- (c) subject to subsection (5) of that section increase the rate of contribution payable by each mine worker and by each owner to the rate of contribution specified in relation to a mine worker and an owner respectively in the Schedule to this proclamation; and
- (d) specify that this proclamation shall take effect on and from the 20th May, 1977.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1975.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1975, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1971, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas the Shire of Mandurah was so declared the Mandurah Fire

District; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council does hereby adjust the boundaries of the Mandurah Fire District so that the boundaries are in accordance with the description set out in the Schedule to this Order.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the low water mark of the Indian Ocean with prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Lot 104 of Cockburn Sound Location 16 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 741 and extending easterly to and along that boundary to a northwestern side of Fremantle Road; thence generally southwesterly along sides of that road to the prolongation westerly of the southern side of Gordon Road; thence easterly to and along that side to a southeastern side of Thornborough Road; thence generally southerly and generally easterly along sides of that road to the southeastern corner of Land Titles Office Lot 6, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 8565; thence easterly to the southernmost southwestern corner of Land Titles Office Lot 12, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 7590; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that lot and onwards to a western shore of Goegrup Lake; thence generally southerly along that shore and generally southerly and generally westerly downwards along the right bank of the Serpentine River to a southwestern side of Pinjarra Road (Road Number 784); thence generally northwesterly and generally westerly along sides of that road to a southeastern side of Wanjeep Street; thence generally southwesterly along sides of that road to the prolongation southeasterly of the southwestern side of Boundary Road; thence southeasterly along that prolongation to the right bank of the Serpentine River; thence generally southerly downwards along that bank to the prolongation northeasterly of the southernmost southeastern boundary of Land Titles Office Lot 168, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2087(4); thence southwesterly to and along that boundary and onwards to the Low Water Mark of Peel Inlet; thence generally westerly along that mark to the prolongation southwesterly of a northwestern side of Wanjeep Street; thence northeasterly to and generally northeasterly along sides of that road to the southwestern side of Boundary Road; thence northwesterly along that side to the prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of Murray Location 58; thence westerly to and along that boundary to the western side of Old Coast Road; thence generally northeasterly and generally northerly along sides of that road and generally northwesterly and generally westerly along sides of Leighton Road to an eastern side of Dalrymple Terrace; thence southerly and southwesterly along sides of that terrace to a southwestern side of McLarty Road; thence generally northwesterly along sides of that road to an eastern side of Armstrong Street; thence generally southerly and northwesterly along sides of that street and onwards to a western side of Marsh Place; thence generally northerly along sides of that place to a southern side of McLarty Road; thence westerly along that side to the northwestern side of Wilkins Street; thence northeasterly along that side to the easternmost southeastern corner of Location 1636; thence generally southwesterly, generally northwesterly and northeasterly along boundaries of that location to a southeastern side of Janis Street; thence generally westerly along sides of that Street to a southeastern corner of Location 1635; thence northwesterly along the southwestern boundary of that location and onwards to the Low

Water Mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally northeasterly, generally easterly, southeasterly across the entrance of Peel Inlet, again generally northeasterly and generally northerly along that mark to the starting point. (Lands and Surveys Public Plans R248-4, Pi 8-4, Pi 23-4, Pi 24-4, Pi 25-4, Pi 39-4, Pi 40-4, Pi 41-4, Pi 56-4, Pi 57-4, Pi 72-4.)

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it, is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. No. 1760/74.—That Reserve 34488 (Karatha Lot 1544) should be granted in fee simple to The Baptist Union of Western Australia (Incorporated) to be held in trust for the purpose of "Baptist Church and Manse".

Corres. No. 796/77.—That Reserve No. 34624 (Geraldton Lot 2724) should be granted in fee simple to The St. John Ambulance Association in Western Australia Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of "Ambulance Sub-Centre Site".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the abovementioned bodies to be held in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

File No. 1185/64.

WHEREAS, by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27270, should vest in and be held by the Shire of Cranbrook in trust for the purpose of "Recreation": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Cranbrook, in trust for "Recreation" with power to the said Shire of Cranbrook, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands to each and every lease or assignment of lease being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion thereof for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to me by section 37 of the said Act; provided that no such lease or assignment of lease shall be valid or operative until the approval of the Minister for Lands, or an officer authorised in that behalf by the Minister, has been endorsed on the Lease Instrument, or Deed of Assignment, as the case may be.

Local Government Act, 1960-1976.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1976, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

said liability, and have jointly deposited at the Treasury a security to wit, a Bond for \$40 000 charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt Alcoa of Australia (W.A.) Limited and Alcoa of Australia Limited from the operation of Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975, for a period terminating on the 30th day of April, 1979, except that they shall obtain from the State Government Insurance Office and maintain for the duration of this exemption a policy of insurance for the full amount of their liability to pay compensation to their workers in respect of Pneumoconiosis.

