Local Government Act, 1960-1975. ORDER IN COUNCIL Town of Cockburn,

C.C.-1-8.

WHEREAS the Town of Cockburn is constituted as a municipality under the Local Government Act, 1960-1975; and whereas by Order made under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, and published in the Government Gazette on the 17th July, 1936, the district of the said Town was divided into four wards; and whereas the number of offices of member for each of the said wards was declared by Orders med and wards the third wards was declared by Orders made under that Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 17th July, 1936 and the 4th February, 1955: Now, therefore, His and the 4th February, 1955: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 12, paragraph (c) of subsection 1 of section 10 and subsection (1) of section 20 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1975, doth hereby—

- (a) abolish the wards existing in the district of the Town of Cockburn;
- (b) create the five new wards in the said district designated as West Ward, North Ward, Central Ward, East Ward and Ward, Centr South Ward;
- (c) describe the boundaries of the said wards in the manner set forth in the schedule to this Order:
- (d) determine that the number of offices of councillor for each of the respective wards shall be as follows:-

West Ward-3 North Ward—3 Central Ward—3 East Ward—2 South Ward-2;

(e) direct that all present members holding the office of councillor for the existing wards, other than the members holding the office of councillor for the South Ward, shall go out of office on the 22nd May, 1976.

- (f) direct the holding on the 22nd May, 1976, of an election of members to the respective offices of councillor for West Ward, North Ward, Central Ward and East Ward:
- (g) direct that the existing members holding the office of councillor for South Ward shall continue to hold office until the expiration of their present terms as members for South Ward as created by this Order;
- (h) direct that this Order shall take effect on and from the 22nd May, 1976.

### Town of Cockburn.

Description of Boundaries of West Ward:

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of a present western boundary of the Town of Cockburn with the prolongation westerly of the centre of Ocean Road and extending easterly to and along that centre line and onward to the centre line of Hamilton Road; thence southerly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Mell Road; thence easterly to and generally easterly along that centre line to the centre line of Sussex Street; thence northerly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line Rigby Avenue; thence easterly to and along that centre line and onward to the centre line of Rockingham Road; thence southerly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Newton Street; thence easterly to and along that centre line to the centre line of the Fremantle-Mandurah-Pinjarra Controlled Access; thence generally northerly along that centre line to a northern side of Winterfold Road, a point on a present northern boundary of the Town of Cockburn aforesaid and thence generally westerly and generally southerly along boundaries of that town to the starting point. Including Rottnest, Carnac and other islands adjacent and excluding Garden Island. (Lands and Surveys Public Plans: Perth 2000 08.11, Perth 2000 09.11, F78-4, 88-4, F89-4, F90-4, F105-4, F106-4, F121-4).

### Description of Boundaries of Central Ward:

  - "regulation" means a regulation made under the Act;
  - "section" means a section of the Act;
  - "the Act" means the Noise Abatement Act, 1972.

3. For the purposes of section 34 inspectors may be appointed as—  $\,$ 

State Inspectors. Local Inspectors.

Examina-

4. The examinations pursuant to section 34 of the Act for appointment as an inspector shall test the candidate's knowledge of the physical and biological aspects of noise and the measurement and control of noise and the candidate shall satisfy standards in these subjects as determined by the Council together with a knowledge of the Act and regulations.

Duties of Inspectors.

- 5. (1) Subject to the Act and these regulations, it is the duty of a State Inspector to enforce the provisions of the Act and regulations throughout the State, and in relation to a nuisance from any source.
- (2) Subject to the Act and these regulations, it is the duty of a Local Inspector to enforce the provisions of the Act and regulations only in relation to any source of nuisance causing annoyance to an occupier of a residential plot within the boundary of the district to which he is appointed.

6. For the purposes of carrying out his duties under the Act and these regulations an inspector shall use only such instruments as are approved by the Council or the Commissioner.

Road Traffic (Vehicle Weights) Regulations, 1975.

- I, RAYMOND JAMES O'CONNOR, Minister for Traffic, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Act, 1974, and above cited regulations do hereby direct:-
- 1. The directions relating to the licensing of certain vehicles as of Class B and C appearing on page 4171 of the *Government Gazette* of the 9th November, 1973, are hereby rescinded.
- 2. The Road Traffic Authority may issue licenses of Classes B and C, in accordance with the following directions, subject to the conditions of movements, purpose of use of the vehicle, requisite signs and warning devices being endorsed on the license documents as specified in the direction.
  - 2.1 In this Direction—
    - "Warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square;
    - means a sign bearing the words "OVERWIDTH" "OVERLENGTH" or both as the case may require, in black lettering, 200 millimetres in height on a yellow background.
- 3. Fire Fighting vehicles:—Licenses of Class B may be issued for any vehicle that is owned by a person engaged in the business of farming or grazing and that is fitted and used solely for the purpose of fire fighting or fire prevention, or its movement to the nearest practicable place for repair, without the payment of a licence fee but subject to such other charges as are prescribed

- 4. Class "B" vehicles:—Licenses of Class "B" may be issued where a vehicle—
  - 4.1 is not equipped with lights in conformity with the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1975, provided its use is restricted to the hours between sunrise and sunset.
  - 4.2 is a tractor or self-propelled agriculture implement not exceeding 8.5 metres in width which is used only in agricultural or pastoral pursuits within such areas as the Road Traffic Authority may direct and subject to the following conditions—
    - 4.2.1 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3 metres a warning flag is to be affixed at each lateral extremity;
    - 4.2.2 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 3 metres but not 4.9 metres a warning flag is to be affixed to each lateral extremity and a warning sign indicating the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle;
    - 4.2.3 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 4.9 metres but not 8.5 metres, a warning flag is to be affixed at each lateral extremity, a warning sign that the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and to the rear of a vehicle, the vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it and the vehicle is to be followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign that an overwidth vehicle is ahead of it;
    - 4.2.4 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 3 metres it is not to be driven within 32 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, unless the Commissioner of Main Roads has approved in writing and that movement is made between sunrise and sunset only;
  - 4.3 is a tractor or tractor plant other than a tracked vehicle and not exceeding 3 metres in width or 12.2 metres in length subject to the following conditions—
    - 4.3.1 where the length of the vehicle exceeds 11 metres but not 12.2 metres, or its width exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3 metres a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overlength, overwidth or both, as the case may be, is to be affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle;
    - 4.3.2 where the vehicle is a mobile crane a warning flag is to be attached to the hook which is to be secured and if the length exceeds 11 metres or width exceeds 2.5 metres its use is confined to the hours between sunrise and sunset;
    - 4.3.3 irrespective of the number of tyres per axle the tyre-axle loadings and tyre inflation pressures do not exceed the following—

