5. Each Scholarship shall be awarded for one year in the first instance but subject to the approval of the Selection Committee, may be renewed from year to year until the Scholar completes his course.

6. The value of the Scholarships shall be determined from time to time by the Senate on the recommendation of the Selection Committee. In addition to meeting all compulsory fees payable by the Scholar, the scholarships will provide—

(a) a living allowance including, where appropriate, a wife and child allowance;

(b) a book or equipment allowance;

(c) a travelling allowance to enable a Scholar, and when appropriate his wife and children, to visit his normal place of residence at least once during each year that he holds the Scholarship;

(d) where deemed necessary, such amount as may be needed to pay for any special tuition required by the Scholar.

7. The Selection Committee shall each year determine the number of new Scholarships, if any, to be made available in the following year.

(c) bears the seal of the Board.

- (a) The objective of the Special Rural Zone is to select areas within the rural areas wherein closer subdivision will be permitted to provide for such uses as hobby farms, horse breeding, rural-residential retreats, intensive agriculture including market gardens and viticulture, and also to make provision for retention of the rural landscape and amenity in a manner consistent with the orderly and proper planning of such areas.

  - (iii) A plan or plans showing contours at such intervals as to adequately depict the land form of the area and physical features such as existing buildings, rock outcrops, trees or groups of trees, lakes, rivers, creeks, swamps, orchards, wells and significant improvements.
  - (iv) Information regarding the method whereby it is proposed to provide a potable water supply to each lot.
  - (v) The proposed staging of the subdivision and development and the criteria to be met before successive stages are implemented.
- (c) The Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall include a Plan of Subdivision showing:
- (i) The proposed ultimate subdivision including lot sizes and dimensions.
  - (ii) Areas to be set aside for Public Open Space, pedestrian access-ways, horse trails, community facilities etc., as may be considered appropriate.
  - (iii) Those physical features it is intended to conserve.
  - (iv) The proposed staging of the subdivision where relevant.

- (i) The facilities which the purchasers of the lots will be required to provide (e.g. their own potable water supply, liquid and solid waste disposal system, etc.)
  - (ii) Proposals for the control of land uses and development which will ensure that the purpose of intent of the zone and the rural environment amenities are not impaired.
  - (iii) Any special provisions appropriate to secure the objectives of the zone.
- (e) In addition to a Building License, the Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development including a private dwelling house and such application shall be made in writing to Council and be subject to the provisions of the Scheme.
- (f) The Council may, by notice served upon individual landowners or upon a subdivider of land within this zone require the preservation of specified trees or groups of trees and thereafter no landowner or subdivider shall cut, remove or otherwise destroy any tree or trees so specified unless the Council rescinds the notice or order.
- (g) In addition to such other provisions of the Scheme as may affect it, any land which is included in a "Special Rural Zone" shall be subject to those provisions as may be specifically set out against it in Schedule No. 1 entitled "Special Rural Zones—Provisions Relating to Specified Areas" as set out under Schedule No. 1 to the Scheme.
- (h) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Scheme and what may be shown in the Plan of Subdivision specified in Schedule No. 1 the Town Planning Board may approve a minor variation to the subdivisional design but further breakdown of the lots so created shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the Scheme.
4. By adding a Schedule No. 1 to the Scheme Text entitled: Special Rural Zones—Provisions Relating to Specified Areas in the form of a schedule with two columns (a) and (b) such that the specified area of locality is identified under column (a) and the provisions which refer specifically to that area are set out under column (b).
5. By adding a new Part, Part VII to the Scheme:—
- PART VII.—DEVELOPMENT.**
- 7.1 In addition to a building license, Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development including a private dwelling house.
- Council's Approval.**
- 7.2 The Council may grant its approval with or without conditions or may refuse to grant its approval to commence development.
- 7.3 If the Council shall have granted its approval to commence development subject to conditions if any of the conditions shall not be fulfilled or complied with the Council may revoke its approval.
- 7.4 Development approval shall be valid for a period of two years from the time of approval. Failure to re-apply to the Council for development approval within the specified time will result in lapse of approval.
- 7.5 If the Council shall not within sixty days of the receipt by it of an application to commence development have conveyed its decision to the applicant the application shall be deemed to have been refused.



7.6 If a person shall have applied for approval to commence development and the Council shall have refused or be deemed to have refused such approval or granted it subject to conditions unacceptable to the applicant, he may appeal to the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning.

