Bunbury Crematorium By-laws.

LG: 116/76.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Trustees of the Bunbury General Cemetery Board, the said Board makes the following By-laws on resolution of the Council of the Municipality of Bunbury, recorded on 27th September, 1976, for confirmation by the Governor.

1. These By-laws shall apply to the Southern section of Reserve 14000 which area and buildings thereon are clearly marked and to be known as the "Bunbury Crematorium" hereinafter called the "Crematorium" which applies to the surrounds of the Crematorium also.

2. In these By-laws "The Trustees" of the Bunbury Cemetery Board hereinafter called "The Board" mean the Mayor and Councillors of the Town of Bunbury elected in accordance with the Local Government Act, 1960-1976—

"The Secretary" means the person for the time being employed by the Board and Secretary of the Cemetery.

"The Superintendent" means the person for the time being employed by the Board as Superintendent.

"The Cremation Act" refers to the Cremation Act, 1929 as amended from time to time.

"Funeral" includes the burial or cremation of a dead body and all associated processions and ceremonies, but does not include so much of a ceremonial that is solely a religious rite.

"Undertake a Funeral" means to manage a funeral for reward.

"Undertaker" means a person firm or company the holder of a current annual Undertakers License issued by the Bunbury Cemetery Board.

"Vehicle" means any motor car, motor truck, motor cycle, carriage cart, bicycle or other means of conveyance of whatsoever kind or nature and howsoever ridden driven or impelled.

3. The Secretary shall, subject to the control of the Board, exercise general supervision and control over all matter appertaining to the Crematorium and to carrying out and enforcement of these By-laws.

4. The Superintendent shall have charge of the general care of the Crematorium including buildings, surrounds, cremations, disposing of ashes, keeping of registers as required by the Cremation Act and Regulations made under the Act.

5. The Board may engage other Officers and servants where their employment is necessary or expedient for carrying out the provision of the Cemeteries Act and Cremation Act.



6. No person employed by or under the Board shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Crematorium other than the remuneration he receives from the Board, and any person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

7. Unless otherwise ordered the entrance to the Crematorium shall remain open daily between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

8. The hours for Cremation shall be—

9.30 a.m. to 4.15 p.m. (Mondays to Fridays).

9.30 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. (Saturdays at penalty rates).

No Cremation shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the Crematorium at any other hour except by written permission of the Board and by payment of the penalty rates set down in Appendix B to these by-laws.

9. A person desiring a funeral within the Crematorium shall be an Undertaker and make application to the Board and lodge with the application the following—

Form 1 Application for Cremation;

Form 2 Permit to Cremate,

as set out in Appendix "A" to these By-laws.

10. Metal or metal lined coffins will not be accepted for cremation.

11. The Undertaker shall deposit the coffin for cremation on the catafalque in the Crematorium and all further services will be rendered by and be under the sole control of the Board.

12. The Board shall remove the name plate from the coffin prior to the cremation and shall place it in the container for the ashes.

13. The Board may remove any metal fitting on coffins for cremation which in their opinion could impede the cremation or cause damage to the crematorium retorts.

14. An Administrator, as defined in the Cremation Act, if he has not given directions for disposal of ashes in the application to cremate, may do so by lodging an authorisation for disposal at the office of the Board and the Board shall accept such an authorisation as evidence that the person signing the authorisation is in fact entitled to dispose of the ashes. Authorisation to be as form 3 Appendix "A".

15. An Administrator may at anytime, insofar as it is possible and in the opinion of the Board reasonable, vary his directions for disposal of the ashes on payment of all fees and expenses arising therefrom.

16. If within 6 months of the date of cremation ashes have not been claimed or no arrangements have been made for their disposal they may be disposed of by the Board.

17. Ashes held by the Board at the request of an Administrator after the expiration of six months from the date of cremation shall be subject to a holding fee payable monthly in advance. In the event of default being made in payment the Board may dispose of the ashes.