REGULATIONS.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Justices Act (Extraordinary Licences) Regulations, 1977.
- Revocation. 2. The Justices Act (Extraordinary Licences) Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th and 12th September, 1975 and amended by notices published in the *Gazette* from time to time thereafter are hereby revoked.
- Definitions. 3. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
“application” means an application to a court of petty sessions under section 76 of the Act;
“court of petty sessions” includes a Children’s Court established under the Child Welfare Act, 1947;
“Form” means a form in the Schedule to these regulations;
“regulation” means one of these regulations;
“special application” means an application made—
(a) within two months after the applicant has been disqualified from holding or obtaining a driver’s licence pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 63 of the Act; or
(b) within one month after the applicant has been disqualified from holding or obtaining a driver’s licence pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 64 of the Act;
“the Act” means the Road Traffic Act, 1974;
“the Authority” means the Road Traffic Authority established under section 6 of the Act and includes an officer of that Authority acting on its behalf;
“the clerk” means the clerk for the court of petty sessions to which an application is made.
- Form of Application. 4. (1) An application under subsection (1) of section 76 of the Act other than a special application shall be made by lodging with the clerk an application in the form of Form 1.
(2) A special application shall be made by lodging with the clerk an application in the form of Form 5.
(3) An application under paragraph (a) of subsection (7) of section 76 of the Act shall be made by lodging with the clerk an application in the form of Form 2.
(4) An application under paragraph (b) of subsection (7) of section 76 of the Act shall be made by lodging with the clerk an application in the form of Form 3.
(5) An application shall be lodged in triplicate and shall set out clearly and concisely the information required by the form in which it is made.
(6) A fee of \$2.00 shall be payable on the lodging of an application referred to in subregulation (1), (2) or (3) of this regulation.

(3) On accepting an application referred to in subregulation (4) of regulation 4 the clerk shall—
(a) subject to subregulation (4) of this regulation, list the application for hearing at the earliest convenient sitting of the court and insert the date and time of the hearing on the copies of the application; and
(b) return one copy of the application to the Authority and serve another copy on the holder of the extraordinary licence to which the application relates.
- As to "serve" see Act No. 30 of 1918 s. 31. (4) An application referred to in subregulation (4) of regulation 4 shall not be listed for hearing on a date less than twenty-one clear days after the date on which the application was lodged unless—
(a) the holder of the extraordinary licence to which it relates consents to an earlier hearing; or
(b) the court considers that an earlier hearing is desirable in the interests of the safety of the public generally and orders accordingly.
- Record of convictions. 7. The Authority—
(a) on lodging an application referred to in subregulation (4) of regulation 4; or
(b) as soon as practicable after being served with an application referred to in subregulation (1), (2) or (3) of regulation 4,
shall lodge with the court a copy of the record of convictions of the extraordinary licence holder or applicant, as the case may be.
- Procedure at hearing. 8. (1) The Authority is not obliged to be represented at the hearing of an application referred to in subregulation (1), (2) or (3) of regulation 4 but if the Authority is represented the hearing shall be conducted as if it were the hearing of a complaint laid by the applicant against the Authority as defendant.
(2) The holder of the extraordinary licence to which an application referred to in subregulation (4) of regulation 4 relates is not obliged to be present or represented at the hearing of that application but if he is present or represented the hearing shall be conducted as if it were the hearing of a complaint laid against him by the Authority.
- Notice of result of hearing. 9. Whenever an application is determined by a court of petty sessions the clerk shall forthwith provide the Authority with a notice in the form of Form 4 indicating whether the court made an order or refused the application and, where an order was made, stating the terms of the order.

1B. In relation to temporary privies to be provided for the use of workmen employed on any works, within the District the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) The privy shall comply with the requirements for borehole type privies prescribed in Regulation 44 of the Bacteriolytic Treatment of Sewage and Disposal of Effluent and Liquid Waste Regulations.
- (b) A privy shall not be within 20 feet of any house or tank, nor within 50 feet of any milking shed or milk room of any dairy.
- (c) the walls and roof shall be of wood and galvanised iron or such other material as may be approved by the local authority.
- (d) The entrance shall be effectively screened to ensure privacy.

he may cause the vehicle to be inspected and for that purpose shall serve a notice in writing on the driver of the vehicle ordering that the vehicle be presented for inspection before a date specified in the notice and at a place specified in the notice.

- (3) Where a driver of a vehicle on whom a notice is served under subregulation (2) of this regulation is not the owner of the vehicle—

(a) the officer of the Authority or patrolman by whom the notice is served shall cause a copy of the notice to be served on the owner; and

(b) the driver shall bring the notice to the attention of the owner.

(4) The owner of a vehicle that is the subject of a notice served under subregulation (2) of this regulation shall not use the vehicle, or permit or suffer it to be used, on or after the date specified in the notice unless the vehicle has been presented for inspection pursuant to that notice.

(5) Nothing in subregulation (4) of this regulation authorises a vehicle to be used at any time whilst the use of the vehicle is prohibited, under regulation 106 or 107 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1975. .

5.34 Composite Business and Light Industrial Zone: Areas designated under this zone may be used only for such business, professional, service trade or light industry as approved by Council and the development of the same must meet the following requirements:—

All developments proposed must—

- (a) Provide a needed amenity or service to the Local Community.
- (b) Any development constructed and operated must not cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood.