Conditions to be complied with.

7.7 Where conditional approval to the carrying out of development is given under Part VII of this Scheme no person shall commence, carry out, or complete that development otherwise than in accordance with the condition or conditions upon which the approval is given or continue to carry out such development after the expiry of any period limited by such a condition for the completion of the development or fail to remove any structure or building erected pursuant to the approval if so required by such a condition.

6. By adding the following clauses to Part VI of the Scheme.

#### 6.5 Enforcement of Provisions

- (a) If any person contravenes or fails or neglects to comply with the condition of any approval granted by the Council pursuant to this Scheme or with any other of the provisions of this Scheme the Council may, by notice in the manner set out in Clause 6.6 thereof, order such person to discontinue forthwith any such contravention and within thirty (30) clear days after the service of such notice to remove, pull down, take up, alter or otherwise make good any work which contravenes the Scheme, or carry into effect any provisions of the Scheme which are not being complied with and at the same time it may pursuant to subsection 1 of Section 10 of the Act advise such person that in the event of him failing to comply with the provisions thereof in the time limited for compliance, then the Council by its agents will enter such person's property and cause to be done such works and things as shall be specified in such notice.
- (b) Any expense incurred by the Council in doing any works pursuant to any default under paragraph (a) hereof may be recovered from the person in default by action for a civil debt recoverable summarily in any court having jurisdiction in respect of the amount involved.

6.6 Notices: Any notice under Clause 6.5 hereof:

- (a) Shall be addressed to the owner, occupier or lessee of the land in question.
- (b) Shall describe in general terms the manner in which the Scheme has been contravened.
- (c) Shall require the owner, occupier or lessee as the case may be, within 30 clear days after the service of such notice, to discontinue such contravention of the Scheme and take such action as the Council may direct to cause a compliance with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (d) Shall where necessary advise the person to whom it is addressed that in default of his compliance with such notice the Council will enter such land and carry out the requirements of such notice itself at the expense of such person.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 26th day of July, 1976 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Kalamunda.

“District” means the District of the Shire of Kalamunda.

“Stall” means a moveable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services.

“Stallholder” means a person in charge of a stall.

“Voluntary organisation” means a charitable, benevolent, religious, literary, cultural, recreational, sporting or other voluntary institution, association, club, society or body, whether incorporated or not, whose members are not entitled nor permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from the transactions thereof.

2. A person shall not set up or conduct business at a stall unless—

(a) he is the holder of a licence issued to him by the Council in accordance with these by-laws; or

(b) he is the owner or occupier of an orchard and/or market garden and  
(i) the stall is set up within the boundaries of the orchard, and/or market garden, and

(ii) no goods, wares, merchandise or services are sold at or from the stall other than fruit or vegetables grown in the orchard and/or market garden; or

(c) he is a member of a voluntary organisation which is authorised under by-law 12 hereof to set up the stall and conduct business thereat.

3. No person shall set up or conduct business at a stall—

(a) except at the place specified in the licence issued to him;

(b) at a distance of less than 50 metres from the intersection or junction of two or more streets;

(c) in a street, way, footpath or other public place so as to obstruct portion of the street, way, footpath or other public place;

- (d) in a street, way, footpath or other public place at a distance nearer than 5 metres to another stall set up in the street, way, footpath or other public place.
4. A person who desires to obtain a licence to set up and conduct business at a stall shall make application in writing to the Council therefor in the form of Form 1 in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
5. A licence shall—
- state the type of things or services which are authorised to be sold at the stall;
  - specify the size of the stall;
  - specify the place in which the stall may be set up;
  - specify the conditions (if any) on which the licence is issued; and
  - be in the form of Form 2 in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
6. A licence granted by the Council shall remain valid until the 30th day of June next after the issue thereof unless previously revoked and shall not be transferable.
7. A fee of \$20.00 shall be payable to the Council in respect of a licence, but the Council may remit the fee in any particular case if it thinks fit.
8. The Council may revoke a licence on any of the following grounds:—
- that the stallholder has committed a breach of these by-laws;
  - that the stallholder has committed a breach of any condition on which the licence held by him was issued;
  - that the stallholder has engaged in dishonest practices in or in respect of the sale of things at the stall;
  - that the stallholder is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
  - that the stallholder has transferred the licence issued to him or does not himself carry on the business.
9. A stallholder shall not—
- conduct business at a stall except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11.30 p.m.;
  - deposit any box, basket or receptacle (except a receptacle for litter) outside his stall;
  - make any noise or disturbance to the annoyance of neighbouring residents or passers by;
  - obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway;
  - act in an offensive manner.
10. A stallholder shall carry his licence with him and produce it upon demand to an officer or employee of the Council or to a member of the Police Force.
11. A stallholder shall have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.
12. The provisions of by-laws 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 10 shall not apply to a stall set up and conducted by a member or members of a voluntary organisation in any of the streets or places specified in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.
13. A person who shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$200.00 and to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20.00 per day.