18. A dead body not be brought into the Crematorium unless—

(i) The Board has accepted an application for its cremation.

(ii) A permit to cremate has been received by the Board.

(iii) It is enclosed in a substantial coffin bearing the name of the deceased person stamped (or otherwise indelibly inscribed) in legible characters on metal plate on the lid of the coffin.

19. The Board will record, maintain and keep a register of all cremations as required under the Cremation Act and Regulations pursuant thereto.

20. The time to be fixed for a funeral shall be at the discretion of the Board but subject to these by-laws will be as near as possible to the time requested by the applicant.

21. No dog may enter the Crematorium. Any dog found within the area will be impounded.

22. No person may promote or advertise or carry on within the Crematorium any trade business or profession either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise or by any system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written permission of the Board first had and obtained which permission will be in the Board's absolute discretion to grant or withhold. The Board has the right to withdraw any permission so given at any time and without compensation.

23. Any person infringing these by-laws or behaving in a manner that in the opinion of the Board or one of its officers is inappropriate or unbecoming in a Crematorium may be expelled and subjected to a fine.

24. Smoking shall not be allowed in the Crematorium building or immediate surrounds nor shall firearms be discharged except in the case of a Military Funeral controlled by an Officer of the Armed Forces.

25. Ashes will be made available to the Administrator 7 days after the date of Cremation.

26. Any person found guilty of breaching these by-laws commits an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding the maximum prescribed under the Cremation Act or any Act of Parliament under which the offender has transgressed.

27. The charges and fees for the Cremation are as set down in Appendix "B" to these by-laws.

THE above by-laws for the Bunbury Crematorium were adopted by the Council of the Town of Bunbury as Trustees for the Bunbury Cemetery Board at the Council meeting of 27th September, 1976.

## INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1976.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting pursuant to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1976, and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918, has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto.

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Schedule.  
Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Arbitration Act (Elections by Postal Ballot) Regulations, 1977.
2. (1) In these regulations—  
“Returning Officer” means—
  - (a) in relation to an election to which section 36M of the Act applies—the person who conducts the election; and
  - (b) in relation to any other election—the person appointed under the rules of the union to conduct the election;“the Act” means the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912; and  
“union” includes a branch, section or other division of a union.
  - (2) Words and expressions used in any of these regulations have, unless the contrary intention appears, the same respective meanings as in the Act.
  3. Where in these regulations provision is made in respect of matters relating to the conduct of an election for an office, the rules of the union to which that office relates shall not apply in respect to those matters except to the extent to which those rules so apply by virtue of these regulations.
  4. In addition to the matters referred to in section 9 of the Act, the rules of a society relating to elections for office shall make provision for—
    - (a) the title of each office for which an election is to be held;
    - (b) the term for which each officer is to be elected;
    - (c) the title of each office which shall form the Committee of Management;
    - (d) the requirements, as to eligibility and otherwise, to be fulfilled by a person wishing to become a candidate for election to office, or any particular office;
    - (e) the manner in which casual vacancies are to be filled, the term of office of a person elected to fill a casual vacancy being limited to the unexpired portion of the term for which the previous holder of the office vacated was elected; and
    - (f) the eligibility of members to vote at an election.
  5. (1) The Returning Officer shall determine the times and dates of the commencement and close of the period for lodging nominations of candidates for election for an office having regard to—
    - (a) the date of expiration of the term of office of the holder of the office;
    - (b) the time required to lodge nominations;
    - (c) the time required to complete the election; and
    - (d) the provisions of the rules of the union relating to the times and dates of the commencement and close of the period for lodging nominations in respect of the election.(2) The Returning Officer shall determine the place for lodging nominations of candidates for election.
  6. (1) The Returning Officer shall, not less than 14 days and not more than 21 days before the date of commencement of the period for lodging nominations of candidates for an election for an office, cause to be published in a newspaper or newspapers circulating widely within the State a notice setting out—
    - (a) the name of the union;
    - (b) the title of the office;
    - (c) the form in which nominations are to be made;
    - (d) the place for lodging nominations;
    - (e) the times and dates of the commencement and close of the period for lodging nominations, which shall be a period of not less than 7 days, and inviting nominations of persons, eligible for election for the office under the rules of the union, to stand as candidates for election for the office.(2) Where the rules of a union provide for a notice inviting nominations of candidates for election to be published in a manner other than in such a newspaper, the Returning Officer, in addition to publishing the notice referred to in subregulation (1) in the manner provided by that subregulation, shall, if practicable, publish the notice referred to in that subregulation in the manner provided by those rules.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

