Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Air Chief Marshal Sir Wallace
Fixed Fixed

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to the Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State by any person; and whereas such types of bread as are respectively specified in the schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, of forty-five kilometres from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the Schedule to this proclamation.

It is an implicit pro-vision in the maximum price abovementioned that where two 450 gram ordinary loaves of bread are sold at the same time to the same person, the price shall not exceed the price of one 900 gram ordinary

In these regulations the Education Act Regulations 1960, as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971, and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

- 2. Regulation 63 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted:—
 - 63. (1) Any suitably qualified person may be appointed to the teaching staff of the Department as a temporary teacher.
 - (2) A temporary teacher is not eligible—
 - (a) to have his name included on a promotion list; or
 - (b) to apply for an advertised vacancy unless the vacant position is one for which applications are invited from persons not employed by the Department. .

Reg. 85 substituted.

- 3. Regulation 85 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted:— $\,$
 - 85. (1) Subject to this regulation, a teacher who desires to resign from the Department may do so at any time if he gives written notice of his resignation to the Director-General not less than one month (including at least twenty working days) before the date that his resignation takes effect but the Director-General may at his discretion in special circumstances accept a notice of resignation given in a shorter period.
 - (2) A teacher shall not resign from the Department at any time within the period commencing on the 1st January and ending on the 31st March in any year unless—
 - (a) he commenced his employment with the Department within the period commencing on the 2nd January and ending on the 30th March of that year; and
 - (b) his resignation takes effect only on a date subsequent to the anniversary of the date on which he began the continuous service which is terminated by the resignation.
 - (3) Where the period of the notice of resignation given by a teacher pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation—
 - (a) includes-
 - (i) any period of the first or second term vacations;(ii) any period within seven days immediately following either of those vacations,

the Director-General may at his option accept the resignation as being effective as from the last school day immediately preceding the vacation in question; or

- (b) includes any period during the summer vacation, the Director-General may at his option accept the resignation as being effective as from the 31st December during that vacation.
- (4) Subject to subregulation (5) of this regulation, the employment of a temporary teacher may be terminated at any time upon the giving of one week's notice of termination of employment.
- (5) Where a temporary teacher is employed to fill a short term vacancy his employment with the Department lapses from the date that the Director-General determines that the vacancy filled by the temporary teacher no longer exists.
- (6) Where a teacher (including a temporary teacher) does not give the appropriate notice of resignation to the Director-General that is applicable in relation to him under this regulation the Director-General may direct that the teacher shall not be paid in respect of—
 - (a) the period of notice that is applicable in relation to the teacher under this regulation; or
 - (b) such portion of the period that is applicable in relation to the teacher under this regulation as is determined by the Director-General,

and if any moneys have already been paid to the teacher for a period in respect of which the Director-General has directed that the teacher shall not be paid the moneys so paid may be recovered by the Minister in any court of competent jurisdiction.