  - 4.3.4 the transverse distance (track) between centres of the two tyres is not less than 1.2 metres;
  - 4.3.5 the longitudinal distance between the centres of any two axles is not less than 1.2 metres;
  - 4.3.6 where the longitudinal distance between the centres of extreme axles of a group or two or more consecutive axles is less than 2.4 metres, the total load carried by those axles does not exceed 13 208 kilograms;
  - 4.3.7 the vehicle travels unladen at all times except when operating within the confines of a road construction activity and is directed by the Road Construction Authority.
- 5. Class "C" vehicles: Motor vehicles of a dimension, weight or axle loading exceeding those set out in Clause 4 of this direction may be licensed as of Class "C" only with my special approval.

Movement of Agricultural Implements.

I, REGINALD JAMES COURT, Chairman of the Road Traffic Authority acting pursuant to Regulation 1101 (6) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1975, do hereby rescind the order published in the Government Gazette of 4th January, 1975 and direct that the movement of agricultural or horticultural implements exceeding 2.5 metres in width or 16.8 metres in length may be made during the hours between surrise and sunset subject to the following conditions:—

- 1.0 Main Roads and Important Secondary Roads shown in the schedule hereto—
  - 1.1 The movement is authorised by a permit issued under Regulation 1101 (6) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations by an officer of the Authority, Traffic Inspector or a Patrolman.
  - 1.2 The movement is made in accordance with the general directions of this order and such special conditions relating to time, place or circumstance as may be endorsed on the permit by the issuing officer.
  - 1.3 The permit must be carried in the towing vehicle at all times.
- 2.0 Roads other than those shown in the schedule hereto-
  - 2.1 The movement is authorised by virtue of this direction alone.
  - 2.2 The movement is made in accordance with the general directions of this order.

#### 3.0 Overwidth-

- 3.1 Exceeding 8.5 metres-
  - 3.1.1 The movement of agricultural implements exceeding 8.5 metres in width is not permitted without the special approval of the Chief Executive Officer.
- 3.2 Exceeding 4.9 metres but not exceeding 8.5 metres.
  - 3.2.1 The towing vehicle is to be a tractor.
  - 3.2.2 Warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement.
  - 3.2.3 Warning signs indicating that the implement is overwidth is to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement.
  - 3.2.4 The towing vehicle and implement is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign that an overwidth vehicle follows.
- 3.3 Exceeding 3 metres but not exceeding 4.9 metres.
  - 3.3.1 The towing vehicle is to be a tractor.
  - 3.3.2 Warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement.
  - 3.3.3 Warning signs indicating the implement is overwidth are to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement.
- 3.4 Exceeding 2.5 metres but not exceeding 3.0 metres.
  - 3.4.1 The weight of the implement is not to exceed the laden weight of the towing vehicle.
  - 3.4.2 Warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement.

### 4.0 Overlength-

- 4.1 The movement of agricultural implements with the combined length of the implement and towing vehicle exceeding 22 metres in length is not permitted without the special approval of the Chief Executive Officer.
- 4.2 Exceeding 16.8 metres but not exceeding 22 metres.
  - 4.2.1 The towing vehicle is to be a tractor if the implement exceeds 3.0 metres in width.
  - 4.2.2 The weight of the implement is not to exceed the towing vehicle (other than a tractor) if the width of the implement exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3.0 metres.
  - 4.2.3 Warning signs indicating the combined implement and towing vehicle is overlength are to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement.


### 5.0 General-

- 5.1 In this direction:—
  - 5.1.1 "Warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square.

- 5.1.2 "Warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "Overwidth" or "overlength" or a combination of these words as may be required in black lettering 200 millimetres in height on a yellow background.
- 5.1.3 Warning signs are to be covered or removed on completion of the movement.
- 5.2 The implement or towing vehicle is not to be parked on the main portion of a road.
- 5.3 The movement is to be made at a speed not exceeding 35 km/h.
- 5.4 A movement of an implement exceeding 3 metres in width or of a combined implement and towing vehicle exceeding 16.8 metres is not to be made within 32 kilometres of the General Post Office Perth without the approval in writing of the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority.
- 5.5 Permits, for which no fee is payable, may be issued for a single movement or a number of movements or for a period not exceeding twelve months.
- 5.6 Additional limitations relating to time, place and circumstance may be imposed by a Patrolman, Traffic Inspector or an Officer of the Authority.

Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations, 1975.

- I, DONALD HECTOR AITKEN, Commissioner of Main Roads, acting pursuant to Regulation 12 of the Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations 1975 do hereby rescind Direction No. 1 issued under the Traffic Act 1919-1972 and published in the *Government Gazette* of 26th October, 1973, and give the following direction:
  - 1. In this Direction—

"warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square;

