PROCLAMATION.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Air Chief Marshal Sir Wallace

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of section 5 of the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921, the Governor may, by proclamation, divide the State into named districts for the purposes of that Act and from time to time alter the boundaries of any such district; and whereas by proclamations respectively published in the *Government Gazette* on 1st July, 1922; 14th September, 1934; 9th February, 1945 and 15th October, 1971, the State has been so divided by reference to the boundaries therein respectively described: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting pursuant to section 5 of the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921, do hereby, by and with the consent of the Executive Council—

- (a) delete that portion of the Schedule to the Proclamation dated 1st February, 1945, published in the *Government Gazette* on 9th February, 1945 as amended by errata so published on 23rd February, 1945, which relates to the North-West district; and
- (b) proclaim the districts named in the Schedule hereto, with the boundaries therein stated, to be respectively districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act.

North-West:

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of the North-West district; thence due East along the South parallel of latitude 19 deg. 30 min. to the State boundary; thence due South along the said State boundary to the North-Eastern corner of the North-East Coolgardie district; thence West along the North boundary of the North-East Coolgardie district to the South-East corner of the Mount Margaret district; thence North to the North-East corner of the Mount Margaret district; thence West along the North boundaries of the Mount Margaret and East Murchison districts to the East boundary of the Murchison district; thence in a general Northerly and North-Easterly direction along the East boundaries of the Murchison, Peak Hill and North West districts to the Tropic of Capricorn (23 deg. 27½ min.); thence East along the Tropic of Capricorn to the 126th meridian of East longitude; thence North along the said meridian to the starting point.

AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 9th day of February, 1977, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975 that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas Australian Iron & Steel Pty. Ltd., a company incorporated in the State of New South Wales having its registered office in the State of Western Australia at T. & G. Building, 37 St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for \$25 000 charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt Australian Iron & Steel Pty. Ltd. from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975 for a period terminating on the 25th day of January, 1979.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Road Traffic (Taxi-cars) Regulations, 1975, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th May, 1975 and amended thereafter by notice so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg 2 amended. 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the passage "Parts III, IV, VI, VII, VIII and X" in line one and substituting the passage "Parts III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII and X".
- Reg 4 amended. 3. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the passage "Authority." in line four and substituting the passage "Authority and, in relation to the metropolitan area and any other area of the State to which the Taxi-cars (Co-ordination and Control) Act, 1963, applies, the Taxi Control Board established under that Act."

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Taxi-cars Regulations, 1964, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd September, 1964, reprinted as amended pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published as so reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th March, 1970 and amended from time to time thereafter by notice so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Regs. 15A to 15E added. Vehicle requirements. 2. The principal regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 15 five new regulations as follows:—
- 15A. The Board shall not issue a taxi-car licence for a vehicle unless, in respect to that vehicle—
- (a) there are provided suitable floor mats or floor coverings;
 - (b) the cushions and lining trims are of good materials adequately sprung or padded and covered with leather or leather substitute material;
 - (c) provision is made for the safe carriage of a reasonable amount of luggage;
 - (d) all usual requisites for securing proper cleanliness and the safety and convenience of passengers are provided;
 - (e) the exterior is painted in such colour or colours and in such manner as the Board may approve;
 - (f) there is adequate seating accommodation for a sufficient number of passengers; and
 - (g) all other requirements of these regulations have been complied with to the satisfaction of the Board.
- 15B. The maximum seating accommodation of any taxi-car, as approved by the Board and endorsed on the licence, shall be painted or exhibited in some conspicuous place inside the vehicle where it may clearly be seen by day or night.
- 15C. Subject to the provisions of regulation 60, the driver of a taxi-car shall not carry any person in excess of the number for which that vehicle is licensed.
- 15D. An inspector may, at any time, inspect any taxi-car then on a public road or taxi-stand and if, in his opinion, that vehicle—
- (a) does not comply with these regulations;
 - (b) is dirty; or
 - (c) is otherwise in such condition as to be unfit for public use,
- the inspector may require the driver to remove the vehicle from the road or stand until such time as the vehicle shall have been cleansed, or any other defect shall have been remedied, to his satisfaction, and the driver shall not thereupon stand or ply the vehicle for hire until it has been so cleansed or its defects have been so remedied.
- 15E. The Board may by notice to the owner or operator of a taxi-car require the production of that taxi-car at a time and place stipulated in the notice, for the purpose of ascertaining whether the taxi-car conforms with these regulations and the owner or operator to whom the notice is directed shall comply with that notice.
- Seating accommodation. Carrying capacity not to be exceeded. Inspection. Reg. 22 amended. 3. Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting subregulation (1) and substituting a new subregulation as follows:—
- (1) A person shall not operate a taxi-car in the Metropolitan Control Area or any other area of the State to which the Act applies unless a taxi-meter complying in every respect with, and fitted, tested, sealed and maintained as prescribed by, these regulations is fitted to the taxi-car.

4. The principal regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 22 five new regulations as follows—

22A. A taxi-meter shall not be approved for use on a taxi-car unless it—

- (a) has upon the face of it—
 - (i) a slot wherein the amount of fare registered by the taxi-meter is clearly visible; and
 - (ii) above or below that slot, the word "FARE" in block letters;
- (b) is adjusted to register in the slot marked "FARE" the amount payable by the hirer in respect of flagfall, distance travelled and detention charge;
- (c) is so installed and illuminated that the fact that the taxi-meter is operating, and the amount of fare being registered by the taxi-meter, is readily visible to any passenger and to the driver, each from his sitting position, including during the hours of darkness;
- (d) is so constructed that when it is set in operation the prescribed amount of flagfall is forthwith registered on the taxi-meter and thereafter one or both of the prescribed charges for distance travelled or detention, as the case may be, is registered by operation of the taxi-meter;
- (e) is so constructed that when the flag or other controlling device is moved from an operating position the taxi-meter forthwith ceases to operate, and when that flag or device is moved to the "for hire" position the fare indicators return to zero;
- (f) is fitted with lugs or the case is drilled in such manner that a wire may be inserted and the ends of the wire sealed together, with the effect that, unless the wire is severed or the seal is broken, access may not be gained to the interior mechanism of the taxi-meter, and, in the case of a taxi-meter that does not contain the distance gearbox, the distance gearbox is capable of being similarly sealed;
- (g) is submitted for testing in a completely serviceable condition; and
- (h) is of a type approved by the Board.

22B. (1) The owner of a taxi-car to which a taxi-meter is fitted shall, prior to operating that taxi-car, cause the taxi-meter to be regulated to record the charges prescribed by these regulations and, after payment of the prescribed fee, shall submit the vehicle so fitted to an authorised officer of the Board for inspection, testing and sealing.

(2) Prior to the vehicle to which it is fitted being permitted or suffered to stand or ply for hire a taxi-meter shall be tested by an authorized officer of the Board for—

- (a) distance, over a distance of not less than two kilometres; and

SCHEME No. 6—NEWTON STREET (SOUTH)
SCHEME.

Scheme Text.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Town of Cockburn Town Planning Scheme No. 6 Newton Street (South) Scheme, hereinafter called "the Scheme". The Scheme shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Honourable the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette* (which date is hereinafter called "the commencement date").

Responsible Authority.

2. The authority responsible for carrying out and enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Town of Cockburn, hereinafter referred to as "the Council".

Scheme Area.

3. The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broad broken black line on the Land Use Map and such land is hereinafter referred to as the "Scheme Area".

