Local Government Act, 1960-1975. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961-1974.

(a) by adding under the subheading "Division 2." under the heading "CLASS 3—NITRO-COMPOUND" in the schedule to that Order, the item—

Higel (ZZ); and

(b) by adding under the subheading "Division 2." under the heading "CLASS 6—AMMUNITION" in the schedule to that Order, the items—

 $\begin{array}{ll} \textbf{Premium Ribcord} & \textbf{(ZZ)} \\ \textbf{Tuffcord} & \textbf{(ZZ)} \end{array}$

and declare those items to be authorised explosives for the purposes of the said Act, with effect from and including the day of the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette.

Companies Act, 1961-1975.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by subsection (1a) of section 5 of the Companies Act, 1961-1975 it is provided, inter alia, that the Governor may by Order declare any law of a State which is a participating State for the purposes of the Act to be a declared law for the purposes of the Act and may by Order vary or revoke any declaration made under paragraph (b) of that subsection; and whereas by Order published in the Government Gazette on 23rd May, 1975, the States of New South Wales, Victoria and Queensland were declared to be participating States for the purposes of the Act and certain laws of those States were declared to be declared laws for the purposes of the Companies Act, 1961-1974; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid doth hereby—

- (a) vary the Order published in the Government Gazette on 23rd May, 1975 by revoking paragraph (b) thereof by which certain laws of the States of New South Wales, Victoria and Queensland were declared to be declared laws for the purposes of the Companies Act, 1961-1975; and
- (b) declare each of the Companies Act, 1961 of the State of New South Wales, the Companies Act, 1961 of the State of Victoria and the Companies Act, 1961-1975 of the State of Queensland, as in force on 1st March, 1976 to be a declared law for the purposes of the Companies Act, 1961-1975 of the State of Western Australia.

Securities Industry Act, 1975.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 (9) of the Securities Industry Act, 1975 that the Governor may by Order declare—

- (a) a State or Territory of the Commonwealth to be a participating State for the purposes of that Act if—
 - (i) the Interstate Corporate Affairs Agreement within the meaning of the Companies Act, 1961 has been signed on behalf of that State or Territory; and
 - (ii) there are in force in that State or Territory laws relating to the securities industry that, in the opinion of the Governor, enable that State or Territory to have uniformity in administration and to enter into reciprocal arrangements as a participating State in accordance with the provisions of subclause (1) of clause 2 of that agreement; and
- (b) any law of that State or Territory to be a declared law for the purposes of the Securities Industry Act, 1975;

and whereas the aforesaid Interstate Corporate Affairs Agreement has been signed on behalf of the States of New South Wales, Victoria and Queensland; and whereas there are in force in each of the aforesaid States laws relating to the securities industry that in the opinion of the Governor enable each of those States to have uniformity in administration and to enter into reciprocal arrangements as a participating State in accordance with the provisions of subclause (1) of clause 2 of that agreement: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid doth hereby—

- declare the States of New South Wales, Victoria and Queensland to be participating States for the purposes of the Securities Industry Act, 1975; and
- (2) declare the Securities Industry Act, 1975 of the State of New South Wales, the Securities Industry Act, 1975 of the State of Victoria and the Securities Industry Act, 1975 of the State of Queensland each to be a declared law for the purposes of the Securities Industry Act, 1975 of the State of Western Australia.

Securities Industry Act, 1975. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 133 (6) that the Governor may by Order in Council exempt any member of a stock exchange from compliance with all or any of the provisions of sections 59 and 60 of the Securities Industry Act, 1975, subject to such terms and conditions as are specified in the Order: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby—