- (c) The requirements of this part subsection (c) are to apply only to the part of Swan Location 1586 which is contained within the Composite Business and Light Industrial Zone and the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—
- (i) To dispose of lots created within Location 1586 upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit.
 - (ii) To impose conditions regarding the purchase or lease of land.
 - (iii) To enter into any agreements with any person or Government instrumentality for the purpose of carrying out any of the works associated with the development of this part of the Composite Business and Light Industrial Zone.
 - (iv) In the event of the sale of land within this part of the Composite Business and Light Industrial Zone showing a profit, the amount of such profit shall be paid into Council's Municipal Fund to be spent on projects that will generally be of benefit to residents within the district of the Shire of Wanneroo.
 - (v) In the event of any loss being incurred in the development of this part of the Composite Business and Light Industrial Zone the amount of the loss shall be borne by the Council.
- (d) Building Construction:
- (i) Every building shall have a brick office or showroom facade to the street or streets which adjoin all lots within the approved subdivision.
 - (ii) Where concrete panels are used they shall have an approved exposed aggregate or textured finish.
 - (iii) Where metal cladding is permitted to be used on walls under the Uniform Building By-laws, it must have a factory applied painted finish to the satisfaction of the Shire Building Surveyor.
 - (iv) All industrial type fencing must be erected behind the building line. Suitable separator fences to blend with the landscaping may be permitted forward of the building line. The location and type of all fences it is proposed to erect are to be shown on the plans submitted for development and building approval.
- (e) Setback Areas:
- (i) The setback areas to streets may only be used as follows. No person shall use or permit to be used the land within 3 m from the street alignment except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) Means of access or egress to or from the site. Access driveways are not to exceed one quarter of the frontage of the site.
 - (b) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees and shrubs.
 - (ii) No person shall use or permit to be used the land between 3 m from the street alignment and the building line except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) Parking of vehicles used by employees or customers.
 - (b) Loading or unloading of vehicles.
 - (c) Trade display, where permitted by Council.
- (f) Landscaping: The owner or occupier of the land shall within 12 months from the issue of a building licence to construct a building on the land, plant and thereafter maintain, lawns, trees, shrubs or other garden treatment approved by the Shire Superintendent of Parks and Recreation on the area of land between the street alignment and the line 3 m from and parallel to the street boundaries.
- (g) Material Storage: The occupier of land on which there is stored, stacked or allowed to remain any rusty materials or any materials which by their unsightliness detract from the amenity of the area or are untidy shall completely screen the said land from adjoining properties and from street or streets in a manner specified by the Local Authority, by means of a wall, fence, hedge or shrubs not less than 1.8 m in height.
- (h) Light Industrial and Warehousing:
- (i) Front setback to be minimum 15 m where parking is provided between the building line and the 3 m landscaping area or 9 m where no parking is provided forward of the building line.
 - (ii) Side and rear boundary clearances shall be in accordance with the Uniform Building By-laws.
 - (iii) Parking shall be provided on one third of the total site area behind the front setback line.
 - (iv) A portion of the one third calculated parking area may be provided between the 3 m landscaping line and the 15 m setback.
- (i) Factory Units:
- (i) Front setback to be minimum 15 m where parking is provided between the building line and the 3 m landscaping area or 9 m where no parking is provided forward of the building line.
 - (ii) Side and rear boundary clearances shall be in accordance with the Uniform Building By-laws.

- (iii) The minimum area of any one factory unit is to be 150 m².
- (iv) Parking is to be on the basis of four bays per factory unit of 150 m² with one additional parking bay per additional 38 m².
- (v) Only one pylon sign will be permitted on any one factory unit development, the maximum area of the sign to be 6 m². Equal sized sign panels are to be provided on the ratio of one per unit. The length of the panel is not to exceed 2 m and the overall height of all panels is not to exceed 4 m. A minimum clearance of 2.7 m is to be maintained to the underside of the sign and the overall height of the sign is not to exceed 7 m.
- (j) Showrooms: Requirements for showrooms are to be as specified under Shire of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme No. 1 except that Council may require additional customer parking, depending upon the type of business to be established.
- (k) Offices:
 - (i) Front setback to be 15 m where parking is provided forward of the building line and 9 m where no parking is provided in that area.
 - (ii) On corner lots, a setback of 3 m is required to the side or lesser street.
 - (iii) The rear boundary clearance is to be 6 m, with appropriate vehicular access to the rear.
 - (iv) The maximum plot ratio is to be 1.0 and the maximum site coverage 0.6.
 - (v) Parking is to be provided in the ratio of one parking bay plus appropriate access per 28 m² of gross floor area. 1. AMENDMENT TO STATUTE No. 8—THE FACULTIES:

(a) Clause 15 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 15 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:—

15. The Faculty of Dental Science shall consist of—

- (a) the professors, lecturers and other full-time members of the academic staff in the school of Dental Science;

- (b) the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine or his nominee who must be a full-time member of the teaching staff of the Faculty of Medicine;
- (c) the professors of Chemistry, Physics, Zoology or their nominees who must be full-time members of the teaching staff of the departments concerned;
- (d) the heads of such other departments as may from time to time be established within or associated with the Faculty or their nominees who must be full-time members of the teaching staff of the departments concerned;
- (e) a nominee of the Western Australian Committee of the Royal Australian College of Dental Surgeons;
- (f) two persons elected annually by the University Dental Students' Society of whom one is to be a member of that Society enrolled as an undergraduate in the Faculty of Dental Science and one to be a person who has completed the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Dental Science of the University of Western Australia within the preceding two years;
- (g) the following persons each of whom shall hold office for one year but shall be eligible for re-nomination and re-appointment:
 - (i) the most senior dental officer of the Western Australian Department of Public Health;
 - (ii) two members of the Dental profession nominated, one by the Faculty and the other by the Australian Dental Association (W.A. Branch);
 - (iii) a dental member of the Dental Board nominated by that Board;
 - (iv) a dental member of the Perth Dental Hospital Board nominated by that Board; and
 - (v) such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the Faculty and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

2. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 9—CONVOCATION.

- (a) Clause 6A is amended by the deletion of existing Clause 6A and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

6A. (1) The Convocation Officer shall keep a postal list of members of Convocation. The postal list shall contain the names and addresses of all members of Convocation who advise the Convocation Officer in writing of their wish to receive notices of meetings of Convocation.

(2) Only those members of Convocation whose names are entered in the postal list shall be entitled to receive notices of meetings and voting papers of Convocation.

(3) The name and address of each person who from time to time becomes a member of Convocation shall be entered in the postal list.

