WHEREAS the municipal district of the Town of Geraldton was, pursuant to subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1975, constituted as the Geraldton Fire District; And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 4th August, 1972, the boundaries of the Geraldton Fire District were adjusted to include portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Greenough; And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 20th October, 1972-

- (a) the name of the Geraldton Fire District was altered to the Geraldton-Greenough Fire District; and
- (b) the name of the Geraldton Fire District appearing in Part IV of the Second Schedule of the Act was altered to the Geraldton-Greenough Fire District and the name of the local authority appearing opposite and corresponding to that fire district was altered to "Town of Geraldton, Shire of Greenough":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1975, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Geraldton-Greenough Fire District so that the boundaries are in accordance with the description set out in the Schedule to this Order.

TOWN OF COTTESLOE TOWN PLANNING SCHEME.

THE Council of the Town of Cottesloe under and by virtue of the power conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the follow-ing Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of:

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves.
- (b) controlling land development, and
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1.1 Scheme Title: The Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Town of Cottesloe Town Planning Scheme and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 1.2 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the District of the Town of Cottesloe.
- 1.3 Operation of Scheme: The Scheme is complementary to, and is not a substitute for, the Metropolitan Region Scheme, and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time shall continue to have effect.
- General Intent: The intent of this Scheme is to direct and control the development of the Scheme Area (hereinafter referred to as the District) in such a way as shall promote and safeguard the health, safety and convenience, economic and general welfare of its inhabitants and the amenities of every part of the District.
- 1.5 Revocation of Town Planning Scheme: The Town Planning Scheme for the Council of the Town of Cottesloe which was approved by the Honourable Minister for Town Planning on 11th October, 1949 and subsequently amended from time to time is hereby revoked.
- 1.6 Responsible Authority: The responsible Authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Town of Cottesloe except that where land is shown on the Scheme Map marked "MRS" the responsible Authority is deemed to be the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme shall apply to such reservations.
 - 1.7 Arrangement of the Scheme:

The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:

- 1.8 General Obligations: Subject to the provisions of the Act and all Regulations made thereunder and to Part IV of this Scheme, no person shall depart or permit or suffer any departure from the requirements and provisions of the Scheme, nor shall any person use or permit the use of any land or building or undertake or permit. any new work if the use, new work, reconstruction, alteration or modification does not conform with the Scheme or would tend to delay the effective operation of the Scheme.
- 1.9 Relationship of Scheme to By-laws: The provisions of this Scheme shall have effect, not-withstanding any by-law for the time being in force in the District and where the provisions of the Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of any by-law, the provisions of the Scheme shall prevail.
- 1.10 Appeal Rights: The procedure for the lodgement and determination of appeals shall be as laid down in Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act and the Regulations made under
- 1.11 Control of Defence Areas Regulations: All buildings erected within the District shall be subject to the requirements of the "Control of Defence Areas Regulations" as promulgated by the Department of the Army from time to time.
- 1.12 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959 (as amended) unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

1.13 Definitions:

"Effective Frontage" shall be calculated for lots having parallel side boundaries as the length of a line drawn perpendicular from one side boundary so as to meet the opposite side boundary and, in the case of other lots, as the length of a line drawn parallel to the street frontage between the two side boundaries at one third of the mean depth of the lot measured from the main street frontage: PROVIDED THAT nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from deciding by other means, the effective frontage of lots of such irregular proportions that it considers the above formulae cannot appropriately be applied.

"Owner" in relation to any land includes the Crown and every person, who, jointly or severally, whether at law or in equity:

- (a) is entitled to the land for any estate in fee simple in possession; or
- (b) is a person to whom the Crown has lawfully contracted to grant the fee simple of the land; or
- (c) is a lessee or licensee from the Crown; or
- (d) is entitled to receive or is in receipt of, or, if the land were let to a ten-ant, would be entitled to receive the rents and profits thereof, whether as a beneficial owner, trustee, mortgagee in possession or otherwise.

"Plot Ratio" shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws.

"Site Coverage" shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws.

"Setbacks for Lots with Multiple Street Frontages" shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws.

