Professional Drafting Officers (Main Roads Department) Salaries.

IN the matter of Government Officers who are employed as Professional Drafting Officers by the Commissioner of Main Roads (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner) under the Main Roads Act, 1930, and in the matter of a claim made by the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated (hereinafter referred to as the Association) for an Award to supersede and replace the Professional Drafting Officers' (Main Roads Department) Salaries Agreement 1973, No. 2 of 1973.

Having heard and considered the above claim in accordance with section 15 (4) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966-1975, the Public Service Arbitrator, pursuant to section 24 of the said Act, hereby makes the following award.

PROFESSIONAL DRAFTING OFFICERS (MAIN ROADS DEPARTMENT) SALARIES AWARD, 1977.

No. 5 of 1977.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Professional Drafting Officers' (Main Roads Department) Salaries Award, 1977 and shall supersede and replace the Professional Drafting Officers' (Main Roads Department) Salaries Agreement 1973, No. 2 of 1973.

5.—Salaries.

The salaries and salary ranges to be allocated to Drafting Officers covered by this Award shall be those which the Commissioner considers appropriate taken from the salaries and salary ranges set out in clause 4 of this Award.

Provided that:

- (i) An officer who obtains an appropriate Diploma of the Technical Education Division or an equivalent qualification approved by the Commissioner shall, where relevant, commence at the second year rate of Level 1.
- (ii) A Level 1 Draftsman who subsequent to appointment obtains an appropriate Diploma or equivalent qualification approved by the Commissioner shall, where relevant and subject to the provisions of clause 6 of this Award, thereupon be advanced by one increment.
- (iii) A Level 1 Draftsman who holds an appropriate Diploma or equivalent qualification approved by the Commissioner shall, where relevant and subject to the provisions of clause 6 of this Award, upon becoming entitled to progression to the 9th year of the incremental range be advanced to the 10th year of such range.

6.—Annual Increments.

Subject to good conduct, diligence and efficiency an officer shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of the salary range according to the increments in such range.

No. 1, of 1977.

In the matter of the Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly for the Kimberley District held on the 19th day of February, 1977.

THE Petition of ERNEST FRANCIS BRIDGE, of Halls Creek, in the State of Western Australia, whose name is subscribed.

- A. Your Petitioner (hereinafter referred to as "Bridge") was a candidate at the election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly for the Kimberley District which was held on the 19th day of February, 1977.
- B. At the said election Keith Alan Ridge (hereinafter referred to as "Ridge") and Allan Robert Louis Rees (hereinafter referred to as "Rees") were also candidates.