7. (1) A person is not eligible for election for an office unless the nomination is signed by that person signifying his willingness to accept the office if elected and is also signed by the number of persons qualified under the rules of the union to nominate a candidate for that office that is equal to the number of nominators required under those rules for a nomination for that office.

(2) Where the Returning Officer finds that a document lodged at the place and within the period determined by the Returning Officer under regulation 5 and purporting to be the nomination of a person as a candidate for an election for an office is not a nomination in accordance with the provisions of subregulation (1), the Returning Officer shall, if practicable, give notice to that person by telegram of the reasons why the document is not a nomination in accordance with those provisions and advise that person that a proper nomination may be lodged—

(a) within a period of 7 days after the date of sending the telegram; or

(b) where, under the rules of the union, a defective nomination may be remedied within a period of longer than 7 days after the close of the period for lodging nominations—within that longer period.

(3) A person nominated as a candidate may, by notice signed by him witnessed by an elector and addressed to and lodged with the Returning Officer before the time fixed for the expiry of the period for lodging nominations, withdraw his consent to the nomination and that person shall thereupon be deemed not to have been nominated.

8. (1) Where on the expiry of the period for lodging the nomination of a candidate for election for an office, only one candidate is nominated for election for the office, the Returning Officer shall declare in accordance with these regulations that the candidate has been elected to that office.

(2) Where on the expiry of the period for lodging the nomination of a candidate for election for an office no nomination for that office has been received, the Returning Officer shall as soon as practicable after the expiry of that period so advise the union.

(3) Where pursuant to subregulation (2) the Returning Officer advises a union that no nomination for an office has been received the Committee of Management may thereupon appoint a person eligible to hold that office and a person so appointed shall for all purposes be deemed to have been elected by the members of the union.

9. (1) The full names and addresses of the members of the union who are entitled under the rules of the union to vote in that election shall form the electoral roll for the election.

(2) The Returning Officer shall be provided by the union with a roll of the persons who, on the twenty-first day before the date determined under subregulation (1) of regulation 11 of these regulations for the commencement of issuing ballot papers, are entitled to vote in the election, and that roll shall—

(a) be so provided fourteen days before the date so determined under subregulation (1) of regulation 11 of these regulations;

(b) be certified as correct by an authorised officer of the union; and

(c) show the full names in alphabetical order of surname, and where the surnames are identical in alphabetical order of Christian or given names, (the surname being in each case given before the Christian or given names relating thereto) with a consecutive number against each name in a margin at the left hand side of the surname.

(3) The Returning Officer shall add to the roll referred to in subregulation (2) the names and addresses of persons who, after the day referred to in that subregulation, become entitled to vote in the election.

(4) The Returning Officer shall delete from the roll referred to in subregulation (2) the names of persons who, after the day referred to in that subregulation, cease to be entitled to vote in the election.

(5) The Returning Officer shall, at the place where he carries out his functions as Returning Officer, make the electoral roll applicable to an election for an office available for inspection by members of the union, or by any person authorized by the Returning Officer, during the ordinary hours of business in the period that commences on the day referred to in subregulation (2) and ends on the day on which the result of the election is declared.