"Service Industrial" means light industry carried out on land and in buildings having a retail shop front and in which goods may be manufactured only for sale on the premises; or, land and buildings having a retail shop front and used as a depot for receiving goods to be serviced; or, land and buildings used predominantly for industrial or commercial purposes complementary to the functioning of a town business and administrative centre.

"Night Club" means premises used for commercial entertainment of public or private parties whether or not food or liquor is served to patrons.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

- 2.1 Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved Scheme Map, and the reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme are shown in the Scheme to comply with the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act.
- 2.2 Development on Reserved Land; Except as otherwise provided in this Part, a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under or on land abutting a reserve defined in this Scheme without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council in the form prescribed as Form 1 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.
- 2.3 Approval of Development on Reserved Land: In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purpose of a Public Authority, confer with that Authority before giving its approval.
- 2.4 Reservations under the Metropolitan Region Scheme: Any application for development on land reserved or abutting a reserve defined in the Metropolitan Region Scheme shall be referred to the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for determination in accordance with Clause 29 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.
- 2.5 Existing Use Rights on Reserved Land: No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.
- 2.6 Compensation for Injurious Affection: Where the Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.
- 2.7 Compensation Claim Procedure: Claims for compensation shall be lodged at the Office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.
- 2.8 Council may Purchase: In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by the decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval, or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—ZONES.

- 3.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Scheme and without affecting the generality of Clause 1.6 of Part I, the Council may with the consent of the Minister, or when required by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority so to do, shall require that the development of any land within the District, however zoned, shall be subject to the provisions of Clauses 10, 24 and 30 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.
- 3.2 Zones Specified in Scheme: The following use zonings are specified and described in this Scheme and more particularly in Table No. 1—Zoning Table.

- 1. Residential A.
- 2. Residential B.
- 3. Town Centre.
- 4. Business.
- 5. Special Industrial.
- 6. Service Station.
- 7. Foreshore Development.
- 8. Places of Public Assembly.
- 9. Places of Public Worship.
- 3.3 Residential Development Control Code: Development within Residential A and Residential B Zones shall be in accordance with the controls and standards set out hereunder.
- 3.3.1 A minimum of 50 per cent of the area of every lot designed for residential purposes shall be designed, developed and maintained as natural planting and pedestrian space (access driveways between street alignment and setback-line may be included in the 50 per cent of the area maintained as natural planting).

3.3.2 Aged Persons Accommodation:

- (a) Subject to the provisions of this Clause, Council may permit within the Residential A or Residential B zone an alteration or addition to a single tenement residence which will result in the provision of two units of self-contained accommodation on the site if direct internal access is provided within the two units by a common wall and not by covered way.
- (b) No person other than a parent of the owner or the spouse of the owner of the residence, or such other aged relative of the owner or his spouse as Council in its discretion shall permit, shall reside in the second self-contained unit and then only whilst there is a current annual permit granted by the Council in respect of that use. Aged parents' accommodation units shall be registered and a permit obtained from the 1st July each year. Permits will expire on the 30th June each year and an annual permit fee of \$10 shall be paid; where a permit is issued during the year the fee shall be proportional to the months which will elapse before 1st July next.
- (c) Within 3 months or within such further time as the Council shall in its absolute discretion all of the second self-contained unit ceasing to be occupied by the parent of the owner or of the spouse of the owner of the residence or of the Council failing to renew the annual permit for that use of the residence, the owner of the residence shall effect such modifications to the building as shall restore it to a single tenement residence.
- (d) The site clearances for side, front and/or rear boundaries shall be as prescribed in the code pertaining to the zoning of the subject land and the site cover and plot ratio of the total development shall not exceed the figures laid down within the above codes.
- (e) All aged parents' accommodation units shall have deep sewerage connection.
- (f) All requirements of the Uniform Building By-laws pertaining to structural requirements shall apply.
- 3.4 Residential A Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are described in Table No. 1 Zoning Table. The following schedule details the bulk and location requirements which the Council will administer within the Zone.

- The Council may approve construction of a single family detached dwelling on an existing lot having a lesser effective frontage and/or a smaller area than the minimums prescribed in Clause 3.4, or a dwelling of Class I Occupancy may be erected on any lot of which the subdivision whereby the lot was created has been approved by the Town Planning Board under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or by the Minister on appeal to him under Section 26 of that Act.
 - 3.5 Residential B Zone:
- 3.5.1 Intent: To provide for the multi-unit residential development of parts of Cottesloe as housing precincts retaining wherever possible the amenities which are normally associated with good quality single family residential localities.

