Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972, that where the Trustees of the Western Australian Museum recommend that any Aboriginal site is of outstanding importance the Governor may by Order in Council, declare that site to be a protected area; and whereas pursuant to subsection (1) of section 13 of the Act the Trustees, with the consent in writing of the Minister for Education, Cultural Affairs and Recreation, by resolution, have delegated to the Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee, the power to make recommendations to the Governor for the purpose of section 19 of the Act; and whereas the Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee recommend to the Governor that the petroglyph and occupation site at South West Creek—Site No. 4 is an Aboriginal site of outstanding importance: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972, hereby declares that the area specified in the first column of the schedule to this order is a protected area for the purpose of the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972, in relation to the Aboriginal Site specified in the second column.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

File No. 947/69.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 34294 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Dandaragan in trust for the purpose of "Parking and Recreation": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Dandaragan in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act, and subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) Permanent development shall not be carried out within 50 metres eastward of the western boundary of the reserve and within that 50 metre width temporary development such as Parking is not to occupy more than 40% of the surface area nor be concentrated at one section of the said width.
- (b) The top soil removed during any development shall be stored and respread on damaged or disturbed areas needing revegetation.
- (c) Provide defined access between the beach and the Parking Area and discourage indiscriminate traffic across the vegetated dunes.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 34491, should vest in and be held by the Shire of Esperance, in trust

for the purpose of "Club and Club Premises": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Esperance, in trust for "Club and Club Premises", with power to the said Shire of Esperance, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands to each and every lease or assignment of lease being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion thereof for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to me by section 37 of the said Act; provided that no such lease or assignment of lease shall be valid or operative until the approval of the Minister for Lands, or an officer authorised in that behalf by the Minister, has been endorsed on the Lease Instrument, or Deed of Assignment, as the case may be.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. No. 1412/67.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 30196 (Kelmscott Lot 235) should be granted in fee simple to The Roman Catholic Archbishop of Perth to be held in trust for the purpose of "Schoolsite (Roman Catholic)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to The Roman Catholic Archbishop of Perth to be held in trust for the purpose of "Schoolsite (Roman Catholic)" subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Schedule.
Regulations.

1. In these regulations the Enzootic Diseases Regulations, 1970, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th June, 1970 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published and reprinted as so amended pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th March, 1974 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the passage "PART 5.—INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF STOCK BY SEA—regulations 35-40." and substituting the passage "PART 5.—INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF STOCK—regulations 34A-40."

3. Regulation 30 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the passage "The Form No. 6" in line one of subregulation (2) and substituting the passage "Form No. 6, 6A or 6B, as the case may be,".

4. The principal regulations are amended by deleting the heading "PART 5.—INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF STOCK BY SEA." before regulation 35.

5. The principal regulations are amended by adding the following heading and regulation before regulation 35:—

PART 5.—INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF STOCK.

Division 1.—General.

34A. (1) In this regulation:—

"column" means a column of the Table in the Fifth Schedule.

(2) The Fifth Schedule sets out the prohibitions and conditions (if any) applicable in relation to the intrastate movement of cattle.

(3) A person who moves or introduces cattle from—

(a) a portion of the State of the kind specified in column 1; or

(b) a herd of cattle of the kind specified in column 1;

into—

(c) a portion of the State of the kind specified in column 2; or

(d) a herd of cattle of the kind specified in column 2,

opposite and corresponding to that portion of the State or that herd of cattle, as the case may be, otherwise than in accordance with the prohibitions or the conditions (if any) numbered in column 3 opposite and corresponding to the portion of the State specified in column 2 or the herd of cattle specified in that column, as the case may be, and set out below the Table in the Fifth Schedule commits an offence.

(4) Except where otherwise required by the Fifth Schedule, the provisions of the Fifth Schedule do not apply in relation to the movement of cattle for the purpose of immediate slaughter.

6. The principal regulations are amended by adding before regulation 35 the following heading:—

Division 2.—Intrastate Movement of Stock by Sea.

7. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 39 the following regulation:—

39A. Except with the written permission of the Chief Inspector, stock from parts of the State within a cattle tick free area shall not be shipped in a vessel that is also carrying cattle from a cattle tick infected area.

