#### Local Government Act, 1960-1976. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 761/75 (R5212).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1976, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, con-trol, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils men-tioned in the schedule hereto have requested that tioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

(a) by substituting for subregulation (5) the following subregulation—

(5) The characters on a general number plate shall comprise a combination of three letters and three numerals, with the expression "W.A.", above, and the word, "Dealer", below that combination and shall be enamelled or painted on the plate in the colour and on the ground approved by the Authority. ; and

(b) by substituting for subregulations (8) and (9), the following subregulations---

 $(\overline{8})$  The fees payable on the issue and for the use and possession, of general number plates is \$20.00 annually payable in advance.

(9) Where a general number plate or a set of general number plates is lost the person to whom that plate or set of plates was issued shall send to the Authority notice in writing of the loss and, subject to subregulation (4) of regulation 26A, the Authority shall, on proof by statutory declaration of the loss, issue a new set of general number plates to that person.

(10) Where a general number plate has become dilapidated, or is damaged, to such an extent as to render it illegible, the holder of the plate shall return the plate to the Authority and the Authority shall either issue another general number plate in substitution for the dllapidated or damaged plate or issue a new set of general number plates, as it thinks fit.

(11) The fee payable for the issue of a general number plate to replace a general number plate bearing the same characters is \$8.00.

4. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 26 a regulation as follows—

26A. (1) In this regulation "the appointed day" means the day appointed by the Authority, by notice published in the *Gazette*, as the day on and from which the provisions of sub-regulation (8) of this regulation shall take and have effect, being a day not less than sixty days after the day on which that notice is so published.

(2) Every person who is the holder of a set of general number plates issued before the appointed day, and who wishes to continue to use those plates on and after that day, shall before that day, pay to the Authority a deposit of \$20.00 in respect of that set of plates.

(3) A set of general number plates shall not be issued after the appointed day unless a deposit of 20.00 is paid to the Authority in respect of that set of plates in addition to the fee prescribed for the issue of those plates.

(4) Where, on or after the appointed day, a declaration is made pursuant to subregulation (9) of regulation 26 declaring one or both plates of a set of general number plates to be lost, the deposit paid pursuant to this regulation in respect of that set of plates shall be forfeited to the Authority and a new set of plates shall not be issued to replace the lost plate or plates unless a further deposit of \$20.00 is paid to the Authority in addition to the fee prescribed for the issue of the new set of plates.

(5) Where, pursuant to subregulation (10) of regulation 26, a new set of general number plates is issued to replace a set that has become damaged or dilapidated, the deposit paid in respect of the damaged or dilapidated set of plates shall, for the purposes of this regulation, be deemed to have been paid in respect of the new set of plates.

(6) Where the holder of a set of general number plates surrenders those plates to the Authority the Authority shall refund to him the deposit paid under this regulation in respect of those plates.

Reg. 26A added. Conditions for use of general plates. (7) Adhesive labels indicating the month and year in which the annual fee for the use and possession of a set of general number plates is next payable shall be issued by the Authority to the holder of that set of plates—

- (a) on the payment of a deposit in respect of that set of plates pursuant to subregulation (2), (3) or (4), of this regulation and thereafter whenever the annual fee for their use and possession is paid;
- (b) on the issue of a plate or a set of plates pursuant to subregulation (10) of regulation 26.

(8) On or after the appointed day a general number plate shall not be used on an unlicensed motor vehicle unless-

- a) that plate bears an adhesive label issued by the Authority pursuant to subregulation (6) of this regulation indicating the month and year in which the annual fee for the use and possession of the set of plates of which that plate forms part next becomes payable; and
- (b) that plate forms part of a set of general number plates in respect of which a deposit has been paid pursuant to subregulation (2), (3) or (4) of this regulation.

The Carnarvon Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the follow-ing Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of:

- (a) enabling the comprehensive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area;
- (b) controlling the development of the land within the Scheme Area;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

#### Part I.—Preliminary.

1.1 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the "Shire of Carnarvon Town Planning Scheme No. 6—Carnarvon Town Lot 1179" hereinafter referred to as "The Scheme".

1.2 Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for the carrying out of the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Carnarvon hereinafter referred to as "The Council".

1.3 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land enclosed within the inner edge of the broken black border shown on the maps appended hereto.

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:

Part I—Preliminary. Part II—General Objectives. Part III-Method of Carrying Out Objectives.