- C. On the 19th day of February, 1977 the Returning Officer for the Kimberley District declared that of the valid first preference votes cast 1 726 were recorded in favour of Ridge, 1 631 were recorded in favour of Bridge and 118 were recorded in favour of Rees.
- D. On the same day the Returning Officer declared Rees to be a defeated candidate and proceeded to distribute in favour of Bridge and Ridge the votes recorded in favour of Rees in the order of the electoral preference.
- E. After the distribution of those preferences the votes recorded in favour of Ridge numbered 1 784 and in favour of Bridge numbered 1 691.
- F. Thereupon the Returning Officer declared Ridge to be the duly elected candidate.
- G. But for the matter set forth below the majority of votes cast, after the distribution of preferences, would have been in favour of Bridge and he would have been declared to be the duly elected candidate:
1. At the polling stations at Derby, Fitzroy Crossing, Go Go Station, Halls Creek, Kununurra, Mowanjum and Turkey Creek the Presiding Officers when satisfied (or when they ought to have been satisfied) that Aboriginal electors were so illiterate as to be unable to vote without assistance failed to mark ballot papers for illiterate electors in accordance with instructions given by those electors by displaying to the Presiding Officers cards containing the precise order and manner in which those papers were to be marked whereby 182 votes which would have been validly cast for Bridge were declared informal by virtue of s. 139 of the Electoral Act.
 2. The Presiding Officers at the polling stations at Derby, Fitzroy Crossing, Go Go Station, Halls Creek, Kununurra, Mowanjum and Turkey Creek failed to appoint in writing one or more Assistant Presiding Officers to assist them at those polling places being Assistant Presiding Officers able to interpret for the Aboriginal electors, or alternatively the Returning Officer failed to authorize them to make such appointments whereby:
 - (a) large numbers of Aboriginal electors who would have cast valid votes for Bridge at each of those polling stations were disqualified from voting because of inadequate answers by them to questions put to them in the English language in the terms of s. 119 of the Electoral Act when all those persons could have answered any such questions fully if put to them in a manner which they could understand;
 - (b) large numbers of Aboriginal electors who would have cast valid votes for Bridge and whose names were on the rolls were not properly identified and were not permitted to vote when all those persons would have been identified if asked questions in a manner which they could understand;
 - (c) large numbers of Aboriginal electors who would have cast valid votes for Bridge were given no or no proper advice in words which they could understand about their rights pursuant to s. 122 of the Electoral Act so being deprived of the right to vote.
 3. At the polling stations at Derby, Fitzroy Crossing, Go Go Station, Halls Creek, Kununurra, Mowanjum and Turkey Creek the Presiding Officers failed to find on the rolls the names of large numbers of Aboriginal electors who were correctly enrolled, were present and would have cast valid votes for Bridge, whereby they were deprived of the right to vote.
 4. At the polling stations at Derby, Fitzroy Crossing, Go Go Station, Halls Creek, Kununurra, Mowanjum and Turkey Creek the Presiding Officers turned away from the polling place large numbers of Aboriginal electors who claimed that their names were upon the rolls but which could not be found there, without giving them any or any proper advice about their rights pursuant to s. 122 of the Electoral Act whereby large numbers of Aboriginal people who would have cast a valid vote for Bridge were deprived of the right to vote.
 5. The polling booths at Kununurra, Mowanjum and Halls Creek were not kept open for the whole of the period between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on the polling day in circumstances in which by virtue of the demand of scrutineers for Ridge and Rees for large numbers of questions pursuant to s. 119 of the Electoral Act to be put to large numbers of Aboriginal electors in the English language about twenty minutes was required for the examination of each elector and whereby the time available for Aboriginal people to vote at those polling booths was lost and many Aboriginal people who would have cast valid votes for Bridge were deprived of the right to vote.
 6. At the polling stations at Derby, Fitzroy Crossing, Go Go Station, Halls Creek, Kununurra, Mowanjum and Turkey Creek the Presiding Officers having regard to the length of time which had been involved in questioning Aboriginal electors pursuant to s. 119 of the Electoral Act at the request of the Scrutineers for Ridge and Rees, failed before 8 p.m. on the polling day to adjourn the poll to other days to ensure that all Aboriginal electors should have a full and free opportunity to vote whereby large numbers of Aboriginal electors who would have cast valid votes for Bridge were deprived of the right to vote.
 7. The Chief Electoral Officer in his administration failed to provide sufficient polling places and electoral officers to ensure that the Aboriginal people properly enrolled for the election in the Kimberley District could pass through the polling booths on polling day and fully and freely exercise the right to vote in the event that scrutineers demanded that each of them be asked all of the questions provided for by s. 119 of the Electoral Act, whereby large numbers of Aboriginal people who wished to cast valid votes for Bridge were deprived of the right to vote.