- "warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "OVERWIDTH", "OVER-LENGTH", "OVERHEIGHT" or any combination of those words, as the case may require, in black lettering, 200 millimetres in height, on a yellow background.
- 2. A limitation imposed by this direction does not affect the power of a Patrolman to impose additional limitations relating to time, place or circumstance.
- 3. A patrolman, or other officer of the Road Traffic Authority approved by me may, subject to the Traffic (Vehicle Weights) Regulations, 1975 issue permits for the carrying of indivisible loads that will occasion any or all of the dimensions of a vehicle or combination of vehicles, to exceed those, or that project for a greater distance than that, prescribed by the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1975 where—
  - (a) the overall length of vehicle or combination of vehicles and load does not exceed 22 metres or the overall width does not exceed 3.1 metres, subject to the following conditions, namely—
    - (i) the transporting vehicle is to have a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overwidth, overlength, overheight or any combination of those things, as the case may require, affixed to the front and rear;
    - (ii) warning flags are to be placed at the points of greatest extension of the load or of the vehicle and load;
    - (iii) the vehicle is not to travel during the hours of darkness;
    - (iv) the warning signs provided by this paragraph are to be removed or covered when the movement of the load has been completed;
    - (v) the permit is to be carried on the transporting vehicle; and
    - (vi) the permit is liable to immediate cancellation on the infringement of any condition to which its issue is subject;
  - (b) the width exceeds 3.1 metres but not 4.3 metres, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely—
    - (i) the transporting vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it; and
    - (ii) the headlights of the transporting vehicle and pilot vehicle are to be kept burning in the dipped position, until the movement of the load is completed;
  - (c) the height exceeds 4.3 metres but not 4.9 metres, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely—
    - (i) the movement is to be made in conformity with the requirements of the State Energy Commission;
    - (ii) approval for the movement of the load is to be obtained from the Australian Postal Commission; and
    - (iii) when required by the State Energy Commission or the Australian Postal Commission under conditions (i) and (ii) the transporting vehicle is to be escorted by a Patrolman.
- 4. Permits shall not be issued for the carrying of loads that exceed the maximum dimensions, or that project for a greater distance than that mentioned in clause 3 of this direction, without the specific approval of the Commissioner of Main Roads, in each case.

### NICKOL BAY PRAWN FISHERY.

I, PETER VERNON JONES, Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, acting pursuant to the powers conferred on me by the Fisheries Act, 1905, and in particular by sections 32 and 17 of that Act, do hereby declare that the provisions and conditions specified in the Schedule below apply to and in respect of the Nickol Bay Prawn Fishery and in relation to persons and boats authorised to operate in the Fishery.

### Schedule.

- 1. All species of prawn constitute a limited entry fishery in the waters of the Indian Ocean and Nickol Bay below high water mark lying between latitudes 20 degrees 25 minutes south and 20 degrees 45 minutes south, and between longitudes 116 degrees 45 minutes east and 117 degrees 45 minutes east.
- 2. For management purposes the waters comprised in the Nickol Bay Prawn Fishery shall be divided into the Zones following:—
  - Zone A—The waters of the Indian Ocean and Nickol Bay below high water mark lying between latitudes 20 degrees 25 minutes south and 20 degrees 45 minutes south, and between longitudes 116 degrees 45 minutes east and 117 degrees 05 minutes east.
  - Zone B—The waters of the Indian Ocean and Nickol Bay below high water mark lying between latitudes 20 degrees 25 minutes south and 20 degrees 45 minutes south, and between longitudes 117 degrees 05 minutes east and 117 degrees 45 minutes east.
  - 3. In this notice, unless the contrary intention appears-
    - (a) the provisions of section 26 of the Interpretation Act, 1918, apply as they apply to an Act:
    - (b) the expressions used have the same respective meanings as are given to them by the Act and the regulations;
    - (c) a reference to "the Act" is a reference to the Fisheries Act, 1905, as from time to time amended, and a reference to "the regulations" is a reference to the regulations for the time being in force under the Act;
    - (d) "length" means length as determined in relation to a fishing boat under the Western Australian Marine Act regulations relating to survey and equipment;
    - (e) "the Fishery" means the Nickol Bay Prawn Fishery.
    - (f) "zone" means a licensing zone as defined in clause 2 of this notice.
- 4. (1) Except with the written permission of the Director, no person shall take or attempt to take for sale or disposal for gain or reward any species of prawn in the waters comprised in the Fishery unless—
  - (a) the prawns are taken from a boat authorised to operate in the Fishery pursuant to this notice; and
  - (b) the prawns taken are taken in accordance with the manner authorised by this notice.
- (2) No person shall sell or deal in any species of prawn taken in contravention of the provisions of this notice.
- 5. (1) An authorisation to operate a boat in the Fishery shall be given by the Director, or by a licensing officer on behalf of the Director, in the form annexed to this notice and the relevant license shall be endorsed with the number and date of the authorisation.
- (2) An authorisation to operate a boat in the Fishery may be made subject to any condition, restriction or limitation relating to the authorisation specified or referred to therein by reference to seasons, zones and equipment that may be used, or otherwise.
- (3) An authorisation to operate a boat in the Fishery is an authorisation to take prawns only by means of two trawl nets and one try-net at one and the same time and where a try-net is used the head-line of the try-net shall not exceed 5 metres,

- (4) For the purposes of any prosecution under the Act, any condition, restriction or limitation, by whatever name described, specified or referred to by an authorisation shall be construed as a condition imposed upon the license to which the authorisation relates.
- 6. A boat other than a boat authorised to operate in the Fishery may take fish other than prawns in the Fishery provided that it does not use or carry on board a trawl net with a mesh size that is less than 100 millimetres.
- 7. (1) An application for authorisation to operate a boat in the Fishery shall be made by the owner of the boat to the Director in writing in the form annexed to this notice not later than the 15th November in each year.
- (2) An authorisation, unless sooner cancelled or suspended, has effect for the period therein specified.
- (3) If an authorised boat is sold or leased during the period specified on the authorisation for that boat the authorisation for that boat to operate in the Fishery is cancelled.
- (4) The fees prescribed by the regulations shall be paid in relation to each application and to any authorisation granted pursuant to this notice.
- (5) Any authorisation may be varied from time to time by the Director, or by a licensing officer on behalf of the Director, and may be cancelled or from time to time suspended by the Director by notice in writing to the holder of the license.
- (6) Where the Director, in writing, gives to the holder of a relevant license any specific authorisation to operate a boat in the Fishery other than in the form annexed to this notice the operation of any boat carried out in accordance with that authorisation shall be deemed not to contravene the provisions of this notice.
- 8. An authorisation to operate a boat in the Fishery does not permit a person to operate a boat in Zone A during the period commencing on the 1st January in any year and ending on such date as is fixed by the Director after consultations on the potential of the Fishery with the persons who are authorised to operate boats in the Fishery and the persons who are authorised to operate the processing establishments at which the fish taken pursuant to this notice are processed.
- 9. The criteria that will be applied to determine whether a boat may be authorised to operate in the Fishery are—

    - (c) if the other processing establishment referred to in paragraph (b) is not able to take delivery of the prawns so offered within ten hours of the boat being moored, the owner of the boat shall take all practical steps to distribute the prawns to another market.

