WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973, that where a local authority in whose district a sewerage area is situated, undertakes any works in that sewerage area and it appears after inquiry that—

- (a) the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act 1960-1976, will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payment of the instalments of capital debt and interest on any of the works with respect to which any debt is owing; and
- (b) the local authority should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1976,

the Governor may, by proclamation, grant to the local authority such permission and may in the proclamation specify new limits of the maximum

general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960-1976; and whereas the Brookton Sewerage Area constituted under section 4 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on 6th August, 1976, is within the district of the municipality of the Shire of Brookton and the Shire has undertaken works within that area; and whereas it appears after inquiry that the maximum general rate that the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Brookton may impose will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payments of the instalments of capital debt and interest on the works to which any debt is owing and that the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Brookton should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1976: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred under subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973, do hereby grant to the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Brookton permission to levy a general rate not exceeding forty cents (40 cents) for each dollar of the annual value of the rateable property in any year in its district that is within the Brookton Sewerage Area aforesaid.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1976, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor have power to construct provide and extend water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:

City of Melville and Town of Cockburn.
460 mm Water Main—Annois Road—Bibra Lake.

The construction of a four hundred and sixty millimetre diameter water main about two thousand and forty metres in length complete with valves and all other necessary apparatus.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

By-laws of the Kent Shire Council, Relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Shire or any part of the Shire of Kent.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. (a) On the resolution of the Council to establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade and application accompanied by the resolution of the Council forming the brigade shall be made to the Bush Fires Board for its registration accordingly.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Council shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade and who, in the Council's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The Shire Clerk or such other person as the Council may appoint, shall be the Secretary of the brigade.

4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot or depots approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there is more than one such depot in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Council shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the President and Shire Clerk of the Council conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the powers and duties of the captain.

Membership of Brigades.

7. (1) Members of a bush fire brigade shall be those persons being able-bodied members of either sex, over 15 years of age, who are willing to render service or assistance at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Schedule to these by-laws.

(2) The enrolment of persons as members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Council.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council but the Shire Clerk shall keep record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigades.