8. The Presiding Officer at Kununurra at the request of John Chaney purporting to act as a scrutineer for Ridge wrote the word "objection" on a number of valid ballot papers which named Bridge as their first preference whereby all of those ballot papers were declared informal and the votes were lost to Bridge.
9. At Kununurra Police Sgt. Corker interfered with the right of assembly and voting of a large number of Aboriginal electors outside the polling booth who were waiting to complete their declarations under s. 122 of the Act by telling them to go away from the polling place which instruction they obeyed and passed on in turn to other Aboriginal electors coming to the polling place who in turn went away from the polls whereby large numbers of Aboriginal electors who would have cast valid votes for Bridge were denied their full and free opportunity to vote.
10. The Presiding Officers at certain polling stations permitted persons who did not make declarations in accordance with s. 114 (3) of the Electoral Act in the presence of those Presiding Officers or in the presence of the Returning Officer to:
- enter and remain in the polling stations contrary to s. 115 of the Electoral Act;
 - to interfere with the full and free exercise of the franchise by Aboriginal electors by purporting to act as scrutineers for Ridge and Rees in an oppressive manner.
- Whereby many Aboriginal electors who would have cast valid votes for Bridge cast votes which were declared informal or were not permitted to vote.
11. The purported scrutineers referred to in paragraph 10 hereof by their acts there pleaded:
- interfered with and attempted to interfere with the free exercise of the franchise of the Aboriginal electors at those polling stations;
 - intended that the result of the election should be affected;
 - did affect the result of the election.
12. All the acts of the purported scrutineers above pleaded were done with both the knowledge and the authority of Ridge and Rees.
- Full particulars of paragraphs 10, 11 and 12 hereof will be furnished after the inspection of the rolls and other documents used at or in connection with the election.
13. At the polling station at Mowanjum one Bob Rowell contrary to s. 192 of the Electoral Act questioned Aboriginal electors as to why they were letting Ridge down whereby a number of Aboriginal electors who would have cast valid votes for Bridge were so disillusioned about their freedom to vote as they wished that they left the polling station and never voted at the election.

DEVELOPMENT SCHEME.

THE Town of Canning under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

SCHEME TEXT.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Town of Canning Town Planning Scheme No. 13—Ionic Street Development Scheme.

Responsible Authority.

2. The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Town of Canning (hereinafter referred to as "The Council").

Maps.

3. The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme:—

Land use Map.
Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

General Objects.

5. The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To make suitable provision for the use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
- (c) To make suitable provision for roads within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To ensure proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage.
- (e) To make provision for drainage reserves.
- (f) To make provision for public open space within the Scheme Area.

Scheme Works.

6. The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—

- (a) The Scheme Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such minor variations as may with the approval of the Town Planning Board be determined by the Council.
- (b) The roads which are shown on the Scheme Map as roads to be closed, shall be closed and the land used for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map.
- (c) The land shown as roads on the Scheme Map shall be reserved for that purpose.
- (d) The roads of which the proposed carriage-way is coloured yellow on the Scheme Map shall be constructed and drained.
- (e) The footways shown on the Scheme Map shall be formed paved and fenced.
- (f) Those outbuildings or fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision shall be demolished or removed.
- (g) Where in the opinion of the Council it would be advantageous to fence existing lots in order to promote the sale of new lots such works may be undertaken.
- (h) Levelling filling and drainage works shall be carried out where considered necessary or desirable by the Council. Any drainage line required within the Scheme Area may if deemed necessary by the Council be connected by a pipe drain to a point of discharge outside the Scheme Area and the costs thereof debited to the Scheme.
- (i) Sewage disposal facilities shall be provided throughout the Scheme Area.
- (j) Fresh water shall be reticulated throughout the Scheme Area.
- (k) The lands shown as public open space and the lands shown as public purposes shall be set aside for those purposes.

- (l) Development of public open space shall be carried out.
- (m) If economically feasible electric power lines shall be laid underground.

Acquisition of Land.

7. The land within the Scheme Area (or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme) shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. The lands shown as lots on the Scheme Map on which houses are erected shall not be resumed.

Owner's Value Ratio.

8. (a) The lots shown on the Land Use Map with the exception of those listed in subclause 8 (b) and (c) hereof (hereinafter called "Old Lots") shall be valued as at the 9th day of June, 1975, on which date the Council passed a resolution deciding to adopt the Scheme and each owner will as soon as the valuation has been made be notified of the value so placed on his Old Lot.

(b) Those portions of the Old Lots listed hereunder which comprise the balance of each such lot after excision of the New Lots shown on the Scheme Map listed against each such Old Lot shall be valued as at the 9th day of June, 1975, on which date the Council passed a resolution deciding to adopt the Scheme and each owner will as soon as the valuation has been made be notified of the value so placed on the balance of the area of his Old Lot.

(c) Lot 1061 Beatrice Avenue shall not be valued.