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1975; DOG ACT, 1903-1972.

The Municipality of the Shire of Kulin.

By-Laws Relating to the Control of Dogs.

#### L.G. KU-7-11.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 17th day of September, 1975, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

### Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-Laws the term "Council" means the Council of the  $\operatorname{Shire}$  of  $\operatorname{Kulin}$ .
  - 2. All previous By-Laws relating to dogs are hereby revoked.

### PART I.-IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

- 3. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act 1903 as amended.
- 4. A dog seized by a Police Officer or an Officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.
- 5. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other employees authorised by the Council shall if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
- 6. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
- 7. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.
- 8. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or employee may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of the dog if made in good faith.
- 9. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of 1t being impounded or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council may sell the dog or have it destroyed. Any costs incurred by the Council in seizing or disposing of the dog shall be recovered by the Council from the owner.
- 10. Upon the sale of the dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.

- 11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the said Dog Act 1903 as amended any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authorisation of the Shire Clerk of the Council if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from any injury disease or sickness.
- 12. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto.
  - 13. No person shall-
    - (a) unless a pound keeper or other employee of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
    - (b) destroy break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
    - (c) destroy break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.
- 14. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1903 as amended or by the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions or by these By-Laws.
- 15. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure care detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of his liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these By-Laws.
- 16. Any person who shall commit a breach of these By-Laws 3-15 (both inclusive) shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00).

#### PART II.—GENERAL.

- 17. No person shall permit a dog to wander at large but shall keep such dog chained or under effective control at all times.
- 18. Subject to the provisions of Section 21A (3) of the Dog Act 1903, the owner of a dog or person responsible for its keeping shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
  - (a) A public building.
  - (b) A theatre, or drive-in theatre.
  - (c) A house of worship.
  - (d) A shop or other building used by the public.
- 19. Subject to the provisions of section 21A (3) of the Dog Act, 1903, the owner of a dog or persons responsible for its keeping shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—
  - (a) A sportsground.
  - (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
  - (c) A car park.
  - (d) Any land vested in or under the control of the Council including a road or street.
  - (e) A school.
- 20. The occupier of any premises where a dog is kept or permitted or suffered to remain shall not allow such dog by continuous barking or physical trespassing to be nuisance to any inhabitant or inhabitants in the neighbourhood.
- 21. No person shall keep a dog on any premises so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.
- 22. Any person who shall commit a breach of any By-Law 17-21 (both inclusive) shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00).
- 23. Any person who shall commit a breach of By-Law 20 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100 and in the case of a continuing breach not exceeding \$4 for each day that the breach is committed.

By-laws Relating to Hawkers and Stallholders.

#### L.G. R-7-14.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 1st September, 1975 to revoke the by-laws for the control of Hawkers as published in the Government Gazette on 6th October, 1960, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

- 1. In these by-laws, the terms "hawker", "stall" and "stallholder" shall have the meanings assigned to them by sections 217 and 242 of the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended). These definitions are as follows:—
  - "haweker" means a hawker, pedlar or other person who, with or without any horse or other beast bearing or drawing burden, travels and trades and goes from town to town or to other men's houses or is in any street there soliciting orders for or carrying to sell or exposing for sale any goods, wares or merchandise, but does not include—
    - (a) commercial travellers or other persons selling or seeking orders for goods, wares or merchandise to or from persons who are dealers therein, or selling or seeking orders for books or newspapers.
    - (b) sellers of vegetables, fish, fruit, newspapers, brooms, matches, game, poultry, butter, eggs, milk or any victuals;
    - (c) persons selling or exposing for sale goods, wares or merchandise in any public market or fair lawfully established, or upon any racecourse, agricultural showground, or public recreation ground;
    - (d) sellers of goods of their own manufacture;
    - (e) persons representing a manufacturer whose goods are sold direct to consumers only and not through the medium of a shop.
  - "stall" means a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services;
  - "stallholder" means a person in charge of a stall.
- 2. Any person who desires to hawk any goods, wares or merchandise, or to be a stallholder within the District, shall make application in writing to the Council for a licence so to do.
- 3. The Council shall not entertain any application for a Hawker's licence (other than an application for a licence by way of renewal of a licence) unless the applicant produces a certificate signed by two Justices of the Peace certifying that the person sought to be licensed is of good character and reputation and is a fit person to exercise the trade of a hawker.
- 4. The Council may grant a licence to the applicant: or the Council may refuse to grant the licence on any of the following grounds:—
  - (a) that the applicant has committed a breach of any of these by-laws;
  - (b) that the applicant is not of good character or has been convicted of a criminal offence;
  - (c) that the needs of the District or the portion thereof for which the licence is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have been issued;
  - (d) that the stall is untidy, in disrepair or of insufficiently sound construction for use as a stall;
  - (e) that the stall or the customers thereof will cause an obstruction to pedestrians or vehicular traffic;
  - (f) that the stall will adversely affect the amenities of the area;
  - (g) that inadequate parking space is available to the customers of the stall.
- 5. The licence granted to a hawker by the Council may be in respect of the whole District, or for any portion of the District specified in the licence. The licence may only be granted upon the condition that the licensee shall not carry on business within one kilometre of any shop which sells commodities similar to those to be sold by the licensee.
- 6. The licence to a stallholder shall describe the things or services which are authorised by the licence to be sold at the stall and the place at which the stall is authorised to be set up and conducted.
- 7. A licence granted by the Council shall remain valid until the 31st day of December next after the issue of the licence or until the expiry date specified in the licence, unless previously revoked.

8. The fees set out hereunder shall be payable to the Council in respect of each licence—  $\,$ 

Hawker's Licence, for one year or part thereof—\$20.00. Stallholder's Licence, for one year or part thereof—\$40.00.