## CEMETERIES ACT, 1897-1972.

The Municipality of the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes.

By-Laws Relating to the Greenbushes Public Cemetery (Reserve 10819).

L.G. 842/53.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned municipality as trustees of the Greenbushes Cemetery hereby records having resolved on the 20th day of February, 1976, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. The by-laws relating to the Greenbushes Public Cemeteries published in the *Government Gazette* of 10th May 1918 as amended by notices published in the *Government Gazette* of 9th August, 1946 and 23rd November, 1955 are hereby repealed.

2. All fees and charges payable to the Council as set forth in Schedule "A" shall be paid at the times and manner mentioned unless otherwise ordered.

3. The "Clerk" as referred to in these by-laws means the person for the time being employed by the Council as the Shire Clerk, and such person shall subject to the Council, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Council.

4. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B.

5. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Council in such time as to allow at least forty eight hours notice being given to the Clerk prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

6. The Council shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

7. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. Any coffin not complying with this by-law will not be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

8. Every grave shall be at least 1.8 metres deep at the first interment and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than one metre from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application in form of assignment of Right of Burial, Schedule "F".

10. (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this by-law, a person shall not bring a dead body into the Cemetery unless he or his representative has first handed to the Clerk for inspection and return a medical certificate of death or a Coroner's order for burial in respect of the body.

(ii) Where an undertaker or his representative, for a valid reason, is unable to produce a medical certificate or Coroner's order for burial, as required by paragraph (i) of this by-law and he has given to the Clerk a written guarantee to produce the certificate or order within three days, they may bring the body into the Cemetery.

(iii) A burial shall not be permitted in the Cemetery unless the provisions of one of the foregoing paragraphs of this by-law have been complied with.

(iv) Where a representative or the undertaker himself has given a written guarantee as required by paragraph (ii) of this by-law and he has failed to produce the certificate or order within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until the certificate or order is produced.

11. No interment shall be allowed on a Sunday or Public Holiday, except where it is certified in writing by a medical officer of health, or by a Police Magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day, in which case additional fees shall be charged.

12. The hours for burial shall be as follows: Monday to Friday 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m., Saturday 9 a.m. to 12 noon, Sundays and Public Holidays (subject to by-law 11) from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Council. No burial shall take place on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

13. The time fixed for any burial shall be at which time the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable for an additional fee.

14. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Vehicles shall not be allowed to proceed faster than 8 kilometres per hour within the Cemetery, and shall

proceed at and by such roads as directed by the Clerk or other officer of the Council. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

15. If application to the Council be made to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or his family, an order from the Governor or the warrant of a Coroner or a Justice of the Peace issued in accordance with the law authorising the Council to permit the exhumation must be attached to the application form.

16. Children under the age of 10 years entering the Cemetery must be in the charge of some responsible person.

17. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery nor may any fireworks be discharged therein.

18. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery and any dog found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

19. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing a nuisance of trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, plant or flower border, grave or any erection, or in any way infringing these by-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

20. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers) or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Council.

21. No person shall pluck any tree, shrub, plant or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

22. No person shall remove or carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, flower or shrub without the written authority of the Council.

23. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars by cards or otherwise or by any other system of advertising whatsoever without the written consent of the Council and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

24. No person employed by the Council shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatsoever nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Council and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

25. Any person requiring a Grant of Right of Burial in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Council in writing specifying the location of the grave. If it is proposed to inter therein the remains of any already deceased person the name of such person must be shown in the application. If the application is approved by the Council a Grant of Right of Burial shall be issued in the form of Schedule "D" or "E".