Part IV-Finance and Administration. The remaining documents are as follows:-

1. Land Use Map.

2. Scheme Map.

1.5 Relationship to Zoning Scheme: To the extent to which the provisions of the Scheme are inconsistent with the Shire of Carnarvon Town Planning Scheme No. 2 the provisions of the Scheme shall prevail.

#### Part II.—General Objectives.

2.1 The general objective of the Scheme is to provide for the subdivision of land within the Scheme Area for residential and associated recreation, public use and commercial purposes.

The Scheme will ensure that provision is made for:

- (a) the subdivision of land for residential purposes;
- (b) recreation and other public uses and a commercial centre;
- (c) the circulation of traffic within the Scheme Area and the connection of the Scheme with adjacent areas of the town of Carnarvon;
- (d) major earthworks and drainage of land and comprehensive drainage of roads;
- (e) reticulated sewerage and water supply to all lots created.

2.2 In carrying out the objectives contained in clause 2.1, the Council's over-riding objective shall be to develop a residential area of the highest possible standard.

The Scheme shall:-

- (a) Establish standards for the development of land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) Provide for the planting of trees and shrubs in road reserves and other areas, the development of recreation reserves and other improvements for the general benefit and amenity of the owners and occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.

Part III—Method of Carrying Out Objectives.

3.1 Works to be Carried Out: The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:-

- (a) Survey: The land within the Scheme Area shall be surveyed and marked generally in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map.
- (b) Filling: Filling and drainage of the Scheme Area shall be undertaken.
- (c) Roads: The lands shown as roads on\_the Scheme Map shall be constructed as bitumen roads and drained, and the neces-sary earthworks undertaken.
- (d) Footways: The lands shown as footways on the Scheme Map shall be constructed and used for that purpose.
- (e) Water Supply and Sewerage: All lots within the Scheme Area shall be connected to a sewerage disposal system and shall be supplied with reticulated water.

3.2 Public Open Space: The land shown on the Scheme Map as Public Open Space shall be set aside for that purpose and transferred to the Crown under section 20A of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended). The land so set aside shall be used for the specific purposes shown on the Scheme Map.

3.3 Commercial Site: The land shown on the Scheme Map as Commercial Area shall be de-veloped according to the following criteria:—

- (a) A parking area occupying not less than 6 600 m<sup>2</sup> shall be developed to supplement the existing shortage of car spaces in the Carnarvon town centre.
- (b) The remaining 11 200 m<sup>2</sup> shall be developed as a commercial centre. Car parking space shall be provided at the rate of  $2 \text{ m}^2$  parking area to  $1 \text{ m}^2$  gross leaseable commercial area, and shall be in addition to that provided under clause 3.3 (a).

3.4 Sale of Lots:-

(a) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of the residential lots and commercial and special sites created by survey of the Scheme Area.

(b) The Council may sell the said lots either by public auction or private contract upon such terms and conditions as it considers fit. In the event of sale by private contract the price shall be not less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia, unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender, that price has not been obtained.

3.5 Acquisition of Land: So much of the land within the Scheme Area as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

Part IV-Finance and Administration.

4.1 Scheme Costs: For the purposes of the Scheme the Scheme Costs shall comprise:—

- (a) The Council's costs of administering the Scheme including such amount of the Council's overhead costs as the Council considers attributable to the Scheme and its administration.
- (b) All fees and costs incurred by the Council in connection with the preparation of the Scheme, the valuation of land and the survey of lots within the Scheme Area.
- (c) The costs of all works, including all earthworks and drainage, the provision of water supply and sewerage to all lots within the Scheme area, the construction of all roads and any other works deemed necessary by the Council for development of the Scheme Area.
- (d) The amount of all compensation paid or payable in respect of land resumed under the Scheme.
- (e) The amount paid or payable for the acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area where such land has been acquired other than by resumption.

4.2 Cost of Works External to the Scheme Area: The cost of certain works on land external to the Scheme Area may be debited to the Scheme provided that such works are essential for or caused by the development of the Scheme Area and/or are for the general benefit and amenity of residents and owners of lots within the Scheme Area.

These works may include:-----

- (a) any drainage, sewer or water supply line which requires discharge or connection to a point outside the Scheme Area;
- (b) any services headworks essential to the Scheme Area which, due to engineering criteria, must be developed or extended on land outside the Scheme Area;
- (c) any upgrading of major roads providing access to the Scheme Area;
- (d) any landscaping works peripheral to and/ or visible from the Scheme Area;
- (e) any other works of benefit to the Scheme Area that from time to time may be deemed necessary by the Council.
- 4.3 Valuations:---
  - (a) Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land or portion thereof for the purpose of the Scheme, the value shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him; or at the option of the Council by a disinterested and competent valuer appointed by the Council.
  - (b) If an owner objects to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.
  - (c) If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values

placed on other land and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in value.