- (a) exempt each member for the time being of The Stock Exchange of Perth Limited from compliance with subsection (2) of section 59 of the Securities Industry Act, 1975, on condition that the member shall pay to the credit of the trust account required to be kept pursuant to subsection (1) of that section—
 - (i) moneys received from, for, or on behalf of, any client by whom instructions for the purchase of securities have not then been given;
 - (ii) moneys arising from the sale of securities on behalf of a client who has instructed that the moneys be held by the member pending further instructions for settlement or reinvestment; and
 - (iii) moneys held by the member for a client against buying instructions to which effect has not been given within a period of fourteen days after the receipt of those moneys,

and shall make such payments to the credit of that trust account—

- (iv) in the case of moneys referred to in subparagraph (i)—within three bank trading days after the moneys have been received in the circumstances referred to in that subparagraph;
- (v) in the case of moneys referred to in subparagraph (ii)—within three bank trading days after the receipt of documents delivered consequent upon a sale in the circumstances referred to in that subparagraph; and
- (vi) in the case of moneys referred to in subparagraph (iii)—not later than the next bank trading day after the expiration of the period of fourteen days referred to in that subparagraph;

- (b) order that the term "moneys" in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall not be construed as extending to any cheque, bank cheque, bank draft or money order made payable to or to the order of a specified person or bearer (not being a cheque, bank cheque, bank draft or money order in which the payee is the member, a partner of the member or the firm in which the member is a partner) received from or on behalf of a client with instructions, express or implied, that the cheque, bank cheque, bank draft or money order is to be delivered to the person to whom it is payable; and
- (c) order that the exemption granted to members of The Stock Exchange of Perth Limited by this Order shall, unless sooner revoked, expire on the 30th June, 1976.

Scheme Area.

- 4. The Scheme shall apply to the lands within the inner edge of a broken black line on Sheet 1.1 KEY SHEET with the exception of those areas marked "Not included in Scheme Area". The said Area is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".
- 5. Those portions of the Scheme Area which are marked as such on the Scheme Maps are hereinafter referred to as "Area A B C D and E" respectively.
- 6. The remainder of the Scheme Area that is to say excluding the Areas A B C D and E is hereinafter referred to as "the Subdivisional Area".

General Objects.

- 7. The general objects of the Scheme are-
 - (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
 - (b) To make land available for residential or other purposes.
 - (c) To make suitable provisions for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
 - (d) To make suitable provision for roads and traffic within the Scheme Area.
 - (e) To ensure the proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage and to provide adequate drainage areas and drainage compensating basins.
 - (f) To provide for the reticulation of water to and throughout the Scheme Area.
 - (g) To provide for the establishment of sewage disposal facilities throughout the Scheme Area.
 - (h) To make provision for land to be used for public open space public recreation and local authority purposes within the Scheme Area.

Scheme Works.

- 8. The following works shall be carried out:-
 - (a) The Scheme Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Maps with such minor variations as may with the approval of the Town Planning Board be determined by the Council.
 - (b) The lands shown as roads on the Scheme Maps of which the carriageway is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earthworks undertaken.
 - (c) All existing roads within the Scheme Area shall where considered desirable by the Council be repaired and reconstructed.
 - (d) The lands shown as footways on the Scheme Maps shall be set aside for that purpose and shall be paved.
 - (e) Levelling filling and drainage works shall be carried out where considered necessary or desirable by the Council.
 - (f) The lands shown as drainage on the Scheme Maps shall be set aside for drainage purposes and drainage reserves.
 - (g) Sewage disposal facilities shall be provided throughout the Scheme Area where necessary mains and pumping stations shall be installed outside the Scheme Area.
 - (h) Freshwater shall be reticulated throughout the Scheme Area and where necessary mains and pumping stations shall be installed outside the Scheme Area.
 - (i) The lands shown as public open space on the Scheme Maps shall be set aside for that purpose.
 - (j) Development of public open space within the Scheme Area will be carried out.

- (k) Those buildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision will be demolished or removed and in cases considered desirable by the Council such fences and buildings may be re-erected.
- (1) If economically feasible electric power lines will be laid underground.

Acquisition of Land.

9. The land within the Scheme Area (or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme) but with the exception of Areas A, B, C, and D shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

Closure of Roads and Rights-of-Way.