10. The Returning Officer shall use, for the purpose of receiving ballot papers in respect of an election, a private box at a post office, being a private box used exclusively for that purpose.

11. (1) Where more than one candidate is nominated for election for an office, the Returning Officer shall determine the date of commencement of issuing ballot papers and the time and date of the close of the ballot having regard to—

(a) the date of expiration of the term of office of the holder of the office;

(b) the time required to send and return ballot papers by post;

(c) the time required to complete the election; and

(d) the provisions of the rules of the union relating to the times and dates of the commencement and close of the ballot in respect of the election.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

(2) As soon as practicable after the date determined under subregulation (1) for the commencement of issuing ballot papers in respect of an election, the Returning Officer shall issue, by posting by prepaid post, to each person—

- (a) whose name is on the roll referred to in subregulation (2) of regulation 9 of these regulations;
- (b) whose name is, under subregulation (3) of regulation 9, added to the roll; and
- (c) whose name has not, before the issue of the ballot paper, been deleted from the roll under subregulation (4) of regulation 9,

at the address shown on the roll, a ballot paper and the other ballot material in a sealed envelope and provide for the return of the ballot paper without expense to the voter.

(3) Where in respect of an election the Returning Officer has, under subregulation (2), issued a ballot paper to a person whose name is after the issue of the ballot paper, deleted from the roll under subregulation (4) of regulation 9, the person shall be deemed to be entitled to vote in the election.

(4) The envelope referred to in subregulation (2) shall bear an instruction that, if it is not delivered to the addressee, it should be returned to the private box referred to in regulation 10.

(5) The envelope referred to in subregulation (2) shall contain—

- (a) a ballot paper initialled by the Returning Officer or bearing a facsimile of those initials;
- (b) an envelope marked "ballot paper"; and
- (c) an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer at the private box referred to in regulation 10, being an envelope that may be posted without expense to the voter, the back of which envelope may be used as a counterfoil and, where the back of that envelope is not so used, a separate counterfoil, the counterfoil being numbered to coincide with the number shown against the name of that person on the electoral roll.

(6) The counterfoil shall be numbered with a number coinciding with the voters consecutive number on the electoral roll, and shall make provision for the endorsement thereon of—

- (a) the office or offices to which the election relates;
- (b) the full name of the voter;
- (c) the address of the voter; and
- (d) the signature of the voter.

(7) The ballot paper for an election for an office shall be in a form that is in accordance with the rules of the union relating to the form of ballot paper for an election for that office or, where there is no such, or insufficient, provision in those rules, in accordance with a form determined, subject to subregulations (9) and (10), by the Returning Officer.

(8) The Returning Officer shall obtain from the printer of the ballot papers a certificate stating the number of ballot papers printed in respect of the election.

(9) Where the rules of the union do not provide for the order in which the names of candidates for election for an office shall appear on the ballot paper for that election, the full names shall appear in the alphabetical order of the surnames of the candidates or, in relation to candidates whose surnames are identical, in the alphabetical order of their Christian or given names.

(10) The Returning Officer shall include on the ballot paper information and instructions to the voter that is substantially in accordance with the following form:—

- (a) the title of the office to which the election relates;
- (b) the time and date of the close of the ballot;
- (c) how to mark the ballot paper in order to record a formal vote, so that such instructions shall comply with the rules of the union as far as possible;
- (d) not to put on the ballot paper any mark or writing by which the voter can be identified;
- (e) to place the ballot paper when completed in the envelope marked "ballot paper" and then to seal that envelope;
- (f) to complete the details on the counterfoil; and
- (g) to place the ballot paper envelope (and the counterfoil if a separate one is used) in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, and then to seal the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer and post it to reach the Returning Officer before the time of the close of the ballot.

12. (1) Where, on application before the time of the close of the ballot in an election, the Returning Officer is satisfied that a ballot paper or return envelope issued to a person whose name is on the electoral roll, has not been received or has been lost, destroyed or spoilt, he shall issue to that person a duplicate ballot paper, or return envelope, as the case may be.