(4) (a) As soon as possible after the coming into operation of this amending statute a card shall be posted to each member of Convocation who had previously been exempt from revision or removal from the postal list at his address given therein requesting him to indicate whether he wishes his name to be deleted from the postal list by completing the card and returning it to the Convocation Officer.

(b) Where such a member does not return the card duly completed to the Convocation Officer before the mailing of the Agenda for the next ordinary meeting of Convocation the Convocation Officer shall include in that posting a second card in similar form to that member.

(c) Where such a member does not return a card duly completed to the Convocation Officer before the expiration of three successive months from the date of posting to him of the second card his name and address shall be removed from the postal list.

(5) (a) The postal list in as far as it relates to the names of members of Convocation entered therein on their first becoming a graduate of the University of Western Australia in accordance with the provisions of subclause (3) shall be revised in the year immediately following this graduation. For this purpose a card shall be posted with the notice of the first ordinary meeting of Convocation in that year to each such person at the address given in the postal list requesting him to indicate whether he wishes his name to remain on the postal list by completing the card and returning it to the Convocation Officer.

(b) Where such a member does not return the card duly completed to the Convocation Officer before the mailing of the Agenda for the second ordinary meeting of Convocation in the same year the Convocation Officer shall include with the notice of meeting a second card in similar form to that member.

(c) The name and address of any such member who does not return a card duly completed to the Convocation Officer before the expiration of three successive months from the date of posting to him of the second card shall be removed from the postal list.

SCHEDULE—continued.

(6) In 1979 and in every fourth successive year thereafter the postal list shall be revised. On each revision of the postal list a card shall be posted with the notice of the first ordinary meeting of Convocation in that year to each person whose name appears on the postal list at his address given therein requesting him to indicate whether he wishes his name to remain on the postal list by completing the card and returning it to the Convocation Officer.

(7) (a) Where a member does not return the card duly completed to the Convocation Officer before the mailing of the Agenda for the second ordinary meeting of Convocation in the same year the Convocation Officer shall include with the notice of meeting a second card in similar form to that member.

(b) The name and address of each member who returns a card duly completed to the Convocation Officer shall remain on the postal list unless the member has specifically indicated on the card that he wishes his name to be removed from the postal list.

(c) The name and address of any member who does not return a card duly completed to the Convocation Officer before the expiration of three successive months from the date of posting to him of the second card shall be removed from the postal list.

(8) (a) Where a member at any time requests in writing that his name be removed from the postal list his name and address shall be removed from the list.

(b) Where a member orally requests that his name be removed from the postal list he shall be informed that he will need to submit the request in writing and for this purpose the Convocation Officer will forward to him a card and a reply-paid envelope. On the card will be printed the request that his name be removed from the postal list which he will be required to complete and return to the Convocation Officer.

(9) The name and address of a member may be deleted from the postal list after mail addressed to him has been returned unclaimed not less than twice and in the absence of any other evidence of the true address of the member. Provided that a list of such members shall be tabled every six months at a meeting of the Standing Committee of Convocation.

(10) A member whose name has been removed from the postal list does not thereby cease to be a member of Convocation.

(11) A member of Convocation may at any time apply in writing to the Convocation Officer requesting that his name be entered in the postal list notwithstanding that his name has previously been removed from the list and the Convocation Officer shall on receipt of such application enter his name and address in the postal list provided that a member who lodges an application with the Convocation Officer on a date less than fifty-six days before an election shall not be entitled to vote in that election.

(12) The postal list shall be available at all reasonable times for inspection by any member of Convocation.

(b) Clause 7 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 7 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

7. (1) At least thirty-five day's notice of any meeting shall be given by advertisement in one daily newspaper published in Perth.

(2) At least twenty-eight days before any meeting a printed notice stating the matters to be considered at the meeting shall be sent by surface mail to all persons whose names are entered in the postal list as prescribed in Clause 6A

(3) Where there is to be a contested election of Warden, Deputy Warden or of member of the Standing Committee in any year the notice of the first ordinary meeting of Convocation in that year shall be accompanied by the voting papers and envelopes as hereinunder mentioned.

(c) Clause 44C is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 44C and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

44C. (1) At least sixty days before the date of the first ordinary meeting of Convocation in each year a notice calling for nominations for election to the Committee shall be inserted in one daily newspaper published in Perth, and also in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be exhibited at the University.

(2) The notice shall contain—

(a) particulars of the number of vacancies to be filled;

(b) notification of the date on which nominations close, which date shall be at least fifty-six days before the date fixed for the first ordinary meeting of Convocation.

(c) information that nomination forms are available upon application to the Convocation Officer.

(d) Clause 44E(3) is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 44E(3) and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

- (i) a voting paper which shall be initially by the Convocation Officer;
- (ii) an envelope that is marked "Voting Paper—Election of Standing Committee"; and
- (iii) another envelope on the back of which is printed a form of declaration and which shall bear a distinguishing number. Upon this envelope there shall be written or printed the address of the Convocation Officer and the words "Convocation—Elections".

The declaration shall be in the following form—

I declare I am a member of Convocation of the University of Western Australia and that I have not previously voted at this election.

(b) All voting papers and envelopes addressed to members at places not having a regular surface mail which would be received by the addressee within fourteen days of posting shall if there is an airmail service available be forwarded to the addressee by airmail.

(c) On the voting paper shall be printed or typed the number of vacancies to be filled, the names of the candidates in alphabetical order and the following particulars for each candidate:

- (i) the year of the candidate's admission to Convocation;
- (ii) his qualifications for membership under section 17(1) of the University Act; and
- (iii) whether he is a member of the Committee seeking re-election.