9. The lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "New Lots") with the exception of those listed in clause 8 subclause (b) above and New Lots 106, 107 and 116 shall be valued on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out.

10. From the sum of the values of the remaining New Lots shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the New Lots. The Owners Value Ratio is the relationship between the net values of the New Lot and the sum of the values of the Old Lots.

Owner's Interest in Scheme.

11. (1) Subject to clause 8 subclause (b) and (c) herein and to paragraph (2) hereof each owner of an Old Lot or portion of an Old Lot in the Scheme Area shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in the Scheme of a value equal to the value of his Old Lot or the portion thereof within the Scheme Area increased in the ratio of the Owners Value Ratio determined in accordance with Paragraph 10 hereof if the net value of the New Lots exceeds the sum of the values of the Old Lots.

(2) The owners of Lots 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 60 and 61 Corinthian Road West and 1, 2 and 3 Sixth Avenue on the Land Use Map shall have no interest in the Scheme nor any right to share in the profits of the Scheme.

Lots 60 and 61.

12. The rear portions of Lots 60 and 61 shown as being part of other lots on the Scheme Map will be resumed for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map. The Council shall assess the cost of the provision of sewerage reticulation service to each of the said lots and shall offer to undertake this work and the cost thereof shall if the offer be accepted be set off against the compensation payable to the owners with the necessary cash payment being made by the owner or the Council as the case requires.

Council's Land.

13. The Council is the owner of certain land in the Scheme Area and in respect of such land the Council shall have the same rights and be under the same obligations as other owners of land in the Scheme Area.

Public Open Space.

14. The land set aside in the Scheme Area for Public Open Space exceeds ten per cent. (10%) of the total Scheme Area and the Council for that reason will pay to Scheme Funds the value of 2.5377 hectares subject to survey of the land set aside for public open space. The said value shall be made as at the 9th day of June, 1975, being the date on which the Council passed a resolution to adopt the Scheme.

Sewerage.

15. The Council shall as part of the Scheme Works instal or pay the cost of installation of pipes for the reticulation of sewerage services to serve all lots in the Scheme Area. The sewerage services will not be available for use until the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board provides mains and headworks to serve the Scheme Area.

16. The Council may permit development before the sewerage services become available but such permission will if given be on the condition that the owner will connect the property to the sewerage service when it becomes available to the lot.

17. If the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board shall require that as part of the sewerage design the lots in the area bounded by Sixth Avenue, Central Avenue and Burnham Way be included, the Board shall reimburse the Scheme funds for any additional costs involved thereby.

Costs of Scheme.

18. The costs or estimated costs of the following items shall comprise the Scheme Costs:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme.
- (b) The costs of the Scheme Works.
- (c) All the compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation and any payment made under clause 22 hereof.
- (d) The estimated compensation and costs payable under clause 19 hereof.
- (e) The cost of the acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (f) The cost of altering existing electricity water sewerage drainage or telephone services or of providing exceptional services rendered necessary by the Scheme to the extent to which and in cases where the Council considers the cost justified.
- (g) Such proportion of the cost of the drainage works to be carried out by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board as the Council considers reasonable.

- (h) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to complete the Scheme.

Estimate of Compensation.

19. In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

Allocation and Disposal of New Lots.

20. The New Lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) Each owner of an Old Lot with the exception of Lots 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 60 and 61 Corinthian Road West, 1, 2 and 3 Sixth Avenue and 1061 Beatrice Avenue shall be offered a New Lot or lots (hereinafter called replacement lots) of a value as near as practicable to the owner's interest in the Scheme as calculated according to clause 11. The replacement lots shall be chosen and allocated as equitably as possible so that if practicable the replacement lot will have characteristics similar to those of the Old Lot acquired from the owner.
- (ai) The owner of Lot 1061 Beatrice Avenue shall be offered New Lots 106, 107 and 116 subject to the payment by him of the proportionate cost of the Scheme, excluding road construction costs in respect to New Lots 107 and 116. Such offer shall be in total satisfaction of his interest in the Scheme and he shall not be entitled to any further interest or to share in any profits of the Scheme.
- (aii) The owners of the lots listed in clause 8 (b) herein shall be offered the New Lots listed in the last column in addition to the offer contained and provided for in clause 20 (a) above but shall in respect to the vacant New Lots 40, 42, 48, 54, 56 and 58 pay to the Council the proportionate cost of the Scheme, excluding road construction costs, in respect of each such lot.
- (b) All the remaining New Lots (hereinafter referred to as Saleable Lots) may be sold to pay the Scheme Costs and otherwise dealt with in accordance with the Scheme.