- 9. The Council may revoke any licence issued by it on any of the grounds set out in By-law 4 hereof, or on the grounds—
  - (a) that the licensee has committeed a breach of the terms or conditions of the licence;
  - (b) that the licensee is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
  - (c) that he has assigned his licence or does not himself carry on the business; or
  - (d) that he is not regularly carrying on the business for which the licence was granted; or
  - (e) that the stall does not comply with these by-laws.
- 10. No person shall hawk goods, wares or merchandise or act as a stall-holder—
  - (a) without being licensed by the Council;
  - (b) in any part of the District other than that specified in the licence;
  - (c) in respect of commodities of a type description or place of origin not authorised by the licence; or
  - (d) otherwise than in accordance with any conditions imposed by the Council when granting the licence.
- 11. No stallholder shall have a stall in any place other than that specified in the licence.
  - 12. No hawker or stallholder shall-
    - (a) sell or offer for sale any commodity excepting between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11.30 p.m.;
    - (b) deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle or on the roadway or footpath;
    - (c) shout his wares or make any violent outcry, noise or disturbance;
    - (d) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway; or
    - (e) act in an offensive manner.
- 13. No person shall conduct a stall in such a manner that the stall or the customers cause an obstruction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
- 14. The person to whom a stallholders licence is issued shall maintain the stall in good order and condition.
- 15. No person shall conduct a stall on private property being land whether freehold or leasehold land of any tenure whether occupied or not unless there is adequate provision on the private property adjacent to the stall for the parking of customers' vehicles.
- 16. A hawker or stallholder shall carry his licence and badge with him and produce it upon demand to any employee of the Council or to a member of the Police Force.
- 17. A stallholder shall have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.
- 18. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these By-laws or who shall be guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws shall be liable to—
  - (a) a maximum penalty of \$200.00; and
  - (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20.00 per day; and
  - (c) a minimum penalty of one-tenth of the maximum penalty and of one-tenth of the maximum daily penalty for the breach.

1. These regulations may be cited as The Grain Pool of W.A. (Elections) regulations, 1976.

Application of Electoral Act.

2. The provisions of the Electoral Act, 1907 as amended, and the regulations made thereunder shall apply in so far as they can, with any necessary adaptations, be made applicable to all matters, relating to the election of an elective Director of The Grain Pool of W.A., that are not provided for in these regulations.

Interpre-tation.

- 3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears-"the Act" means the Grain Marketing Act, 1975;
  - "Board" means the Board of Directors of The Grain Pool of W.A. established under the Act;
  - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board;
  - "Director" means a Director of The Grain Pool of W.A.;
  - "election" means an election of an elective Director;
  - "elector" in relation to an electoral zone means a prescribed producer within the meaning of these regulations or the authorized representative thereof, as the case requires, whose name appears on the electoral roll for that electoral zone:
  - "electoral roll" means the roll of prescribed producers for an electoral zone referred to in regulation 11;
  - "electoral zone" means one of the zones set out in the Second Schedule to the Act;
  - "form" means a form in the Schedule to these regulations;
  - "grain" means the seed of any crop or pasture species;
  - "Grain Pool" means The Grain Pool of W.A. established under the Act:
  - "pool" means a pool established under the Act for the marketing of a grain;
  - "regulation" means one of these regulations;
  - "season" means the period between the 1st April in any one year and the 31st March in the next following year;
  - "Secretary" means the Secretary of The Grain Pool of W.A.;
  - "subregulation" means a subregulation of the regulation wherein the term is used.

General

- (1) The returning officer for an election shall be the Chief Electoral Officer for the State or his nominee.
- (2) The returning officer may appoint other officers to assist him in the conduct of an election.
- (3) The Board shall pay the expenses incurred in connection with an election.

returning officer and other

- 5. (1) The returning officer shall be paid thirty per centum of the fees prescribed by regulations made under the Electoral Act, 1907, as amended, for returning officers at parliamentary elections; and the officers employed by him shall, while engaged on the scrutiny and count of votes, be paid for their services the fees prescribed for similar duties by those regulations for presiding officers at parliamentary elections.
- (2) Officers employed by the returning officer in the preparation and distribution of voting material shall be paid at the rate prescribed by regulations made under the Electoral Act, 1907, as amended, for presiding officers engaged on the scrutiny and count of votes.
- (3) Where elections are held for more than one zone on the same date they shall, for the purposes of ascertaining fees and amounts payable pursuant to sub-regulations (1) and (2), be treated as one election.

Notice of first election.

- (1) For the purpose of the first election for each electoral zone the returning officer shall fix a day to be the nomination day and cause a notice in the form of Form 1, to be published in the Government Gazette and in at least three newspapers circulating in the State.
- (2) The day fixed as nomination day shall be not less than fourteen days nor more than thirty days, after the latest of the publications of the notice.

Notice of subsequent elections.

- 7. (1) For the purpose of every subsequent election for each electoral zone the Chairman shall, not less than three months prior to the expiration of the term of the office of the elected Director, and not less than fourteen days after the occurrence of a casual vacancy in the office of elected Director, direct the returning officer to fix a day to be the nomination day and the returning officer shall thereupon fix a nomination day and cause a notice of the day to be published as provided by regulation 6.
- (2) The day fixed as nomination day under this regulation shall be not less than twenty-one days, nor more than forty-five days after the latest of the publications of the notice.

Date of election.

8. Every election day shall be not less than twenty-one days, nor more than forty-five days, after the nomination day and shall be fixed by the returning officer.

Close of poll.

9. When fixing an election day the returning officer shall fix an hour for the closing of the poll at that election.

Lists of prescribed producers.

- 10. (1) For the purpose of the first election for an electoral zone the Board shall, not less than fourteen days before the nomination day for the election, furnish the returning officer with a list that is certified by the Secretary and contains the full names and addresses of persons who are prescribed producers in that electoral zone
- (2) For the purpose of each election for an electoral zone after the first election the Board shall, not less than twenty-one days before the nomination day for the election, furnish the returning officer with a list that is certified by the Secretary and contains the full names and addresses of persons who are prescribed producers in that electoral zone.
- (3) Where a person who is a prescribed producer in an electoral zone and whose name and address is not included in the list furnished in accordance with subregulation (1) or (2) makes an application in the form of Form 2 to the Board not less than seven days before the day fixed for the election in respect of which the list was so furnished, the Board may, forthwith, furnish the returning officer with a further list that is certified in accordance with the subregulation under which the earlier list was furnished and contains that name and address.