26. Every such Grant of Right of Burial shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being in force, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the grant aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened unless with the consent of the Council.

27. No brick grave or vault shall be constructed in any plot in respect of which a Grant of Right of Burial has been issued without the authority of the Council first obtained, and subject also to specifications of the proposed work and the execution thereof.

28. Every coffin placed in any such grave or vault shall be bricked in and cemented, and any space surrounding such coffin shall be filled with charcoal, dry earth, or other suitable material and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Council.

29. In the event of such exemption being obtained from the Council each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly leadlined and hermetically sealed.

30. If application be made for an interment in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assignee the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the Grant of Right of Burial.

31. Should the grantee be unable to produce the Grant of Right of Burial through having lost same, on making application for a grave to be re-opened for the purpose of interment, the said grantee shall make a declaration to this effect and shall pay the fee for a copy of such Grant of Right of Burial as prescribed in Schedule "A" before the interment takes place.

32. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or any enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Council and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897.

33. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Council shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

34. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Clerk or other officer appointed by the Council and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.



35. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Clerk.

36. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall before commencing work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Clerk the sum of \$2.00 which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the preceding by-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Clerk.

37. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at the main entrance and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 100 millimetres broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

38. No catacomb shall be allowed.

39. Licences for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Council, and licences may be renewed annually in the month of July.

40. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the Cemetery during other than the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days, Saturdays and Sundays excepted, when no work is to be done from noon on Saturday to the opening of the gates on the Monday morning, without the written consent of the Council.

41. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

42. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Clerk.

43. All workmen whether employed by the Council or by any other person shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Clerk and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give and any workmen committing any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Clerk shall be removed from the Cemetery.

44. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall first obtain from the Council a licence in the form of Schedule G.

45. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Council an annual fee as prescribed in Schedule "A" and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Council may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made he shall receive a permit to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July next following and unless in the possession of such permit no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

46. The Council may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Council to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Council for that purpose.

47. No person except the relatives of the deceased, the Council or those licensed by the Council shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

48. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the Council find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc., from the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the Council the charges laid down in Schedule "A".

49. Notwithstanding anything contained in these by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of the deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

50. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Council—

(a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries received on active service; or

(b) that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances.

Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of the deceased person as approved by the Council shall be interred in the grave.

51. Any person committing any breach of any by-laws or regulations or any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars and in a case of continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding two dollars for every day during which such breach continues.

52. Any person committing a breach of any by-laws shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty under any by-law, be liable to be forthwith removed from the Cemetery by the Council or the Clerk, or other employees of the Council or by any police constable. If such person resists removal from the Cemetery or, if, and as often as such person so removed shall, unless with the consent of the Clerk again enter the Cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Dollars.

## STATUTE TO RE-ENACT STATUTE 5—ACADEMIC COUNCIL.

1. There shall be an Academic Council.
2. The members of the Academic Council shall be—
  - (a) The persons holding the following offices, *ex officio*:—
    - Vice-Chancellor;
    - Deputy Vice-Chancellor;
    - Deans of Schools;
    - Chairman of the Board of Part I Studies;
    - Chairman of the Board of Part II Studies;
    - Chairman of the Board of Research and Postgraduate Studies;
    - University Librarian;
    - Director of External Studies.
  - (b) Nine other persons elected by and from amongst the full-time academic staff of the University.
  - (c) One person elected by and from amongst the post-graduate students.
  - (d) Three persons elected by and from amongst the undergraduate students.
  - (e) Any person or persons co-opted under Section 21(2)(d) of the Act.
3. (1) Elections for full-time academic staff members, and postgraduate and undergraduate student members shall be held at the times and in the manner decided by the Senate.
  - (2) (a) A full-time academic staff member shall hold office for three years.
  - (b) The nine persons elected or co-opted in July 1976 as full-time academic staff members of the Academic Council are hereby confirmed in office as members of the Academic Council and the first three persons declared by the Senate to have been elected shall hold office for three years, the next three persons so declared elected shall hold office for two years and the three persons finally so declared elected shall hold office until 31st May, 1977.
4. The Vice-Chancellor shall be the chairman of the Academic Council. In the absence of the Vice-Chancellor, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor shall act as chairman at any meeting of the Council. In the absence of the Vice-Chancellor and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, the Council shall elect a chairman for the meeting.
5. (1) The quorum to constitute a meeting of the Academic Council shall be seven members.
  - (2) Each member shall have a deliberative vote at any meeting of the Academic Council and where there is an equality of votes, the chairman shall have the casting vote as well as a deliberative vote.
  - (3) A meeting of the Academic Council may be held at any time on the initiative of the Vice-Chancellor. A meeting shall be held within fourteen days after lodgement with the Secretary of a request for a meeting signed by not less than three members of the Council.
6. The functions of the Academic Council shall include, in addition to the matters mentioned in Section 21(4) of the Act—
  - (a) The consideration of reports and recommendations of the Schools of study, through their Deans or management committees, and of other academic boards and committees on matters pertinent to the functions of the Council; and