Maps.

4. The following maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.
Scheme Map.

5. The map entitled "Land Use Map" shows the existing subdivision and zoning of the Scheme Area. The map entitled "the Scheme Map" shows the proposed subdivision of the Scheme Area.

General Objects.

6. The general objects of the Scheme are:

- (a) to improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage;
- (b) to provide for the progressive subdivision and development of land in the Scheme Area;

- (c) to provide a design for the resubdivision of the Scheme Area;
- (d) to make suitable provision for the use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes;
- (e) to make suitable provision for roads and pedestrian access ways within the Scheme Area;
- (f) to ensure the proper drainage of the roads and of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other such works;
- (g) to make provision for drainage reserves and easements;
- (h) to make provision for land to be used for open space;
- (i) to make provision for land to be used for two primary schools;
- (j) to make provision for land to be used for local authority, civic and cultural purposes;
- (k) to ensure the provision of reticulated water throughout the Scheme Area;
- (l) to carry out initial development of the open space;
- (m) to ensure the provision of sewage disposal facilities throughout the Scheme Area.

Scheme Works.

7. For the purposes of the Scheme the following shall be Scheme Works:—

- (a) The Scheme Area shall be surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such variations as may with the approval of the Town Planning Board be determined by the Council from time to time. Such survey may be carried out in stages.
- (b) Roads complying with the Council's specifications for roads in residential areas shall be constructed on the land shown as roads on the Scheme Map including any necessary drainage and earthworks. All roads in the Scheme Area constructed as at the commencement date shall be upgraded to the standard of construction required by the Council for new roads in residential areas.
- (c) The Scheme Area shall be drained and all necessary drainage works shall be carried out.
- (d) All New Lots within the Scheme Area shall be supplied with reticulated water.
- (e) The pedestrian access ways shown on the Scheme Map shall be constructed, drained and fenced and the access ways will be vested in the Crown under Section 20A of the Town Planning and Development Act.
- (f) Sewage disposal facilities shall be provided throughout the Scheme Area.
- (g) Those outbuildings or fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision shall be demolished or removed.
- (h) The land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for open space and shown on the Diagram of Survey as a "Reserve for Recreation" and vested in the Crown under Section 20A of the Town Planning and Development Act.
- (i) Initial development of the open space shall be carried out.
- (j) The land coloured blue on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for drainage reserves and easements.
- (k) The land coloured orange on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for local authority, civic or cultural purposes.
- (l) Electric power lines shall be laid underground.
- (m) Any levelling, grading and landscaping within the Scheme Area shall be carried out where it is considered necessary by the Council.
- (n) Where necessary existing services shall be relocated.
- (o) All other works (whether of a similar kind to the foregoing or not) necessary to give effect to the objects of the Scheme shall be carried out.

8. The Council shall as part of the Scheme Works install or cause to be installed pipes for the reticulation of sewerage services to serve all lots in the Scheme Area, and provide a pumping station where shown on the Scheme Map. In the area edged in red on the Scheme Map the pipes for sewerage reticulation for those lots which are incapable of being connected to the existing sewer main shall be laid to a design which will enable those lots at a future date to be connected to a proposed pumping station in the central depression between Rockingham and Hamilton Roads.

Existing Flora.

9. (a) So far as is practicable and consistent with the economic subdivision and development of the Scheme Area, existing trees and shrubs are to be retained. The Council may mark specific trees or groups of trees and trees so marked are to be retained unless approval is given by the Council in writing for their removal. Upon so marking trees the Council shall give notice thereof to the owner of the land on which such marked trees are located and such notice shall be accompanied by a plan to scale showing the general location of such trees.

(b) No existing trees or shrubs shall be removed from land designated on the Scheme Map as an area of open space unless approval is given by the Council in writing for their removal.

(c) If any owner of land is aggrieved by the giving of any such notice or the refusal of any approval under subclause (a) or (b) of this clause such owner shall have a right of appeal against such decision in accordance with Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928.

Council Owned Land.

10. The Council is the owner of certain land in the Scheme Area and in respect of such land the Council shall, in addition to the powers conferred by clause 43, have the same rights and be under the same obligations as other owners of land in the Scheme Area.

Acquisition of Land.

11. The land within the Scheme Area (or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme) shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. The land shown as New Lots on the Scheme Map and on which dwelling houses are erected at the commencement date shall not be resumed.

Valuations.

12. The lots and parcels of land within the Scheme Area and shown on the Land Use Map shall be valued at the commencement date and the sum total of such values is hereinafter referred to as "the value of the Old Lots".

13. The lots to be created pursuant to the Scheme in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "the New Lots") shall be valued on the basis that all Scheme Works have been undertaken. Such valuations shall be made as at the date of the acquisition by the Council of the Old Lots from which the New Lots are to be created.

14. The valuations of the Old and New Lots shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or by some person appointed by him on the basis of their unimproved value as defined by Section 533(3) of the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended).

Owner's Value Ratio.

15. From the sum of the values of the New Lots shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the New Lots. The Owner's Value Ratio is the relationship between the sum of the values of the Old Lots and the net value of the New Lots.

Owner's Interest in Scheme.

16. Each owner of an Old Lot shall, subject to clause 30 hereof, be deemed to be entitled to an interest in the Scheme of an amount equal to the value of his Old Lot:—

- (a) increased in the ratio of the Owner's Value Ratio determined in accordance with clause 15 hereof if the net value of the New Lots exceeds the sum of the values of the Old Lots, and
- (b) decreased in the said ratio if the net value of the New Lots is less than the sum of the values of the Old Lots.

Scheme Costs.

17. For the purposes of the Scheme the Scheme Costs shall comprise:

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount determined by the Council to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme.
- (b) The costs of the Scheme Works.
- (c) All compensation paid or payable with respect to land resumed for the purposes of the Scheme or to enable it to be implemented whether such land be within or outside the Scheme Area and all costs and expenses of determining and settling the amounts of such compensation.
- (d) The cost of acquisition (otherwise than by resumption) of any land acquired for the purposes of the Scheme or to enable it to be implemented whether such land be within or outside the Scheme Area.
- (e) The cost of water reticulation works necessary for the connection of the lots within the Scheme Area to the Metropolitan Water Main networks.
- (f) The cost of all other works as the Council considers necessary for the proper planning, functioning and implementation of the Scheme.
- (g) The cost of any insurance cover the Council considers necessary in connection with the Scheme Works or with respect to any liability to which the Council may be exposed in implementing the Scheme.
- (h) The cost of any works outside the Scheme Area which are considered necessary for the proper operation of any services within the Scheme Area.
- (i) All compensation and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation for land in the Scheme Area resumed prior to the commencement date for roads, drainage or other works or purposes necessary or incidental to the implementation of the Scheme.
- (j) The cost of water and sewerage headworks charges to the Scheme Area.
- (k) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

Estimate of Scheme Costs.

18. The Council may from time to time estimate and revise the estimate of Scheme Costs and the Council shall advise owners having an interest in the Scheme of the amount of such estimate or revised estimate.

Estimate of Compensation.

