IN the matter of Professional Engineers who are employed under the Public Service Act, 1904-1975 and the Public Service Board and in the matter of a claim made by the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated for an award to replace the Public Service (Professional Engineers) Salaries Agreement, No. 103 of 1971.

PUBLIC SERVICE (PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS) SALARIES AWARD, 1976, No. 4 of 1976.

This Award shall be known as the Public Service (Professional Engineers) Salaries Award, 1976, and shall supersede and replace the Public Service (Professional Engineers) Salaries Agreement, No. 103 of 1971.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all Government Officers who are employed as Professional Engineers on the permanent or temporary staff in the Professional Division under and within the meaning of the Public Service Act, 1966-1973.

4.—Adjustment of Salary Rates.

(a) The salaries of Engineers covered by this Award shall be adjusted where necessary to the appropriate point in the new salary range on the basis of years of service in the position.

(b) In the event that the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission should make any decision as to wages based on general economic grounds to apply as Awards generally (known as National Wage Decision) during the operation of this Award, then such decision shall be applied to vary salary rates prescribed by this Award, but such decision shall be applied to the rates payable under this Award in accordance with the principles and as to the amount decided by the Commission which makes the National Wage Decision.

6.—Annual Increments.

Subject to good conduct, diligence and efficiency, an officer should proceed from the minimum to the maximum of his salary range, where so provided, according to the increments in such salary range.

7.—Special Progression.

(a) An Engineer, Level 3, who was classified as an Engineer, Level 3 prior to September 17, 1971, the operative date of the Public Service (Professional Engineers) Salaries Agreement, 1971, No.

103 of 1971, shall, after progressing through the incremental range in Level 3 of this Award, proceed by way of permanent allowance to the minimum salary of Level 4 of this Award, provided that the allowance shall be automatically varied to conform to variations to the minimum salary of Level 4.

(b) Positions classified Engineer, Level 3 immediately prior to September 17, 1971, the operative date of the Public Service (Professional Engineers) Salaries Agreement, 1971, No. 103 of 1971, which were reviewed and classified Level 4 under that Agreement, were, in the first instance, designated Level 3/4. Officers placed on such a classification under that Agreement shall proceed through the amalgamated incremental range by annual increments to the maximum of Level 4. When such a position becomes vacant, it shall be reclassified Level 4.

8.—Copies of Award.

Every officer and temporary employee covered by this Award shall be entitled to have access to a copy of the Award. Sufficient copies shall be available for this purpose in each Department concerned.

9.—Term of Award.

This Award shall operate as from and including the twelfth day of May, 1975 and shall remain in force for a period of three years, provided that at any time after the expiration of the first twelve months from the operative date of this Award, or of the expiration of any period of twelve months from the date of any variation thereof, either of the parties may negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Award or approach the Public Service Arbitrator for an amendment to this Award.

By-law No. 60—Care, Control and Management of Parking Facilities— Amendment.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the Fifteenth day of December, 1975, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to By-law No. 60:—

1. That Clause 6 be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—
 6. (1) Subject to Clause 8 of this By-law no person shall stand a vehicle in a metered space during the hours specified in the First Schedule hereto unless the appropriate fee specified in such Schedule is forthwith on each occasion inserted in the parking meter appurtenant to such space and, where such meter is equipped with a handle to set it in operation, the handle is turned forthwith after inserting the appropriate fee.
 - (2) The insertion in the said parking meter of the said fee, and (where applicable) the turning of the meter handle, shall entitle the vehicle to be parked in the metered space for the period specified in the said Schedule but no longer.
2. That Clause 15 (2) be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—
 - (2) No motorcycle or bicycle shall be parked in any parking stall or metered space unless the same is marked with the symbol "M/C" or the parking of motor cycles or bicycles therein is permitted by a sign referable thereto.
3. That a new subclause be added after clause 15(2) as follows:—
 - (3) No motorcycle or bicycle shall be parked in any parking stall marked with the symbol "M/C" for longer than the time permitted for parking in that stall by a sign specifically referable thereto or if there is no such sign for longer than the time permitted in any stall or metered space adjacent thereto.
4. That Clause 3 of the Second Schedule be amended by—
 - (a) deleting the figures and word "10 cents" in paragraph (1) and substituting therefor the figures and word "20 cents";
 - (b) deleting the figures and word "30 cents" in paragraph (m) and substituting therefor the figures and word "40 cents";
 - (c) deleting the figures and word "15 cents" in paragraph (n) and substituting therefor the figures and word "20 cents".