- (b) The furnishing to the Vice-Chancellor of reports and recommendations on matters referred to it by the Vice-Chancellor and on matters pertinent to the functions of the Council.

7. Statute No. 5 as approved on 5th June 1974, is hereby repealed, but notwithstanding such repeal, the Academic Council as originally established by the original Statute No. 5 shall be deemed to continue in existence for all purposes. All members of the Academic Council immediately prior to the date this Statute comes into force shall be deemed to be members of the Academic Council after this Statute comes into force and the term of office of each of the elected members shall expire as provided in this Statute.

Principal regulations.

1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960 as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 87 amended.

2. Subregulation (3) of regulation 87 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting from lines two and three the passage ", or established as special schools pursuant to regulation 262A, ",

Part XIA substituted.

3. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for Part XIA the following Part:—

PART XIA.—SPECIAL SCHOOLS FOR HANDICAPPED CHILDREN.

262A. (1) A full-time special school for handicapped children may be established in any locality where, in the opinion of the Minister, there is a reasonable likelihood of a constant enrolment of six children.

(2) A reference in this Part to a "special school" means a special school established in accordance with subregulation (1) of this regulation.

262B. Any full-time special school established under this Part shall be classified in accordance with regulations 162 and 163 of these regulations, provided that for the purposes of determining the average attendance each pupil shall count as two.

SCHEDULE—*continued*.

262C. (1) There shall be established a "Special Schools for Handicapped Children Selection Board" which shall consist of—

- (a) a person not being a member of the Department who shall be appointed by the Director-General to be Chairman of the Board;
- (b) two representatives of the Department, nominated by the Director-General; and
- (c) two representatives of the Union, nominated by the Union.

(2) The Board shall consider applications from teachers for appointment to the positions of principal, deputy principal or principal mistress of special schools and make recommendations thereon to the Director-General.

(3) A teacher aggrieved by any decision of the Board may within twenty-one days after the publication of the decision appeal against the decision by lodging with the Board a notice in writing signed by him setting out fully the grounds of appeal.

(4) The decision of the Board after considering the appeal shall be final and no further appeal of any kind shall be allowed.

262D. (1) Vacancies in the positions of principal, deputy principal and principal mistress in special schools shall be advertised as directed by the Director-General.

(2) If, after advertising any position within the Department, the Board considers that there is no suitably qualified applicant, the Board shall so advise the Director-General who may then advertise the vacancy outside the Department.

262E. On and after the first day of January, 1977, a person is not eligible for appointment as principal of—

- (a) a Class IV or Class III special school, unless he holds a Teachers' Certificate or a higher certificate;
- (b) a Class II, Class I or Class IA special school, unless he holds a Teachers' Higher Certificate.

262F. (1) A teacher who does not possess the Teachers' Higher Certificate, appointed as principal of a Class IV special school shall be eligible to have his name included on the promotion list for Class III primary schools after four years' service in the Department including two years' satisfactory service in a Class IV special school.

(2) A teacher appointed as principal of a Class III special school or above whose name does not appear on any promotion list for primary schools may apply to have his name included on the promotion list for Class III primary schools after four years' service in the Department including two years' satisfactory service as a principal.

(3) (a) A teacher appointed as principal of a Class III special school or above and whose name is on the promotion list for Class III primary schools shall be eligible to receive promotion to Class III status when the Primary Schools Appointments Board rules that he is so entitled because of his position on the list compared with other teachers who are receiving ordinary promotion from the list.