(2) An application under subregulation (1) by a person for a duplicate ballot paper, or return envelope, for an election shall be in writing setting out the grounds on which the application is made and declaring that the person has not voted in the election and shall, if practicable, be accompanied by any evidence that is available of that non-receipt, loss destruction or damage.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

13. At the time of the close of the ballot but not before, and in the presence of the scrutineers, or where a scrutineer has been informed in accordance with regulation 16 but is not present at the appointed time in his absence, the Returning Officer shall—

- (a) collect all envelopes from the private box at the post office;
- (b) take all the envelopes so collected to the place of count and proceed to make the count; and
- (c) keep all those envelopes in safe custody until the count is complete.

14. Pursuant to section 36L of the Act the Returning Officer in consultation with the Committee of Management shall make provision for the preservation in the custody of the union of—

- (a) all ballot papers admitted as formal;
- (b) all ballot papers rejected as informal;
- (c) all counterfoils relating to the ballot papers, whether formal or informal;
- (d) all envelopes received after the close of the ballot;
- (e) the marked electoral roll against which the counterfoils were checked; and
- (f) unused ballot papers, counterfoils and other documents prepared in connection with the election,

which shall be respectively placed in separate containers each endorsed with the name of the union and the office to which the election relates and shall be sealed, signed and dated by the Returning Officer and retained for a period of not less than one year after the date of the election.

15. (1) The Returning Officer before proceeding to count the number of votes to ascertain which candidate is successful in the election shall—

- (a) check each counterfoil against the member's name on the electoral roll and, if the voting papers are in order, mark the roll;
- (b) remove the ballot paper envelope from the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer and place the ballot paper envelope unopened into a separate container until all counterfoils are checked; and
- (c) when all the counterfoils are checked and cleared, open the ballot paper envelopes,

and shall then proceed with the count.

(2) Where any voting papers are rejected the Returning Officer shall replace the counterfoil and the envelope marked "ballot paper" in the envelope in which they were received, endorse the latter envelope "rejected" with the reasons for rejection and set it aside for safe keeping.

(3) The Returning Officer shall reject as informal a ballot paper that—

- (a) does not bear the initials of the Returning Officer or the facsimile of those initials that is referred to in paragraph (a) of subregulation (5) of regulation 11 of these regulations;
- (b) has upon it a mark or writing by which the voter can be identified; or
- (c) is not marked substantially in accordance with the instructions referred to in paragraph (c) of subregulation (10) of regulation 11.

(4) Where, during the scrutiny, the Returning Officer is informed by a scrutineer appointed under regulation 16 of these regulations that the scrutineer objects to a ballot paper being admitted as formal, or rejected as informal, as the case may be, the Returning Officer shall decide the matter and endorse his decision on the ballot paper.

16. (1) Each candidate nominated for election may, by written notice given to the Returning Officer not less than 7 days prior to the close of the ballot, appoint to be a scrutineer a person who is eligible, under the rules of the union, to be a scrutineer in respect of that election, being a person other than a candidate, and may by notice in like manner appoint another such person to carry out the functions of scrutineer where the first-mentioned person does not carry out those functions.

(2) A scrutineer appointed under subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be given sufficient notice, in writing by the Returning Officer prior to the date and time when the Returning Officer opens the private box at the post office, to enable him to be present while the Returning Officer performs his functions.