(d) The voter shall exercise his vote by striking out the names of as many of the candidates as exceed the number of vacancies to be filled.

(e) Each voter shall—

- (i) place his voting paper without any other matter in the envelope (provided for that purpose by the Convocation Officer when forwarding the voting paper) marked "Voting Paper—Election of the Standing Committee";
- (ii) seal the envelope and place it in the envelope addressed to the Convocation Officer; and
- (iii) sign the declaration on the envelope addressed to the Convocation Officer and post or deliver the envelope to the Convocation Officer.

(f) All voting papers so transmitted to and received by the Convocation Officer not less than twenty-four hours before the time fixed for the meeting shall if otherwise valid be counted at the scrutiny.

(g) No voting paper or envelope on the back of which is printed the form of declaration other than that officially issued as aforesaid shall be accepted but if the Warden is satisfied that a voting paper or either or both envelopes have been lost or accidentally destroyed he shall on application being made supply another voting paper or either or both envelopes or all or any of them as the circumstances require.

(h) The Convocation Officer shall from time to time (as decided by the Convocation Officer)—

- (i) open each envelope in respect of which the declaration has been signed;
- (ii) check the names appearing on the declarations with the postal list of members of Convocation;
- (iii) place the envelopes marked "Voting Paper—Election of Standing Committee" unopened in a ballot box marked "Standing Committee"; provided that if there is any doubt as to the genuineness of any signature the Warden shall examine the disputed signature and decide whether or not it is genuine and his decision thereon shall be final.

(i) All envelopes containing the voting papers shall be kept by the Convocation Officer unopened until twenty-four hours before the time fixed for the meeting and then he together with the scrutineers to be nominated by the Warden shall open same and a scrutiny thereof be conducted in accordance with the next succeeding paragraph. If on report of the Convocation Officer or a scrutineer the Warden shall be of the opinion that any voting paper is substantially defective or contains identifying marks other than those necessary to indicate the voter's vote such voting paper shall be rejected.

(j) Those candidates up to the total number of vacancies to be filled who have the least number of votes against them as indicated by the striking out of their names shall at the March meeting of Convocation be declared by the Chairman to be elected.

SCHEDULE—*continued*.

(k) In the event of an equality of votes being cast in favour of two or more candidates of whom at least one must be elected to a vacancy in accordance with the foregoing provisions and there being more of such candidates than remaining vacancies to be filled, the Warden shall by casting vote determine which shall be elected.

(l) The Warden shall subject to the provisions herein contained determine conclusively all questions of detail concerning the election.

- (e) Clause 52(2) is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 52(2) and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

52. (2) A member of Convocation seeking election as Warden shall at least fifty-six days before the date of the first ordinary meeting of Convocation deliver to the Convocation Officer a nomination paper signed by him and by two other members of Convocation.

- (f) Clause 52(4) is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 52(4) and the substitution of the following Clause in its place

52. (4) (a) If within the prescribed period more than one valid nomination has been delivered to the Convocation Officer the following provisions shall apply—

The Convocation Officer shall not later than twenty-eight days before the date of the meeting send by post to each member whose name is entered in the postal list—

- (i) a voting paper which shall be initialled by the Convocation Officer;
- (ii) an envelope that is marked "Voting Paper—Election of Warden of Convocation"; and
- (iii) another envelope on the back of which is printed a form of declaration and which shall bear a distinguishing number. Upon this envelope there shall be written or printed the address of the Convocation Officer and the words "Election of Warden of Convocation".

The declaration shall be in the following form—

I declare I am a member of Convocation of the University of Western Australia and that I have not previously voted at this election.

(b) All voting papers and envelopes addressed to members at places not having a regular surface mail which would be received by the addressee within fourteen days of posting shall if there is an airmail service available be forwarded to the addressee by airmail.

(c) On the voting paper shall be printed or types the names in alphabetical order and the addresses and descriptions of all candidates.

(d) The voter shall indicate on the voting paper the order of his preference by placing numbers consecutively starting with the number "1" opposite the names of all candidates so that any voting paper on which the name of any candidate is left unnumbered shall be invalid and that any voting paper which bears the signature of the voter or any matter other than the numbers necessary to indicate the voter's preference shall also be invalid; provided that in case of a voting paper on which one name is left unnumbered the appropriate number shall be inserted thereon by the Convocation Officer and such voting paper shall thereupon subject to the foregoing be a valid voting paper.

(e) Each voter shall—

- (i) place his voting paper without any other matter in the envelope (provided for that purpose by the Convocation Officer when forwarding the voting paper) marked "Voting Paper—Election of Warden of Convocation";
- (ii) seal the envelope and place it in the envelope addressed to the Convocation Officer; and
- (iii) sign the declaration on the envelope addressed to the Convocation Officer and post or deliver the envelope to the Convocation Officer.

(f) All voting papers so transmitted to the Convocation Officer and received by him 5.00 p.m. on the day preceding the date fixed for the meeting shall if otherwise valid be counted at the scrutiny.

(g) No voting paper or envelope on the back of which is printed the form of declaration other than that officially issued and received as aforesaid shall be accepted but if the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that a voting paper or either or both envelopes have been lost or accidentally destroyed he shall on application being made supply another voting paper or either or both envelopes or all or any of them as the circumstances require.

(h) The Convocation Officer shall from time to time (as decided by the Convocation Officer)—

- (i) open each envelope in respect of which the declaration has been signed;
- (ii) check the names appearing on the declarations with the postal list of members of Convocation;

- (iii) place the envelope marked "Voting Paper—Election of Warden of Convocation" unopened in a ballot box marked "Warden of Convocation"; provided that if there is any doubt as to the genuineness of any signature the Vice-Chancellor shall examine the disputed signature and decide whether or not it is genuine and his decision thereon shall be final.