- (d) Where an owner objects to the valuation prepared by the valuer appointed by the Council, the cost of all subsequent valuations together with all other costs incurred by the dispute shall be paid by the owner.
- 4.4 Finance:—
  - (a) The Council shall do all things necessary in order to raise loans or to provide funds from other sources for the purpose of providing the finance necessary for the implementation of the Scheme.
  - (b) In the event of moneys received by the Council pursuant to the Scheme being greater than the amount necessary to repay the said loans and interest thereon or other moneys and carry out the general objects of the Scheme the balance thereof shall be used by the Council in the development of public open space areas and landscaping and other improvements and facilities within or near the Scheme Area.
  - (c) In the event of the Scheme showing a loss, the amount of the loss shall be paid by the Council.

4.5 Powers and Authorities of the Council: In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To develop, purchase, sell and otherwise deal in and dispose of land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
- (e) To establish separate funds for any matters appertaining to the Scheme.

4.6 Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners or between an owner and the Council as to their respective rights under the Scheme or as to the value of any land may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in a manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council.

4.7 Appeal: Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council in the exercise of its discretionary powers under the terms of this Scheme any apreal to the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning or to a Town Planning Court in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the Appeals Regulations made pursuant to that Act.

4.8 Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme may be made within six calendar months of the Scheme coming into operation.

#### HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION ACT, 1946-1975.

Department of Labour and Industry. Perth, 2nd December, 1976.

THE Hairdressers Registration Board of Western Australia acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Hairdressers Registration Act, 1946-1975 and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, has made the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

### Schedule. Regulations.

Principal regulations.

1. In these regulations the Hairdressers Registration Regulations, 1965, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd December, 1971 and amended by notices so published on the 8th November, 1974 and the 19th December, 1975 are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 6 2. The principal regulation as follows-substituted. 6 and substituting a regulation as follows-2. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation

6. Hairdressing for the purposes of the Act and these regulations is divided into five classes as follows:

(1) Men's Hairdressing (Inclusive) which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trim-ming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, colouring of the hair of the head or beard of any male person whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance. It includes blade razor sharpening and the usual maintenance and use of equipment and tools of trade as practised in men's hairdressers' shops.

The expression "men's hairdresser (inclusive)" in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

(2) Men's Hairdressing (Limited) which comprises dressing, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing of the hair of the head or beard of any male person whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

The expression "men's hairdresser (limited)" in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

- Ladies' Hairdressing (Inclusive) which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, colouring of the (3) Ladies' hair of the head of any female person, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance. The expression "ladies' hairdresser (inclusive)" in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.
- Ladies' Hairdressing (Limited) which comprises dressing, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singe-ing of the hair of the head of any female person, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance. The expression "ladies' hairdresser (limited)" in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of these operations of this cleas of hairdressing (4) Ladies' Hairdressing operations of this class of hairdressing.
- (5) Combined Hairdressing which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, colouring of the hair of the head or beard of any male person or the hair of the head of any female person whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, prepara-tion or substance. It includes blade razor sharpening and the usual maintenance and use of equipment and tools of trade as practised in hairdressers' shops. The expression "combined hairdresser" in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

The principal regulations are amended by adding after regula-3. tion 6 a regulation as follows

- 6A. Subject to the Act and these regulations— (a) where, immediately before the date on which this regulation comes into force, a hairdresser was registered in respect of the prescribed class "Men's Hairdressing" that hairdresser shall, on and from that date, be deemed to be registered in respect of the prescribed class "Men's Hairdressing (Inclusive)";

Reg. 6A added.

(b) where, immediately before the date on which this regulation comes into force a hairdresser was registered in respect of the prescribed classes "Men's Hairdressing" and "Ladies' Hairdressing (Inclusive)" that hairdresser shall, on and from that date, be deemed to be registered in respect of the prescribed class "Combined Hairdressing".

Reg. 15 amended. 4. Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking subregulation (1) and substituting a subregulation as follows—

(1) The subjects of the examinations shall be determined by the Board and shall be all or any of the activities set out in paragraph (1) of regulation 6 of these regulations in the case of applicants for registration as men's hairdressers (inclusive) in paragraph (2) of that regulation in the case of applicants for registration as men's hairdressers (limited) in paragraph (3) of that regulation in the case of applicants for registration as ladies' hairdressers (inclusive) in paragraph (4) of that regulation in the case of applicants for registration as ladies' hairdressers (limited) and in paragraph (5) of that regulation in the case of applicants for registration bined hairdressers.