19. If any claim for compensation has not been settled or otherwise disposed of when the Council is ready to transfer lots pursuant to the Scheme, or if at that time, although no formal claim for compensation has been submitted, the Council anticipates that such a claim or claims will be made, the Council may estimate the amount of compensation which may become payable and the costs relating thereto and shall debit the Scheme with the amount so estimated and the amount of the Scheme Costs shall be increased accordingly. If there shall prove to be any difference between the amount so estimated and the actual compensation (if any) which becomes payable and the costs relating thereto such difference shall be debited or credited to the Scheme as the case may be and the Scheme Costs shall be increased or decreased accordingly.

Allocation and Disposal of New Lots.

20. The New Lots created pursuant to the Scheme shall be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) The Council shall set aside a sufficient number of New Lots (hereinafter called "saleable lots"). Subject to the provisions of clauses 35, 36 and 37 hereof the saleable lots shall be sold and the proceeds of sale shall be applied in accordance with clause 38 hereof.
- (b) The land shown as a primary school site on Newton Street on the Scheme Map shall be transferred to the Minister for Education free of cost but upon his paying half the cost of boundary roads, drainage to the site, regrading of the quarry and of the sewerage and water reticulation thereof, and of engineering and surveying fees necessary for the construction and installation of those works.
- (c) The land shown as a primary school site on Kipling Street on the Scheme Map shall be offered for sale at a figure based on a broad hectare residential value, having regard to the Scheme Works carried out to enable the site to be developed as a school. Such price shall include half the cost of boundary roads, drainage to such site, and of the sewerage and water reticulation thereof, and of the engineering and surveying fees necessary for the construction and installation of those works. The site shall be sold on the basis that the same is to be used as a school site only.
- (d) Subject to subclause (e) of this clause each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall be offered a New Lot or Lots (hereinafter called "replacement lots") of a value as near as practicable to the amount of the owner's interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with Clause 16 hereof. The replacement lots shall be chosen and allocated by the Council as equitably as possible so that as far as is practicable the replacement lots have characteristics similar to those of the Old Lot acquired from the owner.
- (e) The Council may defer the making of any offer or offers until it is satisfied that the proceeds of the sale of saleable lots sold or to be sold will be sufficient to pay the amount of the Scheme Costs whether in relation to a particular stage of the implementation of the Scheme or otherwise.

Nature of Offers.

21. The offer mentioned in paragraph (d) of clause 20 hereof (hereinafter called "an offer made pursuant to the Scheme") shall be made either with an offer of payment of money or subject to the owner making a payment of money in order that the total value of the New Lot or Lots offered and the new value of any land within the Scheme Area not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner together with or subject to a payment

in money is equal to the owner's interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with clause 16 hereof. The offer may be made in the alternative giving the owner the right to accept a lot or lots subject to a payment to or by him or to accept a lesser number of lots with a payment by the Council to him.

22. Every offer made pursuant to the Scheme shall be deemed to be made subject to the owner to whom the offer is made accepting the same in full satisfaction of any claim that owner may have against the Council for compensation in respect of the resumption of any land from him or otherwise in respect of the making or operation of the Scheme.

23. If an owner shall in the opinion of the Council suffer any additional damage or inconvenience by reason of the reduction in size of the lot on which a dwelling house is erected or by reason of the proximity of a road or lot boundary to such dwelling house the Council shall offer to such owner such sum (if any) as it (acting on the advice of the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department) considers equitable. The said offer shall be made with the offer mentioned in clause 21 hereof to the intent that the owner may not accept the offer mentioned in clause 21 either wholly or in part without accepting the offer mentioned in this clause. Nothing in this clause shall confer any right on an owner to require the Council to make any such offer.

24. If a pipe drain or other service has been or is to be laid across land within a New Lot such New Lot may be offered or sold expressly subject to the condition that the transferee shall grant to the Council, the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board, or such other statutory authority as the case requires, an easement over so much of the lots as is required to enable the drain or service to be maintained, serviced, repaired or replaced. If the Council shall itself have granted an easement to the Board or any such authority the lot shall be transferred subject to such easement.

25. An offer made pursuant to the Scheme shall:

- (a) be made in writing;
- (b) specify the New Lot or Lots which is or are being offered to the owner to whom the offer is made and the Old Lot or Lots in respect to which the offer is made;
- (c) specify a date, being not less than twenty-eight (28) days after the day on which the offer is posted, by which the offer may be accepted;
- (d) specify the amount of the owner's interest in the Scheme;
- (e) specify the valuations placed on the said lots and any payment to be made or received as the case may be, and how the amount of that payment is calculated;
- (f) specify the amount of any sum offered pursuant to clause 23 hereof.

26. Every offer made pursuant to the Scheme shall be made and served by registered post and it shall be addressed to the owner to whom it is made at the address for the time being recorded as his address in the Council's rate book or at the last address of that owner known to the Council.

27. (a) Any offer made pursuant to the Scheme may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time on or prior to the date specified in the offer as the last day on which the offer may be accepted.

(b) If any offer made pursuant to the Scheme is not accepted in the manner and within the time specified as the last day on which the offer may be accepted, that offer shall, subject to the provisions of clause 43 hereof, be deemed to have been rejected.

28. If an offer made pursuant to the Scheme is wholly accepted in the manner and within the time specified:—

- (a) it shall be deemed to have been accepted by the owner accepting the same in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of any land pursuant to the Scheme and otherwise in respect of the making and operation of the Scheme;
- (b) the owner accepting the same shall be liable to pay to the Council the amount of all rates which would have been payable on any land resumed or acquired from him pursuant to the Scheme if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the New Lots to him.

29. If an offer made pursuant to the Scheme is accepted in the manner and within the time specified as to some but not all of the New Lots offered:—

- (a) it shall be deemed to have been accepted by the owner accepting the same subject to the payment referred to in paragraph (c) hereof in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of any land pursuant to the Scheme and otherwise in respect of the making and operation of the Scheme;
- (b) the owner accepting the same shall be liable to pay to the Council the amount of all rates which would have been payable on any land resumed or acquired from him pursuant to the Scheme if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the New Lots to him.
- (c) the difference between the value of the New Lots accepted and the amount of the owner's interest in the Scheme after making any appropriate adjustment for any amount payable by or to the owner with respect to the New Lots accepted shall be paid to the owner in cash.

30. If an owner does not accept an offer made pursuant to the Scheme wholly or in part he shall not be entitled to any interest under the Scheme or to participate in the Scheme profits.

Transfers and Rescission.

31. If an owner accepts an offer made pursuant to the Scheme wholly or in part the Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to that owner transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with the Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act 1893 as amended and return it to the Council for registration or if the owner shall fail to make payment of any money which may be due by him to the Council pursuant to the Scheme in either case within twenty eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so the Council may, by notice served by registered post on the owner at the address for the time being recorded as his address in the Council's rate book or at the address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer), rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall be deemed not to have accepted an offer made pursuant to the Scheme.

32. Upon the return to the Council of a properly executed transfer pursuant to clause 31 hereof and upon the Council being satisfied that all moneys payable pursuant to the Scheme by the owner to whom such transfer relates the Council shall subject to clause 33 hereof cause such transfer to be registered at the Land Titles Office Perth. Any moneys payable by the Council to the owner pursuant to the terms of the offer accepted by the owner shall be paid by the Council upon the lodging of such transfer for registration. All registration and other fees including stamp duty payable with respect to any such transfer shall be paid by the owner to whom such transfer is to be made.

33. If any land in the Scheme Area resumed by the Council pursuant to the Scheme was at the time of such resumption subject to a registered mortgage, charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of a purchaser, mortgagee, chargee or lessee, the Council shall not transfer a New Lot to the former owner of such land unless such transfer is subject to a similar encumbrance or unless all the persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance so registered consent to such transfer free of encumbrances.

Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots.

34. Any lot offered to but not accepted by an owner in accordance with the Scheme or the subject of an agreement rescinded pursuant to clause 31 hereof may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears. All such lots are hereinafter referred to as "rejected lots".

35. The Council may sell the saleable lots and the rejected lots either by public auction, tender or private contact as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

36. If in the opinion of the Council it shall not prove necessary to sell all the saleable lots in order to pay the costs of the Scheme the Council may re-allocate some or all of the lots unsold to owners where it considers it just and equitable so to do and the cash payment to be made or received under clause 21 hereof shall be adjusted accordingly.

37. The Council may instead of selling any of the saleable lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and the Scheme Costs shall be reduced accordingly. Such lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained, sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner according to law as the Council thinks fit.

Application of Proceeds of Sale.

38. The Council shall apply the proceeds of sale of the saleable lots and the rejected lots in the manner following:—

- (a) first in payment or reimbursement of the Scheme Costs;
- (b) any balance shall be paid to those owners who accepted offers made pursuant to the Scheme wholly or in part in proportion to their respective interests in the Scheme.

39. If an owner entitled to portion of a distribution pursuant to clause 38(b) hereof cannot be found the Council may after the expiration of six (6) years from the date on which the owner's share of such distribution was ascertained expend the amount of his portion of such distribution in the improvement of the Scheme Area and thereafter such owner shall have no claim in respect of such moneys.

40. If the proceeds of sale of saleable and rejected lots are insufficient to pay or effect reimbursement of the Scheme Costs the difference shall be borne by the Municipal Fund.

Encumbrances on Title.

41. In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage, charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interests of the purchaser, mortgagee, chargee or lessee the Council shall not make any payments to nor transfer a New Lot to the owner without the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance or unless subject to a similar encumbrance.

Rates and Taxes and Moneys Owning to the Council.

42. The Council may deduct from any moneys payable to an owner pursuant to the Scheme the amount of any unpaid rates or taxes and any other moneys owing by the owner to the Council.

Powers of the Council.

43. The Council in the conduct and management of the Scheme shall in addition to the powers and authorities hereinbefore mentioned have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer made pursuant to the Scheme may be accepted.
- (d) Subject to clause 11 hereof, to acquire by purchase or otherwise any land or buildings within the Scheme Area.
- (e) To acquire by purchase or otherwise land or buildings outside the Scheme Area if such land or buildings are required for the purposes of the Scheme or to enable it to be implemented.
- (f) To agree to the extension of time for payment of any moneys payable to it and to accept security for the payment thereof.
- (g) To implement the Scheme in stages dealing with portions of the Scheme Area from time to time as the Council considers proper in the circumstances and to postpone the implementation of the Scheme for such period as it thinks fit.
- (h) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of the Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (i) With the consent of all persons affected thereby to alter the allocation of New Lots.
- (j) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the Scheme Area at the commencement date upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specific parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specific purpose.
- (k) To enter into such agreements and arrangements with the Crown, the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board or other Government instrumentality or statutory authority as seem proper to the Council for any purpose connected with the Scheme or the carrying out of any works within the Scheme Area.
- (l) To remove, alter or demolish any buildings which obstruct the implementation of the Scheme.

Finance.

44. The Council may do all things necessary in order to raise loans or to provide funds from other sources for the purpose of providing the finance necessary for the implementation of the Scheme. If the Council shall be unable to arrange the necessary finance it shall be under no liability to the owners of land within the Scheme Area or to any other person by reason of its failure to acquire lands or carry out works.

Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.

45. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of the Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the commencement date or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the date of the issue of a notice of rescission pursuant to clause 31 hereof whichever is the later.

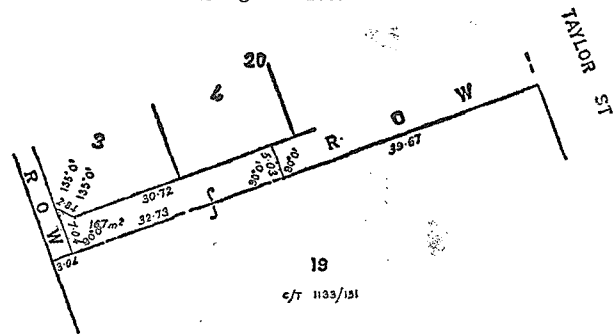

STATUTE No. 4—STUDENT GUILD.

1. Definitions.—In this Statute—

“Guild” means the Student Guild of the Western Australian Institute of Technology established by Section 44 of the Act upon the making of the original Statute No. 4 on 14th January, 1969;

“Guild regulations” means regulations made by the Guild under Section 12 of this Statute;

“Guild rules” means rules made by the Guild under Section 7 of this Statute or under any regulation;

“student society” means any club, society or association within the Institute which is affiliated with the Guild in the manner prescribed by the Guild regulations.

2. Objects.—The objects of the Guild shall be—

- (a) to further the common interest of its members;
- (b) to provide for and encourage communication among its members in matters of common interest;
- (c) to promote extra-curricular activities and the general well-being of its members;
- (d) to represent its members whenever such representation is necessary or desirable, and to provide a recognised means of communication between the students and the Institute authorities;
- (e) to co-operate with any body or organisation having kindred aims;
- (f) to provide, conduct or manage educational, cultural, sporting, welfare, recreational or commercial facilities or activities intended for the benefit, directly or indirectly, of its members;
- (g) to accommodate and provide for all types of amenities and facilities for its members.

3. Powers.—For the purposes of carrying out its objects the Guild shall have power—

- (a) to expend and invest moneys;
- (b) to operate banking accounts;
- (c) to transact such financial business as may be necessary to carry out the objects of the Guild;
- (d) to borrow, raise or secure the payment of money for any of the objects of the Guild, and in particular, by mortgaging or charging the property of the Guild or any part thereof;
- (e) to enter into contracts on behalf of the Guild or any student society, the terms of which have been approved by the Guild Council—
- (f) to lend moneys to ordinary members of the Guild;
- (g) to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property and to sell, let or mortgage it;
- (h) to exercise general supervision and control over all student societies;
- (i) to affiliate student societies with the Guild;
- (j) to assume the care, control and management of the property and financial affairs of any student society, for such period as the Guild Council thinks fit;
- (k) to engage and dismiss employees;
- (l) to incorporate or cause to be incorporated any student society under the Associations Incorporation Act or under the Companies Act or any like legislation for the benefit of the members of that society or to limit the liability of the Guild, and to hold shares in any company so incorporated;
- (m) to hold licences under any legislation for the time being in force;
- (n) to admit to associate membership, persons other than ordinary members of the Guild;
- (o) as prescribed by the Guild regulations, to impose fines upon members of the Guild, upon members and officers of student societies and on student societies for breaches of the provisions of this Statute, the Guild regulations or the Guild rules; and
- (p) generally, to act in any other manner authorised by this Statute or necessary or convenient for giving effect to this Statute.

