without the approval of the Council and the Council shall not give its approval unless it is satisfied that such fence, wall or hedge will not adversely affect the amenities of other properties in the locality and will not clash in harmony with the exterior designs of buildings in the locality.

DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT, 1973.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, in accordance with the provisions of the Dairy Industry Act, 1973, the Dairy Industry Authority of Western Australia has fixed the undermentioned prices for market milk and rates for transport and treatment of market milk, other than market milk for the production of cream; and determined the undermentioned premiums, penalties and differential rates of payment to apply to prices for market milk; according to its solids-not-fat content as determined hydro-metrically in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; or, according to its milk fat content as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; or, where it has been found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia to contain an anti-biotic or to contain added water; to be effective in the undermentioned dairy areas and districts as from February 1, 1976:

(d) EASTERN GOLDFIELDS DAIRY AREA—

Towns of Boulder and Kalgoorlie, Shires of Coolgardie and Kalgoorlie.

It is further determined that, where the undermentioned prices for market milk and rates for transport of market milk apply—
market milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority IN CANS is accepted by the Authority at the dairy produce factory of the Authority's authorised agent;

market milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority INTO A BULK TANKER is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises;

market milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority;