Nature of Offers.

21. An offer made pursuant to clause 20 (a) hereof will be made either with an offer or payment of money or subject to the owner making a payment of money in order that the total value of the New Lot or lots offered and the new value of any land within the Scheme Area not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner together with or subject to a payment in money is equal to the owners interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with clause 11 hereof. The offer may be made in the alternative giving the owner the right to accept either a lot or lots subject to a payment by him or to accept no lots or a lesser number of lots with a payment by the Council to him.

22. If an owner of an Old Lot shall in the opinion of the Council suffer any additional damage or inconvenience by reason of the reduction in size of the lot on which a dwelling-house is erected or by reason of the proximity of a road to such dwelling-house or otherwise by reason of the Scheme the Council shall offer to such owner such sum (if any) as it (acting on the advice of the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Dept.) considers equitable. The said offer shall be made

with the offer mentioned in clause 20 to the intent that the owner may not accept the offer mentioned in clause 20 hereof either wholly or in part without accepting the offer in this clause mentioned.

23. The offers mentioned in the above clauses shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served on him by registered post at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and where relevant shall specify the New Lot or lots (if any) the subject of the offer and the Old Lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owners interest in the Scheme the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be and how the amount is calculated.

24. If a pipe drain has been or is to be laid across land within a lot shown on the Scheme Map such lot may be offered or sold expressly subject to the condition that the transferee shall grant to the Council or to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board as decided by the Council a drainage easement over so much of the lots as is required for the drain. If the Council shall itself have granted an easement to the said Board the lot shall be transferred subject to such easement.

25. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

26. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall unless the time shall have been extended by the Council be deemed to have been rejected.

27. If an offer is made in the alternative and an owner does not accept all the lots offered to him the lots accepted by him shall be treated as being in payment on account of the owners interest in the Scheme. The remainder of his interest (if any) in the Scheme shall be paid in Cash.

28. An owner who accepts the offer shall be liable to pay to the Council all rates which would have been payable on the land acquired from him if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of lots to him.

29. If an offer be accepted wholly or in part it shall be accepted by the owner on the basis that such acceptance is a complete bar to all claims for compensation which the owner may have had in respect of the resumption from him of the lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of the Scheme but shall not debar him from participating in the profits of the Scheme if he is so entitled.

30. If an owner does not accept an offer of a New Lot wholly or in part he shall not be entitled to any interest under this Scheme or to participate in the Scheme profits.

Registration of Transfers.

31. The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with the Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893, as amended and return it to the Council for registration or if the owner shall fail to make payment of any money which may be due by him to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the Transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for a cash payment equal to his interest in the Scheme and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots.

32. Any lot offered to but not accepted by an owner in accordance with the Scheme or the subject of a transfer not completed as aforesaid may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears.

33. The Council may sell the saleable lots and the rejected lots either by public auction, tender or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or such other valuer as shall be appointed by the Council unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

34. If in the opinion of the Council it shall not prove necessary to sell all the saleable lots in order to pay the costs of the Scheme the Council may:

- (a) Re-allocate some or all of the lots unsold to owners where it considers it just and equitable so to do in which case the cash payment to be made or received under clause 21 shall be adjusted accordingly.
- (b) May otherwise deal with the lots in such manner as it considers to be in the best interest of the District.

35. The Council may instead of selling all or any of the saleable lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained, sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

Profits of Scheme.