(i) All envelopes containing the voting papers shall be kept by the Convocation Officer unopened until 5.00 p.m. on the day preceding the date fixed for the meeting and then he together with the scrutineers to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor shall open same and a scrutiny thereof shall be conducted in accordance with the method prescribed in Statute No. 12. If on report of the Convocation Officer or of a scrutineer the Vice-Chancellor shall be of the opinion that any voting paper is substantially defective or contains identifying marks or matter other than the numbers necessary to indicate the voter's preference such voting paper shall be rejected.

- (g) Clause 55(2) is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 55(2) and the substitution of the following Clause in its place

55. (2) If an election is required the biography of each candidate for election shall be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor who may delete any matter therein which he deems to be offensive or untrue and thereafter a copy of the biography of each candidate showing his name and address and the names of the two persons signing his nomination form shall be sent by the Convocation Officer with each voting paper and envelopes forwarded by him as hereinbefore provided.

3. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 12—METHOD OF ELECTION BY CONVOCATION OF PERSONS TO BE MEMBERS OF THE SENATE:

- (a) Clause 1 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 1 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

1. The annual election of one member of the Senate shall be held on the second Tuesday in March in every year or upon such later date in that month as the Senate may appoint.

- (b) Clause 4 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 4 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

4. No person shall be eligible for election unless his name, together with his written consent to his nomination, shall have been communicated to the Warden of Convocation, under the hands of two qualified voters, at least forty-six days before the date fixed for the election.

- (c) Clause 8 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 8 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

8. (1) Should a ballot be necessary for the annual election of one member of the Senate the Convocation Officer shall not later than twenty-eight days after the latest day for receiving nominations post with the notice of the first ordinary meeting of Convocation despatched in accordance with the provisions of Clause 7(2) and Clause 7(3) of Statute No. 9 to each member of Convocation whose name and address is entered in the postal list—

- (a) a voting paper which shall be initialled by the Convocation Officer;

- (b) an envelope that is marked "Voting Paper—Election of Senate Member"; and

- (c) another envelope on the back of which is printed a form of declaration and which shall bear a distinguishing number. Upon this envelope shall be written or printed the address of the Convocation Officer and the words "Convocation—Election of Senate Member".

The declaration shall be in the following form—

I declare I am a member of the Convocation of the University of Western Australia and that I have not previously voted at this election.

(2) In the event of the office of a member of the Senate elected by Convocation becoming vacant from any cause whatsoever except termination of office by effluxion of time and a ballot is necessary the Convocation Officer shall not later than twenty-eight days after the latest day for receiving nominations post to each member of Convocation whose name and address is entered in the postal list—

- (a) a voting paper which shall be initialled by the Convocation Officer;

- (b) an envelope that is marked "Voting Paper—Election of Senate Member"; and

- (c) another envelope on the back of which is printed a form of declaration and which shall bear a distinguishing number. Upon this envelope there shall be written or printed the address of the Convocation Officer and the words "Convocation—Election of Senate Member".

The declaration shall be in the following form—

I declare I am a member of Convocation of the University of Western Australia and that I have not previously voted at this election.

- (d) Clause 11 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 11 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:
11. Every voting paper shall contain the names of the candidates who have been duly nominated for election, arranged in alphabetical order of surname, and no voting paper or declaration other than that officially issued as aforesaid shall be accepted; provided that in any case any voting paper or either or both envelopes has been lost or destroyed a duplicate shall be supplied, if time permits, on written application to the Convocation Officer.
- (e) Existing Clause 13 is deleted.
- (f) Clause 14 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 14 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:
13. Having marked his voting paper, the voter shall place it without any other matter in the envelope marked "Voting Paper—Election of Senate Member" and shall seal the same and place the said sealed envelope in the envelope addressed to the Convocation Officer and marked "Election of Senate Member" and same shall be sealed and transmitted to the Convocation Officer. All voting papers so transmitted and received at the University not later than 5 p.m. on the day of the election shall be counted in the ballot.
- (g) Clause 15 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 15 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:
14. Except as aforesaid no member of Convocation shall, before or after marking his voting paper, transfer or part with his voting paper or envelope on which the declaration is endorsed to or permit it to be used by any other person.
- (h) Clause 16 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 16 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:
15. The Convocation Officer shall from time to time (as decided by the Convocation Officer)—
- (a) open each envelope in respect of which the declaration has been signed;
 - (b) check the names appearing on the declarations with the postal list of members of Convocation;
 - (c) place the envelopes marked "Voting Paper—Election of Senate Member" unopened in a ballot box marked "Senate Member"; provided that if there is any doubt as to the genuineness of any signature the Warden shall examine the disputed signature and decide whether or not it is genuine and his decision thereon shall be final. At the expiration of the time allotted for the ballot the Convocation Officer and the scrutineers shall proceed to the examination of the voting papers.
- (i) Clause 17 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 17 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:
16. If, on the report of the Convocation Officer or of a scrutineer, the Warden be of opinion that any voting paper is substantially defective, such voting paper shall not be used in the election.
- (j) Clause 18 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 18 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:
17. If there be more than one vacancy to be filled at any election, the vacancies shall be filled separately, and as each vacancy is filled the name of the successful candidate shall be deemed to have been erased from each voting paper, and the names which remain to have been renumbered with the figures "1", "2", "3", "4", etc., according to the order in which they stand in the voter's order of preference.
- (k) Clause 19 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 19 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:
18. One or more scrutines shall be made by the Convocation Officer and scrutineers, according to the following rules:—
- (i) Subject to subsection (v) hereof the first scrutiny shall be made in the following manner—
 - (a) The figure written opposite the name of any candidate on any voting paper shall be deemed to represent so many votes against the said candidate.
 - (b) The number obtained by dividing the total number of votes so cast by the number of candidates shall be the average for the scrutiny.
 - (c) Every candidate whose sum total is not less than the average shall be rejected.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