8. Regulations 41 to 48 (both inclusive) of the principal regulations are revoked and the following regulations substituted—

41. (1) For the purposes of these regulations the Minister may by notice published in the *Government Gazette* declare any part of the State to be a cattle tick free area or a cattle tick infected area.

(2) A declaration made pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation may be varied or cancelled by the Minister by a subsequent notice published in the *Government Gazette*.

42. All treatment carried out on stock for the purposes of the prevention or eradication of cattle tick pursuant to these regulations shall be paid for by the owner of the stock and shall be in accordance with the appropriate fee prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.

43. A person shall not move, out of a cattle tick infected area, any conveyance that has, within six months prior to such movement, been used to transport cattle within the cattle tick infected area, unless the conveyance is first treated to the satisfaction of an inspector for the destruction of cattle tick and buffalo fly.

9. Regulations 55 to 64 (both inclusive) are revoked and the following regulations substituted—

55. For the purposes of these regulations—

“tuberculosis free area”, “tuberculosis provisionally free area”,
“tuberculosis eradication area”,

“tuberculosis control area” means an area of the State declared pursuant to regulation 56 of these regulations to be a free area, provisionally free area, eradication area or control area, as the case requires, in relation to tuberculosis of cattle.

56. (1) The Minister may from time to time by notice published in the *Government Gazette* declare any part of the State to be a tuberculosis free area, a tuberculosis provisionally free area, a tuberculosis eradication area, or a tuberculosis control area and apply to any area so declared a designation for the purposes of these regulations.

(2) A declaration made pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation may be varied or cancelled by the Minister by a subsequent notice published in the *Government Gazette*.

57. (1) For the purposes of these regulations, a reference to an “accredited tuberculosis free herd” is a reference to a herd of cattle declared pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation to be an accredited tuberculosis free herd.

(2) Where the Chief Inspector is satisfied in relation to a herd of cattle that—

- (a) the herd is held under management and facilities that are of such a standard as would maintain that herd free from tuberculosis;
- (b) all cattle in the herd are individually identified in an approved manner;
- (c) all cattle in the herd that are more than 12 months of age have passed not less than two tuberculin tests at not less than 8 and not more than 16 weeks apart with negative results; and
- (d) all the animals in the herd over the age of 12 months have given negative results to a tuberculin test carried out on them not more than 60 days after the date of the expiry of a period not exceeding 36 months since the last tuberculin test previously carried out on the herd,

he may by written notice declare the herd to be an accredited tuberculosis free herd.

(3) A declaration made under subregulation (1) of this regulation in relation to a herd remains in force until revoked by the Chief Inspector.

58. (1) A person shall not carry out a tuberculin test on cattle for the purposes of these regulations unless—

- (a) he is a veterinary surgeon registered under the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1960; and
- (b) the Chief Inspector has approved of him as a person who may carry out such a test.

(2) An approval given by the Chief Inspector to a person to carry out tuberculin tests may be revoked by the Chief Inspector at any time.

59. Where an animal on being tested for the diagnosis of tuberculosis gives a positive reaction to the test the person giving the test—

- (a) shall forthwith notify the Chief Inspector of that fact and give to him such particulars relating to the animal as the Chief Inspector may require; and
- (b) shall cause it to be branded for the purpose of identification in such manner approved by the Chief Inspector.

60. Where an officer of the Department of Agriculture carries out a tuberculin test on cattle, either pursuant to these regulations or on request, the owner or person having charge of the animal shall on demand pay the cost of the test as prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.

10. Regulations 65 to 78 (both inclusive) of the principal regulations are revoked and the following regulations substituted—

65. For the purposes of these regulations—

“brucellosis free area”, “brucellosis provisionally free area”, “brucellosis eradication area”, means an area of the State declared pursuant to regulation 66 of these regulations to be a free area, a provisionally free area or an eradication area in relation to brucellosis in cattle;

“accredited brucellosis free herd” means a herd declared to be an accredited brucellosis free herd pursuant to regulation 68 of these regulations;

“certified brucellosis free herd” means a herd declared to be a certified brucellosis free herd pursuant to regulation 69 of these regulations.

“brucellosis controlled herd” means a herd declared to be a brucellosis controlled herd pursuant to regulation 70 of these regulations;

“compulsory vaccination area” means an area of the State declared to be a compulsory vaccination area pursuant to regulation 72.