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Town Planning Regulations Amendment Regulations, 1976.

2. In these regulations the Town Planning Regulations, 1967 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th November, 1967 and amended by a notice so published on the 22nd June, 1973 are referred to as the principal regulations.

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 14 the following regulation:—

14A. Where the Minister has, pursuant to regulation 14, given preliminary approval to a proposed Scheme or a proposed Town Planning Scheme Amendment before the coming into operation of the Town Planning Regulations Amendment Regulations, 1976 that proposed Scheme or proposed Town Planning Scheme Amendment shall be dealt with in the manner prescribed by these regulations as in force immediately before the coming into operation of the Town Planning Regulations Amendment Regulations, 1976.

4. Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the word "objections" where occurring in each of the following instances:—

- (a) in the last line of subregulation (3); and
- (b) in line four and in line eight of subregulation (5),

and substituting the word "submissions" in each case.

5. Regulations 16 to 21 (both inclusive) of the principal regulations and the headings thereto are substituted as follows:—

Submissions on Scheme.

16. (1) A person who desires to make a submission on the Scheme shall make a written submission by notice in the form of Form No. 4 in the Appendix signed by him to the responsible authority.

(2) A person making a submission under subregulation (1) of this regulation shall state in the notice whether he makes the submission as an owner or occupier of property within the area of the responsible authority or as the representative of a body corporate or other body, or in some other capacity.

Consideration of Submissions.

17. (1) As soon as practicable after the period prescribed by subregulation (5) of regulation 15 for making submissions has expired, the responsible authority shall consider all submissions to the Scheme and in respect of each submission shall consider whether the Scheme should be modified accordingly or whether it shall be rejected.

(2) After considering the submissions made pursuant to subregulation (1) of regulation 16 or if no submissions have been lodged within the period prescribed by subregulation (5) of regulation 15 for making submissions, the responsible authority shall pass a resolution either—

- (a) that the Scheme be adopted with or without modification; or
- (b) that the Scheme be not proceeded with.

Scheme to be Forwarded to the Board.

18. (1) Where a responsible authority passes a resolution to adopt a Scheme with or without modifications the responsible authority shall within twenty-eight days after such adoption forward to the Board—

- (a) one copy of the Scheme without any modification thereto;

- (b) a schedule of submissions made on the Scheme;
- (c) its recommendations made in respect of the submissions made to it; and
- (d) particulars of the modifications (if any) to the Scheme recommended by the responsible authority.

(2) The schedule of submissions referred to in paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation and the recommendations thereon of the responsible authority shall be submitted in the form of Form No. 5 in Appendix E and shall be accompanied by such relevant maps, plans, specifications and particulars as may be necessary.

Board to Submit Scheme to Minister.

19. The Board shall after having examined the Scheme and the submissions made thereon and the comments, recommendations and modifications made by the responsible authority submit its recommendations to the Minister.

Consideration of Scheme by Minister.

20. (1) Where the Minister is of the opinion that a modification to the Scheme is substantial whether the modification is recommended by the responsible authority or any other modification he shall direct the responsible authority to advertise the modification in the form of Form No. 3B in Appendix E and in the manner and for the period set forth in the direction and the responsible authority shall give effect to the direction.



The authorised witness witnesses that signature and adds his own signature, and his qualification. The elector then marks the voting paper, without letting the witness see how it is marked folds it, inserts it in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" and seals that envelope, and places it in the envelope addressed to the returning officer, and fastens that envelope which the elector posts or delivers or causes to be posted or delivered (not by a person who is a candidate for the election) to the returning officer.

If the elector has eyesight so defective that he cannot mark his voting paper, or if he cannot read or write, he may appoint a person, who may be the authorised witness, but may not be a person who is a candidate for the election, to mark the voting paper for him and that person shall, in the presence of the authorised witness, mark the voting paper, fold it so that the vote cannot be seen, place it in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper", seal this envelope and either hand it to the elector who shall deal with it in accordance with the procedure detailed in the preceding paragraph, or request the authorised witness to carry out that procedure. The authorised witness must not attempt to discover how the elector votes, except when requested to mark the voting paper by a blind person, or one who cannot read or write.

Any person present when an absent vote is being taken must obey directions given to him by the authorised witness and shall not look at the elector's vote or do anything to become acquainted with how he votes, except where he has been requested to mark the voting paper by a blind person or one who cannot read or write.