10. Those roads and rights-of-way which are shown on Land Use Maps but are not shown on the Scheme Maps or are shown thereon as closed roads and closed rights-of-way shall be closed and the land used for the purpose shown on the Scheme Maps.

Valuations.

- 11. The lots shown on the Land Use Maps excluding Areas A and D (hereinafter called "old lots") shall be valued as at the date on which the Scheme comes into operation and each owner shall be notified of the value so placed on his old lot.
- 12. The lots within the Subdivisional Area and in Areas B and C created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Maps (hereinafter called "New Lots") shall be valued as at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme as residential land on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out.
- 13. The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or by some person recommended by him to ascertain the value of the land assuming that there are no buildings, structures or fences thereon.
- 14. If an owner shall object to the value placed on his old lot he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty eight (28) days after having been served with notice of the said value or revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner, the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.
- 15. If a value placed on a lot shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the value placed on the other lots and make such re-valuations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected shall forthwith be notified of any change in value so made.

Owner's Value Ratio.

16. From the sum of the values of the New Lots within the Subdivisional Area and in Areas B and C shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure as ascertained is the net value of the New Lots. The Owner's Value Ratio is the relationship between the sum of the values of the Old Lots within the Subdivisional Area and in Areas B and C and the net values of the New Lots within the Subdivisional Area and in Areas B and C.

Owner's Interest in Scheme.

17. Each owner of an Old Lot or portion of an Old Lot in the Subdivisional Area shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in the Scheme of a value equal to the value of his old lot or the portion thereof within the Subdivisional Area and in Areas B and C increased or decreased (as the case may be) in the ratio of the Owner's Value Ratio determined in accordance with Clause 16 hereof as the case may be.

Council's Land.

18. If the Council is or shall be the owner of any land in the Scheme Area other than as the responsible authority under the Scheme it shall have similar rights to an owners value ratio replacement lots and otherwise as have other owners of land within the Scheme Area.

Scheme Costs.

- 19. The costs or estimated costs of the following items comprise the Scheme Costs— $\,$
 - (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme.
 - (b) The costs of the Scheme Works works to be carried out, less any contributions received from the Shire of Swan or other persons having benefit from the Scheme Works.
 - (c) Payments to the City of Stirling in respect of works carried out on Bunya Road.
 - (d) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation and any payment to be made under Clause 22 hereof.
 - (e) The estimated compensation and costs payable under Clause 20 hereof.
 - (f) The cost of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
 - (g) The costs of repairing and upgrading drainage works outside the Scheme Area necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area.
 - (h) The costs of sewerage and water supply headworks pumping stations and other works outside the Scheme Area necessary for those services within the Scheme Area.
 - (i) The costs of extension of water mains and any contribution made or to be made to the Public Works Department in respect of sewerage and drainage works.
 - (j) The provisions of underground electricity and gas services if such costs are incurred.
 - (k) The cost of altering existing electricity water sewerage drainage or telephone services or of providing exceptional services rendered necessary by the Scheme to the extent to which and in cases where the Council considers the cost justified.
 - (1) The cost of installation of traffic lights required and installed by the Main Roads Department.
 - (m) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to complete the Scheme.

Estimate of Compensation.

20. In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the amount so estimated. In the even of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

Allocation and Disposal of New Lots.

- 21. The New Lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) Each owner of land within the Subdivisional Area and in Areas B and C shall be offered a new lot or lots zoned for residential purposes (hereinafter called "replacement lots") of a value as near as practicable to the owners interest in the Scheme as calculated according to Clause 17. The replacement lots shall be chosen and allocated as equitably as possible so that if practicable the replacement lot will have characteristics similar to those of the old lot acquired from the owner.
 - (b) All the remaining lots in the Subdivisional Area (hereinafter referred to as "saleable lots") may be sold to pay the costs of the Scheme and otherwise dealt with in accordance with the Scheme.

Additional Damage or Inconvenience.