Reg. 17 amended. 5. Regulation 17 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking subregulation (1) and substituting subregulations as follows—

(1) A hairdresser registered in respect of the prescribed class "Men's Hairdressing (Limited)" who is eligible to qualify by examination for registration in the prescribed class "Men's Hairdressing (Inclusive)" shall be required to submit himself for examination in and to pass all or any of the additional subjects required by the Board that are additional to the activities set out in paragraph (2) of regulation 6 of these regulations but are included in paragraph (1) of that regulation.

(1a) A hairdresser registered in respect of the prescribed class "Ladies' Hairdressing (Limited)" who is eligible to qualify by examination for registration in the prescribed class "Ladies' Hairdressing (Inclusive)" shall be required to submit himself for examination in and to pass all or any of the additional subjects required by the Board that are additional to the activities set out in paragraph (4) of regulation 6 of these regulations but are included in paragraph (3) of that regulation.

(1b) A hairdresser registered in respect of any one or more of the prescribed classes "Men's Hairdressing (Inclusive)", "Men's Hairdressing (Limited)", "Ladies' Hairdressing (Inclusive)" or "Ladies Hairdressing (Limited)" who is eligible to qualify by examination for registration in the prescribed class "Combined Hairdressing" shall be required to submit himself for examination in and to pass all or any of the additional subjects required by the Board that are additional to the activities set out in regulation 6 of these regulations in relation to the prescribed class or classes in respect of which he is registered but are included in paragraph (5) of that regulation.



(3) Ladies' Hairdressing (Inclusive) which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching tinting colouring of the hair of the head of any female person whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

(4) Ladies' Hairdressing (Limited) which comprises dressing, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing of the hair of the head of any female person, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

(5) Combined Hairdressing which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting colouring of the hair of the head or beard of any male person or the hair of the head of any female person whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance. It includes blade razor sharpening and the usual maintenance and use of equipment and tools of trade as practised in hairdressers' shops.

#### AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS ACT, 1929-1974

I, THE UNDERSIGNED MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE, being the Minister charged with the administration of the Agricultural Products Act, 1929–1974, acting in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by Section 3D of the said Act and on the recommendation of the Apple Sales Advisory Committee constituted under the Act, do hereby prohibit the sale, except for the purpose of export, of all apples and pears except in accordance with the Schedule hereunder setting out the varieties, grades and minimum sizes of apples and pears which may be sold and the period of operation of this notice. The provisions of this notice shall be read in conjunction with the Agricultural Products (Apple and Pear Grading) Regulations 1970.

A person shall not sell except for the purpose of export from the State, any apples or pears of which the sale, is, pursuant to Section 3D of the Act, prohibited and any person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence. Penalty: One Hundred Dollars.

6. Regulation 32 of the principal regulations is amended-

- (a) as to subregulation (1), by adding after the word "Commission", in line three, the passage ", the industrial union and the appellant by notice in the form of Form B"; and
- (b) by revoking subregulation (2) and substituting the following subregulations---

(2) Where there is no industrial union the Chairman of the Appeal Board shall cause notice to be given to the appellant of the time and place for the hearing of the appeal by notice in the form of Form C.
(3) Upon receipt of a notice in the form of Form B of the time and place fixed for the appeal the Commission shall direct that arrangements be made to allow and enable the appellant and every member of the Appeal Board to attend at the hearing.

7. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 32 the following regulations:---

32A. An appointment pursuant to subparagraph (i) of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 78 of the Act shall be in the form of Form D and shall be lodged with the Commission prior to the seventh day immediately preceding the date fixed for the hearing of the appeal.

32B. Where the industrial union has not made an appointment pursuant to subparagraph (i) of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 78 of the Act prior to the seventh day immediately preceding the date fixed for the appeal the chairman of the Appeal Board shall forthwith cause notice to be given to the appellant of that fact by notice in the form of Form E. 32C. Where an appellant receives a notice in the form of Form C or Form E he shall, not later than the day immediately preceding the date fixed for the hearing of the appeal, appoint a person as a member of the Appeal Board pursuant to subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 78 of the Act by notice in writing in the form of Form F lodged with the Commission.