36. If the Scheme shall show a profit such profit shall subject to the foregoing clauses be distributed among each of those owners of land within the Scheme Area, who accept wholly or in part the offers mentioned in clause 20 (a) in the proportion which the value of the owners Old Lot or portion thereof within the Scheme Area bears to the total value of the Old Lots within the Scheme Area whose owners have accepted wholly or in part the offer made to them pursuant to clause 20 (a). For the purpose of this clause the values shall be those finally made pursuant to clause 8 hereof. The right to participate in the profits shall not in the absence of agreement devolve to any person not the owner of the land who accepted an offer made by the Council pursuant to this Scheme.

37. If an owner or other person entitled to portion of the profits of the Scheme cannot be found the Council may after the expiration of six (6) years from the date on which the owner's share in the profits was ascertained expend the amount of his portion of the profits in the improvement of the Scheme Area and thereafter such owner shall have no claim in respect of such money.

Loss.

38. If the Scheme shall show a loss the amount of the loss shall be borne by the owners in the same proportion as that specified in clause 36 and each owner shall at the expiration of three (3) months from the service of a notice on him stating his proportion of the loss pay such amount to the Council.

Encumbrance on Title.

39. In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser, mortgagee, chargee or lessee the Council shall not make any payments to nor transfer a lot to the owner without the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance or unless subject to similar encumbrances.

Moneys Owing to Council and for Rates and Taxes.

40. The Council shall deduct from any moneys payable to an owner the amount of any unpaid rates or taxes and any other moneys owing by the owner to the Council. Except in the case of pensioners no lot shall be transferred to an owner until all moneys owing by him for rates and taxes have been paid.

Powers of Council.

41. The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall in addition to the powers and authorities hereinbefore mentioned have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer of lots may be accepted.
- (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land or buildings within the Scheme Area.
- (e) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled either as the owner of land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme or to which it becomes entitled pursuant to the Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specific parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (f) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of the Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (g) To enter into such agreements and arrangements with the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board as seems proper to the Council for the purpose of draining the Scheme Area and providing reticulated water and sewerage disposal services within the Scheme Area.
- (h) To remove, alter or demolish any building which obstructs the observance or carrying out of the Scheme.
- (i) With the consent of the Town Planning Board to make minor variations to the survey design where necessary or desirable.
- (j) To let or lease on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit any land or buildings acquired by it pursuant to this Scheme.
- (k) With the consent of all owners affected thereby to alter the allocation of any replacement.
- (l) The Council may but is not obliged so to do pay by way of compensation the interest in the Scheme to which the owner would have been entitled if he had accepted the offer or a part thereof.
- (m) To agree to the extension of time for payment of any moneys payable to it and to accept security for the payment thereof.
- (n) To postpone the implementation of the Scheme for such period as it thinks fit or to implement the Scheme in stages dealing with portions of the Scheme Area from time to time as the Council considers proper in the circumstances.

Valuations.

42. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined on the assumption that there are no buildings, structures or fences thereon and shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or by such other valuer being a member of the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers as shall be approved by the Council.

43. If an owner objects to the value placed on his land he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been notified of the said value or revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner and if the objection shall not have been withdrawn the value shall be determined by the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner hereinafter provided.

44. If a value placed on a lot shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on the other lots and make such re-valuations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected shall forthwith be notified of any change in value so made.

Arbitration.

45. Any dispute or difference between the owners as to the valuation of land made for the purpose of this Scheme may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council.

Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.

46. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of the Scheme shall be made within six months of the coming into operation of the Scheme or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of rescission under clause 31 hereof whichever is the later.

BY-LAWS.

- Principal by-laws.
1. In these by-laws the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Board By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th January, 1970 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal by-laws.
- By-law 2 amended.
2. By-law 2 of the principal by-laws is amended—
- (a) by substituting for the interpretation “industrial waste” the following interpretation:—
- “industrial waste” means the liquid, solid or gaseous refuse from any business, industry, warehouse or manufacturing premises, other than domestic sewage, stormwater, or unpolluted water. ;
- (b) by adding after the interpretation “main vent” the following interpretations:—
- “observation well” means a well constructed for the purposes of observing the depth to the ground water from the top of the well, and for obtaining samples of the ground water.
- “pesticides” means a substance or compound used or intended for use for agricultural, pastoral, horticultural, domestic, or industrial purposes for controlling, destroying or preventing the growth and development of any fungus, virus, insect, mite, mollusc nematode, plant or animal and includes all admixtures containing any proportion of any one or more of them. ; and
- (c) by adding after the interpretation “private service” the following interpretation:—
- “production well” means a well owned and operated by the Board and from which groundwater is extracted and conveyed by pipeline to a water treatment plant. .