66. (1) For the purposes of these regulations, the Minister may from time to time by notice published in the *Government Gazette* declare any part of the State to be a brucellosis free area, a brucellosis provisionally free area or a brucellosis eradication area, and apply to any area so declared a designation for the purposes of these regulations.

(2) A declaration made under subregulation (1) of this regulation may be varied or cancelled by the Minister by a subsequent notice published in the *Government Gazette*.

67. (1) The owner of any herd situated within a brucellosis free area, a brucellosis provisionally free area, or a brucellosis eradication area shall notify the nearest inspector if he knows or suspects that a bovine animal has aborted or calved prematurely.

(2) The owner of such animals known or suspected to have aborted or calved prematurely, shall, where possible, keep the affected animals in isolation and separated from the rest of the herd until otherwise allowed by an inspector.

68. (1) Where the Chief Inspector is satisfied in relation to a herd of cattle that—

(a) the herd is not known to be or is not suspected of being affected with brucellosis and all breeding animals in the herd over the age of 6 months have completed two approved tests for brucellosis at intervals of not less than 6 months and have shown no evidence of the disease;

(b) all breeding cattle in the herd have been identified in an approved manner; and

(c) the herd is held under such conditions that it is not at risk to the introduction of brucellosis,

he may by written notice declare the herd to be an accredited brucellosis free herd.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation but subject to paragraphs (b) and (c) of that subregulation the Chief Inspector may make a declaration pursuant to that subregulation in relation to a herd that has been known to have been infected with brucellosis before the making of the declaration if he is satisfied that

all breeding animals in the herd over the age of six months have before the making of the declaration completed not less than three approved tests for brucellosis over a period of twelve months immediately preceding the date of the making of the declaration and have shown no evidence of the disease.

(3) A declaration made pursuant to this regulation ceases to have effect in relation to a herd unless an approved brucellosis test is conducted on all breeding animals in the herd over the age of 6 months not later than 60 days after every anniversary of the last such test.

69. (1) Where the Chief Inspector is satisfied in relation to a herd of cattle that—

- (a) the herd is not known to be or is not suspected of being infected with brucellosis, and all breeding animals in the herd over the age of 6 months have completed two approved tests for brucellosis at intervals of not less than 6 months and have shown no evidence of the disease;
- (b) all breeding animals in the herd have been identified in an approved manner; and
- (c) the herd is held under such conditions that it is not at risk to the introduction of brucellosis,

he may by written notice declare the herd to be a certified brucellosis free herd.

(2) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation but subject to paragraphs (b) and (c) of that subregulation, the Chief Inspector may make a declaration pursuant to that subregulation in relation to a herd of cattle that has been known to have been infected with brucellosis before the making of the declaration if he is satisfied that all breeding cattle in the herd that are over the age of 6 months have completed not less than three approved brucellosis tests over a period of twelve months immediately preceding the date of the making of the declaration and have shown no evidence of the disease.

(3) A declaration made under this regulation in relation to a herd of cattle ceases to have effect in relation to the herd unless an approved brucellosis test of all breeding animals in the herd is carried out not later than 60 days after the third anniversary of the last such test.

70. (1) Where a herd of cattle in a brucellosis eradication area is not held under quarantine conditions and—

- (a) has a herd test for brucellosis conducted on all breeding animals in the herd with negative results; or
- (b) has had a test of such numbers of breeding cattle that a 99 per cent probability of the prevalence of infection from brucellosis not exceeding 0.5 per cent is revealed,

the Chief Inspector may declare the herd to be a brucellosis controlled herd.

71. The Chief Inspector may at any time revoke any declaration made pursuant to regulation 68, 69 or 70 of these regulations.

72. (1) The Minister may by notice published in the *Government Gazette* declare any part of the State to be a "compulsory brucellosis vaccination area" and may by subsequent notice vary or revoke that declaration.

(2) Where a part of the State has been declared to be a compulsory brucellosis vaccination area pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation the owner of any cattle in that area shall upon being requested by the Chief Inspector so to do submit such cattle as are required by the Chief Inspector or an inspector for inoculation by an inspector or veterinary surgeon with a brucella vaccine approved by the Chief Inspector.

(3) Inoculation of cattle carried out pursuant to this regulation shall be carried out free of charge.

73. (1) A person shall not vaccinate any cattle against brucellosis unless he is an inspector, or a veterinary surgeon registered under the provisions of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1960*, and has been approved for that purpose by the Chief Inspector.