Electoral roll.

11. A list furnished in accordance with regulation 10 shall be the roll of prescribed producers for the election for the electoral zone in respect of which that list is so furnished and shall be signed on each page by the returning officer.

Prescribed producers.

- 12. (1) Subject to the other provisions of these regulations, a person is, or the parties to a sharefarming or partnership agreement are, a prescribed producer in relation to an electoral zone if—
  - (a) in the season in which the election is held or in either of the two preceding seasons grain grown in that electoral zone has been delivered by or on behalf of that person, or those parties, to a pool or, in the case of an election in 1976, to any Statutory Marketing Authority under the Acts repealed by the Act;
  - (b) that person is, or those parties are, currently engaged in the production, or cultivation for production, of prescribed grain or an approved grain in that electoral zone; and
  - (c) that person, or those parties, make application to the Board in the form of Form 2 for enrolment on the electoral roll for that electoral zone.
- (2) The parties to a sharefarming or partnership agreement who satisfy the requirements referred to in subregulation (1) constitute one prescribed producer.
- (3) Where any prescribed producer on an electoral roll for an electoral zone are parties to a sharefarming or partnership agreement one of those parties (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled on the electoral roll) may be authorized by the other party or parties thereto to represent the parties to the sharefarming or partnership agreement as an elector, and upon receipt of an application for enrolment in the form of Form 2 from such a representative, not later than seven days before an election for that electoral zone, including an authority in writing evidencing the representative's authority in that behalf under the hand or hands of that other party or those other parties the Board shall, subject to all other requirements of these regulations, enrol that representative on the electoral roll for the election in accordance with his application.
- (4) Where any prescribed producer on the electoral roll for an electoral zone is a corporate body, the Board of Directors or other management authority thereof may authorize any director, trustee, or other member of the board or management authority or its manager, secretary, or other officer (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled on the electoral roll) to represent the corporate body as an elector and, upon receipt of an application for enrolment in the form of Form 2 from such a representative, not later than seven days before an election for that electoral zone, together with a certificate in writing evidencing the representative's authority in that behalf under the hand of the managing director, or the president or chairman of the management authority, of the corporate body, as the case may be, the Board shall, subject to all

other requirements of these regulations being satisfied, enrol that representative on the electoral roll for the election in accordance with his application.

- (5) No person shall be entitled to be enrolled on an electoral roll more than once, or on more than one electoral roll at the same time, whether as an elector in his own right or as the representative of a corporate body or of parties to a sharefarming or partnership agreement or otherwise.
- (6) Where, apart from subregulation (5), a person would be qualified to be enrolled on more than one electoral roll he shall nominate in writing the one on which he wishes to be enrolled and the Board shall enrol him accordingly, and shall not enrol him on another electoral roll within a period of four years thereafter.
- (7) Every authority given under subregulation (3) or (4) shall remain effective for all subsequent elections and electoral rolls until written notice of revocation is sent or delivered to the Board.
- (8) Any authority given under subregulation (3) or (4) may be revoked by notice in writing, under the hand of the person or persons who gave the authority, sent or delivered to the Board, but such a revocation shall not invalidate any vote by the representative person enrolled and voting by virtue of such authority at an election held previously to the revocation.
- (9) Upon receipt of a revocation of authority as mentioned in subregulation (8), the Board shall forthwith remove from the electoral roll the name of the representative whose authority has been so revoked.

Nomination.

- 13. A nomination may be in the form of Form 3, but a nomination is not valid unless it—
  - (a) sets out the full name and address of the candidate and the election for which he is nominated;
  - (b) is signed by two or more electors for the election for which the nomination is made;
  - (c) contains a statement, signed by the candidate, that-
    - (i) he consents to his nomination; and
    - (ii) he is an elector for the election for which the nomination is made; and
  - (d) is addressed to the returning officer and is delivered to him, or forwarded so as to reach him, before the hour of twelve noon on the day fixed for the close of nominations.

Withdrawal of nomina-tion.

14. A candidate may, by notice, signed by him, witnessed by an elector and addressed to, and lodged with, the returning officer before the hour of twelve noon on the nomination day, withdraw his consent to his nomination; and that candidate shall, thereupon, be deemed not to have been nominated.

Unopposed candidates.

15. Where only one candidate has been duly nominated for an election that candidate shall be duly elected.

Ballot.

- 16. (1) Where more than one candidate has been duly nominated for an election, the returning officer shall, as soon as practicable after the close of nominations—
  - (a) cause the full names of the candidates and the day and hour fixed for the close of the poll to be published in the Government Gazette and in at least three newspapers circulating in the State;
  - (b) cause ballot papers and counterfoils to be printed, in accordance, respectively, with Forms 4 and 5, setting out in the ballot papers the full names of the candidates in alphabetical order of their surnames; and
  - (c) send by post, or otherwise, to each elector-
    - (i) one ballot paper, initialled by the returning officer or a person authorized by him in that behalf;
    - (ii) one counterfoil;
    - (iii) one ballot paper envelope; and
    - (iv) one envelope addressed to the returning officer.
- (2) Each ballot paper, counterfoil, ballot paper envelope and addressed envelope, shall be enclosed by the returning officer in a covering envelope which shall be fastened, addressed and forwarded to the person for whom it is intended.

Further pallot papers.

17. If an elector makes, and sends, to the returning officer a statement in writing setting out his full name, correct address and former address (if any) and stating that he has not received a ballot paper or that the ballot paper received by him has been lost or destroyed and that he has not already voted, the returning officer may issue to the elector a ballot paper, counterfoil and envelopes, or a further ballot paper, counterfoil and envelopes, as the case may require.

Voting.

- 18. (1) Voting shall be by means of a preferential ballot and a person, having received a ballot paper and counterfoil and wishing to vote, shall record his vote on the ballot paper, in the manner following—
  - (a) Where there are only two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral, "1", opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.