(b) A teacher appointed as principal of a Class II special school or above and whose name is on the promotion list for Class II primary schools shall be eligible to receive promotion to Class II status when the Primary Schools Appointments Board rules that he is so entitled because of his position on the list in comparison with other teachers who are receiving ordinary promotion from the list.

(c) A teacher appointed as principal of a Class I special school or above and whose name is on the promotion list for Class I primary schools shall be eligible to receive promotion to Class I status when the Primary Schools Appointments Board rules that he is so entitled because of his position on the list in comparison with other teachers who are receiving ordinary promotion from the list.

(4) Satisfactory service as principal of a special school shall count as service for the purposes of qualifying for placement on a promotion list in accordance with regulation 97 of these regulations.

262G. (1) Where a regularly constituted group of persons provides a teacher for the instruction of a group of less than six children needing special education, the Minister may approve an allowance at the rate of two hundred and sixty-one dollars (\$261) per annum per pupil to be paid to the group.

(2) The Director-General must be satisfied that the person employed by the group as a teacher is a person capable of providing the proper training of the pupils under his control.

(3) The group of persons responsible for the formation and administration of such a group of children shall provide classroom accommodation acceptable to the Director-General.

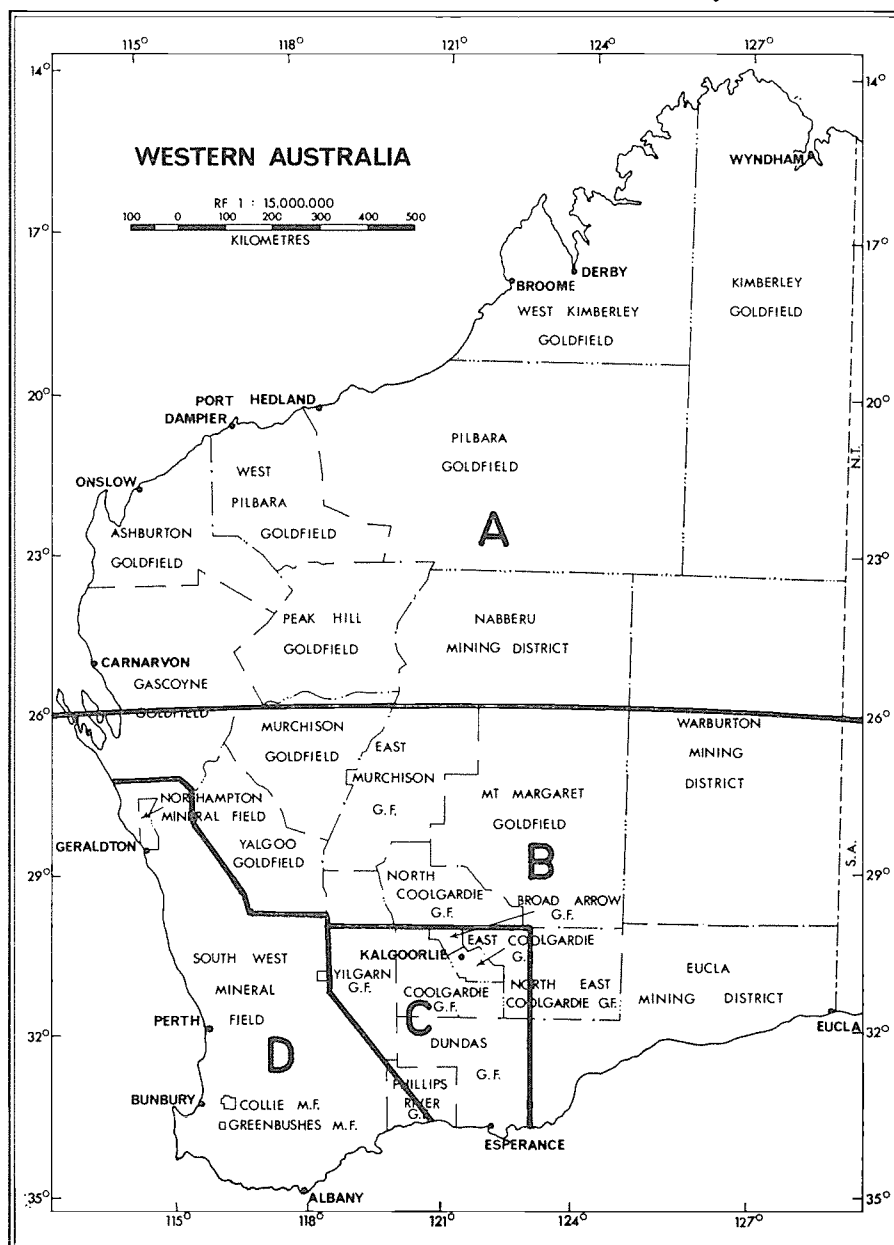

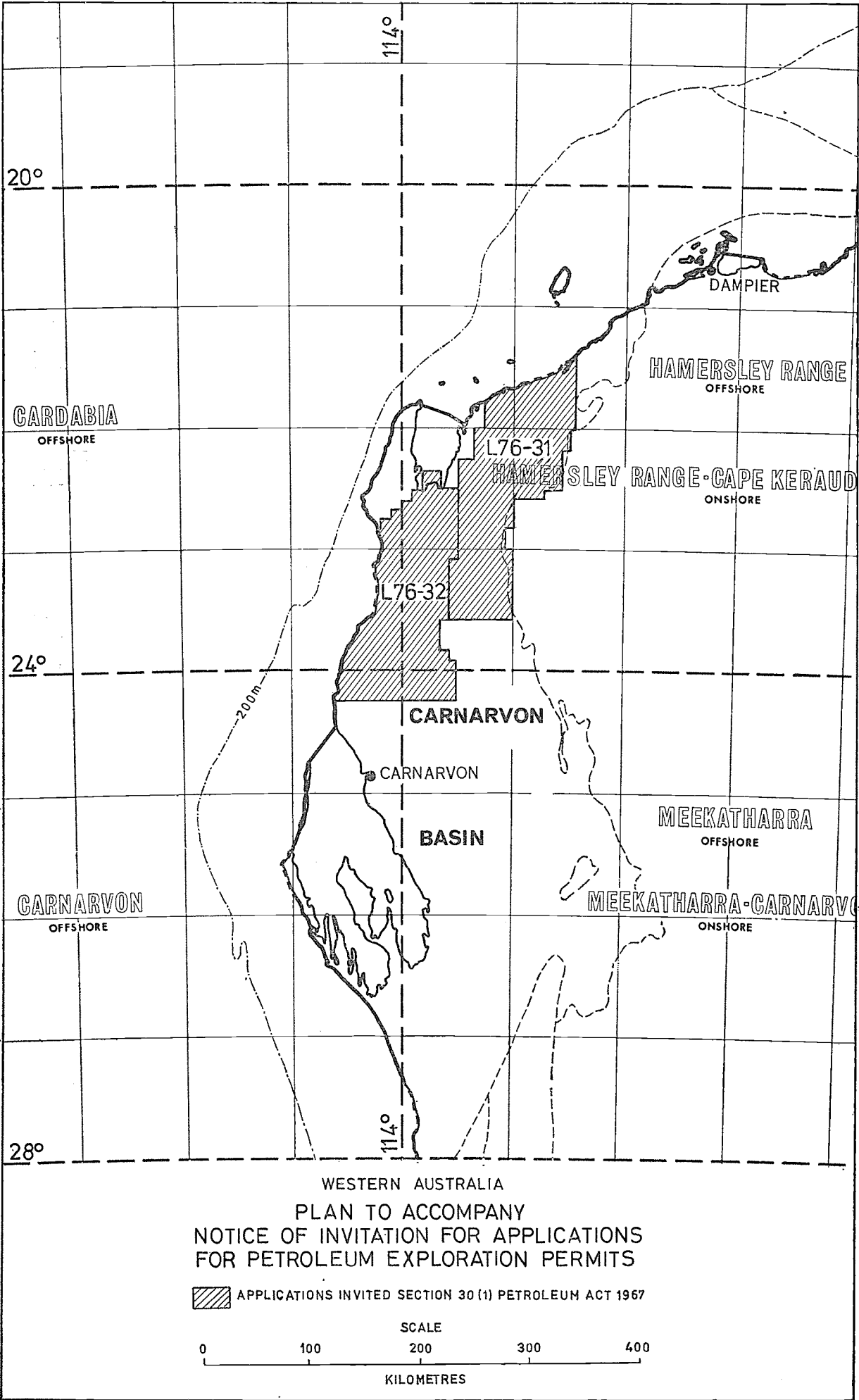
