FINANCE BROKERS CONTROL ACT, 1975.

(Section 44 (1) and (2).)

THE FINANCE BROKERS SUPERVISORY BOARD has fixed the following schedule to be the maximum amounts of remuneration for services rendered by persons carrying on the business of a Finance Broker. The schedule shall apply in the case of contracts made on or after the 1st day of May, 1977:—

Schedule.

1. Application Fee:

\$25.00 for requested loans up to \$50 000.00 and an additional \$25.00 for each additional \$50 000.00 or part thereof.

The Application Fee is a Deposit against Broker's own inspection fee and eventual Brokerage charge.

If an independent qualified valuation is required this is chargeable separately at cost.

2. Inspection Fees:

Initial inspections:

Up to 30 kilometres radius—\$25.00.

Over 30 kilometres radius—\$25.00 plus \$25.00 per hour spent outside the 30 kilometre radius with a maximum of \$80.00 per half day or part thereof or \$150.00 per day.

Subsequent Inspections:

For progress payments for residential properties—\$12.50.

For progress payments for commercial properties—By negotiation with the client.

3. Establishment Fee:

For all mortgages arranged—\$100.00.

This fee may be charged in addition to Inspection and Brokerage Fees.

4. Brokerage Fees:

(a) Local Money Loans:

On the first \$30 000—1%.

On the next \$20 000—2%.

On the next \$50 000—2½%.

Over \$100 000—as is mutually agreed between the parties in writing.

(b) Bridging Loans:

On loans for 6 months or less 3/4%.

Over 6 months—normal rates.

(c) Interstate and Overseas Money Loans:

Rates subject to special written agreement between broker and client. If interim Bridging Finance also arranged, additional brokerage of 3/4% to be charged.

(d) Conditions of Brokerage Charges:

(1) Brokerage should NOT be charged by a selling Agent where a Contract of Sale or Mortgage to Vendor is arranged. The Agent Broker may, however, charge on a time basis for consultations and work done (see Miscellaneous Charges).

- (2) Where the selling Agent is also the broker a separate written Loan Application is also required before brokerage can be charged.
- (3) Where a broker arranges a loan from a Building Society, Bank, Insurance Company or other Finance Institution, and where the applicant would not otherwise have been able to obtain that loan from that source, brokerage at one half normal rates may be charged. This applies whether the broker is also the selling Agent or not, and is subject to clause 4 (d) 2 hereof.

5. Transfer of Mortgage Between Investor Clients: Standard scale of fees plus out of pockets, payable by the Transferor.

6. Extension of Mortgages: One quarter standard brokerage inclusive of any re-inspection, but solicitors costs, stamp duty, and registration should be in addition.

7. Finalisation Fee (Discharges): Flat fee of \$25.00 to include all services required of a broker, in addition to legal costs, out of pockets, and settlement fees.

8. Commission on Interest Collections: 6% inclusive of postages, cheque duty and bank charges.

9. Miscellaneous Charges:

- (a) Production of Titles—Standard Fee \$15.00.
- (b) Titles Office Searches—\$2.00 plus Titles Office fees.
- (c) Additional Interest Statements as provided in the Finance Brokers Code of Conduct—\$2.00 for each statement issued.
- (d) Bank cheques—\$1.00 including costs.
- (e) Where no brokerage fees are payable consultations, advice, investigations and negotiations on finance—standard charge of \$20.00 per hour based on the actual time spent.

The possession of, or progress towards, an appropriate tertiary level academic qualification will be considered a factor, increasing in importance with the level of classification, when determining efficiency of applicants in the Clerical Division.

(1) Junior or Achievement Certificate (or equivalent), essential including Maths and English with preference for Leaving Certificate. Field Technician—Diploma from a recognised Agricultural College or Leaving Certificate in five approved subjects including English plus Departmental examination in field techniques. Preference for applicants with suitable experience.

- (6) Degree in Economics, Commerce or Arts (Economics).
- (7) Preference will be given to a more mature applicant with a knowledge of general office routine.