To attain this objective the Council will only allow flats to be built with its approval having been satisfied that the proposed building will not detract from the amenities of the immediate neighbourhood or of the general locality. In its examination of applications to construct flats the Council will have regard to:

- the bulk and location of the building on the subject site;
- the future density of site occupation;
- the safe and convenient movement of vehicles and pedestrians on and about the site;
- the visual scale of the building in relation to neighbouring buildings;
- the external appearance of the building and the site area about the building;
- the preservation of privacy of both tenants of the proposed building and of neighbouring properties;
- the preservation of views, particularly of the ocean and foreshore, so that a building on one site does not close off the views which might reasonably be expected to be enjoyed from neighbouring sites and buildings.

The Council has adopted the following controls which shall be applied to development applications in order that the intent of this Scheme is

^{(3) (}a) No building containing dwelling units shall be erected in a manner which would prevent practical vehicular access from the front to the back of the site unless provisions for parking vehicles are made to the satisfaction of the Council behind the front setback of 7.5 metres.

(b) With the approval of the Council, a wall of a single storey detached dwelling may be built on one side boundary provided that the Council has notified the adjoining owner and has received comments from that owner on the proposals to construct the adjoining dwelling on the common boundary between the two lots.

between the two lots.

(4) A flat building shall not be built within the zone so that a window to a habitable room is positioned so as to be visible within 12 metres of a window of a habitable room in a dwelling built upon another lot whether or not the dwelling is within the residential flat zone.

(5) Lots 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22 fronting Eric Street between Broome and Gadsdon Streets and Lots 23, 24 and 25 Broome Street between Geraldine and Eric Streets are excluded from multiple dwelling type development otherwise permissible in this zone.

(6) Where comprehensive architectural plans and designs of houses, such as are commonly known as "row houses", are submitted for a minimum group of four dwelling units, the Council has, with the consent of the Town Planning Board, the discretion to modify these standards as stipulated in the preceding Schedule. Schedule.

3.5.2 Density: No building shall be constructed or occupied having a site density equivalent greater than 250 persons per hectare. In calculating density the Council shall apply the following schedule:—

One bedroom flat—2.0 persons. Two bedroom flat—3.0 persons. Three bedroom flat—4.0 persons. Four bedroom flat—5.0 persons.

The site density equivalent in respect of single unit flats shall be calculated on the basis of one person per flat and shall not exceed 125 persons per hectare.

3.5.3 Amenity:

- 1. Building Height and Site Development: No site shall be developed and no building containing dwelling units shall be constructed which would:
 - (a) unreasonably restrict the light, sunshine and natural ventilation enjoyed by adjoining residential properties.
 - (b) unreasonably diminish the view available from adjoining properties having regard to the Council's intention of creating a multi-unit residential environment.
 - (c) unreasonably intrude upon the privacy enjoyed by adjoining properties having regard to the Council's intention of creating a multi-unit residential environment.
- 2. Design and Appearance: The Council may obtain advice from its Environmental Control Advisory Committee on all applications to build flats. In addition to the policy and the controls set down above, the Council will request the Committee to advise upon:
 - (a) the external appearance of the building, and
 - (b) the scale of the building in relation to the site and to neighbouring development and zones.
- 3.5.4 Distances between Buildings on the same lot: Subject to the overriding provisions of this ordinance, distance between buildings on the same lot shall be determined in accordance with By-law 11.13 (4) (B) of the Uniform Building By-laws.
- 3.5.5 Setbacks for lots with Multiple Street Frontages: Setbacks from all effective street frontages shall conform to the standards for front boundaries, except in the case of a lot at a corner of intersecting streets, where the minimum setback from not more than one secondary street is reduced to one half the minimum setback from the effective frontage to the primary street or streets.
- 3.5.6 Size, Location and Design of Car Parking, Natural Planting and Pedestrian Spaces on Lots: Subject to the overriding provisions of this ordinance, the size, location and design of car parking, natural planting and pedestrian spaces on lots shall be determined in accordance with 11.13 (4) (D) of the Uniform Building By-laws.
- 3.5.7 Parks and Recreation: Developers of buildings containing more than one residential unit shall contribute cash value to the equivalent of 25 sq. metres land per unit for each unit in excess of one, to the Council which shall be used to acquire land for parks and recreation purposes in or nearby the Residential B Zone.