(2) An approval granted by the Chief Inspector under subregulation (1) of this regulation may be revoked by him at any time by notice in writing.

74. A person shall not inoculate cattle or horses with Strain 19 vaccine without the prior approval of the Chief Inspector.

75. (1) An inspector or veterinary surgeon who vaccinates any cattle with a brucella vaccine shall cause the cattle to be marked for identification with an ear mark of a type approved by the Chief Inspector for the purpose.

(2) The ear mark required by subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be placed in that ear of the cattle not already marked with the owner's ear mark registered under the Stock (Brands and Movement) Act, 1970.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation, where the cattle vaccinated are of stud stock the inspector or veterinary surgeon administering the inoculation may issue a certificate instead of an ear mark showing the date of the inoculation and particulars that will enable the cattle to be identified, and the owner or person in charge of the animal or animals shall produce that certificate at the request of an inspector.

CONDITIONS.

Preliminary.

In these conditions—

“Brucellosis Test” means a Rose Bengal Plate Test and Complement Fixation Test;

“Tuberculin Test” means a single intradermal caudal fold test using bovine PPD tuberculin read at 72 hours.

Notwithstanding anything in this Schedule, a person shall not move cattle from any portion of the State into a—

- (a) brucellosis free area;
- (b) brucellosis provisionally free area;
- (c) tuberculosis free area;
- (d) tuberculosis provisionally free area,

for the purpose of immediate slaughter unless a permit in the form of Form 3 has been issued by an inspector.

General.

1. Permit in the form of Form 3 issued by an Inspector. Movement shall be direct and any off-loading into areas or premises of lower status shall be only into approved yards or premises.

2. When moving to accredited, certified, and controlled herds, consignee shall:—

- (a) notify the nearest Inspector within 14 days of the date of introduction of the cattle;
- (b) isolate and keep isolated from the herd, any cattle introduced onto the property, unless and until otherwise directed by an Inspector; and
- (c) submit any introduced cattle to such tests as an Inspector may direct.

Brucellosis.

3. A brucellosis test of breeding cattle shall be carried out not earlier than 30 days prior to movement, with negative results. Cattle shall be held in isolation during that period.

4. Breeding cattle shall have been resident on the property of origin for not less than 90 days prior to testing for movement.

5. Non-pregnant females and bulls shall be isolated on the property of introduction and a brucellosis test conducted on them with negative results, not earlier than 60 days nor later than 90 days after the date of introduction.

6. Pregnant females shall be isolated on the property of introduction. Animals shall be held in isolation until a brucellosis test is conducted on them with negative results not earlier than 15 days and not later than 45 days after calving.

Tuberculosis.

7. Every animal in the group to be moved shall be subjected to a tuberculin test with negative results; non-reactor cattle from a mob in which positive reactors occur may be moved into areas other than a Tuberculosis Free Area if, not less than 60 days after the removal of reactors, they are submitted to a tuberculin test with negative results.

8. Introduced cattle shall be isolated and tuberculin tested 8-16 weeks after the last test, with negative results.

Cattle Tick.

9. Cattle shall be free of ticks before movement off the property of origin. Immediately prior to movement out of the infected area cattle shall be dipped in an approved insecticidal solution lethal to cattle tick and dipped, or sprayed with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to buffalo fly, under the supervision of an inspector, or cattle shall be free of ticks and shall not during the period of 35 days immediately preceding movement have been in an area in which cattle tick is known or suspected to exist.

Immediately prior to movement out of the infected area cattle shall be dipped in an approved insecticidal solution lethal to cattle tick, and, dipped or sprayed with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to buffalo fly, under the supervision of an inspector.

All movement shall be by road transport or by sea vessel only.

10. Where cattle are moved for the purpose of immediate slaughter:—

- (a) every animal shall be dipped, under the supervision of an inspector, with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to cattle tick and dipped or sprayed with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to buffalo fly;
- (b) the cattle shall be moved only in approved transport without being depastured anywhere along the route.

11. Where the animals consist of a horse, mule, donkey or camel, every animal to be moved shall be dipped or sprayed with an approved insecticidal solution under the supervision of an inspector at a place that has been approved and within 24 hours prior to movement.

12. The Chief Inspector may grant written permission subject to any other conditions which he may from time to time deem necessary to impose.