9. Meetings will be held as necessary.

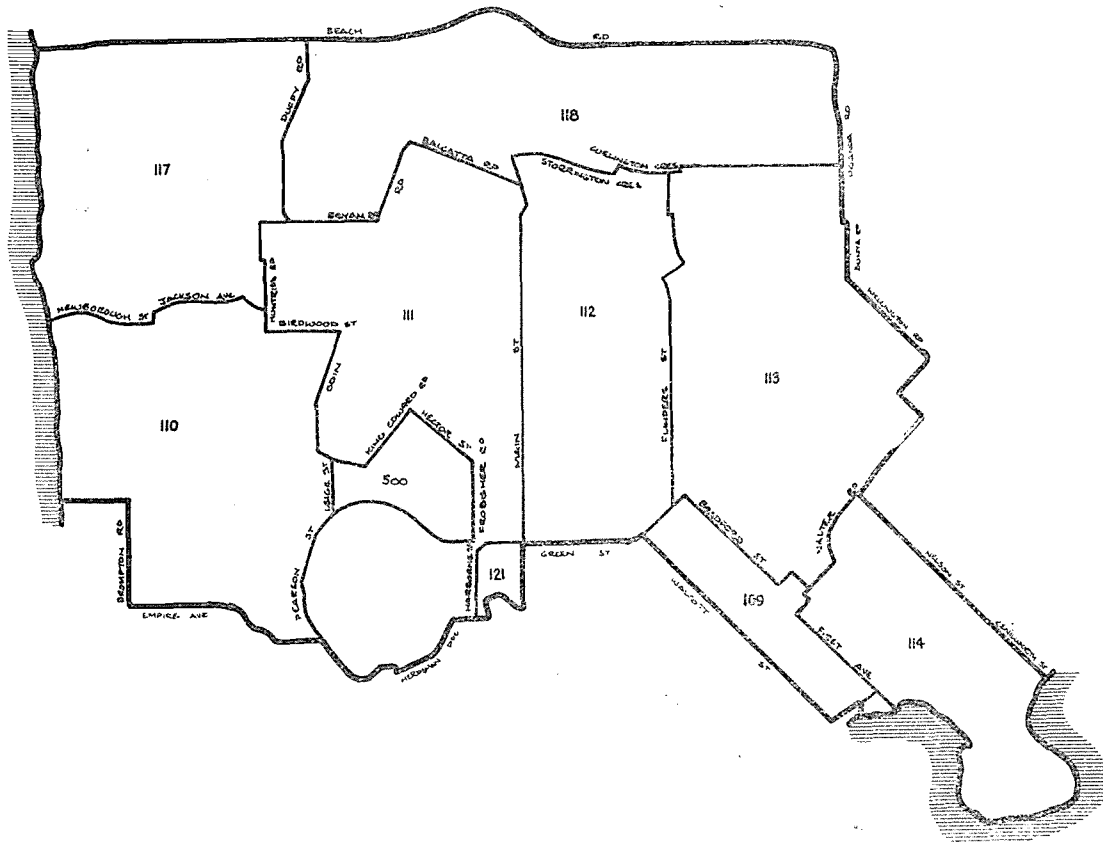

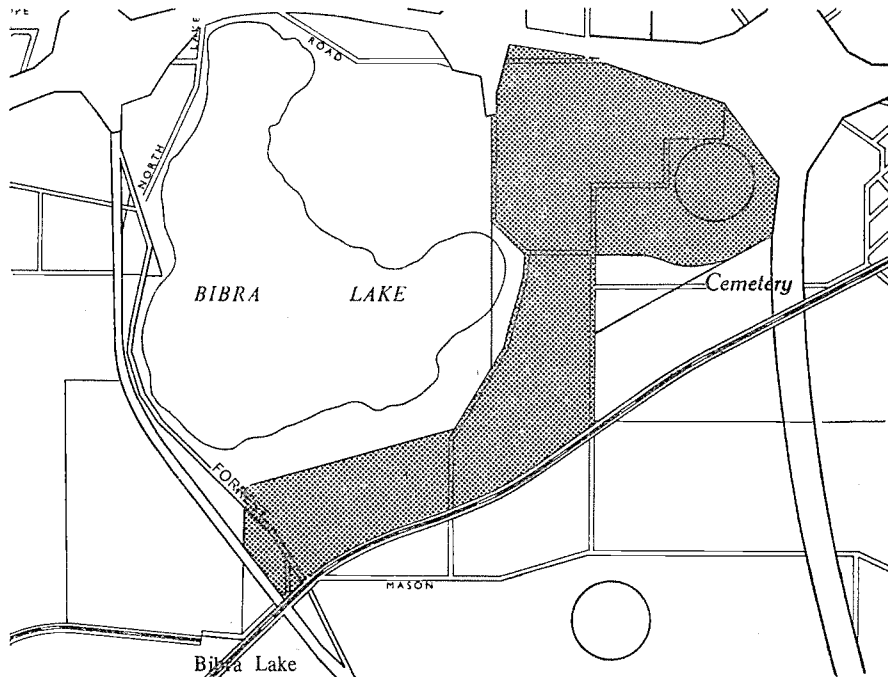

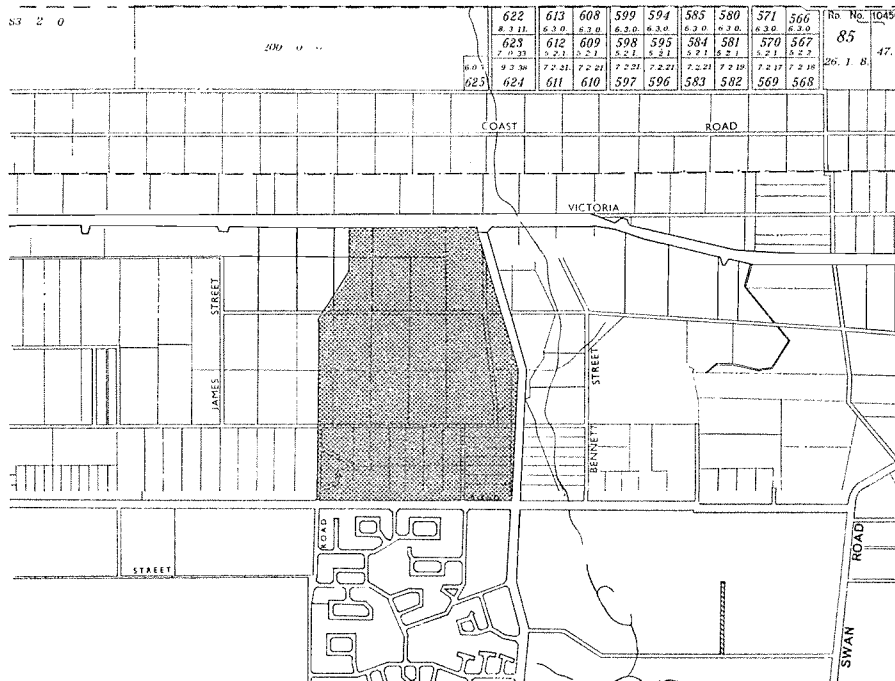

3. (1) An application pursuant to section 17 of the Act for approval to operate an abattoir shall be in the form of Form 1.
 - (2) An application pursuant to section 17 of the Act for approval to construct and operate an abattoir shall be in the form of Form 3.
 - (3) An application pursuant to section 21 of the Act for approval to carry out any structural alterations or additions to an abattoir shall be in the form of Form 5.
4. (1) An approval to operate an abattoir shall be in the form of Form 2.
 - (2) An approval for the construction and operation of an abattoir shall be in the form of Form 4.
 - (3) An approval to carry out structural alterations or additions to an abattoir shall be in the form of Form 6.
 - (4) An approval of the Authority shall be signed by the Chairman or the Deputy Chairman.
5. (1) Where the Authority refuses any application made pursuant to regulation 3, the applicant may within 30 days of notification of the refusal, appeal to the Minister in writing, stating clearly the grounds on which the appeal is made.
 - (2) An applicant may, within 30 days of being granted an approval pursuant to regulation 4, appeal to the Minister in writing, with respect to any conditions or restrictions which the Authority has imposed on the approval.
6. The owner of an abattoir which has been approved pursuant to regulation 4, shall inform the Authority when—
 - (a) the information provided to the Authority in Form 1 is altered as a result of any operational change with respect to that abattoir;
 - (b) the operation of the abattoir ceases; or
 - (c) any change in ownership, control or management of the abattoir occurs.
7. The Authority may refuse to grant an approval under section 17 of the Act for the construction or operation of an abattoir to which the Country Slaughterhouse Regulations, 1969 apply, if such construction or operation will be contrary to those regulations.
8. (1) The owner of an abattoir shall on the first day of each month make a return to the Authority in the form of Form 7 providing particulars of the slaughtering throughput of the abattoir during the month immediately prior to that date.
 - (2) The owner of an abattoir shall ensure that any other persons who undertake the management of operations at the abattoir shall provide the Authority with the information required by subregulation (1) of this regulation.

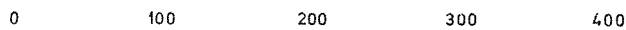


WESTERN AUSTRALIA