3.5.8 —Notice of Development:

(a) An applicant who applies for approval for the development of a duplex, triplex, quadruplex or Multi-unit building, other than a single storey development, shall advise in writing any adjoining owner, of the details of such development within seven days of lodging the sketch or preliminary drawing with the Council. The details referred to shall be sufficient to indicate clearly the bulk and extent of such development and a copy of the advice shall be submitted to Council before a final decision is made on the application.

- (b) There shall be a notice board affixed to the site when a development application is made in respect of a duplex, triplex, quadruplex or multi-unit building, other than a single storey development, indicating the proposed development and such notice will invite objections to be submitted to Council for a period of 21 days after the erection of the sign. The sign board is to be of dimensions at least 1.8 m x 1.2 m and it shall be erected in a prominent position, no further than 2 metres from the street boundary.
- 3.6 Town Centre Zone: The uses which the Council may permit within this zone are described in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. The Council intends to direct and control development within this zone in a manner which will pronounce the centre's function as the commercial and administrative centre serving Cottesloe, Peppermint Grove and Mosman Park. The Council will allow development within the zone after considering submissions made by intending developers showing how it is proposed to stage development and to integrate buildings, parking areas, vehicular access, services and pedestrian and planting areas throughout the whole of the zone to achieve high standards of safety, appearance, convenience and service. In its consideration of development submissions for land within this zone, the Council will have regard to Diagram 1, Development Policy Town Centre Zone, annexed hereto.
- 3.7 Business Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are described in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. The Council intends that development within this zone should be restricted to the provision of local business functions and predominantly to local shopping services.
- 3.8 Foreshore Development Intent: To provide for the development of the foreshore strip along Marine Parade from Eric Street to Forrest Street in a manner which will exploit the natural and economic conditions which have in the past caused it to be used for business, entertainment, residential and recreational purposes associated with the foreshore and which will secure a safe, convenient and attractive solution to the physical, visual, land use and traffic problems which presently characterise this part of the district.
- 3.8.1 The Council may allow land within this zone to be used for the purposes listed in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. In its consideration of applications to commence development the Council will have regard to:
 - preservation of the adjacent foreshore as primary marine recreation and tourist attraction;
 - grade separation of pedestrian traffic between the foreshore and interior land uses from vehicular traffic travelling on Marine Parade:
 - the unity, scale and external appearance of all buildings within the zone;
 - the integration of parking areas and vehicular access thereto with total land usage so as to secure the most convenient, safe and efficient use of land;
 - the preservation of privacy, views and residential quiet in adjoining residential zones as is commensurate with Council's intention that the Foreshore Development Zone should be re-developed for uses associated with foreshore recreational entertainment and business uses.
- 3.8.2 Council has adopted the following controls which shall generally be applied to development applications in order that the intent of this ordinance is secured.
- 3.8.3 Residential Use: With the approval of Council, land may be used for residential purposes in accordance with the provisions of the Residential B Zone, providing that the departure from the controls of that Zone may be made where the Council is satisfied that any such departure is warranted to help achieve Council's development intention and where the Council has first notified

its intention to use its discretion to allow a proposed development in accordance with the provisions of Clause 3.11 of this Scheme.

- 3.8.4 Business and Entertainment Uses: With the approval of Council land may be used for business and/or entertainment purposes in accordance with relevant provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws and with the requirements set down hereunder.
 - (1) No site shall be built upon so as to exceed a plot ratio of 1.5 or a site coverage of 0.5 except in special circumstances in which case these requirements shall not prevent the Council from allowing a greater plot ratio and/or a greater site coverage where a proposed development will help secure Council's development intention but in no case shall a plot ratio of 3.0 be exceeded though the Council may approve an increase site coverage up to the maximum of 1.0.
 - (2) Car parking spaces shall be provided in accordance with the requirements of Table II, Vehicle Parking Requirements, of the Text.
- 3.8.5 Design and Appearance: The Council may obtain advice from its Environmental Control Advisory Committee on all applications to develop land within this zone. In addition to the policy and the controls set down above, the Council will request the Committee to advise upon:
 - (a) the external appearance of proposed buildings;
 - (b) the scale of buildings in relation to the site and to neighbouring development and zones.
- 3.9 Zones not Included in Table No. 1, Zoning Table: The following zones are specified in the Scheme but are not included in Table No. 1—Zoning Table.