SCHEDULE—*continued.*By-law 3A
added.

3. The principal by-laws are amended by adding immediately before by-law 4 and under the heading PREVENTION OF POLLUTION, the following by-law:—

3A. The Board may erect signs and notice boards in any pollution area, Public Water Supply Area, water reserve or catchment area for the exhibition of any by-law, rule, regulation or notice.

By-law 34D
substituted.

4. The principal by-laws are amended by substituting for by-law 34D the following by-laws:—

34D. In a pollution area the use, storage and transport of pesticides, the disposal of pesticide containers and the disposal of spilled pesticides shall be in compliance with the provisions of the Pesticides Regulations as amended from time to time.

34E. In a pollution area a person shall not carry out the burial or disposal of animal or poultry carcasses, blood offal, or other refuse products in excess of two tonnes, unless prior approval has been obtained from the Board.

34F. In a pollution area a person shall not store animal manures or sewage sludges within 100 metres of a production well except under approved conditions.

34G. A person shall not establish an offensive trade in accordance with the provisions of the Health Act, 1911, in a pollution area, unless they have obtained the consent of the Board to do so, and unless they comply with any conditions which the Board may impose in relation to the establishment of that offensive trade.

34H. In a pollution area a person shall not yard or house an animal within 30 m of a production well.

34I. In a pollution area installation or operation of septic tanks, leach drains, soakwells and other apparatus for the disposal of domestic waste waters shall be carried out in conformity with the Bacteriolytic Treatment of Sewage and Disposal of Effluent and Liquid Waste Regulations as amended from time to time and where the site is within 100 m of a production well a person shall obtain prior consent for the installation or operation from the Board which may impose further conditions and restrictions as to the siting, construction or operation of the apparatus, in which event the Board shall meet any consequential extra cost incurred in the initial construction of the apparatus.

34J. A person shall not construct or cause to be constructed or altered a well in any pollution area except in accordance with the Health Act (Underground Water Supply) Regulations, 1959 as amended from time to time.

34K. In a pollution area or a part of a pollution area a person shall not dispose of or discharge onto or into the ground, or into any lake, swamp or drain industrial wastes, chemicals, radio active material, petroleum or petroleum products, polluted water, or refuse unless that person has been granted permission in writing by the Board to do so.

34L. The establishment or operation of any premises for the storage, packaging, formulating, processing, manufacturing, sale, testing or use of chemicals or other substances liable to pollute underground water in a pollution area shall be subject to the following terms, provisions and conditions:—

- (a) application shall be made to the Board in writing for a permit to operate existing or proposed premises, and the application shall set out—
 - (i) the process or processes of manufacture, packaging, storage, formulating, testing, or use of all raw materials and fuels, intermediate products and final products including waste materials and effluents whether gaseous, liquid or solid;
 - (ii) the quantities of raw materials, and fuels used and the intermediate and final products, waste materials, effluents, being or proposed to be produced;
 - (iii) the methods proposed to treat and dispose of any wastes, by-products and effluents, including stormwater and wash down water where this may be or could become polluted;
 - (iv) plans and procedures proposed to prevent pollution of underground water, including emergency plans and procedures for contingencies such as accidental spillage or malfunction of any manufacturing, storage, transport or treatment process or system, both on and off the premises where this is applicable;
 - (v) such other information required by the Board to assess the pollution risk to underground water and to assist with measures to prevent pollution;

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

(b) upon receipt of the permit for the operation of the premises the applicant shall enter into a written agreement with the Board to comply with the conditions of the permit which may where so required include conditions that where at any time in the opinion of the Board—