- (ii) Any subsequent scrutiny shall be made in the same manner as the first scrutiny; provided that the names of all candidates rejected at any preceding scrutiny shall be deemed to have been erased from each voting paper and the names which remain to have been renumbered with the figures "1", "2", "3", "4", etc., according to the order in which they stand in the voter's order of preference.
- (iii) When upon any scrutiny all the candidates but one have been rejected, that one shall be declared elected.
- (iv) If upon any scrutiny all the candidates have the same number of votes recorded against them, the Warden shall by a casting vote reject one of them.
- (v) If upon the first scrutiny it is found that any candidate has an absolute majority of the total number of first votes polled, he shall be declared elected.
- (l) Clause 20 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 20 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

19. The Warden shall, subject to the provisions herein contained, determine conclusively all question of detail concerning the election.
- (m) Clause 21 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 21 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

20. The Warden shall report the result of the election to the Chancellor, who shall then declare the candidate or candidates, who have been found to be preferred by the electors, duly elected a member or members of the Senate.
- (n) Clause 22 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 22 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

21. Immediately upon the completion of the scrutiny of voting papers same shall be placed by the Convocation Officer in a sealed container and shall be held by him for fourteen days at the expiration of which time the same shall be destroyed by the Convocation Officer unless otherwise directed by the Chancellor.
- (o) Clause 23 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 23 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

22. The Convocation Officer shall prepare a list of all persons entitled to vote completed to the last day for receiving nominations for any election, and a copy of such list shall be exhibited at the University during the period from that date to the day of the election.
- (p) Clause 24 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 24 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

23. Whenever the word "Warden" is used in this Statute it shall mean: "The Warden, or in his absence a Deputy appointed by the Warden, or failing the Warden by the Chancellor." Similarly the words "Convocation Officer" shall mean "The Convocation Officer, or in his absence a Returning Officer appointed by the Warden, or failing the Warden, by the Chancellor."
- (q) Clause 25 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 25 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

24. All voting papers and envelopes in connection therewith for the election by members of Convocation of members of the Senate addressed to members at places not having a regular surface mail which would be received by the addressee within fourteen days of posting shall if there is an airmail service available be forwarded to the addressee by airmail.
- (r) Clause 26 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 26 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

25. (1) There may be delivered with the written consent hereinbefore referred to of a person seeking election a short biography containing all or any of the following particulars of that person:

 - (a) his degree or degrees, date of graduation and other professional qualifications;
 - (b) his profession or position;
 - (c) details of his work on bodies connected or associated with the University;
 - (d) prizes won, publications issued and research done by him;
 - (e) his service whether in war or peace to the community or any section of it and positions held by him in connection therewith;
 - (f) such other particulars as he shall deem fit.

Such biography shall not exceed two hundred and fifty words in length.

(2) If an election is required the biography of each person seeking election shall be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor and the Warden of Convocation (unless he is a person seeking election) who may delete any matter therein deemed by them or him (as the case may be) to be offensive or untrue and thereafter a copy of the biography of each person seeking election showing his name and address and the names of the two qualified voters hereinbefore referred to shall be sent by the Convocation Officer with each voting paper and envelopes as hereinbefore provided.

4. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 18—CONDITIONS OF AWARDING HACKETT BURSARIES AND SCHOLARSHIPS:

- (a) Clause 3 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 3 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

3. (1) Postgraduate studentships hereinafter described as Studentships are tenable at the University of Western Australia or at another Australian University or at a University outside Australia and are open to—

- (a) enrolled students of the University of Western Australia who are graduates of that University and hold at least a Second Class Honours degree or its equivalent; and
- (b) graduates of that University of not more than three years standing who hold at least a Second Class Honours degree or its equivalent.

(2) The value of studentships tenable at Australian Universities, the value of studentships tenable at Universities outside Australia, and the value and method of payment of any additional travelling allowances shall be prescribed by regulations.

(3) Where the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that a person awarded a Hackett Studentship would be unable to take up or continue his course without undue financial hardship, a special additional allowance of up to such amount per annum as is prescribed by regulations, payable at such times and by instalments of such amounts as the Vice-Chancellor shall determine, may be granted to the student.

(4) The University of Western Australia will pay direct to the institution concerned all compulsory fees for admission and tuition payable by the student during his tenure of the Studentship including registration, matriculation, lecture, research, supervision and laboratory fees, but not fees for examination of thesis or graduation.

(5) A Hackett Student is eligible to apply for a free passage or other available travelling award but if granted such a passage or award will not be granted any travelling allowance under subsection (3).

(6) (a) A Studentship shall be awarded for a maximum period of one, two or three years depending upon the nature of the work or course of study for which the award is made.

(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) each Studentship awarded for more than one year shall be reconsidered by the Professorial Board annually and extended for one year at a time up to the maximum period of the award only if the Board is satisfied that the student is making good progress in his work or course of study.

(7) (a) A student shall not without written permission engage in any work or course of study in addition to that for which the studentship was granted.

(b) Written permission to undertake additional work or an additional course of study must first be obtained from the tutor or supervisor if the work or course of study will continue for less than four weeks and from the Vice-Chancellor if the work or course of study will continue for more than four weeks.