3.9.1 Special Industrial Zone:

- (a) Industries which are lawfully established on lands described in the Schedule immediately hereunder at the date of the coming into force of this Scheme are permitted to remain and to carry out the present industrial use of their respective sites and to carry out such extensions on these lands as may be approved by the Council in accordance with the Building By-laws provided that the Council at all times shall have the discretion to determine whether or not applications to enlarge, extend, modify or otherwise change buildings or land usage within the zone should be approved with or without conditions and the applicant shall comply with any conditions so imposed and provided further that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to limit any right of appeal which the applicant may have against the exercise by the Council of any discretion exercised by it hereunder.
- (b) In the event of lands in this zone ceasing to be used for industry for a period of twelve months the land shall not thereafter be used other than in accordance with the provisions of the Residential A Zone of this Scheme.

Schedule:

- Site (A) Lots 1 and 2 on diagram 2179 and Lots 39, 46, 47, 55 and 56 of sub lot 33 on Plan 1258 lying between Curtin Avenue, Athelstan Street, Charles Street and Eric Street.
- Site (B) Lots 35 and part of Lot 34 on Plan 1258 situated at the corner of Athelstan Street and Curtin Avenue.
- Site (C) Lot 15 of sub-lot 45 situated at Curtin Avenue.
- 3.9.2 Service Station Zone: Within this zone land may be used only for service station purposes.

- 3.9.3 Places of Public Assembly: Within this zone land may be used only as a place of public assembly.
- 3.9.4 Places of Public Worship: Within this zone land may be used only as a place of public worship.
- 3.10 Table No. 1—Zoning Table indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on top of the Table. The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 have the following meanings:
 - P—A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
 - AA—A use that is not permitted unless special approval is granted by the Council.
 - IP—A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use use as decided and approved by Council.
 - X-A use that is not permitted.

Any use not specifically listed in Table No. 1 shall be included either in the appropriate use class or in a special use class at the discretion of the Council.

- 3.11 Any person who intends to use land for a purpose which is only permitted with the special approval of the Council, shall make application to the Council for such approval and the application shall state:
 - (a) The legal description of the land and the particulars of the Certificate of Title,
 - (b) The names and addresses of the registered proprietors and of all other persons having an interest in the land and the nature of their interest.
 - (c) The full name and address of the applicant and the nature of his interest in the land.
 - (d) The purposes for which the applicant desires to use the land, together with plans and statements illustrating and explaining the nature and details of the proposed use.
 - (e) The reasons why the Council should exercise its authority to permit the proposed use.
- 3.11.1 The Council shall consider the application and may refuse its approval or may resolve to approve the application with or without conditions, or, the Council may resolve that notice of the proposed use should be given to those rate-payers and residents likely to be affected by the granting of the application.
- 3.11.2 The Council shall notify immediately adjoining owners of any proposal to use land in a manner not permitted as of right under the Scheme, and if the Council so resolves the applicant shall give notice of the proposed use to those owners of land scheduled by the Council, and cause to be published in a newspaper circulating in the Scheme Area notice of the application setting out in abbreviated form the information contained in the application and stating that objections may be made to the Council within a period of 28 days from the publication of the said notice.
- 3.11.3 Within 28 days of the expiry of the objection period the Council shall again consider the application and any objection lodged opposing the proposed use and shall resolve to refuse or grant its approval subject to conditions.
- 3.11.4 The Council may enter into agreement with the applicant whereby the applicant covenants for himself and his transferees to carry out and observe the conditions imposed by the Council in granting its approval.
- 3.11.5 Any person grieved by a decision of Council given in terms of Clause 3.11 may appeal to the Minister for Town Planning in accordance with the provisions of Clause 1.10 of this Text.