4. Management: Subject to this Statute and the Guild regulations, the Guild Council shall be responsible for and have the entire control and management of the affairs and property of the Guild and may act in all matters concerning the Guild in such manner as appears to it to be best calculated to promote the interests of the Guild.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

5. Membership:

- (1) All enrolled students shall be ordinary members of the Guild.
- (2) The Director may on the ground of conscience or such other grounds as he may think fit and upon application by student, exempt that student by notice in writing to the Guild from all or any of the rights or obligations of membership of the Guild but not the obligation to pay to the Institute an amount equivalent to such Guild subscription as may be payable by that student under the Statute or the Guild regulations.
- (3) Such persons as may be prescribed by the Guild regulations may be associate members of the Guild.
- (4) Except as provided in this Statute, the conditions of membership of the Guild, both for ordinary members and associate members shall be as prescribed by the Guild regulations.

6. Subscriptions: The annual subscription to the Guild shall be such sum as shall be approved by the Institute Council after report and recommendation by the Guild Council.

7. Guild Council:

- (1) The Guild shall be governed by a Council to be known as the Guild Council. The number of members of the Guild Council, the manner of election of those members, and all other matters relative to membership of the Guild Council, shall be prescribed by the Guild Regulations.
- (2) The Guild Council may in the manner prescribed by the Guild regulations make, alter or repeal rules but only when the power to do so is specified in a Guild regulation and then only to the extent so specified.

8. Officers: The officers of the Guild shall comprise the President and such other officers as shall be prescribed by the Guild regulations. The manner of election of officers and their rights and duties shall be as prescribed by the Guild regulations.

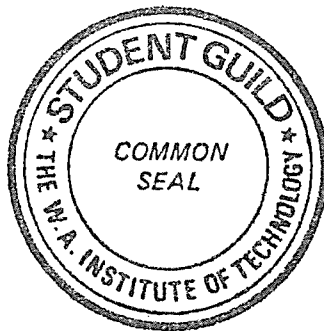
9. General Meetings:

- (1) A general meeting of the Guild may debate any issue of concern to members of the Guild.
- (2) Resolutions passed at any general meeting of the Guild may be in the form of a recommendation to the Guild Council.
- (3) At a general meeting of the Guild, each ordinary member present in person shall have one vote. Associate members of the Guild shall not be entitled to vote.
- (4) A referendum held by the Guild shall determine Guild policy on the issues submitted to the referendum. The result of a referendum shall bind the Guild Council.
- (5) Proceedings at a general meeting of the Guild and the manner in which a referendum shall be conducted shall be as prescribed by the Guild regulations.

10. Communication: The Guild shall be the recognised means of communication between the students or any section of the students and the Institute Council.

11. Seal:

- (1) The Common Seal of the Guild shall be in the following form:



- (2) The Guild Council shall provide for the safe custody of the Common Seal which shall only be used by the authority of a resolution of the Guild Council and in the presence of the President of the Guild who shall sign every instrument to which the Seal is affixed and every such instrument shall be countersigned by some other person appointed by the Guild Council.

12. Regulations:

- (1) The Guild may, in accordance with subsection (2) of this section, make alter and repeal regulations to provide for—
 - (a) the administration, organisation, finances and functions of the Guild;
 - (b) the interpretation of regulations and rules;
 - (c) the implementation of the objects and powers of the Guild and the other provisions of this Statute; and
 - (d) any other matter required by this Statute to be prescribed by regulation.

SCHEDULE—continued.

- (2) Regulations may be made altered or repealed in accordance with the following procedure—
- (a) In this subsection, “absolute majority of the Guild Council” means a majority of all the members of the Guild Council for the time being holding office, regardless of the number attending the meeting of the Guild Council, and no casting vote shall be counted.
 - (b) The Guild Council may resolve to make alter or repeal a regulation subject to the resolution being passed by an absolute majority of the Guild Council and its being confirmed in accordance with this subsection.
 - (c) The resolution as so passed shall be published—
 - (i) by being posted on the official Guild notice board; and
 - (ii) in the Guild newspaper or any other publication generally circulated among the students, produced under the authority of the Guild Council and financed in part or in whole from moneys set aside in the Guild’s newspaper account;
 in both cases notice being given to the ordinary members of the Guild that they are entitled to have the resolution considered at a general meeting of the Guild if notice requesting a meeting is given to the President of the Guild signed by not less than 100 students within 14 days after the resolution is first published.
 - (d) Except as provided in paragraph (f) of this subsection, if no notice requesting a general meeting is given, the resolution shall be deemed to be confirmed after the expiration of the period of 14 days specified in paragraph (c) above.
 - (e) If notice is given to the President of the Guild within the period of 14 days specified in paragraph (c) above, the resolution shall be considered at the next general meeting of the Guild, or the Guild Council may convene a special general meeting for the purpose. The resolution shall be confirmed if it is passed by a majority of the ordinary members of the Guild present at the meeting.
 - (f) A proposed regulation, or the alteration or repeal of regulation, dealing with the raising or expenditure of the revenue of the Guild shall only be confirmed if it is passed by a majority of the ordinary members of the Guild present at a general meeting of the Guild.
 - (g) If a resolution is amended at a general meeting, the amended resolution shall be considered at the next meeting of the Guild Council and the resolution shall be confirmed if it is passed by an absolute majority of the Guild Council.
 - (h) A regulation or the alteration or repeal of a regulation shall take effect on the day after it is approved by the Institute Council, or the date specified in the resolution passed by the Guild Council, whichever is the later.
13. Accounts—
- (1) The Guild Council shall keep such accounting and other records as will sufficiently explain the transactions and financial position of the Guild.
 - (2) The Guild Council shall each calendar year produce to a general meeting of the Guild for adoption an audited balance sheet made up as at the last day of the Guild’s last financial year, and an audited statement of income and expenditure for that year.
 - (3) A copy of the Guild’s audited annual balance sheet and statement of income and expenditure shall be transmitted to the Institute Council as soon as practicable after it has been adopted by the Guild.
14. Records:
- (1) A copy of this Statute and any amendments and a copy of all Guild regulations and Guild rules made under this Statute and any amendments shall be recorded in a Guild Statute Book.
 - (2) An entry in the Guild Statute Book of any Guild regulation made under this Statute and any alteration to a Guild regulation, signed by the Administrative Secretary and the President of the Guild, shall be *prima facie* evidence that the subject matter of the entry was duly approved by the Institute Council.
 - (3) An entry in the Guild Statute Book of any Guild rule made under this Statute or any alteration of a Guild rule signed by the President of the Guild shall be *prima facie* evidence that the subject matter of the entry was duly approved by the Guild.
15. Repeal and Transitional Provisions:
- (1) Statute No. 4 published in the *Government Gazette* on 14th January, 1969 is hereby repealed.
 - (2) All regulations and rules made under the authority of the repealed Statute No. 4 or the Constitution of the Guild in force immediately prior to the date this Statute comes into force shall be deemed to be regulations duly made under this Statute and shall (except where inconsistent with this Statute) continue in force until altered or repealed in accordance with this Statute.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

- (3) Sections 3 (excluding paragraph 3.1), 4, 5 (in which an "Affiliated Association" shall be deemed to be a student society) 6 to 12 inclusive and 14 of the Constitution of the Guild made under the repealed Statute No. 4 as in force immediately prior to the date this Statute comes into force shall be deemed to be Guild regulations duly made under this Statute and shall (except where inconsistent with this Statute) continue in force until altered or repealed in accordance with this Statute.

Schedule.

Statute No. 12—Enrolment.