22. If an owner shall in the opinion of the Council suffer any additional damage or inconvenience by reason of the Scheme the Council may offer to such owner such sum of money or additional lot as it (acting on the advice of the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department) considers equitable. The said offer shall be made with the offer mentioned in Clause 23 hereof to the intent that the owner may not accept the offer mentioned in Clause 23 either wholly or in part without accepting the offer in this Clause mentioned.

Nature of Offers.

- 23. The offer mentioned in paragraph (a) of Clause 21 hereof shall be made either with an offer of payment of money or subject to the owner making a payment of money in order that the total value of the New Lot or Lots offered and the new value of any land within the Scheme Area not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner together with or subject to a payment in money is equal to the owners interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with Clause 17 hereof. The offer may be made in the alternative giving the owner the right to accept either a lot or lots subject to a payment by him or to accept no lots or a lesser number of lots with a payment by the Council to him.
- 24. The owners from whom land has been resumed but to whom no offer of land is made shall be offered a cash payment equal to that owners interest in the Scheme.
- 25. The offers mentioned in the above Clauses shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by registered post on him at his address appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the New Lot or Lots (if any) the subject of the offer and the Old Lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owner's interest in the Scheme, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be, and how the amount is calculated.
- 26. If a pipe drain has been or is to be laid across land within a New Lot such New Lot may be offered or sold expressly subject to the condition that the transferee shall grant to the Council or to the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board or Public Works Department as decided by the Council a drainage easement over so much of the lot as is required for the drain. If the Council shall itself have granted an easement to the said Board or Department the lot shall be transferred subject to such easement.
- 27. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.
- 28. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall unless the time shall have been extended by the Council be deemed to have been rejected.
- 29. If an offer is made on the alternative and if an owner does not accept all the lots offered to him the lots accepted by him shall be treated as being in payment on account of the owner's interest in the Scheme. The remainder of his interest in the Scheme shall be paid in cash,
- 30. An owner who accepts the offer shall be liable to pay to the Council all rates which would have been payable on the land acquired from him if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the New Lots to him.
- 31. If an offer be accepted wholly or in part it shall be accepted by the owner on the basis that such acceptance is a complete bar to all claims for compensation which the owner may have had in respect of the resumption from him of the Old Lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of the Scheme but shall not bar him from participating in the profits of the Scheme.
- 32. If an owner does not accept an offer wholly or in part he shall not be entitled to any interest under the Scheme or to participate in the Scheme profits.

Registration of Transfers.

33. The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled, transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with the Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act 1893 as amended and return it to the Council for registration, or if the owner shall fail to make payment of any money which may be due by him to the Council within twenty eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the Transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for a cash payment equal to his interest in the Scheme and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots.

- 34. Any lot offered to but not accepted by an owner in accordance with the Scheme or the subject of a transfer not completed as aforesaid may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears.
- 35. The Council may sell the saleable lots and the rejected lots either by public auction tender or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.
- 36. If in the opinion of the Council it shall not prove necessary to sell all the saleable lots or rejected lots in order to pay the costs of the Scheme or it is otherwise desirable not to sell all such lots the Council may reallocate some or all of the lots unsold to owners where it considers it just and equitable so to do and the cash payment to be made or received under Clause 23 shall be adjusted accordingly.
- 37. The Council may instead of selling all or any of the saleable lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

Areas A.

- 38. (1) Each of the owners of the land designated as Area A on the Scheme Maps shall when subdividing such land:—
 - (a) subdivide the land according to the design shown on the Scheme Maps or any modification thereto agreed upon by the Council and the Town Planning Board;
 - (b) pay to the Council an amount equal to one tenth of the value of the land as at the date on which the subdivision of the land is finally approved by the Town Planning Board;
 - (c) pay all costs relating to the construction and drainage of the roads within the said area, the provision of reticulated water, sewage disposal services, and underground electric power lines;
 - (d) at his own cost carry out such earthworks and other works as are necessary for the subdivision of the land; and
 - (e) transfer free of cost to the Council so much of the land as is required for road widenings as shown on the Scheme Maps and at his own cost remove therefrom all obstructions fences retaining walls and where required reconstruct the retaining walls in the new position.
- (2) For the purpose of paragraph (1) (b) hereof the valuation shall be made on the basis of the fair net expectancy inclusive of sub-dividers profit from the sale of the land in its optimum subdivided form. The value shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or some person recommended by him. If an owner shall object to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection within twenty eight (28)

days after having been informed of the said value and in that event if the parties cannot agree upon the valuation the value shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