(1) Residential Buildings may only be built in the Residential B Zone in accordance with the bulk and location controls which apply to flat buildings built in that Zone.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

- 4.1 Existing Use Rights: No provisions of the Scheme shall prevent—
 - (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
 - (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) or any other

law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

- 4.2 Non-Conforming Use and Reserved Lands: Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use lawfully exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.
- 4.3 Extension of Buildings: Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a nonconforming use lawfully exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may, at the discretion of the Council, be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws, made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under the Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried out immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

Provided that where the provisions of any by-law referred to in this Section are inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme then the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

- 4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:
 - (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
 - (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 4.1 of this Part, should any building or works comprised in such land be so damaged or destroyed that the cost of restoration or replacement is greater than 75% of the value of such building or works immediately prior to the damage to or destruction thereof, such land shall be used only in conformity with the provision of the Scheme.
 - (c) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase or resumption of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and occupier of that property and may enter into an agreement with the owner of that property for that purpose.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 5.1 Vehicle Parking and Loading: The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision in accordance with the requirements of Table II for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees or other persons) to stand on or, at the discretion of the Council, sufficiently close to the site, but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.
- 5.2 Size and Location of Car Spaces and Loading Facilities: The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be $5.4~\mathrm{m}~\mathrm{x}~2.4~\mathrm{m}$ excluding all access drives. When considering any development applications, the Council shall have regard to and may impose conditions concerning the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces and loading facilities. In particular, the Council shall take into account and may impose conditions concerning:
 - (a) the proportion of spaces to be roofed or covered.
 - (b) the proportion of spaces to be below natural ground level.

- (c) the means of access to each space and the adequacy of any manoeuvring area,
- (d) the location of the space on the site and their effect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect if spaces should later be roofed or covered,
- (e) the adequacy of proposed screening or planting,
- (f) the extent to which spaces are located within the required setback areas,
- (g) the location of proposed footpaths and the effect on traffic movement and safety, and
- (h) the location of proposed access ways on and off public roads and the effect on traffic movement and safety.
- 5.3 Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided:
 - (a) Where a site is to be used for a purpose stipulated in the first column of Table II, car parking spaces of the number specified in the second column of that table shall be provided before that site is used for that purpose.
 - (b) Where a site is to be utilised for uses permitted within the Business Zone, the Council may permit it to be so used not-withstanding the prescribed number of parking spaces is not to be provided on or in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the site provided that the owner or occupier of such site makes such arrangements with the Council with respect to off-street parking in the vicinity of the site as are satisfactory to the Council.
 - (c) Where in the opinion of the Council the provision of the number of parking spaces prescribed in Table II would be excessive in a particular case the Council may permit the particular site to be used for the purpose proposed if such number of parking spaces are provided as the Council considers adequate. In deciding whether the number so prescribed is excessive in a particular case, the Council shall have regard to the nature of the use to be made of the site, the known or likely volume of goods or materials, or the numbers of people moving to or from the site and the likelihood or otherwise of congestion of traffic on any road or other public place in the vicinity.

- 5.4 The Scheme Map shows a number of closed roads. It is not the Council's intention that these roads should be closed physically or legally at the date of coming into operation of this Scheme. Rather, the Scheme gives notice of the Council's intention to close and deviate roads to secure safe and more pleasant residential conditions. The actual closures or deviations will occur only when adequate and safe alternative vehicular and pedestrian access can be provided and then in compliance with the relevant provisions of the Local Government Act and the Road Closure Act and provided that the closures do not conflict with the ultimate decision of the suggested West Coast Highway extension.
- 5.5 Appearance of Buildings: All buildings shall be maintained by the owner and occupier thereof so as to preserve the amenities of the locality and their harmony with the exterior designs of neighbouring buildings.
- 5.6 Prohibition of Unsightly Objects: No persons shall cause, allow or permit to be placed on any building or part of a building or on a building lot, any article, object or thing which shall be visible from any street, way or public place or from any other land or building or any part thereof, and which is, in the opinion of the Council, offensive, unsightly or otherwise considered to be detrimental to the amenities of the neighbourhood.
- 5.7 Nuisance: No lot, building or appliance shall be used in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of smoke, dust, fumes, odour, noise; vibration or waste products in such quantity or extent or in such a manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant of the neighbourhood of such land or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

5.8 Advertising:

5.8.1 Relationship to By-laws: Without limiting the generality of the application of any by-law it is expressly declared that this Clause is ancillary to and not in substitution for the by-laws relating to the control and licensing of signs and advertising. However, in the event of conflict between the provisions of this Clause and any by-law the provisions of this Clause shall prevail.