- (b) Where there are more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral, "1", opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals, "2", "3", and so on (as the case may require) opposite their names, so as to indicate by numerical sequence the order of his preference.
- (2) An elector having marked his ballot paper in the manner prescribed by subregulation (1) shall, thereupon—
  - (a) enclose the ballot paper alone in the envelope marked "ballot paper" and fasten the envelope;
  - (b) complete and sign the counterfoil in the presence of a witness who shall also sign it; and
  - (c) return the ballot paper envelope, containing the ballot paper together with the completed counterfoil to the returning officer, by post or otherwise, in the envelope addressed to the returning officer, so as to be received by him not later than the day and hour fixed by the notice of election for the closing of the poll at that election.

Scrutiny and count.

- 19. (1) The returning officer shall place, and keep, in a locked and sealed ballot box, all envelopes received by him purporting to contain ballot papers, until the close of the poll.
- (2) An envelope containing a ballot paper received after the close of the poll shall not be admitted to the scrutiny.
- (3) As soon as practicable after the hour fixed for the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of any scrutineer appointed under subregulation (4) who is present, proceed with the scrutiny, count the votes received and ascertain and declare the result of the poll.
- (4) Each candidate at an election is entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer who may be present when the envelopes containing ballot papers relating to the election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny and who may remain during the scrutiny.

Informal votes.

- 20. (1) Where the right of a person to vote is not established, or the counterfoil is not signed by the elector and by a witness, the returning officer shall replace the counterfoil and the envelope marked "ballot paper" in the envelope in which they were received, endorse the latter envelope "rejected", and set it aside for safe keeping together with any others that may have been rejected.
  - (2) A ballot paper is informal, if-
    - (a) it does not bear the initials of the returning officer or a person authorized by him to initial ballot papers;
    - (b) the voter has not marked it as prescribed by these regulations; or
    - (c) it is not marked.

Recount.

- 21. (1) At any time before the publication of the result of an election, as prescribed by these regulations, the returning officer may, on the written request of a candidate setting out the reasons for the request, or of his own motion, make a recount of the ballot papers.
- (2) Where the returning officer refuses the request of a candidate to make a recount of ballot papers, the candidate may, prior to the publication of the result of the election, appeal in writing to the Minister to direct a recount and the Minister may allow or dismiss the appeal.
- (3) Where the Minister allows an appeal under this regulation, he shall direct the returning officer to make a recount and the returning officer shall comply with that direction.

Equal votes.

22. Where on any count two or more candidates receive an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall decide, by lot, which of them is defeated.

Disputes.

23. Any dispute arising out of the conduct of an election shall be referred by the returning officer to the Minister and the decision of the Minister in that regard shall be final and conclusive.

Security of ballot papers.

- 24. (1) On completion of the scrutiny and count of votes, the returning officer shall enclose in one packet all ballot papers that were admitted to the count, in another packet all counterfoils relating to those ballot papers and in a third packet all rejected votes; and thereupon seal the several packets and indorse on each of them the date of the election and the description and number of the contents and sign the indorsement.
- (2) The returning officer shall hold the sealed packets referred to in subregulation (1) in his custody together with all other documents used at, or in connection with, an election, for a period of three months after the day of the election when the packets and documents shall be destroyed.

Result of election.

25. The returning officer shall prepare and forward to the Minister and the Board a statement showing the result of each election and the name of the candidate elected, and shall cause the result of the election to be notified in the *Government Gazette* and in at least three newspapers circulating in the State.

False statements prohibited.

26. A person shall not make a false statement in any application to be an elector, or in any nomination or voting paper, in respect of any election that is held, or that is to be held, under these regulations.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.

- (1) All foliage and canes to be sprayed with a solution containing 1 part of 2,4,5-T Ester 80% in 600 parts of water or 4 parts of 2, 4, 5-T Amine 20% in 600 parts of
- (2) Effective cultivation to destroy the plants. You are required to comply with the requirements of this Notice by 1st March, 1976. Dated 9th February, 1976.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Stock Diseases (Regulations) Act, 1968-1974, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

#### Schedule,

#### Regulations.

- In these regulations the Exotic Diseases (Emergency Powers) Regulations published in the Government Gazette on the 24th June, 1970 and amended by a notice so published on the 14th June, 1974, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 14 the following regulations:-
  - 14A. Without limiting the operation of any other provision of these regulations, the Chief Inspector of Stock may, where the existence of rabies has been confirmed impose rules and restrictions on the movement of all animals within a propolal med restrictions on the movements of all animals within a proclaimed Infected Area as follows:
    - Rule 1. The provisions of subregulation (7) of regulation 6 of these regulations shall not apply to an animal which is transported through an Infected Area travelling directly between two places outside an Infected Area provided the animal is not unloaded within the Infected Area from the vehicle or vessel which is carrying it or permitted to come into contact with any other animal within the Infected Area.
    - Rule 2. Subject to rules 3 and 4 of these rules, the owner or person in charge of a dog or cat or any other animal which in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Stock is in denger of being infected with or Stock is in danger of being infected with, or transmitting, rabies and the occupier of the premises at which such animal is normally kept, or at which it may be temporarily staying, shall ensure that that animal-
      - (a) is at all times securely confined within the premises. and does not stray escape therefrom:
      - (b) does not come into contact with any other such animal, other than one with which it is normally in contact on the premises.
    - Rule 3. Notwithstanding the requirements of Rule 2, a dog or cat may-
      - (a) be exercised outside the premises within which it is confined, on condition that, throughout the period of exercise, it is-
        - (i) held securely on a leash by the person in charge of the dog or cat and in no circumstances permitted to run free; and

regulations.

Reg. 14A, 14B, 14C, 14D, 14E and 14F added.