1. In this Statute, unless the context otherwise requires, "Rules" means rules, as from time to time in force, made under this Statute.
2. The Council may enrol as a student of the Institute any person who satisfies the conditions specified in the Rules, for any course of study or programme offered by the Institute.
3. The Council may from time to time limit the enrolment of persons as students of the Institute for any course of study or programme.
4. A person shall be an enrolled student of the Institute when the enrolment procedures prescribed by the Rules, have been completed. Enrolment shall not be complete until he has paid—
 - (a) to the Institute, all amounts payable by him to the Institute under the Rules; and
 - (b) to the Institute on behalf of the Student Guild all amounts which will become payable by him to the Student Guild under its constitution and rules when he becomes an enrolled student.
5. A student shall cease to be enrolled—
 - (a) at the end of the last day of the course of study or programme for which he is enrolled;
 - (b) if he notifies the Director in writing of his withdrawal from the Institute, when such notice is received by the Director; or
 - (c) as otherwise prescribed by the Rules.
6. An enrolled student shall be subject to the Institute's By-laws and Statutes, By-laws and Rules made under any Statute, and the lawful instructions of authorised persons at the Institute.
7. (1) The Council may by resolution make rules, not inconsistent with the Act, this Statute or any other Statute, regulating or providing for the regulation of the enrolment of persons as students of the Institute, or to carry out or give effect to this Statute.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

(2) Without in any way limiting the rule-making power contained in subsection (1) of this section, the Council may make rules which prescribe fees to be charged to all or any persons applying for enrolment.

8. The Council may delegate to the Director its powers under sections 2 and 3 of this Statute.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960 as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 4 amended. 2. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by adding after the interpretation "junior primary school" the following interpretation:—
"long service leave" means long service leave on full pay; .
- Reg. 130 substituted. 3. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 130 the following regulation:—
130. (1) A teacher who has completed—
(a) ten years of continuous service as a permanent teacher; or
(b) ten years of continuous service as a temporary teacher within a period of eleven calendar years, is entitled to thirteen weeks of long service leave.
(2) A teacher who has completed—
(a) fifteen years of continuous service as a permanent teacher; or
(b) fifteen years of continuous service as a temporary teacher within a period of sixteen calendar years, and who has not, within such period of continuous service, taken long service leave or long service leave on half pay, is entitled to twenty-six weeks of long service leave.
(3) A teacher may, with the approval of the Director-General take double the period of entitlement or any part of the period of entitlement to long service leave on half pay.
(4) Long service leave shall be taken—
(a) in the period commencing with the date of the beginning of the school year and ending with the date of the second Friday in July; or
(b) in the period commencing with the date of the Monday immediately following the second Friday in July and ending with the date of the end of the school year, except that the Director-General may in special circumstances direct that the provisions of this subregulation shall not apply in a particular case.
(5) Where a portion of the long service leave to which a teacher is entitled cannot be taken because of the provisions of subregulation (4) of this regulation, that portion shall remain credited to the teacher and shall be added to any further leave that may accrue to that teacher.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

(6) All or any part of the summer vacation shall not be considered to form part of a period of long service leave.

(7) For the purpose of determining rights and entitlements in respect of long service leave under these regulations—

(a) any interruption in the service of a teacher shall not count as service and shall break his continuity of service except that—

- (i) any continuous period of leave without pay exceeding two weeks;
- (ii) any period of long service leave;
- (iii) any period of long service leave on half pay;
- (iv) any continuous period of sick leave without pay in excess of three months;
- (v) any interruption in the service of a temporary teacher for a period of under three months because the teacher's services are for the time being not required;
- (vi) any period spent by a teacher as a student at a teachers' college; and
- (vii) as of 1st January, 1960, any period commencing with the date of the expiration of four years from the date a teacher becomes entitled to 26 weeks of long service leave and ending with the date of the completion of such leave,

shall not count as service but shall not break the continuity of service;

(b) any period of leave without pay determined under the provisions of subregulation (2) of regulation 118 (relating to leave without pay for the purpose of undertaking studies) to be part of the service of a teacher for all purposes shall count as service and shall not break the continuity of service;

(c) where the continuous service of a teacher consists of service as a monitor and service as a teacher his period of service as a monitor shall be reduced by one-half, and the term "continuous service" shall in its application to and in relation to these regulations, be read and construed accordingly.

(8) (a) The Director-General shall cause a notice regarding the taking of long service leave, hereinafter referred to as "the notice" to be published in *The Education Circular* in March of each year.

(b) The notice shall require teachers who wish to take long service leave on full pay or half pay to make application for such leave and shall specify the time limits within which such an application may be made.

(c) A teacher may make an application under this subregulation if he—

- (i) is entitled to long service leave; or
- (ii) will be entitled to long service leave during the school year immediately following that in which the notice is published.

(d) An application under this subregulation—

- (i) shall be in writing in such form as the Director-General directs;
- (ii) shall state whether the leave applied for is leave on full pay or leave on half pay;
- (iii) shall state the period of long service leave on full pay or half pay for which the applicant is applying;
- (iv) shall state the date on which the teacher wishes the leave to commence;
- (v) shall be in respect of a period of long service leave on full or half pay to commence within the school year immediately following that in which the notice is published; and
- (vi) shall be made within the time limits specified in the notice.

(e) As soon as practicable after the receipt of an application under this subregulation, the Director-General—

- (i) shall, in the case of an application for leave on full pay, approve the taking of the leave for which the application has been made;
- (ii) may, in the case of an application for leave on half pay, approve the taking of the leave for which the application has been made,

except that he may order that the leave commence on a date other than that contained in the application, provided that the substituted date is within the same school year as the requested date.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

Reg. 131 substituted. 4. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 131 the following regulation:—

131. (1) A lump sum payment for the money equivalent of any long service leave entitlement of a teacher under the provisions of regulation 130, and any proportional long service leave credit of a teacher under the provisions of this regulation shall be made—

- (a) as of the date of his retirement, to a teacher who is retired because of age or incapacity, provided that he has completed at least 12 months of continuous service prior to the date of his retirement;
- (b) as of the date of his retirement, to a teacher who retires voluntarily at or over the age of sixty years provided that he has completed at least three years of continuous service prior to the date of his retirement;
- (c) as of the date of his death, in respect of a teacher who dies—
 - (i) to his estate if he is not survived by a spouse or other person legally dependent on him;
 - (ii) to his spouse if he is survived by a spouse legally dependent on him; or
 - (iii) where he is not survived by a spouse legally dependent on him to such person legally dependent on him as the Minister approves,

provided that the teacher has completed not less than 12 months of continuous service prior to the date of his death;

- (d) as of the date of her resignation, to a permanent female teacher who—
 - (i) resigns, giving proper notice, to marry;
 - (ii) marries within three months of the date of her resignation; and
 - (iii) produces such evidence of the marriage as may be required by the Director-General,

provided that she has completed at least four years of continuous service prior to the date of her resignation and that the payment shall not exceed the equivalent of 26 weeks' pay;

- (e) as of the date of her marriage, to a female teacher who—
 - (i) marries;
 - (ii) remains on the staff after her marriage; and
 - (iii) produces such evidence of the marriage as may be required by the Director-General,

provided that she has completed four years of continuous service prior to the date of her marriage and that the payment shall not exceed the equivalent of 26 weeks' pay;

- (f) as of the date of her completion of four years of continuous service, to a female teacher who—
 - (i) marries before the completion of four years of continuous service;
 - (ii) remains on the staff after her marriage; and
 - (iii) produces such evidence of her marriage as may be required by the Director-General.