- 5.8.2 Interpretation: In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires, "signs" includes:
 - (a) every sign placed, projected or affixed (whether by painting or otherwise) as advertising matter upon a site and visible from off the site; and
 - (b) the board, hoarding or other structure which supports such sign.
- 5.8.3 Signs in Residential Zones: No sign shall be erected or displayed in any residential zone except:
 - (a) Traffic signs erected by or with the consent of the Council or signs denoting the name of the road, number of the premises or the location or other details of a public utility or facility.
 - (b) A sign not exceeding 1.2 sq. metres in area bearing only the name and use details of the premises and erected on a reserve or a recreation ground or on the site of a school, church or church hall.
 - (c) A sign not exceeding .18 sq. metres in area bearing only the name of the premises and the name of occupiers and the name, occupation and hours of attendance of a person or a group of persons using the premises.
 - (d) A temporary sign for electioneering or other purposes:
 - PROVIDED THAT such sign shall not be erected without the consent of the Council and shall be subject to such conditions as the Council shall impose.
 - (e) A sign advertising the intention to sell the land or premises on which it is situated.
 - (f) A sign advertising building, construction or renovation on the land or premises on which it is situated but only during the course of building, construction or renovation.
- 5.8.4 Signs in other Zones: No sign shall be erected or displayed on land not situated in a residential zone or on or in any building erected thereon:
 - (a) If it detrimentally affects the amenities of any residential zone or zones or any parts thereof.
 - (b) If it tends to depreciate the value of any adjoining property.
 - (c) If the area of the sign exclusive of supporting structure exceeds .18 sq. metres for every .30 metre of site frontage PROVIDED THAT in the case of a site having more than one street frontage the limitation as to sign area will apply to each street frontage and the sign area may not be aggregated and displayed on one street frontage.
 - (d) If the height of any part of the sign exceeds 6 metres or extends above the roof line of the building, (whichever is the greater) PROVIDED THAT the Council may allow a sign or part of a sign to extend above the roof line in circumstances where such extension would enhance the appearance of the building.
- 5.8.5 Power to Prohibit Signs Affecting Traffic Safety: If at any time the Council, having regard to considerations of traffic safety or the requirements of traffic control, is of the opinion that the erection or display of any sign ought not to be permitted the Council may by resolution prohibit the erection or display of any such sign.
- 5.9 Amenity Control: No building other than a residential building of not more than two storeys or a building ancillary thereto, shall be erected or built in any zone defined within this Scheme unless and until the Council has approved the design subject to the principles herein contained and the following conditions have been complied with:
 - (a) The Council is satisfied that such building will not clash in harmony with the exterior designs of neighbouring buildings,
 - (b) In considering the design of any such building within the Residential Zones the

- Council shall take into consideration the relationship which such building or buildings proposed within the area bear to the development of public utilities, amenities and other uses planned for the district considered as a whole,
- (c) In considering the design of any building within zones wherein business development may be permitted the Council shall take into consideration the provision in the zone for car parking space, vehicular access, pedestrian ways and general layout relative to the development uses proposed for the whole zone and within this zone the development of single lots shall be considered as part of the general design for the whole zone,
- (d) The Council has obtained the advice of its Environmental Control Advisory Committee on the design and appearance of the proposed development and the effect it would have on the neighbouring environment.

PART VI-ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE.

- with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purposes may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit. In addition to all other powers vested in it, the Council may acquire land and buildings within the Scheme Area and enter into agreements and arrangements with any owners of land within the Scheme Area.
- 6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than 6 months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette except in the case of land reserved under the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme where the provisions of Division 2 of Part II of that Scheme shall apply.
- 6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may, by its Town Clerk, Health Surveyors or Building Surveyors or any other officer authorised in writing by the Town Clerk, enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.
- 6.4 Relationship of Scheme Text to other Documents: This Scheme Text is to be read in conjunction with all documents comprising Town of Cottesloe Town Planning Scheme.
- 6.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 and its amendments.