- (i) the occupier is not fully and faithfully performing and observing the terms, provisions and conditions of the permit or any by-law;
- (ii) the raw materials, intermediate products and final products, wastes, effluents, fuels or any other substance are not in compliance with the terms, provisions or conditions of the permit;
- (iii) the apparatus, the subject of the permit is not in efficient working order;
- (iv) pollution of the groundwater may be occurring or about to occur; or
- (v) any other breach of the agreement has been made,

the Board may serve a notice in writing upon the occupier of the property, by delivering it or posting it addressed to him at the property, specifying the matter or matters in respect of which a breach has taken place, or as to which the occupier is in default, or concerning which there is any complaint by the Board, and the notice shall require the occupier to make good the same in all things to the satisfaction of the Board, within a period to be stated therein, from the date of service thereof, in the manner so specified, and the notice shall also state that the Board is at liberty to terminate and put an end to the permit;

- (c) the occupier shall notify the Board in writing of his desire to make any alteration which shall in any way affect the nature and quantity of the raw materials, fuels, intermediate and final products, wastes and effluents, or the apparatus plans and procedures the subject of the permit, and which may affect the risk of pollution to underground water, and shall not make such an alteration without prior approval in writing from the Board;
- (d) the person to whom the permit is granted shall notify the Board in writing of any change of ownership or occupancy of the property, at least fourteen days prior to the change;
- (e) the permit shall not be assigned or transferred, unless the consent of the Board in writing has been first obtained;
- (f) the Board may require the owner or occupier of any premises the subject of a permit from the Board to instal sample collection apparatus, measuring equipment and observation wells in the ground for the purpose of measuring the depth to the ground water and for obtaining samples of ground water, or for any other purpose;
- (g) the Board or any authorised officer, servant, agent, or workman of the Board shall be at liberty at any time and from time to time to enter upon the property and every part thereof and to take samples or measurements and otherwise to inspect the apparatus stored or situated on the property.

34M. Where the requirements of a notice referred to in paragraph (b) of by-law 34L have not been complied with on the expiration of the period mentioned therein, the permit shall automatically terminate, and the Board, by its officers may enter upon the property, and at the expense of the occupier disconnect or stop the apparatus used and take such other action as may be deemed necessary to prevent or stop pollution of groundwater that may be occurring or which might occur, and the occupier shall not be entitled to compensation in connection therewith.

34N. The holder of a permit referred to in by-law 34L shall notify the Board immediately any spillage occurs that might pollute the groundwater, either directly or indirectly, and where that spillage occurs.

34P. Any person handling petroleum and other flammable liquids in a pollution area shall store and handle those liquids in accordance with the Flammable Liquids Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time and in addition shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) underground tanks for the storage of petroleum products shall not be installed within 100 m of a production well;

SCHEDULE—continued.

- (b) all underground tanks for the storage of petroleum products shall be installed in reinforced concrete or other approved impervious containment structures capable of preventing any leakage from the storage tank to the ground or ground water;
- (c) any bunds or compounds on any premises licenced under the Flammable Liquids Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time, shall be constructed so that the walls and floor of the bund or compound are of reinforced concrete or other impervious material to the approval of the Board;
- (d) where a person intends to store flammable liquids in a pollution area, they shall apply to the Board for its prior approval, setting out the location of proposed structures, buildings and tanks and shall abide by any conditions which the Board may impose.

34Q. A person storing or using petroleum products in a pollution area at unlicenced premises in accordance with Part III of the Flammable Liquids Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time, shall take all reasonable care to prevent spillage or leakage of petroleum products onto or into the ground and may be required by the Board to instal suitable impervious catchpits or similar, approved containment structures.

34R. Any person spilling, or being aware of any leakage of, any petroleum product in a pollution area shall notify the Board immediately of that occurrence.

34S. A person shall not construct, alter or obstruct any watercourse, or drainage works in a manner that causes the flooding of any well or observation well.

34T. A person shall not discharge into any well or observation well any chemical, industrial waste, treated or untreated sewage, effluent or other matter which in the opinion of the Board may pollute the underground water.

34U. A person shall not place any chemical or other substance that is capable of polluting underground water, down a well during the course of its construction, re-development, maintenance or operation without prior approval of the Board.