(c) A student who undertakes additional work or an additional course of study without permission is liable to forfeit his studentship.

(8) Applications for the Studentships must reach the Vice-Chancellor on or before the date fixed by him each year and advertised.

(9) Every applicant must send to the Vice-Chancellor satisfactory evidence that his means are such as to make it difficult for him to work as a full-time student without the assistance of a studentship.

(10) Every applicant must submit a scheme of work or course of study and must attach to his application a written estimate of the amount required by him for books, apparatus and other materials, travelling expenses and other authorised expenditure.

(11) (a) Awards of Studentships will be made by the Professorial Board but the Board has a discretionary power to make no awards or to make less awards than the available number of Studentships if it is of opinion that some or all of the applicants are not of sufficient merit to justify awards being made.

(b) The Board may from time to time delegate the power conferred upon it by the immediately preceding subsection to a committee appointed by it and to consist of such members of the Board and of such heads of departments not being members of the Board as the Board shall select.

(12) (a) A tutor or supervisor of such part of each student's work or course of study as is intended to be done at the University of Western Australia shall be appointed by the Dean of the Faculty and the head of the department concerned as soon as possible after each award is made.

(b) A student who intends to do all or part of his work or course of study at an institution other than the University of Western Australia shall within three months of his enrolment at such institution submit to the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Western Australia the name of the tutor or other person under whose supervision he proposes to do his work or course of study.

Schedule—*continued*.

(13) Payment of the allowances defined in subsection (2) other than travelling allowances shall be made by instalments of such amounts as the Vice-Chancellor shall determine, the first of such instalments being payable at the commencement of the Studentship and the remaining instalments at such times as may be directed by the Vice-Chancellor, but only after he has received sufficient evidence that the student is satisfactorily doing the work or course of study for which the Studentship was awarded.

(14) At the end of the Studentship the student shall be required to supply to the University a full report on the work or course of study undertaken by him and such number of copies as the Vice-Chancellor shall require of any thesis or publications connected with his work or course of study.

(15) Whenever any written work is carried out under a Studentship acknowledgement thereof shall be made in the publication of such work.

(16) If the Professorial Board considers a thesis submitted by a student to be of sufficient merit it may recommend the Senate to grant out of the funds available for Hackett Studentships a part or the whole of the cost of publishing the thesis on condition that the student shall supply to the University free of all charges as many copies of the published thesis as the Vice-Chancellor shall require and that the University shall have the right to use and dispose of such copies in whatever manner the Vice-Chancellor shall decide, and the Senate may make a grant accordingly.

- (b) Clause 4 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 4 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

4. Hackett Scholarships shall be awarded under the following conditions:—

- (1) Postgraduate Scholarships hereinafter described as the Scholarships shall be open to persons who have satisfied the requirements of a bachelor's or higher degree of the University of Western Australia. The Scholarships shall be tenable at the University of Western Australia but may in exceptional circumstances and with the approval of the Professorial Board be held at any other University or recognised institution in Australia.
- (2) (a) Scholarships awarded to candidates who have satisfied the requirements for a bachelor's degree with honours or a higher degree will normally be awarded for one year but may be renewed by the Professorial Board for a second year. The annual value of such scholarships if tenable in Western Australia and their annual value if tenable elsewhere in Australia shall not exceed an amount which shall be prescribed by regulations.
(b) Scholarships awarded to other candidates shall be for one year only and shall not exceed an amount which shall be prescribed by regulations.
- (3) Subsections (8) (9) (10) (11) (12) (13) (15) (16) and (17) of section 3 shall apply to the award and tenure of Scholarships with the words Scholarship and Scholar substituted for Studentship and Student respectively.
- (4) Payment of the allowance granted under subsection (2) of this section shall be made by instalments of such amounts as the Vice-Chancellor shall determine, the first of such instalments being payable at the commencement of the Scholarship and the remaining instalments at such times as may be decided by the Vice-Chancellor, but only after he has received sufficient evidence that the scholar is satisfactorily doing the work or course of study for which his Scholarship was awarded.

5. AMENDMENTS TO STATUTE No. 25—METHOD OF ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE SENATE UNDER SECTIONS 10(c) AND 10A(c):

- (a) Clause 7 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 7 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

7. Whenever subsection (2) of section 5 of this Statute applies—

- (1) The voting paper shall contain the names of the candidates arranged in alphabetical order of their surnames.
- (2) Each elector shall insert opposite the names of the candidates the numbers 1, 2, 3, etc. in numerical order of his preference. Provided that every voting paper shall be valid on which not more than one name is left unnumbered.
- (3) Each elector shall address his completed voting paper to the Registrar in a sealed envelope marked "Senate Voting Paper".
- (4) The scrutiny of the voting papers shall commence at five o'clock on the afternoon of the day of the election and no voting papers received after that hour shall be included in the scrutiny.
- (5) The Registrar with one or more scrutineers to be appointed by him who shall be electors but not candidates shall make a scrutiny of the voting papers in the manner prescribed by

Schedule—*continued*.

section 19 of Statute No. 12, but so that the words "Convocation Officer" in the said section shall be replaced by the word "Registrar" and the word "Warden" by the word "Vice-Chancellor".

- (6) Each candidate shall be entitled to nominate one scrutineer to be present at the scrutiny held in accordance with the preceding subsection.
- (7) Within forty-eight hours of the conclusion of the scrutiny the Registrar shall report to the Vice-Chancellor the result of the election.
- (8) The Vice-Chancellor shall report the result of the election to the Chancellor, who shall thereupon and in writing declare the candidates who have been preferred by the electors to have been duly elected as members of the Senate.