- (10) Bachelor of applied Science (Occupational Therapy), W.A.I.T., or approved equivalent qualifications. Eligibility for registration with the W.A. Occupational Therapy Board.
- (11) Eligibility for full membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers. Previous experience in a psychiatric unit or child assessment centre is required.
- (12) A degree in Arts, Science, Commerce, Economics or Law or on associateship in Administration or Accounting or other relevant degree or associateship is essential with experience in an appropriate field.
- (13) Plus District Allowance of \$320 per annum married man and \$160 per annum single person.
- (14) Progress towards a Diploma in Civil Engineering or approved equivalent. Must have at least two years experience in soil mechanics or ground engineering fields. Alternatively 5 years relevant experience.
- (15) LOCATION: Based in Perth however appointee must be prepared to carry out field work anywhere in the State as required. Travelling allowances payable when working away from metropolitan area.
- (16) Medical Degree registrable in Western Australia, Diploma in Industrial Health (or equivalent) desirable.

THE Town of Canning under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, as amended, hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme:—

SCHEME TEXT.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Town of Canning Town Planning Scheme No. 29—Burton Street Guided Development Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Town of Canning (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.
Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map.

General Objects.

5. The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- To facilitate and encourage the development of land within the Scheme Area.
- To control development within the Scheme Area according to the proposed uses shown on the Scheme Map and detailed in this Text.
- To facilitate traffic movement by the alteration of road junctions and the creation of rights-of-way.
- To set aside lands for public open space.

Scheme Works.

6. The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—

- The surveys of—
 - the proposed alteration to Chapman Road as shown on the Scheme Map.
 - the rights-of-way shown on the Scheme Map, shall be carried out.
- Chapman Road shall be constructed in its new position at the junction of Manning Road.
- The lands shown as rights-of-way on the Scheme Map may from time to time be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council and set aside as rights-of-way.
- The said rights-of-way may from time to time be constructed and drained.

Scheme Costs and Payment Thereof.

7. (1) The costs of the survey of and the acquisition of the land for and the construction and drainage of the rights-of-way shown on the Scheme Map shall be paid in the first instance by the Council and such costs shall be repaid to the Council by the persons who, at the date of the giving of the notice hereinafter mentioned, are the owners of the privately owned land abutting such rights-of-way. - (b) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to complete the Scheme;

shall be paid to the Council by the owners of the land within Areas A to F inclusive in the proportion that the area of each owner's land bears to the total area of land within Areas A to F inclusive. Each such owner shall pay his proportion of Scheme Costs upon the re-zoning of his land in accordance with the Scheme.

(3) If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of re-zoning or at the time of the giving of a notice by the Council as aforesaid the Council may estimate the costs thereof. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

Zoning and Permitted Uses.

8. It is intended that each of the parcels of land within the areas identified on the Scheme Map by the letters A, B, C, D, E and F be from time to time as required by the owners thereof, zoned so as to permit any of the following uses only:—

Areas A and D—Private recreation, public amusement, public exhibition, health centre, office, public utility, canteen or amenity building (which is incidental to the predominant use of the land), veterinary clinic, restaurant, social club.

Area B—Tavern.

Area C—Reception lodge, private recreation, public amusement, public exhibition, public utility, canteen or amenity building (which is incidental to the predominant use of the land).

Areas E and F—Public utility, canteen or amenity building (which is incidental to the predominant use of the land) showroom, office, car sales premises.

Development.

9. No development shall take place within any of Areas A to F unless for one of the uses and purposes specified in the preceding clause.

10. The Council may refuse to grant approval or may grant approval subject to such conditions as it thinks fit to any development of land within Areas A to F in any of the following circumstances:—

- (a) if the lot or lots upon which the development is proposed is, in the opinion of the Council, of insufficient size to accommodate the development or use;
- (b) if an approval to such development would, in the opinion of the Council, render any other lot or lots in the Scheme Area incapable of being efficiently or safely developed for the purpose for which such lot or lots are or are to be zoned;
- (c) if the development proposed would, in the opinion of the Council, adversely affect the amenity of the Scheme Area or adversely affect the safety, health or well being of the occupiers thereof;
- (d) in the case of a tavern, the Council may limit its size.

Powers of the Council.