(2) A lump sum payment for the money equivalent of any long service leave entitlement of a teacher under the provisions of regulation 130 shall be made, as soon as practicable after the date of his resignation or dismissal, to a teacher who—

- (a) resigns, other than a teacher who receives a lump sum payment under the provision of subregulation (1) of this regulation; or
- (b) is dismissed.

(3) The proportional long service leave credit of a teacher, for each period of continuous service less than that required to entitle the teacher to long service leave—

- (a) shall be for a period of less than ten years, that proportion of 13 weeks as the period bears to 10 years; and
- (b) shall be for a period in excess of ten years but less than 15 years, that proportion of 13 weeks as the period bears to five years.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

Reg. 132 substituted. 5. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 132 the following regulation:—

132. (1) In this regulation—

“Commonwealth employee” means a person who is appointed as a teacher and whose appointment is continuous with his employment with a Commonwealth instrumentality;

“Commonwealth instrumentality” means—

- (a) any department of the Australian Public Service;
- (b) any body constituted under an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth; or
- (c) any body subject to the administration of a Minister of the Crown in right of the Commonwealth,

as the Minister declares by notice in the *Government Gazette* to be a Commonwealth instrumentality for the purposes of this regulation;

“period of accrued long service leave” means a period of long service leave—

- (a) to which, under the long service leave conditions of, and by virtue of his service with, a State instrumentality, a State employee is entitled as of the date he ceases to be employed by that instrumentality;
- (b) which he has not taken as long service leave; and
- (c) for which he has received no benefit in lieu of long service leave;

“State employee” means a person who is appointed as a teacher and whose appointment is continuous with his employment with a State instrumentality;

“State instrumentality” means any body within the State which is, or is capable of being declared to be, a department for the purposes of the Superannuation and Family Benefits Act, 1938.

(2) (a) A Commonwealth or State employee is entitled to a credit towards an entitlement to long service leave under regulation 130, hereinafter referred to as a “long service leave credit”, in respect of his service with a Commonwealth or State instrumentality, calculated according to the prescribed formula.

(b) For the purposes of paragraph (a) of this subregulation, the prescribed formula is the formula—

$$A = \frac{B}{C} \times D$$

where

A represents the long service leave credit, in days;

B represents the period, in days, of continuous service with the instrumentality which—

- (i) ended on the date the employee left the service of the instrumentality;
- (ii) was, under the long service leave conditions of the instrumentality—
 - (1) countable as service towards entitlement to a period of long service leave; and
 - (2) less than the period of service required to entitle an employee to a period of long service leave; and
- (iii) in respect of which the employee has not taken long service leave or received from the instrumentality any benefit in lieu of long service leave;

C represents the period, in days, of continuous service with the instrumentality which, under the long service leave conditions of that instrumentality, would have entitled the employee to a period of long service leave had he remained in the employ of the instrumentality; and

D represents the period, in days, of long service leave to which the employee would have been entitled under the long service leave conditions of the instrumentality had he completed the period of continuous service with the instrumentality represented by B.

(c) A Commonwealth or State employee credited with a long service leave credit shall be deemed to be entitled to long service leave under the provisions of regulation 130 on the day after he has completed the period of service from the date of his appointment as a teacher calculated according to the prescribed formula.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

(d) For the purposes of paragraph (c) of this subregulation, the prescribed formula is—

(i) in respect of an entitlement to a period of long service leave of 13 weeks, the formula—

$$E = (91-A) \times 40; \text{ and}$$

(ii) in respect of an entitlement to a period of long service leave of 26 weeks, the formula—

$$E = (182-A) \times 30$$

where

E represents the period of service, in days, a Commonwealth or State employee must complete, from the date of his appointment as a teacher, in order to be entitled to long service leave; and

A represents, in days, the employee's long service leave credit.

(3) Where a State employee is entitled to a period of accrued long service leave, he shall be deemed to be entitled, as of the date of his appointment as a teacher, to that period of long service leave as long service leave under these regulations.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation, the employment of a person with a Commonwealth or State instrumentality shall be deemed to be continuous with his service as a teacher if the period commencing with the date he ceases his employment with the instrumentality and ending with the date of his appointment as a teacher does not exceed four weeks, or such longer period as the Minister, in special circumstances, determines.

(5) A Commonwealth employee shall not proceed on long service leave until he has completed a period of over three years of continuous service as a teacher.

STATUTE No. 17—GUILD OF STUDENTS.

1. Interpretation: In this Statute, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - “Associate Member” means a person described in section 4(2) who becomes an associate member of the Guild, and (unless otherwise provided by Guild Regulation) includes an honorary associate member;
 - “Guild” means the Guild of Students established in accordance with section 20 of the Act;
 - “Guild Regulation” means a regulation made by the Guild under the authority of and in accordance with section 6 of this Statute;
 - “Member” means a student member of the Guild, and does not include an Associate Member;
 - “Secretariat” means the secretariat of the Guild referred to in section 7 of this Statute;
 - “University Association” means any club, society or association within or connected with the University which is not affiliated to the Guild;
 - “University Society” means any club, society or association within or connected with the University which is affiliated to the Guild.

2. Objects:

- (1) The objects of the Guild shall be, either alone or in association with any other organisation within the University—
 - (a) to represent its Members, to further the common interests of its Members and Associate Members, and to co-ordinate joint activities of its Members, Associate Members and other members of the University; and
 - (b) such other objects as the Guild may by Guild Regulation from time to time adopt.
- (2) The Guild shall be the recognised means of communication between the student body for the time being and the Senate.

3. Powers: Subject to the Act, and the Statutes and By-laws of the University, the Guild shall have the power, either alone or in association with any University Society or University Association—

- (a) to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property and to sell, let, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of it;
- (b) to borrow, raise or secure payment of any money for any of the objects of the Guild from time to time and in particular by mortgaging or charging the property of the Guild or any part thereof;
- (c) to engage and dismiss employees;
- (d) to expend and invest moneys;
- (e) to operate banking accounts;
- (f) to transact such financial business as may be necessary for the purposes of carrying out the objects of the Guild;
- (g) to affiliate with any University Association or any other association of students;
- (h) to co-ordinate the activities of the University Societies;
- (i) to provide for representation of the Guild and its Members and Associate Members in cultural, sporting and social activities;
- (j) to make provision for the control and management of any buildings from time to time occupied by the Guild and for regulating the conduct of any person using such buildings or parts thereof;
- (k) to hold licences under any legislation, including, the Liquor Act 1970, for the time being in force;
- (l) to impose fines or other penalties, including suspension or withdrawal of privileges, upon Members and Associate Members for breach of the provisions of this Statute or of a Guild Regulation, but the limits of the fines or other penalties which may be imposed and all necessary procedures shall be prescribed by Guild Regulation;
- (m) generally, to act in all other matters authorised by this Statute or which are necessary or convenient for giving effect to this Statute.

4. Membership:

- (1) All students shall be members of the Guild except such students as may be declared exempt from membership by the Vice-Chancellor on conscientious or other grounds prescribed by regulations of the Senate. Any student so declared exempt from membership shall pay annually to the Guild an amount equal to the amount otherwise payable as the annual subscription.
- (2) Any member of the University other than a student and such other persons connected with the University as may be prescribed by Guild Regulation may become associate members of the Guild. Guild Regulations may make provision for honorary Associate Members.