(3) The owners of land within Area A shall not be entitled to an interest in the Scheme or to share in the profits of the Scheme in respect of such land.

Areas B.

- 39. (1) The lands within Areas B shall not be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. The owners of such lands shall be entitled to an interest in the Scheme pursuant to Clause 17. The said lands shall be valued on the basis of the fair net expectancy inclusive of subdividers profit from the sale of the land in its subdivided form according to the Scheme Maps and such values shall be the new values of the lands "not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner" for the purpose of Clause 23.
- (2) It is not intended that any further subdivision of the lands within Areas B be permitted.

Areas C.

- 40. (1) The lands within Areas C shall not be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. The owners of such lands shall be entitled to an interest in the Scheme pursuant to Clause 17. The said lands shall be valued on the basis of the fair net expectancy inclusive of subdividers profit from the sale of the land in its subdivided form according to the Scheme Maps and such values shall be the new values of the lands "not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner" for the purpose of Clause 23.
- (2) The offer to be made to owners of land in Area C shall be made on the basis that the owner will also accept the portion of a lot or the portion of a closed road adjoining such land and shown on the Scheme Maps as being part of a lot within the Area C and will have such land amalgamated in the title to the land in Area C. The amount payable to or by the owner by way of cash adjustment shall be modified according to the value of the land offered to the owner pursuant to this Clause.
- (3) Any subsequent subdivision of any land within an Area C shall be made according to the design shown on the Scheme Maps or any modification thereto agreed upon by the Council and the Town Planning Board.

Area D.

41. The land within Area D is required by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for the purpose of the Beechboro-Gosnells Highway. It is intended that all compensation and other moneys payable by reason of the reservation and resumption of this land be paid by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority. The Council may by negotiation acquire the land within Area D but unless the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority shall have agreed with the Council to pay all compensation involved the Council shall not resume the land in Area D.

Areas E.

- 42. (1) The lands within Areas E shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. The owners of the lands within Areas E shall be offered replacement lots and the right to participate in the Scheme in all respects as if the said land were within the Subdivisional Area.
- (2) The Council may from time to time re-survey lands within Areas E or any part or parts thereof and so far as it is authorised to do so construct buildings and improvements and carry out road works and earthworks thereon. The Council may sell any Area E or any lot or lots created by the re-survey of an Area E by public auction tender or private contract upon such terms and conditions as it thinks fit including all or any of the following conditions:—
 - (a) that the lot be developed for a purpose and in manner specified by the Council;
 - (b) that the lot be developed within a specified time;
 - (c) that the lot be used for the purpose specified by the Council;
 - (d) that buildings only of a particular type be constructed on the lot;
 - (e) that in default the land or lot may be re-acquired by the Council.

Profits of Scheme.

- 43. If the Scheme shall show a profit such profit shall be distributed among each of those owners of land within the Scheme Area who have accepted wholly or in part the offers mentioned in Clauses 22 to 25 in the proportion which the value of the owner's Old Lot or portion thereof within the Scheme Area bears to the total value of the Old Lots within the Scheme Area whose owners have accepted wholly or in part the offer made to them pursuant to Clauses 22 to 25. For the purpose of this Clause the values shall be those finally made pursuant to Clauses 11 and 13 hereof. The right to participate in the profits shall not in the absence of agreement devolve to any person not the owner of the land who accepted an offer made by the Council pursuant to this Scheme.
- 44. If an owner or other person entitled to portion of the profits of the Scheme cannot be found the Council may after the expiration of six (6) years from the date on which the owner's share in the profits was ascertained expend the amount of his portion of the profits in the improvement of the Scheme Area and thereafter such owner shall have no claim in respect of such money.