#### SCHEDULE—continued.

- (ii) in the case of a dog, securely fitted with a muzzle;
- (b) be moved to other premises within the Infected Area, on condition that—
  - (i) whilst being so moved, it is either controlled in the manner specified in paragraph (a) of rule 3 of these rules, or carried in a suitable container which does not permit it to come into contact with any other animal, other than one with which it is normally in contact at the premises at which it is confined; and
  - (ii) it does not (except under the authority of a permit granted by the Chief Inspector of Stock, or an officer acting on his behalf, and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which it was granted) come into contact with any other animal at any premises to which it may be moved.
- Rule 4. Nowithstanding the requirements of rule 2, an animal which in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Stock is in danger of being infected with, or transmitting, rabies, and which is normally exercised outside the premises within which it is confined may be so exercised, on condition that, throughout the period of exercise—
  - (i) it is closely controlled and properly restrained by the person in charge of the animal, and in no circumstances permitted to run free; and
  - (ii) it does not (except under the authority of a permit granted by the Chief Inspector of Stock, or an officer acting on his behalf and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which it was granted) come into contact with any other animal or constitutes a risk to persons.
- Rule 5. The Chief Inspector of Stock, or an officer acting on his behalf, may serve on the owner or other person in charge of a dog or cat or any other animal which in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Stock is in danger of being infected with, or of transmitting rabies or on the occupier of the premises at which the animal is or should be confined, a notice in writing setting out such requirements and prescribing such conditions, with respect to the control and confinement of the animal as the Chief Inspector of Stock may consider appropriate and the person on whom the notice is served shall take all necessary steps to comply with the provisions thereof.
- Rule 6. Where the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that having regard to the purpose for which a particular animal to which these rules apply is kept, any of the requirements of these rules would unduly restrict its use for that purpose, he may by permit exempt the owner or other person in charge of that animal from all or any of those requirements, subject to compliance by that person with any such conditions as may be imposed in the permit.
- 14B. (1) Where an animal to which the rules set out in regulation 14A of these regulations apply, is not confined or controlled as required by the rules or by a notice or permit thereunder, an inspector may seize and detain the animal.
- (2) An animal seized and detained by an inspector in accordance with subregulation (1) of this regulation may be claimed by or on behalf of its owner within a period of twenty-four hours after it has been so seized and detained.
- (3) An animal seized in accordance with subregulation (1) of this regulation and claimed within twenty-four hours of being so seized may be detained at the expense of the owner of the animal, at such place as the Chief Inspector of Stock directs and may also be further detained for such additional period as the Chief Inspector may direct.

#### (4) Where-

- (a) the owner of an animal which has been claimed within the period specified in subregulation (2) of this regulation—
  - (i) fails to meet, within a period specified by the Chief Inspector of Stock, the reasonable expenses in seizing and detaining the animal; or
  - (ii) where required to leave the animal for an additional period, fails to enter into an arrangement satisfactory to the Chief Inspector of Stock for meeting the reasonable expenses incurred or to be incurred in connection with such additional period of detention, or fails to comply with the terms of such an arrangement;

#### SCHEDULE—continued.

(b) an animal seized in accordance with subregulation (1) of this regulation is not claimed by or on behalf of its owner within the period specified in subregulation (2) of this regulation,

the Chief Inspector of Stock may cause the animal to be destroyed and may determine the manner or disposal of the carcase, or may otherwise dispose of the animal as he thinks fit.

- (5) The reasonable expenses incurred in seizing, detaining, destroying or disposing of an animal in accordance with the provisions of this regulation shall, without prejudice to any proceedings arising for an offence against the Act, be recoverable in any competent court from the owner of the animal by and in the name of the Chief Inspector of Stock or a person authorized on his behalf.
- (6) Where an animal which may be seized in accordance with subregulation (1) of this regulation cannot after reasonable attempts by a Government Veterinary Officer or Stock Officer Inspector be so seized, the animal may be destroyed.
- 14C. Where an outbreak of rabies has been confirmed, a person shall not cause or permit an event at which cats, dogs, or other animals at risk are gathered together to be organized or held within an Infected Area or Control Area until he has obtained a written permit for that purpose from the Chief Inspector of Stock and except in accordance with any conditions imposed on the granting of that permit, and where such a permit has not been obtained—
  - (a) the occupier of any land on which such an event is held; and
  - (b) any person responsible for organizing or holding that event,

commits an offence.

- (1) Where the Chief Inspector of Stock considers it is expedient so to do, he may secure subject to the approval of the Minister the destruction in an Infected Area or in a Control Area, of feral and native animals (other than feral and native animals held in captivity) which, in his opinion may cause the spread of rabies.
- (2) A person shall not obstruct an inspector acting pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation, or interfere with the carcase of any animal so destroyed.
- 14E. (1) Any person in an Infected Area or Control Area who knows of the death of an animal, or who finds the carcase of an animal shall report the fact to the Chief Inspector of Stock or an officer acting on his behalf, unless he has reasonable grounds to believe that the animal did not die from rabies, or that the fact of its death had already been reported.
- (2) The Chief Inspector of Stock may cause to be seized the carcase of any animal reported pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation and may determine the manner of disposal of the carcase.
- 14F. An inspector may enter any land for the purpose of seizing or destroying an animal or the carcase of an animal is liable to be seized or destroyed under which regulations.

#### Schedule. Regulations.

Principal regulations.

In these regulations the Exotic Diseases (General) Regulations published in the Government Gazette on the 24th June, 1970 as amended from time to time by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

The principal regulations are amended by substituting for substituted. regulation 4 the following regulation:-

4. (1) Where a Government Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector receives a report of a suspicion of the existence of an exotic disease he shall proceed to the premises where the suspect animal or animals is or are held, taking with him protective clothing and disinfectant and carry out an examination of the suspect animal or animals.

#### SCHEDULE—continued

- (2) Where a Government Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector receives a report of the suspicion of the existence of an exotic disease in an animal wandering at large he may seize the suspect animal and hold it for observation and diagnostic tests at a place designated by the Chief Inspector of Stock.
- (3) Where an animal which may be seized in accordance with subregulation (2) of this regulation cannot after reasonable attempts by a Government Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector be so seized, the animal may be destroyed.

Reg. 7 3. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for substituted. regulation 7 the following regulation:—

- 7. (1) Any person who is a member of a diagnostic team which proceeds to premises in accordance with regulation 6 of these regulations has authority to enter those premises and conduct transmission tests and remove therefrom specimens suspicious of an exotic disease.
- (2) Where an animal is suspected to be infected with rabies, any person who is a member of a diagnostic team which proceeds to premises in accordance with regulation 6 of these regulations has authority to remove or cause to be removed from the premises any animal affected with, or suspected of being affected with rabies, or any animal which has been in contact with an animal so affected or suspected or the carcase of any such animal to a place where it can conveniently be kept under veterinary observation by or on behalf of the Chief Inspector of Stock or to a place where the animal or carcase can be subject to diagnostic tests.