5. Seal: The Secretariat shall provide for the safe custody of the official seal of the Guild which shall never be used except with the authority of a resolution of the Secretariat and then in the presence of the President of the Guild and one other member of the Secretariat, both of whom shall sign every instrument to which the seal is affixed, and every such instrument shall be countersigned by the Honorary Secretary of the Guild or by some other person appointed by the Guild Secretariat for the purpose.

6. Guild Regulations:

- (1) The Guild may, in the manner described in subsection (2) of this section, but subject in every case to the provisions of subsection (3) of this section, make alter and repeal regulations:
 - (a) to provide for the internal administration, organisation, finances and records of the Guild;
 - (b) to enable any University Association voluntarily to become affiliated with the Guild and to prescribe the conditions and any fees for such affiliation, and for the administration and finances of University Societies;
 - (c) to provide for the payment of subscriptions and fees, and refunds;
 - (d) to provide for the allocation and distribution of Guild funds for the activities of the Guild and for University Societies;
 - (e) to provide for the election of the President and members of the Secretariat and matters relating to the office of President and membership of the Secretariat;

- (f) to prescribe the rights, privileges and obligations of Associate Members and honorary Associate Members;
 - (g) to provide for general meetings or forums of all Members and Associate Members and procedures therefor, including with respect to attendance, quorum and voting, and for referendums and procedures therefor;
 - (h) to provide for meetings of the Secretariat and its committees and the procedures therefor;
 - (i) to establish subsidiary councils of the Guild;
 - (j) to provide for the interpretation of the regulations, subject to a reference to the Senate and an appeal to a tribunal to be agreed between the parties to the dispute;
 - (k) to provide for any matters incidental to any of the abovementioned matters and any of the matters required by this Statute to be prescribed or to be dealt with by Guild Regulation
- (2) The Guild may make, alter and repeal regulations either in general meeting or by referendum of the Members or Associate Members or both, as the Secretariat may decide in relation to each proposal but if the Secretariat decides to refer the matter to the Guild in general meeting, the general meeting may require the proposal to be decided by referendum.
- (3) (a) A regulation made by the Guild in accordance with subsection (2) of this section (which includes an alteration to or the repeal of a regulation) shall be given to the Secretary of the University who shall sign a receipt therefor.
- (b) The Secretary of the University shall submit the regulation to the Senate for its consideration at its next regular meeting, or at a special meeting convened for the purpose.
- (c) The Senate may allow or disallow a regulation so submitted to it in whole or in part, but if the regulation is not allowed or disallowed within a period of three months after the first meeting of the Senate to which it is submitted for consideration, it shall be deemed to have been allowed at the expiration of that period.
- (d) A regulation shall take effect as from the date specified in the regulation or the date on which it is allowed by the Senate, whichever is the later.
- (e) A regulation shall be published in the manner prescribed by Guild Regulation.

7. Guild Secretariat:

- (1) The Guild shall be administered by a Secretariat comprising the President and—
- (a) eight Members of the Guild (in this section and section 11 referred to as "Guild members");
 - (b) not more than seven representative members as described in subsection (4) of this section; and
 - (c) one employee member, if appointed, pursuant to subsection (4) of this section.
- (2) The President of the Guild, who shall at all times be a member of the Guild, shall be elected annually at the time and in the manner prescribed by Guild Regulation.
- (3) The Guild members of the Secretariat shall be elected annually. It shall be compulsory for all full time internal students and optional for all part time or external students to vote in each election for the Guild members of the Secretariat and the President of the Guild. The returning officer shall be a person appointed by the Secretariat whose appointment is approved by the Vice-Chancellor. In all other respects, the procedures for elections shall be prescribed by Guild Regulation.
- (4) The Guild may by Guild Regulation provide for the nomination of not more than seven persons as representative members of the Secretariat, who shall be Members or Associate Members of the Guild and elected officers or representatives of subsidiary councils of the Guild or of University Societies. The Guild may also by Guild Regulation provide for the appointment of not more than one full time employee of the Guild to be a member of the Secretariat.
- (5) The Guild may by Guild Regulation increase the maximum number of members of the Secretariat except that the number of Guild members of the Secretariat (excluding the President) shall be at least equal to the total of the representative members and the employee member.
- (6) The Secretariat shall appoint one of their number to be the Honorary Secretary of the Guild and another of their number to be the Honorary Treasurer of the Guild.
- (7) The Secretariat shall cause accurate minutes to be made of all general meetings and forums of the Guild and meetings of the Secretariat, and the result of every election and referendum. All duly confirmed minutes shall be deemed correct until the contrary is proved.
- (8) The procedures for meetings of the Secretariat shall be prescribed by Guild Regulation.

8. Powers and Functions of the Guild Secretariat:

- (1) The Guild in general meeting or by referendum may delegate to the Secretariat such of its powers (other than the power to make Guild Regulations and this power to delegate) either generally or specifically, as it may from time to time decide; and the Guild may in the same manner revoke any such delegation.
- (2) Subject to—
 - (a) subsection (1) of this section and the other provisions of this Statute;
 - (b) the Guild Regulations; and
 - (c) any resolutions of the Guild in general meeting;the Secretariat may exercise all powers of the Guild delegated to it and shall have the entire control and management of the affairs and concerns of the Guild and shall act in all matters concerning the Guild in such manner as appears to it to be best calculated to promote the interests of the Members and Associate Members and of the University. The Secretariat may delegate any power exercisable by it or any of its activities or functions to any committee of its members.

9. Property and Finance:

- (1) All property of the Guild and its subsidiary councils and all property of the University Societies (other than University Societies which are incorporated bodies) shall be vested in the Guild.
- (2) The Guild may deal with the property of any University Society in accordance with a resolution of the Society but in the event of disagreement between a University Society and the Guild as to the manner in which the property of the Society would be dealt with, the Society may appeal to the Senate upon the question at issue and the Senate's decision shall be final and the Guild and the Society shall be bound to act in accordance with the Senate's decision.
- (3) Subject to this section and section 8, the Secretariat may expend money and enter into contracts in furtherance of the objects of the Guild and on its behalf and in furtherance of the objects of any University Society and on its behalf.
- (4) Neither the Guild nor the Secretariat shall, without prior consultation with the Senate, enter into any financial commitment for an amount which exceeds the current liquid assets of the Guild after deducting all current liabilities, or which it is unable to service adequately from current or future income.
- (5) No action taken by the Guild or the Secretariat in the exercise of any of its powers or authorities conferred by this section shall impose any legal obligation upon the University or the Senate.
- (6) The Secretariat shall make provision for the keeping of proper books of account in connection with all the financial transactions of the Guild.
- (7) The Secretariat shall make provision for the auditing of the Guild's books of account at least once in each year.
- (8) A copy of the audited annual balance sheet and statement of income and expenditure of the Guild shall be transmitted to the Senate each year and as may be prescribed by regulations of the Senate.

10. Subscription: The annual subscription payable to the Guild by a Member and Associate Member shall be such sums as may be fixed by Guild Regulation after consultation with the Senate.

11. Transitional Provisions:

- (1) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Statute, the Senate shall make regulations with respect to—
 - (a) the election of the President of the Guild and the Guild Members of the Secretariat;
 - (b) meetings of the Secretariat;
 - (c) general meetings, forums and referendums of the Guild; and
 - (d) financial provisions for the Guild.
- (2) The regulations made by the Senate under this section shall respectively cease to have effect (by force of this subsection) when a Guild Regulation dealing with the matters dealt with by the particular Senate regulation takes effect, and the Guild Regulation so provides.