Loss.

45. If the Scheme shall show a loss the amount of the loss shall be borne by the owners in the same proportion as that specified in Clause 43 and each owner shall at the expiration of three (3) months from the service of a notice on him stating his proportion of the loss pay such amount to the Council.

Encumbrances on Title.

46. In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser mortgagee chargee or lessee the Council shall not make any payments to nor transfer a New Lot to the owner without the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance or unless subject to similar encumbrances.

Rates and Taxes and Moneys Owing to Council.

47. The Council shall deduct from any moneys payable to an owner the amount of any unpaid rates or taxes and any other moneys owing by the owner to the Council. Except in the case of pensioners no new lot shall be transferred to an owner unless all moneys owing by him for rates and taxes have been paid.

Development Prior to the Scheme.

- 48. (1) The Council may in accordance with this Clause permit an owner or a group of owners to develop land prior to the implementation of the Scheme in respect of such land. If the Council does so agree the owner or owners shall enter into an agreement agreeing:—
 - (a) To subdivide and develop the land according to the Scheme within a time limited.
 - (b) That the works shall be carried out under the supervision of the Council's officers and consultants and to pay all fees incurred in so doing.
 - (c) To pay their proportion of the Scheme Costs.
 - (d) To mortgage or charge specified lands to secure payment of any moneys payable to the Council.
 - (e) To release the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of the Scheme.
- $^{(2)}$ The agreement shall contain such other clauses as the Council acting on the advice of its solicitors shall require.
- (3) The owner or owners who themselves develop land shall not be entitled to any interest in the Scheme or to participate in the profits of the Scheme.
- (4) Adjustments to public open space contributions shall be made by the transfer of land to the Council and not by the payment of cash in lieu thereof.
- (5) If any land is to be used for a commercial purpose the owner shall pay to the Council the difference in the value of such land compared with land used for residential purposes.

Fences.

49. The Council shall not be liable to contribute to the costs of any fences on the boundaries of footways public open space or drainage reserves.

Powers of Council.

- 50. The Council in the conduct and management of the Scheme shall in addition to the powers and authorities hereinbefore mentioned have the following powers:—
 - (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
 - (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Scheme Area.
 - (c) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
 - (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land or buildings within the Scheme Area.
 - (e) To agree to the extension of time for payment of any moneys payable to it and to accept security for the payment thereof.
 - (f) To postpone the implementation of the Scheme for such period as it thinks fit or to implement the Scheme in stages dealing with portions of the Scheme Area from time to time as the Council considers proper in the circumstances. If the Council shall implement the Scheme in stages Scheme Costs shall be apportioned to each portion of the Scheme Area in respect of which the Scheme is implemented and clauses 11 to 21 shall be read as referring to that area and not to the whole of the Subdivisional Area.
 - (g) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
 - (h) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of the land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specific parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specific purpose.
 - (i) To enter into such agreements and arrangements with the Crown the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board the Public Works Department the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority or other Government instrumentality or Statutory Authority as seem proper to the Council for any purpose connected with this Scheme or the carrying out of any works within the Scheme Area.
 - (j) To remove alter or demolish any building which obstructs the observance or carrying out of this Scheme.
 - (k) To make minor variations to the survey design where necessary or desirable.
 - (1) To let or lease on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit any land or buildings acquired by it pursuant to this Scheme.
 - (m) With the consent in writing of all persons interested to vary allocation of New Lots to be offered to owners in accordance with the Scheme.

Arbitration.

51. Any dispute or difference as to the valuation of land hereof may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council.

Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.

52. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of the Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the coming into operation of the Scheme or if a notice of resumption or a notice of rescission under Clause 33 hereof has been given to a claimant claims may be made within six (6) months of the issue of such notice.

Amendment No. 68:
