WHEREAS it is enacted-

- (a) by subsection (1) of section 171B of the Justices Act, 1902-1976 that the Governor may by proclamation published in the Government Gazette-
 - (i) declare another State or Territory of the Commonwealth, being a State or Territory having laws providing

for enforcement in that State or Territory of a fine payable under a conviction or order of a court of petty sessions or other court having summary jurisdiction in this State against a body corporate in this State against a body corporate in that State or Territory, to be a reciprocating State or Territory for the purposes of enforcement in this State of a fine payable under a conviction or order of a court having summary jurisdiction in the other State or in the Territory against a body corporate in this State; and body corporate in this State; and

- (ii) declare a court having summary declare a court having summary jurisdiction in a reciprocating State or Territory to be a reciprocating court for the purposes of the enforcement in this State of a fine payable under a conviction or order of that court against a body corporate in this State; and
- (b) by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of subsection (1) of that section a court may be declared singly or in conjunction with another or others by such description or class or by means of such references as the Governor thinks fit.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and under the provisions of section 171B of the Justices Act, 1902-1976 and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975, do hereby-

- (a) declare the State specified in column one of the Schedule to this proclamation to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of enforcement in this State of a fine payable under a conviction or order of a court having summary jurisdiction in that State against a body corporate in this State;
- (b) declare any court of a State specified in column one of the Schedule to this proclamation within the description of court specified opposite and corresponding to that State in column 2 of that Schedule to be a reciprocating court for the purposes of the enforcement in this State of

a fine payable under a conviction or order of that court against a body corporate in

Schedule.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:-

File No. 3916/08.—That Reserve No. 11372 should vest in and be held by the Western Australian Wildlife Authority in trust for the purpose of "Conservation of Flora and Fauna".

File No. 4274/69.—That Reserve No. 31263 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Mandurah in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation"

File No. 1512/72.—That Reserve No. 32227 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Wanneroo in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation".

File No. 2784/74.—That Reserve No. 34187 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Wanneroo in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation".

SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1976.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1976, and all other powers hereunto enabling, the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia hereby make the following rules.

AMENDMENT OF THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT, 1971.

Principal sules.

1. In these rules the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1971, reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 9th August, 1976 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and amended by rules published in the *Government Gazette* on 14th May 1976 and 27th August 1976, are referred to as the principal rules.

Commence-

2. These rules shall come into operation on the day upon which section 21 of Acts Amendment (Jurisdiction of Courts) Act, 1976 comes into operation.

O. 62A. Amended. (Mortgage Actions.)

3. Order 62A of the principal rules is amended by substituting for the passage, "ORDER 624." in the heading the passage, "ORDER 62A."

O. 64 substituted. (Appeals from Courts of Order 64 Inferior Jurisdiction and from Arbitrators.) Interpretation.

4. The principal rules are amended by substituting for Order 64 the following Order:—

ORDER 64.

Appeals from Courts of Inferior Jurisdiction and from Arbitrators.

- 1. In this Order—
 - (a) "the District Court" means The District Court of Western Australia;
 - (b) "the Family Court" means the Family Court of Western Australia.

Appeal from arbitrator where reference is compulsory. Cf. W.A. O.LIX, R.2. Cf. Vict. O.59, RR.1, 2.

- 2. (1) Where a compulsory reference to arbitration has been ordered, any party to the reference may appeal from the award or certificate of the arbitrator or referee upon any question of law; and on the application of any party the Full Court may set aside the award or certificate on any ground on which the Court might set aside the verdict of a jury.
- (2) An appeal under this Rule shall be to the Full Court, which shall have power to set aside the award or certificate, or to remit all or any part of the matter in dispute to the arbitrator or referee, or to make any order with respect to the award or certificate or all or any of the matters in dispute that may be just.
- (3) An application to set aside or remit an award must be made within 21 days after the award has been made and made available to the parties; but the Full Court or a Judge may by order extend the time either before or after it has elapsed.

Appeals from the District Court or the Family Court. Cf. W.A. O.LIX, R.11.

- 3. (1) Subject to this Rule, the provisions of these Rules relating to appeals to the Full Court from a Judge shall apply so far as is practicable to and in relation to appeals to the Full Court from the District Court (including appeals under section 107 of the Local Courts Act, 1904), or from the Family Court.
- (2) An appeal from the District Court or from the Family Court shall be instituted by notice of motion which must be filed and served on all parties directly affected by the appeal and on the Registrar of the District Court or of the Family Court, as the case may be, within 21 days from the date of the judgment, decision, determination, or order appealed from, or within such extended time as may be fixed by the Full Court or a Judge.
- (3) When an appeal from the District Court or from the Family Court is instituted, the Registrar of the District Court, or the Registrar of the Family Court, as the case may be, shall forthwith upon a request being made by the Registrar transmit to the Registrar—
 - (a) a certified copy of the pleadings and other documents (not being exhibits) that were before the District Court or the Family Court in the proceedings out of which the appeal arises;
 - (b) certified copies of the record of evidence and of the reasons for judgment in those proceedings;
 - (c) a certified copy of the decision, determination or judgment appealed from; and
 - (d) a list of the exhibits adduced in evidence and, so far as is practicable, the original exhibits.
- (4) Every party served with the notice of motion on an appeal must at least 4 clear days before the expiry of the time allowed to the appellant for entering the appeal for hearing, serve on the appellant a notice of address for service not more than 3 kilometres from the Supreme Court at Perth at which all notices and documents, not required to be served personally, may be served.
- 4. (1) This rule applies to an application under subsection (1) of section 79 of the District Court of Western Australia Act, 1969 or subsection (3) of section 107 of the Local Courts Act, 1904, for leave to appeal to the Full Court from a judgment or order of
- the District Court.

 (2) Subject to this rule, an application for leave to appeal may be made *ex parte* to a Judge in Chambers; but where the applicant thinks fit it may be made upon notice by originating
- summons.

 (3) The application shall be supported by an affidavit of the facts relied on, and shall be made upon notice if the Court so
- directs.

 (4) Subject to Order 3 Rule 5, the application shall be made not later than 21 days after the date of the judgment or order sought to be appealed from.
- (5) Where an appeal is brought by leave, the notice of appeal shall so state.
- 5. (1) An application for an order under subsection (5) of section 107 of the Local Courts Act, 1904 to remove into the Full Court an appeal pending in the District Court shall be made by originating summons and within 28 days after the appeal has been instituted.

Applications for leave to appeal. Cf. H.Ct. Rules, O.70 R.2.

Cf. Supreme Court Act, 1935, s.60(3).

Removal of Local Court appeals into Full Court.

- (2) Unless the Court otherwise orders, an order of the kind referred to in paragraph (1) shall not be made until the transcript for use upon the hearing of the appeal has been prepared in accordance with the rules of the District Court and a copy has been filed.
- (3) An appeal removed into the Full Court shall be entered for hearing within 14 days from the day upon which the appeal is ordered to be removed, or within such other period as is fixed by the order; and on default by the appellant in so doing the Full Court may order that the appeal be dismissed for want of prosecution.
- (4) Unless the Court otherwise orders, no security for the costs of the appeal shall be required from the appellant beyond any security given in accordance with the rules of the District Court.
- (5) Subject to these rules, the provisions of Order 63 relating to appeals from a Judge apply, as far as practicable, to and in relation to appeals removed into the Full Court.

Order of Full Court to be sent to court appealed from.

- 6. (1) When an appeal to which this Order applies is determined by the Full Court, the Registrar shall send to the registrar or other officer of the court from which the appeal was brought a copy of the order of the Full Court on the appeal and a copy of the reasons given by that Court for the determination.
- (2) The party extracting the order on appeal must, when filing the order, lodge at the Central Office for the purposes of paragraph (1) a copy of the order.

You shall also clear of all inflammable material all the land within the firebreaks required by this paragraph; and

- 1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Albany Town Planning Scheme No. 2 (Location 366) hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme; (being the whole of Plantagenet Location 366).
- 1.3 The Scheme is complementary to, and is not a substitute for, the Shire of Albany Town Planning Scheme No. 1.
- 1.4 No previously published Planning Scheme is revoked as a result of the coming into force of the Scheme herein described.
- 1.5 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Albany (hereinafter referred to as the Council).
 - 1.6 Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Reserved Land.

Part III.—General Provisions.

Part IV.—Finance and Administration.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

- 2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.
- (c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.
- (d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use of which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.
- 2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.
- (b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.
- (c) In lieu of paying compensation, the Council may purchase or exchange the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 3.1 Land Required for Streets: Land required for streets and walkways shall be acquired by purchase, exchange, or resumption, as soon as possible after the Scheme shall come in operation.
 - 3.2 Subdivision of Existing Lots:
 - All applications for subdivision within the area of the Scheme must conform with the layout shown on the Scheme Map.
 - Where, in order to subdivide land in accordance with the layout shown on the Scheme map, the agreement of more than one owner is required, Council must be satisfied that all owners of the subject land are in agreement with the application.
- 3.3 Provision of Services: Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained within this section or shown on the Scheme map, no application for subdivision the result of which is to create a lot having an area less than 2000 square metres will be considered unless and until such lot or lots are capable of being connected to a scheme of reticulated sewerage, meeting the requirements of the Public Works Department.
- 3.4 Approval of Development: For all development for which a building licence is required under the provisions of the Uniform Building By-Laws 1974, the Council's prior written approval to commence development is also required.

The application shall contain the following particulars:—

- (a) The full name and address of the applicant.
- (b) A description of the land and the particulars of the Certificate of Title.
- (c) The names, addresses and signatures of the registered proprietors and all other persons having an interest in the land and the nature of their interest.
- (d) The nature of the applicants interest in the land.
- (e) The purpose for which the applicant desires to use the land.
- (f) The nature of the building or buildings and other improvements on the land.
- (g) The nature of the buildings and other improvements the applicant desires to construct on or make to the land.
- (h) Floor plans, sections and elevations of any proposed buildings and a location plan for the purpose of identifying the site.

The Council may grant its approval with or without conditions, or may refuse to grant its approval to the application to commence development. In considering any such application the Council shall have regard to the objectives of this Scheme and any other matters related to the orderly and proper planning of the Scheme area.

If the Council shall have granted its approval to commence development, subject to conditions and any conditions shall not be fulfilled or complied with, the Council may revoke its approval.

Development approval shall be valid for a period of 2 years from the time of approval after which time, if no development has taken place, the approval shall lapse and be of no further effect.

- If the Council shall not within 60 days of the receipt by it, of any application to commence development have conveyed its decision to the applicant, the application shall be deemed to have been refused.
- If a person shall have applied for approval to commence development and the Council shall have refused such approval or it shall have been deemed to have been refused or that such approval has been granted subject to conditions unacceptable to the applicant, he may appeal to the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

PART IV.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

4.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may dea with or dispose of any land which it owns of which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and

in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreement with other owners as it deems fit.

- 4.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II apply.
- 4.3 Development of Public Open Space: Prior to approval of an application to subdivide land within the area of the Scheme, the applicant shall pay to the Council a sum representing 10% of the value of the subdivided land as assessed by a valuer of the State Department of Taxation and unless and until such sum is received by the Council, approval to subdivide shall not be granted. Moneys received by Council under this provision shall be placed in trust and utilised to purchase, develop, improve and maintain Public Open Space within the area of the Scheme.
- 4.4 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.
- 4.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

 - 5.4 Special Rural Zone: the following provisions shall apply specifically to all land included in the special rural zone in addition to any provisions which are more generally applicable to such land under this scheme—
 - (a) The objective of the Special Rural Zone is to select areas within the rural areas wherein closer subdivision will be permitted to provide for such uses as hobby farms, horse breeding, rural residential retreats, intensive agriculture including market gardens and viticulture and also to make provision for retention of the rural landscape and amenity in a manner consistent with the orderly and proper planning of such areas.
 - (b) The provisions for controlling subdivision, land uses and development relating to specific Special Rural Zones will be as laid down in the appendix A to the scheme and future subdivisions will accord with the plan of subdivision for the specified area referred to in the Schedule and such Plan of subdivision shall form part of the Scheme.

Before making provision for a Special Rural Zone, Council will prepare, or require the owner(s) of the land to prepare a submission support-

ing the creation of the Special Rural Zone and such submission shall include:—

- (i) A statement as to the purpose of intent for which the zone is being created.
- (ii) The reasons for selecting the particular area the subject of the proposed zone with particular reference as to how this relates to the Council's Rural Planning Strategy,
- (iii) A plan or plans showing contours at such intervals as to adequately depict the land form of the area and physical features such as existing buildings, rock outcrops, trees or groups of trees, lakes, rivers, creeks, swamps, orchards, wells and significant improvements.
- (iv) Information regarding the method whereby it is proposed to provide a potable water supply to each lot.
- (v) The proposed staging of the subdivision and development and the criteria to be met before successive stages are implemented.
- (c) The scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall include a plan of subdivision showing:
 - The proposed ultimate subdivision including lot sizes and dimensions.
 - (ii) Areas to be set aside for Public Open Space, pedestrian accessays, horse trails, community facilities etc., as may be considered appropriate.
 - (iii) Those physical features it is intended to conserve.
 - (iv) The proposed staging of the subdivision where relevant.
- (d) In addition to the Plan of subdivision, the scheme provision for a specific special rural zone shall specify:
 - (i) The facilities which the purchasers of the lots will be required to provide (e.g. their own potable water supply liquid and solid waste disposal system etc).
 - (ii) Proposals for the control of land uses and development which will ensure that the purpose of intent of the zone and the rural environment and amenities are not impaired.
 - (iii) Any special provisions appropriate to secure the objectives of the zone.
- (e) In addition to a building licence, the Councils prior approval to commence development is required for all development including a private dwelling house and such application shall be made in the form of Form 1 to the Metropolitan Region Scheme and be subject to the provisions of clause 5.4 of this scheme.
- (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Uniform Building Bylaws:
 - (i) Not more than one private dwelling house or duplex shall be erected on each lot.
 - (ii) No dwelling house or duplex shall be constructed in a Special Rural Zone that has an internal floor area of less than 110 m² or is constructed of materials that are not acceptable to Council.

- (g) The Council may, by notice served upon individual landowners or upon a subdivider of land within this zone require the preservation of specified trees or groups of trees and thereafter no landowner or subdivider shall cut, remove or otherwise destroy any tree or trees so specified unless the Council rescinds the notice or order.
- (h) In addition to such other provisions of the Scheme as may affect it, any land which is included in a Special Rural Zone shall be subject to those provisions as may be specifically set out against it in Appendix A entitled Special Rural Zone—Provisions relating to Specified Areas as set out under Appendix A to the Scheme.
- (i) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Scheme and what may be shown in the Plan of subdivision specified in Appendix A the Town Planning Board after consultation with the Local Authority may approve a minor varia-

- tion to the subdivisional design but further breakdown of the lots so created shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the Scheme.
- (j) Notwithstanding section 358 of the Local Government Act 1960-1973 (As Amended) the owners of the land shall be responsible for the total cost of construction of a standard crossing to their land.
- (k) No lot shall display a sign hoarding or billboard other than one advertising activities conducted on site without the written consent of Council.

Such signs shall not exceed 0.2 m in area.

4. By adding an Appendix A to the scheme text entitled:

Special Rural Zone—Provisions relating to Specified Areas: In the form of a Schedule with two columns (a) and (b) such that the specified area is identified under column (a) and the provisions which refer specifically to that area are set out under column (b).



"Form" means a form in the Schedule;

"licence" means a clearing licence issued under section 12C;

"section" means a section of the Act;

"Schedule" means the schedule to these regulations;

- "the Act" means the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947.
- 4. (1) An application for a licence shall be in the form of Form 1.
- (2) Where the land which is proposed to be cleared—
 - (a) does not exceed 0.2 hectare; and
 - (b) comprises the whole of the land in the ownership or occupation of the person who would otherwise be required to make application pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation,

that person shall be deemed to have been granted a licence pursuant to these regulations and is not required to make any application in respect thereof.

- (3) Where the land which is proposed to be cleared-
 - (a) does not exceed 0.2 hectare; and
 - (b) is required for the purpose of the erection of any building or other structure, but does not comprise the whole of the land in the ownership or occupation of the person who would otherwise be required to make application pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation,

that person may notify the Department in writing of his intention so to clear the land for that purpose and, if he is not notified in writing by the Department to the contrary within thirty days thereafter, shall be deemed to have been granted a licence pursuant to these regulations and is not required to make any further application in respect thereof.

 - 6. A licence shall be in the form of Form 2.
- 7. An application for the transfer of a licence shall be in the form of Form 4.

 - 9. A renewal or transfer of a licence shall be endorsed on the licence.
 - 10. An appeal to the Minister pursuant to section 12D-

 - (b) shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the appellant; and
 - (c) shall set out the grounds of the appeal and such other particulars as are necessary in support of the appeal.

 - (a) shall be in the form of Form 5; and
 - (b) shall be lodged with the Department not later than 90 days after the date on which the claim for compensation arises.