(3) Subject to subregulation (4), a scrutineer appointed under this regulation may—

- (a) be present while the Returning Officer carries out his functions under regulation 13 and regulation 15;
- (b) direct the attention of the Returning Officer to any irregularity concerning the issue of ballot papers, the admission of any envelope to scrutiny, the admission of a ballot paper as formal, the rejection of a ballot paper as informal or the counting of the votes; and
- (c) carry out any other functions of a scrutineer under the rules of the union.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

- (4) Where a scrutineer appointed under subregulation (1) of this regulation—
- (a) interrupts the scrutiny otherwise than in accordance with paragraph (b) or (c) of subregulation (3); or
  - (b) fails to carry out a lawful request by the Returning Officer,
- the Returning Officer may direct the scrutineer to leave the place where the scrutiny is being conducted.
- (5) A scrutineer appointed under subregulation (1) of this regulation shall comply with a direction by the Returning Officer given under subregulation (4).  
Penalty: \$100.
17. (1) Where practicable, the Returning Officer shall, in accordance with the rules of the union, declare the result of an election.
- (2) Where it is not practicable for the Returning Officer to declare the result of an election under subregulation (1) of this regulation, the Returning Officer shall declare the result of the election by giving notice of the result in writing to the union at its registered office.
- (3) The Returning Officer shall, in the manner and at the time of declaring the result of an election under subregulation (1) or (2), as the case may be, declare in respect of the election—
- (a) the number of ballot papers, other than duplicate ballot papers, issued;
  - (b) the number of duplicate ballot papers issued;
  - (c) the number of ballot papers admitted as formal;
  - (d) the number of ballot papers rejected as informal;
  - (e) the number of unused ballot papers;
  - (f) the number of ballot papers certified by the printer pursuant to subregulation (8) of regulation 11; and
  - (g) the number of votes admitted as recorded in favour of each candidate.
18. (1) The Returning Officer, or a person taking a step in or in connection with an election, may take such action and give such directions as he considers necessary in order to ensure the secrecy of the ballot and that no irregularities occur in or in connection with the election or to remedy any inconsistency or inadequacy that arises in the application of the rules of a union to the conduct of an election for an office.
- (2) A person shall not—
- (a) refuse or fail to comply with a direction given under subregulation (1) of this regulation; or
  - (b) obstruct or hinder—
    - (i) a person referred to in subregulation (1) in the performance of his functions in relation to an election or in the taking of any action under subregulation (1); or
    - (ii) any other person in the carrying out of a direction under subregulation (1).
- Penalty: \$100.
- (3) An election, or a step taken in or in connection with an election, is, notwithstanding anything contained in the rules of a union, not invalid by reason only of—
- (a) an act done under this regulation; or
  - (b) an act done in compliance with a direction under this regulation.
19. An application by a union for exemption from the application of section 36NC of the Act in respect of an election shall be in writing stating the grounds for the application for exemption and shall be accompanied by a copy of the rules of the union.

## AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS ACT, 1929-1975

I, THE UNDERSIGNED MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE, being the Minister charged with the administration of the Agricultural Products Act, 1929-1975, acting in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by Section 3D of the said Act and on the recommendation of the Apple Sales Advisory Committee constituted under the Act, do hereby prohibit the sale, except for the purpose of export, of all apples and pears except in accordance with the Schedule hereunder setting out the varieties, grades and minimum sizes of apples and pears which may be sold and the period of operation of this notice.

The provisions of this notice shall be read in conjunction with the Agricultural Products (Apple and Pear Grading) Regulations 1970.

A person shall not sell except for the purpose of export from the State, any apples or pears of which the sale is, pursuant to Section 3D of the Act, prohibited and any person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Penalty: One Hundred Dollars.

    - (d) Category 4. Officer-in-charge of an evening technical school, class 2; deputy principal of a technical college, grade 3; head of department, grade B; senior lecturer, grade A; senior counsellor; senior education officer.
    - (e) Category 5. Senior lecturer, grade B; senior lecturer (trades), grade B; lecturer, grade A, counsellor, grade A; education officer, grade I.
    - (f) Category 6. Lecturer, grade B; lecturer (trades), grade B; counsellor, grade B; education officer, grade II.
    - (g) Category 7. Lecturer, grade C; counselling assistant.
